SUBJECT : Occupancy of the Nissan Building by Agencies of the Japanese Government.

- Reference is made to your Memorandum, file CIO No. 907 (A), dated 6 December 1945, in which your office reported the Nissan Building in Tokyo as being occupied by the Japanese Foreign Office and the Central Liaison Office.
- Under date of 26 October 1945 a letter, file AG 601 (D), subject: "Retention of Certain Army and Navy Installations by the Japanese Government", from the Commanding General, Eighth Army, advised the Imperial Japanese Government that the Nissan Building was allocated to the Japanese Government for demobilization purposes of the Japanese Navy.
- Further to the above, Directive No. 1 of this headquarters, dated 2 September 1945, in Section VI (c), directs that the Imperial Japanese Government will hold intact and in good condition all military installations and establishments pending receipt of further instructions from this headquarters.
- The Nissan Building is the building which formerly housed the Japanese Naval Technical and Aeronautical Department and is thus considered to be a military installation.
- There is no record in this headquarters or in the headquarters of the Commanding General, Eighth Army, indicating that advices have been received that the Imperial Japanese Government requested permission to occupy the building as offices for the Foreign Office or the Central Liaison Office.
- This headquarters desires, if possible, to avoid taking over any building which will require the movement of governmental agencies, however this may not be possible in all cases as the requirements of this headquarters for office space are constantly expanding. It is not considered advisable at this time to definitely exempt the Nissan Building from requisition for use by this headquarters. Such a requisition will not be executed, however, except to meet an impelling need which cannot be as satisfactorily met by other means.

1. Memorandum this headquarters, file AG 370.05 (15 Nov 45) GC, dated 15 November 1945, subject: "Repatriation" and AG 370.05 (26 Nov 45)GC, dated 26 November 1945 same subject are superseded by this memorandum.

2. It is planned to use Landing Ships, Tanks leaving Sasebo for outloading repatriates for Korea only and to use recovered Japanese shipping to transport any Chinese repatriates in Japan who desire to return to China.

3. In conformity with the above the Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Prepare and execute plans to receive at Sasebo 3,000 repatriates daily by Landing Ships, Tank from China.

b. Outload at Sasebo daily 3,000 repatriates for Korea.

c. Continue to request from this headquarters and SCAJAP transportation on recovered Japanese shipping for Chinese desirous of returning to China.

SUBJECT : Control of Traffic in poisonous beverages

1. The illicit sale and trading of untaxed beverages containing methyl alcohol to members of the Allied Occupation Forces has resulted in a number of cases of death, blindness and severe illness among those who have consumed these beverages.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to provide by appropriate enactment that selling or trading in any food or beverage containing methyl alcohol or other poison, and the manufacture, distillation or possession of such food or beverage will be punishable by a fine of not less than 2,000 nor more than 10,000 yen or penal servitude for not less than three nor more than fifteen years, or both such fine and penal servitude.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will rigidly enforce the enactment above directed and all existing Japanese legislation and regulations controlling the trading, manufacture and sale of alcoholic beverages and of methyl alcohol and other poisons.

4. English translations of the enactment issued in accordance with this memorandum will be forwarded in duplicate to this Headquarters immediately upon publication.

2. The Deposit Bureau will submit, within ten days, a specific plan for investment for the quarter 1 Jan-31 March 1946. This plan should take cognizance of directives previously issued by this Headquarters.
3. Pending acceptance of such a plan by this Headquarters, the Deposit Bureau will confine its investments to making loans or advances to or purchasing obligations of national, prefectural, and municipal governments. This requirement modifies the provisions of par. 3 of the Memorandum from this Headquarters, dated 8 Dec 45, file AG 121.7 (8 Dec 45) ESS/FI, subject "Application of Memorandum Regarding Elimination of War Profits and Reorganization of National Finances," insofar as the Deposit Bureau is concerned.
4. Unless otherwise authorized by this Headquarters, any other bureau or agency of the Imperial Japanese Government entrusted with the investment of public or private monies, will confine its investments to the types enumerated in par. 3 hereof, until a plan for investment, prepared in accordance with the requirements of par. 2 hereof, is submitted to, and accepted by, this Headquarters.

SUBJECT : Restoration of Electoral Rights to Released Political Prisoners.

