Any such person shall be disqualified from standing at any time as a candidate for Prefectural Governor or Mayor of a city (Shi). Also, all such persons shall be removed from and henceforth excluded from appointment to the House of Peers. The Imperial Japanese Government shall adopt measures to enforce this disqualification of candidates for elective office, including the issuance of necessary regulations, the publication of disqualification categories prepared in conformity herewith and the certification by each candidate that he is not thereby disqualified from standing for election. A comprehensive report of the measures proposed to be adopted will be furnished to this Headquarters.

15. The Imperial Japanese Government will make the following reports to this Headquarters (in English; in triplicate):

- a. Reports required by paragraphs 8 and 14 hereof.
- b. An initial report of the Plan of each Ministry or other agency called for by paragraph 11. This Headquarters may direct revision of any of these Plans if they are not considered adequate.
- c. A weekly report, divided into sections for the fields of competence of each Ministry or other agency, showing:
 - (1) Total number of positions whose incumbents are to be investigated.
 - (2) Number and type of positions investigated previously and during the current week.

- (3) Number of persons removed or denied employment during the current week.
- (4) Names, ranks, positions, and Questionnaire numbers of persons removed or denied employment during the current week.

16. This Headquarters will provide for inspections and investigations necessary to check compliance with this directive, and the Imperial Japanese Government will render any assistance required for the making of such inspections and investigations. Action taken by the Japanese Government with respect to removal or denial of employment and with respect to disqualification of candidates for elective office will be reviewed and may be reversed by this Headquarters.

17. Wilful falsification of or failure to make full and complete disclosures in any Questionnaire, report, or Application provided for in this directive will be punishable by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as a violation of the Surrender Terms. In addition, the Imperial Japanese Government will make any provisions necessary to provide adequate punishment in Japanese courts and under Japanese law for such wilful falsification or non-disclosure and will undertake such prosecutions as may be required.

18. In addition to the general provisions of this directive covering all public offices, this Headquarters has made and may make more restrictive requirements respecting employment of certain classes of individuals at all levels in special fields.

19. All officials and subordinates of the Imperial Japanese Government affected by the terms of this order will be held personally responsible and strictly accountable for compliance with and adherence to the spirit and letter of this directive.

MEMORANDUM FOR: LAFACIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Removal and Exclusion of Undesirable Personnel from Public Office.

1. The Potsdam Declaration states: "There must be eliminated for all time the authority and influence of those who have deceived and misled the people of Japan into embarking on world conquest, for we insist that a new order of peace, security, and justice will be impossible until irresponsible militarism is driven from the world".

2. In order to carry out this provision of the Potsdam Declaration, the Imperial Japanese Government is hereby ordered to remove from public office and exclude from government service all persons who have been:

- a. Active exponents of militaristic nationalism and aggression.
- b. Influential members of any Japanese ultra-nationalistic, terroristic, or secret patriotic society, its agencies or affiliates; or
- c. Influential in the activities of the Imperial Rule Assistance Association, the Imperial Rule Assistance Political Society or the Political Association of Great Japan,

as those terms are defined in Appendix A to this directive.

3. The term "public office" as used in this directive shall mean and include:

- a. Any position in the government service which is customarily filled by one with the civil service rank of Chokunin or above (or equivalent rank under any reorganization of the civil service system); or
- b. Any other position in the government service not customarily filled by a member of the civil service which is equivalent or superior to the civil service rank of Chokunin (in the case of government corporations the term will include at least: Chairman of the Board of Directors, President, Vice-President, Director, Advisor and Auditor).

4. The term "government service", as used in this directive, shall mean and include all positions in the central Japanese and Prefectural Governments and all of their agencies and local branches, bureaus (including Regional Administrative Bureaus) and offices and all positions in corporations, associations and other organizations in which said Governments or any of their agencies have a financial interest representing actual or working control.

5. The term "remove from public office" as used in this directive shall mean to discharge the person from the public office which he holds and to terminate his influence and participation therein, directly and indirectly. Persons removed from public office will not be entitled to any public or private pensions or other emoluments or benefits without the consent of this Headquarters. An official removed under this procedure will be dismissed summarily and will not be entitled to the hearing or other procedures precedent to removal to which he may have been entitled under Japanese law.

