MEMORANDUM TO: Minister of Finance, Hypothec Bank Building, Tokyo.  
SUBJECT : Borrowing by Government Agencies.

1. Reference is made to memorandum of the Minister of Finance dated 21 December 1945 (LO 110), subject: "Borrowing by Certain Government Agencies and Instrumentalities", requesting approval for four government-controlled agencies to borrow sums aggregating ¥260,000,000 from the Deposit Funds Section.
2. The request for the Shipping Management Association to borrow ¥120,000,000 for payment of its expenses in the operation of merchant shipping is disapproved. This loan is in reality a government subsidy and as such should be paid directly from government appropriations. A direct government grant from the General Account to the Shipping Management Association is authorized for this purpose, in the amount of ¥120,000,000 for December, 1945, and such amounts as may be found necessary for the period January through March 1946.
3. The request for the Overseas Nationals Relief Association to borrow ¥60,000,000 for relief payments to families in Japan of nationals overseas is disapproved. This proposal is not consistent with the memorandum of this Headquarters, dated 8 December 1945, subject: "Relief and Welfare Plans", (AG 044 (8 Dec 45)GD), which required preparation of one comprehensive plan for relief of all needy persons in Japan during the period January-June 1946. Relief payments or assistance to needy dependents of Japanese nationals overseas will be furnished by the Minister of Public Welfare from general government funds on the same basis as for all other needy persons in Japan.
4. The request for the Housing Bureau to borrow ¥43,000,000 for continuing its program of emergency housing is approved.
5. The request for the Central Insurance Corporation to borrow ¥37,000,000 for payment of interest on past borrowings is disapproved. This is another example of a loan which is in reality a government subsidy. A direct government grant from the General Account to the Central Insurance Corporation is authorized for this purpose to the extent that

1. Reference is made to communication from the Ministry of Finance, dated 12 December 1945, transmitting a list of applications for approval of transactions in precious metals completed subsequent to date of issuance of Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 130 (22 Sep 45) ESS, subject: "Control of Financial Transactions".

2. The Ministry of Finance is directed to deny approval to the transaction between Tanaka Precious Metal Industry Co. and the Kanegafuchi Communication Industry Co., involving 2,420,575.8 grams of silver valued at 120,302.61 yen, completed 14 October 1945.

3. It is further directed that the appropriate agency of the Japanese Government acquire this silver from the Kanegafuchi Communication Industry Co., and that it be placed in the proper depository in the Bank of Japan.

4. There is no objection to the approval by the Ministry of Finance of the other transactions on the list referred to in paragraph 1 of this memorandum.

The Swiss Legation presents its compliments to the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in Japan and, referring to Memorandum No. AG 091.1 (24 Dec 45) GH of December 24th and the enclosed memorandum No. C.L.O. No. 1257(5.2) of December 21st from the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs, begs to inform the General Headquarters that the Swiss Government regrets not to be in a position to intervene on the question of the repatriation of the Japanese residents in Canada.

As the Legation had informed the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs by notes of December 29th, January 7th and January 8th transmitted through the courtesy of the General Headquarters, the Swiss Government has decided not to continue the protection of Japanese interests abroad.

The Federal Political Department in Bern has pointed out in this respect that the transfer of these interests to the Allied Representative has already begun.

The Legation would be grateful if the General Headquarters would transmit the above information to the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Subject to the provisions of Paragraphs 3b and 3c of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 386 (14 Nov 45) ESS/FI, subject: "Transactions in Property in Japan Owned or Controlled by Persons Outside of Japan," the Ministry of Finance, without the prior approval of this Headquarters, is authorized to approve individual applications for transactions in the property of branches or agencies in Japan of concerns with head offices outside of Japan, for the purpose of resuming the normal operations of such branches or agencies, provided that:

a. Favorable consideration is given only to applications of branches or agencies which manufacture or distribute essential consumer goods, or commodities required for the production of such essential consumer goods or are engaged in services necessary to such production.

b. Transactions are limited to:

(1) The payment of wages, taxes and other expenses ordinarily incurred in the normal conduct of business activities within Japan.