The Imperial Japanese Government shall immediately take such legal or administrative action as may be required to:

a. Restore the right to vote and the right to hold public office to;

(1) All persons who were ordered to be released from detention, imprisonment, or protection and surveillance by the terms of the "Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government", subject: "Removal of Restrictions on Political, Civil and Religious Liberties" dated 4 October 1945.

(2) All persons detained, imprisoned, or under protection and surveillance for violation of the laws, decrees, orders, ordinances, and regulations referred to in the memorandum above described who were released from such restriction prior to 4 October 1945.

NOTE: This restoration of political rights shall be effected by providing and publicising the necessary procedures for late registration and waiver of established residence requirements.

b. Notify not later than 31 December 1945 all persons affected by the terms of this directive that their electoral rights have been restored and specify the procedure which they shall observe to register and/or file candidacy for public office.

Memorandum, file AG 402.5 (24 Sept 45)GD, subject: "Materials, Supplies and Equipment Received and to be Received from the Japanese Armed Forces", dated 24 September 1945, forwarded by this headquarters to the Imperial Japanese Government, directs that the Home Ministry will receive and distribute such supplies and equipment as are to be returned to the Japanese Government.

2. It has been noted from reports received in this headquarters from the Armies and from observation that large quantities of military medical supplies still remain available for distribution through civilian channels. It is known that doctors and hospitals are short of necessary drugs and equipment for proper treatment of the civilian population. This condition must be alleviated by prompt utilization of the existing military stocks.

3. Steps must be taken at once to stimulate the distribution of medical supplies transferred to the Home Ministry and to determine that they reach the consumer. Prompt measures must be taken to assure that:

- a. Prefectural officials take vigorous action upon advice that supplies are available at a depot or collection point.
- b. The prefectural agencies are furnished sufficient transport, labor and warehouse space, and that a minimum of delay is caused by necessary paper work.
- c. Distributing agencies move the supplies to doctors, hospitals and other dispensers expeditiously for the relief of civilian ill.

 4. It is directed that the Marunouchi Hotel be operated in the normal manner as a hotel. The following policy will be strictly adhered to in the assignment of rooms:
 - a. Diplomats of neutral and Allied Powers will not be denied reservations unless the fifty rooms reserved for this class of personnel are taken by them.
 - b. Japanese Government officials will not be denied reservations unless the fifty rooms reserved for this class of personnel are taken by officials.
 - c. Civilian employees of this headquarters who are certified by the Headquarters Commandant, this headquarters will not be denied reservations unless the seventy-eight rooms reserved for this class of personnel are taken by them.
 - d. This headquarters, will not furnish certificates to permit civilians other than those employed by General Headquarters to obtain reservations.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of G.L.O. 1092 (1.1), subject above, dated 14 December 1945.

2. Subject plan is approved by this headquarters with the following exceptions:

a. Section (3) states in part, "Relief goods, as a general rule, shall not be used for relief for emergencies or other relief due to special causes. When, however, it shall be deemed specially necessary, permission shall be obtained from the Ministry of Welfare". This statement will be deleted from the plan. Supplies distributed under this arrangement will not be used in mass feeding projects without the approval of the Supreme Commander but no prohibition will be included which prevents the use of supplies in emergencies under procedures set up elsewhere in the plan.

b. Section (4), first paragraph, will be amended to state that exceptions to distribution under the normal ration system will be made only on specific authorization of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

c. Section (5) will be amended to read:

"The actual distribution of relief goods will be started within each prefecture as soon as preparations under this plan are complete and upon specific authorization of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers."

3. The inventory of reserve supplies submitted in reply to memorandum AG 400 (26 Nov 45)PH is accepted as representing the amount of food and clothing set aside for relief distribution. Any variations in this inventory which may later be discovered will be promptly reported to this headquarters.

4. Copies in English of all ordinances, regulations, instructions and other enactments promulgated in connection with subject plan will be furnished the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers without delay.

- a. Administrative documents relating to military personnel to include service records, data on promotions, awards, decorations, pay, allowances and allotments, and other official documents necessary for completing final records and discharge papers of military and auxiliary personnel. Administrative regulations and procedures covering personnel matters are included in this authorization.
- b. Tables of Organization and Equipment, strength returns, changes in command and military directories.
- c. Health regulations, hospital records and sick reports.
- d. Courts Martial proceedings, records of arrests and confinements, and files of pending cases.

