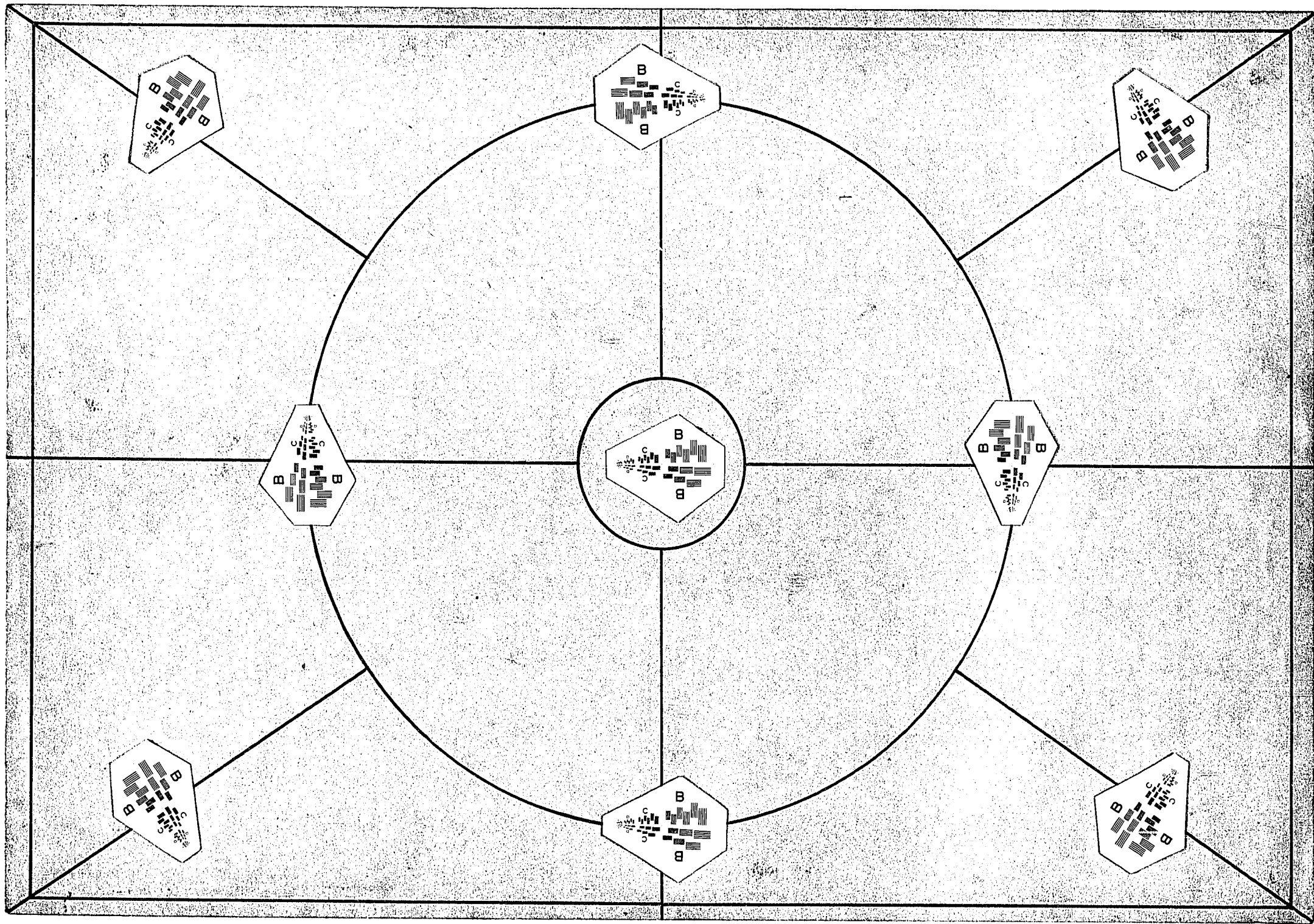

MEMORANDUM FOR THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH: Central Liaison Office Number 1.

FROM : The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

1. The Japanese Government is authorized, subject to later confirmation from this headquarters, to dispatch the flights requested in memorandum from the Japanese Government dated 30 August 1945, in conformity with the following schedule:

- 4 September 1945: Tokyo (Haneda) to Keijo, Korea - three MC 20, type 2 planes. (To return the following day.)
- 5 September 1945: Yokohama to Tamsui, Formosa - one 4-engine flying boat, type 97. (To return the following day.)

2. Inclement weather may interfere with the above schedule; therefore authority is granted to conduct the flights on the first suitable flying day after the dates specified above.

3. It will be understood:

- a. That all aircraft will be painted white, and will bear large, green recognition crosses on both sides of the fuselage and on the top and bottom of each wing.
- b. That, in general, flights will be accomplished via the most direct, practicable air route, but avoiding flying near Allied surface craft and ground installations.
- c. That aircraft will not commit any act that might be construed as hostile to the interests of the Allied Powers.

