TOKYO, Japan (**October 28, 2015**) – The Cabinet Office, Government of Japan today announced the programme overview for its international conference on cyber security, “Cyber³ Conference Okinawa 2015 – Crafting Security in a Less Secure World.” The conference will be held over two days: November 7 and 8 (Sat.-Sun.). During this time, various stakeholders from around the world, including policymakers, business leaders, and security researchers will examine the reality we are now facing with our hyper-connected cyber issues and its implications for the future of the global economy.

The Cyber³ Conference 2015 will consist of three main tracks: Cyber Connection, Cyber Security, and Cybercrime (together, “Cyber³”). Each of the three Tracks — the main pillars of the conference — will be led by a Track Chair who in turn will be supported by a Policy Lead, a Technology Lead, and an Academic Lead. On Day 1, as a general rule, each Lead will moderate one session. On Day 2, the last session for each track will be moderated by the Track Chair, who will then summarize the key points brought out in that track’s discussions and will later present that information in the final Summary session.

Cyber Connection Track

Track Chair: **Toshiyuki Shiga**, Chairman & CEO, Member of the Board, Innovation Network Corporation; Vice Chairman, Member of the Board of Directors, Nissan Motor Co. Ltd.

The Cyber Connection Track led by Mr. Shiga will feature sessions including *Our Hyper-Connected World: Problems, Issues, and Implications* and *Tomorrow’s IoT: A New Global Vision of Cyber Connectivity*. All sessions will focus on the latest efforts by both public and private sectors to leverage the potential of the Internet of Things, and how can countries take advantage of global standardization for competitiveness, scalability, and velocity.

Cyber Security Track

Track Chair: **Admiral Dennis Blair (Ret.)**, Chairman of the Board and CEO, Sasakawa USA

The Cyber Security Track led by Admiral Blair will feature sessions including *Cyber and National Security*, which will discuss how to deter large-scale cyberwar, as well as *Olympics: Preparing for PyeongChang 2018 and Tokyo 2020*.

Cybercrime Track

Track Chair: **Noboru Nakatani**, Executive Director, INTERPOL Global Complex for Innovation

The Cybercrime Track led by Mr. Nakatani will discuss the current state of Cybercrime and efforts by law enforcement agencies to counter it, as well as case studies of effective public-private partnerships, in sessions including *Building a Framework to Share Information and Threat Intelligence*.