6. The term "exclude from government service" as used in this directive shall mean to bar the person in question from any position in the government service. Thus, persons removed from public office will be disqualified from holding any other positions in the government service. Also persons who may not be holding public offices from which they must be removed, may nevertheless be disqualified from taking a position in the government service. This disqualification from holding public office shall be continued until the provisions of the Potsdam Declaration quoted in paragraph 1 have been fulfilled in Japan.

7. The mere removal of officials from public office and the exclusion from government service of those persons described herein will not be sufficient to establish the new order of peace, security and justice envisaged by the Potsdam Declaration. If Japan is to achieve a peacefully inclined and responsible government, the greatest care must be taken to appoint new officials who will foster the revival and strengthening of democratic tendencies among the Japanese people and who will respect fundamental human rights and freedom of speech, religion and thought. If existing civil service qualification regulations provide obstacles to the appointment of such officials or unduly narrow the field from which appointments may be made, such regulations shall be amended or superseded.

8. The removals ordered by this directive shall be effected as expeditiously as possible, priority being given to the more important positions. Removal may be postponed in the case of individuals who are absolutely required to insure mobilization of the Japanese armed forces in the outlying theaters or to carry out the provisions of this directive. When their assistance is no longer absolutely required they will be dismissed. The names of such individuals, their positions, the reason for their disqualification, and the reasons for their temporary retention will promptly be reported to this Headquarters. The time of their final dismissal will also promptly be reported.

9. Appendix "A" contains a list of the categories of persons who must be removed from public office and excluded from government service by the Imperial Japanese Government in order to carry out the provisions of paragraph 2 of this directive. Persons included in the categories listed in Appendix "A" shall be removed from public office as provided in paragraphs 8 and 10 and shall thereafter be excluded from government service. However, if the Imperial Japanese Government represents that in order to carry on indispensable peaceful executive activities of such government, the temporary reinstatement of an individual so removed is essential and that it is impossible to obtain a suitable replacement, an application so stating, signed by a responsible official of the Imperial Japanese Government, may be filed with this Headquarters. Such application shall contain a statement of the name, rank, position, duties, and responsibilities of the individual involved; shall state fully the reasons why such temporary reinstatement is regarded as essential, the requested period of temporary reinstatement and the efforts made to obtain a suitable replacement. Such application shall be accompanied by a copy of the questionnaire described in paragraph 10, below. No such temporary reinstatement will be effected by the Imperial Japanese Government until this Headquarters has registered its approval in writing.

10. In order to insure that the government service is cleansed of undesirable personnel the following action will be taken:

a. The Imperial Japanese Government will instruct each of its Ministries or other appropriate agencies to remove from the positions described in paragraph 3 which are within its competence, any persons whom the records show or who are known to have been within the categories listed in Appendix "A". A Questionnaire (see below) will be obtained from each such individual before he is notified of his dismissal.

b. In addition, the Imperial Japanese Government will instruct each of its Ministries or other appropriate agencies to prepare and distribute to all incumbents of positions described in paragraph 3 and to future applicants for government positions which are within its competence, the Questionnaire contained in Appendix "B". Such Questionnaires will be reviewed and on the basis of them and any other knowledge in possession of the Government, individuals will be removed from office or denied employment in accordance with the provisions of this directive.

11. Each Ministry or other appropriate agency will prepare a Plan for handling the Questionnaires which will provide for:

- a. Distribution.
- b. Collection.
- c. Review.

12. Each Plan will provide for screening of positions occupied by higher rank officials first. A duplicate set of completed Questionnaires will be provided at the Headquarters of each Ministry or other agency where it will be available for inspection or removal by this Headquarters.

13. In addition to the Questionnaires each Ministry or other agency will maintain at its headquarters an alphabetical file of Questionnaire Record Cards substantially in the form indicated in Appendix "C" available for inspection or removal by this Headquarters. The cards will be filled out in English (also in Japanese if desired). Identical numbers, with an identifying symbol for each Ministry or other agency, will be assigned to each Questionnaire and the Record Card relating thereto.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo

SUBJECT : Abolition of Certain Political Parties, Associations, Societies and Other Organizations.