4. The Japanese Government will inform this headquarters, twenty-four hours in advance, of estimated time of departure, intended route to be followed, cruising altitudes, and estimated time of arrival at termini involved.

SUBJECT: Buildings and Facilities in Tokyo Area Required
by Allied Occupation Forces.

TO : Central Liaison Committee, Japanese Imperial
Government.

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1. The buildings and installations indicated below, as
selected by representatives of the Supreme Commander for the
Allied Powers, will be required initially in the Tokyo area
for use of Allied occupation forces.

2. It is desired to commence reconnaissance and inspection
of buildings and installations by representatives of the Supreme
Commander for the Allied Powers, to determine their suitability
without delay. To assist in this inspection it is desired
that 30 officers and guides familiar with locations and types
of buildings and installations indicated, with necessary motor
transportation, be available on call to accompany representa-
tives, commencing 4 September 1945.

3. The type of facilities and estimated capacity or areas
follow:

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a. Quarters:

(1) General Officers:

Suitable hotel or apartment accommodations,
with appropriate appointments and furnishings,
for not less than 150 General Officers.

(2) **Officers:**

Hotel accommodations or equivalent for not less than 5,250 officers, of which 350 will be female officers.

(3) **Enlisted Men:**

Barracks or equivalent for not less than 22,000 (allowance of 600 cubic feet per man). The above requirement includes 1,250 enlisted women.

b. **Hospitals:**

Total capacity of 9,000 beds. (Allowance of 100 square feet floor space per bed.)

c. **Office Space:**

1,025,000 square feet, complete with office furniture and equipment.

BASIC: Ltr SCAP to Central Liaison Committee, Japanese Imperial Government, file AG 600 (3 Sep 45)CG, dtd 3 Sep 45, subj "Buildings and Facilities in Tokyo Area Required by Allied Occupation Forces."

d. **Storage:**

(1) Covered storage: 715,000 square feet.

(2) Open storage: 1,500,000 square feet.

e. **Parking Area:** 470,000 square feet, hard surface.

f. **Shop Buildings:** 50,000 square feet.

g. **Refrigerated Storage:** 21,000 cubic feet.

At the time of transfer to Allied occupation forces, all buildings and installations listed above will be clean, sanitary, equipped for their designed purpose, staffed with operating and service personnel, and ready for full operation, and, where specifically stated, equipped with furnishings as indicated.

SCAPIN 7 Memorandum For the Japanese Government

THROUGH: Central Liaison Office Number 1.

SUBJECT: Funds For Occupation Forces.

1. It is desired that your office take the necessary steps to have the Minister of Finance direct the Bank of Japan to place to the credit of Lieutenant Colonel Maurice Tjebman, Finance Department, Funding Officer, Government Section, General Headquarters, United States Army Forces Pacific, such sums as he may request which may be necessary for expenditures of the occupation forces. It is understood that the cost of printing, handling and distribution of these funds will be borne by the Imperial Japanese Government.
2. It is further desired that the necessary arrangements be made with the bank of Japan to transfer by mail or teletograph from this credit to its branches and correspondent banks such sums as the Funding Officer may direct to the credit of and for the use of Disbursing Officers.
3. Payments will be made from these credits by cash or check as may be preferable to the respective Disbursing Officers.
4. Acknowledgment of these instructions is requested, together with a report of the action taken.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH: Central Liaison Office Number 1.

SUBJECT: Legal Tender.

1. It is desired that the Japanese Imperial Government place in effect immediately as a law, decree or other appropriate measure the following, which will have application within Honshu, Hokkaido, Shikoku, Kyushu and adjacent waters:
 - a. "Supplemental military yen currency, marked "B", issued by the Military Occupation Forces is legal tender in Japan for the payment of all yen debts public or private.
 - b. "Supplemental military yen currency, marked "B", issued by the Military Occupation Forces, regular yen currency issued by the Bank of Japan and Japanese state notes and coin shall be equivalent in all respects and interchangeable at their face value.
 - c. "All military and all occupational currency which has been issued by the Japanese Government, Army or Navy, is void and valueless and the giving or accepting of such currency in any transaction is prohibited."
2. You are advised to bring to the attention of the proper authorities that such penalties as may be necessary to secure enforcement of the above will be prescribed by the Japanese Government and it is requested that the list of maximum and minimum penalties to be imposed for approval.

Required by Allied Occupation Forces.

TO : Central Liaison Committee, Japanese Imperial
Government.

1. The facilities and installations indicated below, as selected by representatives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will be required initially in the Jinzen-Kaijo Area for use of Allied Occupation Forces upon their arrival approximately 7 September 1945. It is desired that officers and approximately 150 guides familiar with the various facilities indicated, with necessary motor transportation, be available on that date to accompany these representatives.