(2) The payment of any expenses necessary for maintaining and preserving the property of such branch or agency.

c. Applications for permission to resume operations by specific branches or agencies are accompanied by the information specified in Paragraph 3 of Memorandum file AG 386 (14 Nov 45) ESS/FI, unless previously submitted. One copy in English of applications approved by the Ministry of Finance, will be forwarded to this Headquarters.

a. Above described pearls intended for sale in the US Army Exchange Central Purchasing Office in fulfillment of written contracts in effect prior to the issuance of this directive.

b. Above described pearl stocks now in the hands of retail establishment provided such stocks do not exceed the quantity of pearls disposed of by the individual retail establishment during the three months preceding the issuance of this directive.

2. Future contracts or transactions will be specifically authorized in writing by this Headquarters only upon approval of prior written requests submitted through the Central Liaison Office. Said written request to indicate:

- a. Owner of pearls.
- b. Source of pearls.
- c. Location of pearls.
- d. Description of pearls.
- e. Intended purchaser of pearls.
- f. Terms of transaction.

3. An inventory of all Japanese owned pearls, including pearls owned by the Imperial Japanese Government or its agencies, as described in paragraph 1 will be made out in triplicate, and will be taken under your direction not later than 20 January 1946. The inventory will not include:

a. Present inventories of individual retail establishments, provided such inventories do not exceed the quantity of pearls disposed of by such retail establishments during the three month period preceding the issuance of this directive.

b. Pearls held and owned by private individuals or firms for their normal or personal use.

The Royal Swedish Legation presents its compliments to the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and has the honour to request that the following message be forwarded to the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs:

"The Royal Swedish Legation in Ankara has in a telegram, dated January 8, informed the Swedish Ministry of Foreign Affairs as follows:

"The British Embassy in Ankara has advised the Legation that the ship "Plus Ultra", which is repatriating Japanese diplomats, will arrive at Port Said about the 18th inst. Accomodations on board are available for Ambassador Kurihara and his staff. The British Embassy has suggested, that the Legation, if possible, make use of this opportunity. The plan has been duly approved of by the competent Turkish authorities."

1. The increasing prevalence of smallpox among Japanese civilians requires more concerted control action than is now being taken by responsible Japanese public health officials.
2. It is desired that the Japanese government immediately institute smallpox control measures as follows:
  - a. Vaccination of all Japanese civilians employed by occupational forces in any capacity, including all civilian personnel in hotels, rest centers and any other place operated for Allied Military Forces.
  - b. Vaccination of civilians as required for the immediate and effective control in all areas where smallpox has been reported or may be reported in the future.
  - c. Re-instatement of the pre-war compulsory vaccination program throughout Japan.
  - d. Immediate development of facilities required for the production of an adequate supply of smallpox vaccine to carry out and continue the foregoing as required for the eradication of smallpox in Japan.

This action is not intended to affect the over-all authorized strength of the Japanese Civil Police Force, which was established at a total of 93,935 as a result of the action directed by memorandum, this Headquarters, 11 October 1945, to the Imperial Japanese Government, subject: "Japanese Government Proposal to Increase Domestic Police Force."

1. Reference is made to the memorandum from the Ministry of Finance dated 8 December 1945 (L.O. 57) and attached memorandum from the Ministry of Home Affairs, with reference to the finances of Prefectures, Cities, Towns and Villages.

2. In the memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government on the subject of Elimination of War Profits and Reorganization of National Finances, AG 121.7 (24 Nov 45) ESS/FI, the words "\*\*\*\*Imperial Japanese Government, its subdivisions,\*\*\*\*" include local governments, that is, the governments of prefectures, cities, towns, and villages. This definition applies to the use of the quoted words in paragraph 8 and wherever else they occur in the above mentioned memorandum.

3. This Headquarters disapproves the issuance of bonds in the total amount of ¥1,500,000,000 as requested. The issuance of bonds by local governments in the amounts and for the purposes shown below is approved:

The approval herewith applies to the borrowings necessary on the part of local governments to cover payments which have already been made by them or with respect to which they are legally committed. Such borrowing as may be necessary to cover local government requirements to the end of the fiscal year will be considered for approval upon submission of revised estimates and satisfactory evidence that all possible retrenchment has been made and all practicable economies have been effected.

BASIC: Memo, GHQ SCAP, file AG 123 (16 Jan 46 ) ESS/FI, dtd 16 Jan 46  
subject: "Local Finances," to Imperial Japanese Government.

4. Approval is granted for the flotation of loans to be paid from taxation or other revenues to be received in the same fiscal year or which are to be paid from the proceeds of bonds or other securities, the issuance of which has been permitted by this Headquarters.