1. You will prohibit the formation of any political party, association, society or other organization and any activity on the part of any of them or of any individual or group whose purpose, or the effect of whose activity, is the following:

- a. Resistance or opposition to the Occupation Forces or to orders issued by the Japanese Government in response to directives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, or;
- b. Support or justification of aggressive Japanese military action abroad, or;
- c. Arrogation by Japan of leadership of other Asiatic, Indonesian or Malayan peoples, or;
- d. Exclusion of foreign persons in Japan from trade, commerce or the exercise of their professions, or;
- e. Opposition to a free cultural or intellectual exchange between Japan and foreign countries, or;
- f. Affording military or quasi-military training, or providing benefits, greater than similar civilian benefits, or special representation for persons formerly members of the Army or Navy, or perpetuation of militarism or a martial spirit in Japan, or;
- g. Alteration of policy by assassination or other terroristic programs, or encouragement or justification of a tradition favoring such methods.

2. A list of organizations, some or all of whose purposes are prescribed under the provisions of paragraph 1 above, is given in Appendix A to this Memorandum. This list will not be regarded as inclusive. The organizations listed in that appendix and other organizations, whose purposes or activities are those above mentioned or similar to them, will be immediately dissolved, together with any organizations which they control or with which they are affiliated.

You will obtain complete records of all such property and will keep them available for inspection as public records. b. 4. You will enact appropriate laws or ordinances to carry out the terms of this Memorandum and to prevent further activities contrary to its terms.

5. Until further order of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, any organization shall be deemed, regardless of its declared purposes, to further purposes or activities contrary to the terms of this memorandum if:

a. Any of its principal officers were (i) members of organizations abolished in accord with this order, or (ii) former commissioned officers of the Imperial Japanese Regular Army or Navy or the Special Volunteer Reserve, who have been on active duty since 1 January 1930 or (iii) any person who has served in or with the military police (Kempeitai) or Naval Police, the TOKUMU KIKAW, KAIGUN TOKUMU BU, or other special or secret intelligence or military or naval police organizations.

b. Its membership includes more than twenty-five percent of persons who were formerly members of an organization or organizations abolished or prohibited in pursuance of this Memorandum.

6. You will forbid the formation or activity of any party, society, organization, association or group whose purpose or activity consists of:

- a. Proposing or supporting candidates for public office.
- b. Influencing the policy of Government, or
- c. The discussion of the relations between Japan and foreign powers,

unless it shall first have filed a declaration of (a) its name, (b) its purposes, (c) the address of its principal offices, (d) the names and addresses of its officers together with a statement as to their military or police service and the names of any associations, societies or parties of which they are or have been members, (e) the names and addresses of substantial financial supporters and the amounts of their respective contributions, (f) a roster of the names and addresses of its membership in the office of the mayor of the town or city in which it has or intends to have its principal office. Such declarations will be kept up to date as changes in purposes and membership occur. Declarations with regard to changes of membership and substantial contributions will be made as required by the Supreme Commander; reports of changes in officers or purposes will be made immediately. You will direct that the mayor of any town or city receiving such a declaration or any change forward two copies to an appropriate office of the Imperial Japanese Government in Tokyo. Both the original and one of the copies of such declarations will be kept available for public inspection at all times during ordinary business hours. No fees will be charged in connection with any of the foregoing and the procedure fixed for filing such declarations shall be such as to make compliance with these directions as simple and easy as possible.

The provisions of this paragraph which require the filing of a roster of the names and addresses of members will not apply to groups or other organizations of workers or employees who meet for the purpose of the discussion of questions relating to wages, hours and working conditions or the choice of persons to represent them in negotiation with their employers in connection with such questions.

7. The purpose of the provisions of paragraph 6 of this Memorandum is to secure public knowledge of the character of political organizations in Japan and to prevent the formation of secret, militaristic, ultra-nationalistic and anti-democratic societies and organizations. It shall not be interpreted nor shall it be applied in a manner which interferes with freedom of assembly, speech or religion except with respect to the purposes and activities specifically mentioned herein.

8. You will present your programme for the execution of the directions of this Memorandum, together with any laws, ordinances or orders to be issued in accord with it, for the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Any laws or ordinances which you will enact in compliance with this Memorandum will provide that upon such approval they will be effective from the date of this Memorandum, regardless of the date of their enactment.