2. Type facilities and installations.

- a. Airfields - Put both airfields at Kaijo, with all existing installations, facilities and equipment, in optimum operating condition at once.
- b. Harbor - As required with approximately 1,500 laborers.
- c. Petroleum Storage - Bulk terminal with minimum capacity of 75,000 U. S. barrels and connection to fueling jetty or wharf.
- d. Quarters - Headquarters Personnel.
 - (1) General Officers - Suitable hotel or apartment accommodations with appropriate appointments and furnishings for not less than 10 General Officers.
 - (2) Officers - Hotel accommodations or equivalent for not less than 400 officers.

- e. Cantonment Areas and Barracks - For not less than 35,000 personnel.
- f. Separate Camp Area - For 2,500 men.

1. It is desired to secure a number of Japanese aircraft for test and study by technicians of the United States Armed Forces. The requirements of this program are as follows:

a. Four (4) of each aircraft and all accessories therefor employed by or developed for both the Japanese Army and Navy. All aircraft employed should be in the best possible operational condition. Such aircraft as may have been in the development stage should be in that condition in which they existed as of 15 August 1945.

b. Sufficient spare parts for each aircraft necessary to conduct exhaustive flight tests. The spare parts sets should include those items which are ordinarily replaceable as a result of normal operation.

c. Aircraft, accessories and spare parts selected will be in the best possible condition and at locations most accessible from the Tokyo area.

d. Competent flying and maintenance personnel, familiar with each aircraft, will be furnished for the purpose of rendering such aircraft operational, where necessary, and for detailed interrogation as to flight characteristics and maintenance procedures. Adequate supplies of fuel, lubricants, etc. of the various types, used in each aircraft will be made available.

e. The Japanese Imperial Government will cause the aircraft, accessories, supplies and spare parts to be furnished on a priority basis, first class priority being the latest types of each model in operational use as of 15 August 1945, second class priority being aircraft not in operational use but in development or testing stages, and third class priority being earlier types of each model whether in operational use, discarded, or outmoded as of 15 August 1945.

f. The Japanese Imperial Government will notify this Headquarters as each of the above aircraft is made ready and the locations at which each is available.

2. Detailed instructions as to flights, tests, and further maintenance will be given by United States Army Air Force personnel as required. In fulfilling the above requirements, aircrafts will not be fueled by Japanese authorities nor will propellers be installed. Fuel and propellers, however, should be immediately available.

b. The manufacture of soap, insecticides, fungicides, medical, dental and sanitation supplies;

c. The production of coal, charcoal and other solid fuels and crude petroleum;

d. The production of fertilizer;

e. The production of clothing, footwear and other textiles for domestic consumption;

f. The production of cement, timber, asphalt and ceramics required for emergency constructions and repair;

9. No news story shall be distorted by the omission of pertinent facts or details.
10. In the make-up of the newspaper no news story shall be given undue prominence for the purpose of establishing or developing any propaganda line.

- b. The budget of the Japanese Imperial Government for the fiscal year ending 31 March 1946 as approved by the Diet and including any alterations which may have been made subsequently by decree or otherwise.
- c. An approved or proposed revised budget for the remainder of the fiscal year ending 31 March 1946.
- d. A financial statement of the Japanese Imperial Government as of the close of business 1 September 1945.
- e. All receipts and expenditures of the Imperial Household for each month, January to August 1945.
- f. The budget of the Imperial Household for the fiscal year ending 31 March 1946.
- g. A revised budget of the Imperial Household for the remainder of the fiscal year ending 31 March 1946.
- h. A financial statement of the Imperial Household as of the close of business 1 September 1945.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will forward to the Supreme Commander within one week:

- a. Sworn Statements of Condition as of 1 September 1945 of all banks, trust companies, national policy companies, insurance companies, and similar financial institutions, incorporated or unincorporated, operating in

Japan. Such Statements of Condition will show, separately, assets and liabilities outside Japan.

b. The Imperial Japanese Government will, at the same time, forward to the Supreme Commander lists of all directors and responsible officials of all such financial institutions and lists of all owners of one thousand shares or more of stock in such institutions whether in the name of the owner or that of another, and the owners of five (5) percent or more of the stock in such institutions.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will forward, within two weeks, to the Supreme Commander, a report of all financial agreements in force on 7 December 1941, or subsequently ratified between the Imperial Japanese Government, the Bank of Japan or any other bank, national policy company or similar financial institution, controlled or directed by the Imperial Japanese Government, and any other government or any bank, or other financial institution controlled or directed by any other government.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will promptly forward to the Supreme Commander copies of all laws, decrees, ordinances, or other enactments concerning:

- a. Compulsory savings.
- b. Limitations on the amounts of salaries, bonuses, dividends, or other income.
- c. Limitations on withdrawals from or the use of bank deposits, trust funds, insurance payments or any other savings.
- d. Limitations on the use of the proceeds of the sale of movable or immovable property, liquidations, inheritances or realization of any other capital assets.
- e. Restrictions on the investment of capital in and the extensions of credit for industrial, commercial, and agricultural activities.
- f. Transactions in gold, silver, foreign securities, foreign currencies, foreign exchange and external assets.
- g. Any other restrictions on the use of income or capital.