The appointed custodian of the documents will present his credentials and clearance certificate from the port of embarkation to the proper authority at the port of debarkation for final clearance to transfer these documents to the control of Imperial Japanese Government.
4. Permission to bring into Japan documents not specifically authorized in this memorandum will require approval from this headquarters in each case. Descriptive lists of other documents desired may be submitted for consideration.
5. The provisions of this memorandum are to be construed as a matter of policy and do not abrogate the prerogatives of the local commander to retain in his area such documents as he considers necessary.
6. Upon request all documents received by the Imperial Japanese Government under this authority will be made accessible to this headquarters for inspection and examination.
7. Commanders of those areas from which repatriation is in progress are being furnished a copy of this correspondence.

over Necessary Articles of Life.

1. Reference is made to CLO No. 616(2) requesting permission to remove sundry essential items from price and distribution controls.

2. Reference is made to paragraphs 2(a) and (b) of Directive No. 3 (dated 22 September 1945) to the Imperial Japanese Government in which the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to maintain a firm control over prices and a strict rationing program for essential commodities. The request referred to in paragraph 1 above is denied for the following reasons:

a. Abandonment of price controls would stimulate inflationary trends.

b. Abandonment of distribution controls would result in inequities to consumers.

3. In the future, all requests for the abandonment of price controls (as differentiated from price changes) and distribution controls of essential commodities will be accompanied by the following detailed information for each specific item:

a. Total amount of each of the raw materials used in production in the period of a year.

b. Quantity available in stockpiles or at distribution points.

c. Monthly production figures from January 1941 until month before request is made.

d. Estimated current monthly demand.

e. A clear and detailed statement of the distribution controls in existence at the time of the request.

f. Figures showing in detail the actual distribution by months since January 1945.

g. Monthly price changes since January 1937.

1. In reply to your CLO 401, 29 October 1945 you are advised that deliveries of election materials may be made only to the islets in Oshima-gun of Kagoshima Prefecture north of 30° north latitude excluding Kuchinoshima. No deliveries shall be made in the other islands mentioned in your request.

2. You will notify this Headquarters when such deliveries are proposed to be made seven days in advance of the time such delivery is to be made.

3. You will give appropriate advance public notice of the times when deliveries are to be made. Provisions will be made so that all candidates and political parties interested in the election will have equal opportunity to use the facilities for delivery to and communication with such islands.

4. Neither the granting nor withholding of permission requested in your CLO 401, 29 October 1945 will be interpreted as an indication of Allied policy with regard to the ultimate disposition of such islands.

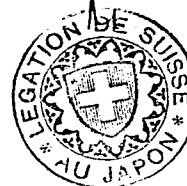
The Legation would therefore be grateful to receive the aforesaid note of November 1st.

c. Repatriation vessels on Kure - Manila shuttles, authorized to be diverted to Takao Formosa on outgoing voyage, are available for outloading Formosans as rapidly as they can be assembled at Kure.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Move these Formosans in the Kyoto area to Kure as soon as possible.

b. Make arrangements without delay for evacuating up to 3,000 Formosans in Kyushu on the Nissho Maru which is scheduled to depart Hakata for Kiirun Formosa within a week.

c. Accelerate movement of other Formosans to authorized ports for repatriation to insure that capacity loads are available for embarkation on each vessel set up to carry repatriates from Japan to Formosa.

SUBJECT : Suspension Repatriation of Koreans.

1. a. Sailings of vessels carrying repatriates for Korea was suspended 30 December until further orders. Military Commanders have been directed to offload all Koreans from vessels destined for Korea that have not left ports in Japan.

b. Serious congestion will develop at reception centers outloading Koreans unless the flow of Korean repatriates into those ports is stopped at once.

2. The Japanese Government will take immediate steps to:

a. Cancel all special trains carrying Korean repatriates to reception centers for shipment to Korea.

b. Cancel the assignment of special cars, designated to carry Korean repatriates, that are normally coupled to regularly scheduled trains.

c. Suspend for time being practice of furnishing transportation tickets to Koreans bound for reception centers.

d. Be prepared to relieve possible congestion that may result at reception centers by evacuating, prospective Korean repatriates, thereat by rail.

e. Care for 2,600 Koreans that will be offloaded by USS General O. H. Ernst, due to arrive Uraga on 1 January, until such time as they can be trans-shipped to Korea.