You will direct that the mayor of any town or city receiving such a declaration or any change forward two copies to an appropriate office of the Imperial Japanese Government in Tokyo. Both the original and one of the copies of such declarations will be

kept available for public inspection at all times during ordinary business hours. No fees will be charged in connection with any of the foregoing and the procedure fixed for filing such declarations shall be such as to make compliance with these directions as simple and easy as possible.

The provisions of this paragraph which require the filing of a roster of the names and addresses of members will not apply to groups or other organizations of workers or employees who meet for the purpose of the discussion of questions relating to wages, hours and working conditions or the choice of persons to represent them in negotiation with their employers in connection with such questions.

7. The purpose of the provisions of paragraph 6 of this Memorandum is to secure public knowledge of the character of political organizations in Japan and to prevent the formation of secret, militaristic, ultra-nationalistic and anti-democratic societies and organizations. It shall not be interpreted nor shall it be applied in a manner which interferes with freedom of assembly, speech or religion except with respect to the purposes and activities specifically mentioned herein.

8. You will present your programme for the execution of the directions of this Memorandum, together with any laws, ordinances or orders to be issued in accord with it, for the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Any laws or ordinances which you will enact in compliance with this Memorandum will

provide that upon such approval they will be effective from the date of this Memorandum, regardless of the date of their enactment.

1. Reference is made to memorandum to this headquarters, C.L.O. No. 1371 (5.1), dated 26 December 1945, subject: "Repatriation to Ryukyus."

2. Ryukyuans, now in Japan, who desire to return to their homes in the Ryukyus Islands, except Okinawa, will be repatriated to their homes without delay.

3. Arrangements for the return of subject individuals follow:

a. Japanese vessels are being scheduled to shuttle between Kagoshima and the islands of Miyako, Ishigaki, Anami, and Tokuno.

b. The Port Director at Kagoshima has been authorized to route vessels on the Kagoshima - Kii-run shuttle via Miyako, Tokuno, Anami or Ishigaki outloading Ryukyuans at Kagoshima for those islands.

c. One United States Liberty ship with a capacity of 1500 repatriates is on the shuttle Uraga and Ryukyuan ports and is available to carry returning Ryukyuans.

d. SCAJAP will furnish the CMMC sailing schedules for Japanese vessels in the Ryukyuan service.

e. Eighth Army will furnish the representative of the Japanese Welfare Ministry at Eighth Army Headquarters with the schedules of the US Liberty ship shuttling between Uraga and the Ryukyus Islands.

4. It is planned to repatriate Ryukyuans as follows:

a. Repatriates from:

Anami, Kikai, and Tokara Retto to Anami;

Tokuno, Yoron, and Okinoerabu to Tokuno;

EASIG: Memo, IJG, file AG 370.05 (5 Jan 46)GC, dated 5 January 1946, subject: "Repatriation to Ryukyus."

Miyako Retto to Miyako;

Yaeyama Retto to Ishigaki.

b. Ryukyuans (less Okinawans) now located in Kyushu and those destined for Miyako and Ishigaki will sail from Kagoshima.

c. Ryukyuans destined for Anami and Tokuno, except those now located in Kyushu, will sail from Uraga.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Assemble Ryukyuans, grouped by destination, at Kagoshima and Uraga in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 above after due consideration is given to the shipping available.

b. Arrange with the CMMC all details necessary for loading at Kagoshima and transporting individual groups to destination.

c. Arrange with Commanding General, Eighth Army, through the representative of the Ministry of Public Welfare, on duty at Eighth Army Headquarters, all details incident to the return of Ryukyuans from Uraga in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 3 above.

The overcrowding of urban centers (cities of 100,000 or more population) in Japan will create serious health, economic and welfare problems if those Japanese who were evacuated to places of safety, prior to the termination of hostilities, are permitted to return. The lack of employment, adequate food distribution, housing, sanitary and public utility facilities in these urban areas will require immediate preventive and corrective action prior to the return of large numbers of evacuees. Japanese evacuees who are considered essential in re-establishing the minimum authorized civilian economy of Japan will be permitted to return to those localities where their services are required.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit a plan to this Headquarters as soon as practicable indicating measures to be taken to restrict or prohibit unnecessary population movements from rural to urban centers (cities of 100,000 or more population) prior to 31 May 1946.