5. The normal lending operations of public pawnshops may be continued.

6. Municipal or prefectural lending under the Officials' Mutual Relief System may be continued.

7. Approval is granted to direct lending by local governments, where the purpose is to promote or improve the security or standard of living or economic development within the community concerned.

8. Investments of local government funds or other assets in income bearing securities or profit making enterprises are approved, provided they are made in accordance with existing law.

9. Subsidies, tax exemptions, tax allotments, rebates or any similar benefits may be granted by local governments under existing or future laws provided they are consistent in all respects with the national government program.

10. Local government properties may be sold provided only that if the sale or transfer is to anyone except another governmental entity, the fair market value at the time of sale must be received.

11. This memorandum constitutes the authorization of this Headquarters required by paragraph 8 of the memorandum of 24 November 1945 referred to above. It should be clearly understood, however, that any payments, borrowing, lending, investment, or other measures taken pursuant to this authorization must be in conformity with paragraphs 4, 5, and 7 of the memorandum of 24 November 1945, as well as the applicable provisions of any other memorandums now or hereafter issued by this Headquarters. No financial measures shall be taken by local governments which are denied to the National Government.

12. Direct communication between the Ministry of Finance and interested Staff Sections of this Headquarters is hereby authorized to implement this memorandum.

1. Information received at this Headquarters indicates that the Japanese Government has refrained from arming the Civil Police due to a misunderstanding of the disarmament directives. Directives issued by this Headquarters have not prohibited the arming of Japanese Civil Police with pistols where necessary nor has such prohibition been the intention of this Headquarters at any time.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is hereby advised that the Japanese Civil Police are authorized to carry pistols in the performance of their duties, as deemed necessary by the Imperial Japanese Government, subject to the provision that the total number of pistols available to the Japanese Civil Police shall not exceed the strength of the Japanese Civil Police Force authorized by this Headquarters.

3. It is directed that all firearms, other than pistols authorized in accordance with the foregoing, currently in the hands of the Japanese Civil Police Force be delivered to United States Army Occupation Forces on or before 1 March 1946 in accordance with established disarmament procedures.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government is authorized to maintain a supply of 100 rounds of ammunition for each pistol authorized the Japanese Civil Police. Ammunition in excess of this amount will be turned over to United States Army Occupation Forces. Requests for resupply of ammunition may be submitted by police chiefs through local Occupation Force Commanders, as necessary.

(1) provides that existing textbooks, teaching manuals, and instructional materials may be used temporarily on an emergency basis only, except for courses in Morals (Shushin), Japanese History, and Geography, as per Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 000.8 (31 Dec 45) CIE.

3. With reference to 1.b. above: The Ministry of Education shall submit all textbooks, teaching manuals, and instructional materials which are approved, sanctioned, or published by the Ministry to this Headquarters for review and approval before printing.

4. Furthermore, the Ministry of Education shall submit translations in English of all these textbooks, teaching manuals, and instructional materials presented for review and approval by this Headquarters.

SUBJECT : Coal Production.

1. Reference is made to the reports submitted as directed by the memorandum from this Headquarters to the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 463.3 (11 Dec 45)GD, dated 11 December 1945, subject: "Report on Coal Production". It is noted that there were produced in December 838,900 metric tons of coal. The efforts which obtained this result are commendable.

2. Because December production so exceeded your estimate of 665,000 metric tons, it is desired that the announced estimates of future production, namely:

January	990,000 metric tons
February	1,065,000 metric tons
March	1,250,000 metric tons

be reviewed and that this Headquarters be advised of the revised estimates by 1200 hours, 22 January 1946.

3. This review will take into consideration the degree of achievement obtainable by a concerted and vigorous effort to execute the measures the Imperial Japanese Government announced have been adopted to alleviate the conditions which are adversely affecting the production of coal. Inspections of the coal mining districts of Kyushu and Hokkaido by representatives of this Headquarters have revealed that these measures are not being universally and energetically applied. In view of the known mine capacity, it is expected that this review will also reflect a determination to reach, at an early date, the maximum production of coal consistent with the existing conditions of mines and equipment.

4. A report will be submitted to this Headquarters by 1200 hours, 26 January 1946, giving, by mining districts, the status of fulfillment of each of the following features of the program and the dates on which each will be fully effective at the mines:

- a. Increased food rations for miners and their families.
- b. Increased pay for miners.
- c. Increased clothing distribution to miners.

