Situation of Implementation Measures for the Aging Society

Section 1

Fundamental Framework of Measures for the Aging Society

- oThe basic framework of aged society measures in Japan is based on the Aged Society Basic Act (1995 Bill #129).
- oThe Aged Society Measures Council makes the Cabinet prime minister the chairman, all cabinet ministers are appointed by committee members, an outline plan for the aged society measures is created, and deliberation of important items concerning aged society measures alongside the mutual adjustment of related administrative agencies needed in regards to aged society measures is promoted along with the implementation of such measures.
- oThe aged society measures outline is required to be created by the government based on the Aged Society Basic Act, and becomes a basic and comprehensive guideline over the medium to long term of aged society measures promoted by the government.
- o5 years following the formulation of the first aged society measures outline in July 1996, the socioeconomic conditions changed and a plan was created in the Aged Society Measures Council on

- December 28, 2001 whereupon an aged society measures outline was decided upon in a Cabinet meeting.
- oIn order to comprehensively promote measures based on the aged society measures outline, basic policy frames are exceeded by field, issues abstracted in a cross-sectional manner are set, and related policies are promoted comprehensively.
- Aged society measures cover a wide range of policies promoting employment, income, health, welfare, study, social participation, living circumstances, and investigative research, and are showing consistent development.

When examining related budgets in the general account budget, 2009 was ¥17,184,700,000,000. When observing by each field, employment and income were ¥10, 319,400, 000,000, health and welfare were ¥6,809,700,000,000, study and social participation were ¥16,400,000,000, living circumstances was 15,300,000,000, and investigative research promotion was ¥23,900,000,000.