1. The establishment by 11 January 1946 of telephone service between points within the United States and Tokyo by the Imperial Japanese Government is desired.
2. This service shall be available only to military personnel and civilian personnel accredited to this theater and stationed in Japan. Service shall be for the placing of personal telephone calls on a pre-paid basis only to any point within the United States. Until notified to the contrary by this office no incoming calls from the United States will be accepted. All calls will be approved in advance by Special Service Officers of Army, corps, divisions, wings, fighter command or other duly authorized officers designated by this Headquarters.
3. A letter from the Board of Communications to this Headquarters dated 28 November 1945 supplemented and amended by letter from Board of Communications to this Headquarters dated 5 January 1946 advises of proposed rates for telephone service, the division of tolls and methods of settling accounts. This Headquarters has no objection at this time to the rates, division of tolls and procedures proposed. They shall remain in effect for the present and will not be changed without prior approval of this Headquarters.
4. The authorized Japanese transmitting frequencies for the radio link between Tokyo and San Francisco are 7780KC, 15860KC, and 18910KC with a maximum power of 20 kilowatts.

1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government instruct the Ministry of Finance to cause the following payments to be made:

a. To all working employees of the offices of the subject institutions in Japan whose employment was continuous between 1 July and 30 September 1945, a payment will be made which is equal to $2\frac{1}{2}$ times basic monthly salary in the position held at 30 September 1945. If employee worked less than the entire period a proportionate payment for the time actually worked will be made.

b. To all such employees who performed work for the institutions subsequent to 30 September 1945 in connection with examination and liquidation, an additional amount will be paid equal to 75% of base per diem salary for each day worked.

2. From the total amount of payments authorized under paragraph 1 (a) and (b) above, the following deductions will be made:

a. The total amount of any bonus payments already made on account of bonus earned in the July-December period, including allowance for high commodity prices and similar allowances, either by the institution or by other persons or organizations on behalf of the institution.

b. The total amount of all unsecured debts to the institution.

3. Payments will be made with the maximum accuracy obtainable without access to the records of the subject institutions now under seal, and amounts paid will be subject to later adjustment upon the examination of the accounts of the institutions.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from Ministry of Finance, LO 106, dated 21 December 1945, subject: "Request for Approval of Printing Schedule of the New Notes of the Bank of Japan."

2. Approval is granted for offset printing of the ten, five, and one yen notes of the new design; and for the intaglio printing of the present one-hundred yen note with the color change and overprint as shown in the sample submitted to this Headquarters.

3. In order to prevent adverse public reaction it is necessary that absolute secrecy surround the decision to print a new type of currency as well as the actual preparations for such printing. In addition, adequate measures must be taken to safeguard the designs, plates, paper, ink and printed notes. The Imperial Japanese Government shall take all actions necessary to accomplish these objectives and shall render a report thereon to this Headquarters within two weeks from receipt of this memorandum.

4. It is deemed undesirable that Bank of Japan notes should continue to be printed in fourteen plants scattered throughout Japan, ten of them privately owned. The Imperial Japanese Government is therefore directed to lease or purchase forthwith all privately owned equipment to be utilized in the printing of the new bank notes to the end that the program shall be executed exclusively with government controlled equipment and under the sole supervision of carefully screened government employees. The Imperial Japanese Government will take steps to concentrate this printing equipment in a minimum number of establishments to the fullest extent possible within the production requirements of the program.

5. Reports on the progress of this program shall be submitted to this Headquarters as of the first and fifteenth of each month, each report being due within seven days after the date thereof. The first report shall be submitted as of 15 January 1946.

SUBJECT : Committee of Japanese Educators.

1. This Headquarters has requested that an Educational Mission, consisting of approximately twenty (20) distinguished American educators, be sent to Japan, to arrive in the month of February.

2. The Educational Mission will study the Japanese educational system for approximately thirty (30) days and will advise the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Japanese Ministry of Education on technical matters.

3. The Educational Mission will make studies of the following problems and submit reports and recommendations to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers upon completion of the mission:

a. Education for Democracy in Japan: A study leading to recommendations as to the content of courses, curricula, textbooks, teachers' manuals, and visual and auditory aids.

b. Psychology in the Re-Education of Japan: A study leading to recommendations as to the educational methodology, language revision, timing and priority of educational reforms, the development of student initiative and critical analysis, and reorientation of teachers.

c. Administrative Reorganization of the Educational System of Japan: A study leading to recommendations as to the immediate and long range administrative reforms, the reorganization of the Ministry of Education, and the problems of decentralization.

d. Higher Education in the Rehabilitation of Japan: A study leading to recommendations in regard to the use of libraries, archives, scientific laboratories, museums in higher education, to student and faculty freedom, to reorientation of the social sciences, and to more active participation in the life of the community and of Japan.