- Reference is made to CIO Memorandum No. 1188 (2.1) of 18 December 1945, subject: "Control of Financial Transactions," requesting permission to use gold, silver and platinum for industrial, dental and other uses.
- (a) The Imperial Japanese Government may authorize the use of precious metals for dental purposes only in the following amounts per month for a three month period starting 1 January 1946:

Gold - 170 Kilograms per month  
 Silver - 600 Kilograms per month  
 Platinum - 10 Kilograms per month

(b) The Imperial Japanese Government may also authorize the use by dental schools of one kilogram of gold and two kilograms of silver per month for three months, beginning 1 January 1946.

3. The Ministry of Finance may give approval to such transactions in, and transfers of, gold, silver and platinum as are necessary so that dentists and dental schools may acquire the precious metals, the use of which is authorized above. All sources, other than the stocks now impounded in the Bank of Japan, will be drawn upon, before authorizing the use of those stocks.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to this Headquarters on or before the 10th of each month, a report showing, a complete list of distributors, the amount of precious metals distributed and the source from which the metal was obtained.

5. The system of distribution of precious metals for dental purposes will remain as heretofore under the Bureau of Public Welfare of the Imperial Japanese Government. Records of the allotment and use of these metals will be available for checking at the convenience of this Headquarters.

- Repatriation to Formosa is authorized. However the return to Japan of repatriated individuals is not favorably considered until such time as commercial facilities are available.

It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government constitute a Committee of Conservators for certain institutions closed pursuant to Memorandum AG 091.3 (30 Sep 45) ESS, this Headquarters, dated 30 Sep 45, subject "Closing of Colonial and Foreign Banks and Special Wartime Institutions," and appoint as members of the committee persons acceptable to this Headquarters.
2. The Committee of Conservators shall have all the powers and authority of the officers and directors of such institutions. However, in the exercise of such powers and authority the Conservators shall perform only those acts which this Headquarters shall from time to time direct.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government is further directed to make available to the Committee and to its accredited representatives upon request all books, records, documents, reports and other material relating to the closed institutions and their subsidiaries and affiliates and in the possession of the Imperial Japanese Government, its agents and instrumentalities and other persons and organizations in Japan.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government is further directed to make available to the Committee such personnel as the Committee may designate.
5. The Bank of Chosen, the Bank of Taiwan, Deutsche Bank für Ostasien, Banque Franco-Japonaise, Chosen Colonization Bank, Banque de l'Indo-Chine and the National Financial Control Association are excepted from the provisions of this Memorandum.
6. If the Imperial Japanese Government deems it necessary to promulgate an ordinance to carry out the provisions of this Memorandum, such ordinance will be submitted to this Headquarters for approval prior to promulgation.
7. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to report on action taken to implement the provisions of this Memorandum.

The following restrictions are applied to all persons departing from Japan, excepting: (1) military and naval personnel of the Allied Powers; (2) personnel accredited to the military and naval forces of the Allied Powers; (3) nationals of Korea, Formosa, China and the Ryukyu Islands; (4) nationals of Germany, Hungary, Bulgaria and Rumania.

a. Individuals will be permitted to take with them currencies of a value not exceeding \$250 or the equivalent. You will take into custody and give receipts for currencies in excess of such amount.

b. Individuals will be permitted to take personal bank books (whether issued by Japanese or non-Japanese institutions) personal insurance policies, non-negotiable savings certificates, receipts, evidences of ownership of property in Japan or any other non-negotiable financial document carried by the owner.

c. You will take into custody and give receipts for any other items enumerated in Memorandum AG 091.3 (22 Sep 45) ESS.

d. You will require each individual, prior to departure, to sign a declaration, copy of which is attached hereto as Annex "A."

e. Persons entitled to diplomatic immunity will not be required to submit to search of personal effects or to sign the attached declaration.

3. You will provide immediately at the port of Yokohama customs officials qualified to administer the above-mentioned financial controls. You will make similar provisions at such other ports of departure as may be hereafter designated by this Headquarters.

b. SUZUKI, Shigeo, Lt., Col., Cavalry Staff Officer of the 18th Army on New Guinea, and one time Staff Officer of the 41st Division, who embarked for Japan at Wewak aboard Kashima Maru, 7 January 1946.

2. The Japanese Government will apprehend these individuals upon their arrival in Japan. In case apprehension is for any reason impossible, a detailed report will be made to this Headquarters, stating whereabouts of individuals not arrested, and reason for non-arrest.