4. The Educational Mission will be requested also to recommend technical experts in subject-matter fields to assist the Japanese Ministry of Education and autonomous educational institutions.

5. In order to facilitate the work of the Educational Mission and in order that the Japanese educational system may derive the maximum benefit from its studies and findings, it is suggested:

- a. That the Ministry of Education appoint a committee of highly qualified Japanese educators to work with the Educational Commission;
- b. That the committee consist of not less than eighteen (18) nor more than twenty five (25) members;
- c. That the members of the committee be selected with particular reference to their qualifications to assist the Educational Commission in the study of problems set forth in paragraph 3 above;
- d. That the membership of the committee be representative of (1) various fields of teaching and educational administration (2) various levels and types of educational institutions.
- e. That the names of educators proposed for membership in the committee, together with proposed assignments for study of the problems set forth in paragraph 3 above, be submitted to the Education Division, Civil Information and Education Staff Section, not later than 20 January 1946.
- f. That the names so proposed be accompanied by all available information as to age, educational background, past and present positions, publications (if any), membership in professional organizations, honorary degrees or other honors received, and any other pertinent facts which will be of interest and value to the Educational Commission.
- g. That the committee be appointed and assembled in sufficient time to permit its briefing by this Headquarters and by the Ministry of Education as to the purposes of the Educational Mission and the type of cooperation desired from the committee.
- h. That the committee, with such later editions from business and professional fields as may be found desirable, be a continuing committee to advise the Ministry of Education on the reform of Japanese education.
- i. That the committee, after the departure of the Educational Mission, continue to study the problems set forth in paragraph 3 above, and submit periodic reports on its findings and recommendations to the Ministry of Education and to the Education Division, Civil Information and Education Staff Section.

For purposes of this memorandum only, geodetic survey monuments shall be construed as pertaining to all benchmarks established by precise spirit levelling and all triangulation stations of third or higher order accuracy.

1. The establishment by January 10 of Sender Composition Message Service and Press Service between Great Britain and Tokyo Area by the Imperial Japanese Government is desired and in order to establish this service it is desired that the OSAKA-LONDON wireless circuit be opened.

2. This service will be available only to military and accredited civilian personnel stationed in Japan. Services shall be for the transmission and receipt of personal messages and Press messages only, to and from Great Britain.

3. Memorandum from this headquarters to the Imperial Japanese Government dated 21 November 1945, subject: "Regulations Governing Communication on International, Foreign and External Telegraph, telephone and Wireless Facilities" and any subsequent memoranda governing censorship will apply to this service except that Sender Composition messages will be in clear English text and contain no code.

4. There is no objection to the rates which you propose for the transmission of prepaid Sender Composition and press messages, from Tokyo to Great Britain. These rates will be as follows:

It is understood that these rates may require amendment at a later date, in which event the approval of this office of change will be obtained in advance.

5. Personal messages will be accepted at the Central Telegraph Office in Tokyo and charges will be prepaid. Press messages will be filed at the Public Relations Office, Radio Tokyo or the Central Telegraph Office and may be sent collect.

6. It is further desired that arrangements be made for the establishment of a charge account, in the name of whatever representative may be designated by the British Embassy. The name of this representative will be furnished later by this headquarters, also the names of three representatives authorized to sign for or approve the sending of the messages.

7. Statements of accounts will be expressed in yen and will be rendered monthly. Exchanges of statements may be made through this headquarters.

8. The sender of a message will be required to state on the message the following information: If military personnel, his name, rank, serial number, unit or organization, and Post address; if a civilian, his name and address in Japan and unit to which attached.

9. Copies of all messages sent or received will be kept on file for a minimum period of one year.

10. All messages received from London will be forwarded to the British Embassy, Tokyo for distribution unless directed otherwise by this headquarters.

11. There is not objection for the present to the divisions and procedures outlined in your letter to this headquarters dated 8 January 1946. They will not be modified without approval from this headquarters.
