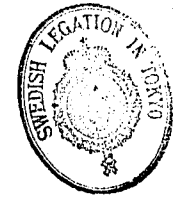

1. Reference is made to C.L.O. Memorandum No. 1112 (5.3) dated 14 December 1945, inclosing two applications of Martin Netke requesting release of funds in blocked bank account.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to release from the terms of the Ordinance of the Ministry of Finance on the Preservation of the Property of the Specified Powers, dated 20 September 1945, the sum of ¥20,000 in blocked bank account in Teikoku Bank, Tokyo Ginza Branch, for repairing his house and furniture.
3. This memorandum shall not be construed to release the account from the blocking provisions of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, this Headquarters, file AG 121.7 (24 Nov 45) ESS/FI, dated 24 November 1945, subject: "Elimination of War Profits and Reorganization of National Finances," or from the blocking provisions of any other memorandum issued by this Headquarters.

SUBJECT : Okinawans in Reception Center at Kagoshima.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from this headquarters, file AG 370.05 (2 Jan 46)GC, dated 2 January 1946, subject: "Repatriation of Okinawans."
2. This headquarters has been informed that the reception center facilities at Kagoshima are being used as permanent housing for repatriates destined for Okinawa.
3. The repatriation of Okinawans has not been authorized. It is impossible at this time to estimate the date when Okinawa, as a self sustaining community, can support any increase in population.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government will:
 - a. Take immediate steps to clear the reception center at Kagoshima of all repatriates for Okinawa.
 - b. Care for these people elsewhere under the provisions of reference paragraph 1 above.

SUBJECT : Weekly Report on Coal Shipment to Korea.

1. Reference is made to your letter dated 18 January 1946, file C. L. O. Number 283 (3.2), subject as above. It is noted on this accompanying report that the shipments of coal to Korea for December total 49,056 tons and to date for January only 6,564 tons.

2. The unloading difficulties which hampered the discharge of coal at Pusan during the months of October and November have been eliminated and, since early December, that port has been in a position to handle 70/75,000 tons per month. You will take immediate steps to insure full compliance with Memorandum from Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Imperial Japanese Government dated 25 September 1945, file AG 463.3 (25 Sep 45)GD, subject: "Provision of Coal at Pusan, Korea, for use of Commanding General, United States Forces in Korea."

The Japanese government will direct all owners and producers of motion pictures and lantern slides (full feature length, educational, cartoon or newsreel), 16mm or 35mm, silent or sound, to submit to the Civil Censorship Officer, SCAP, a complete list of all uncensored film not later than 28 February 1946.

2. The Japanese government will prohibit producers, distributors and exhibitors from showing any motion picture or lantern slide (full feature length, educational, cartoon or newsreel), 16mm or 35mm, silent or sound, not bearing Civil Censorship identification number, in the islands of Japan for public or private audiences in places of public entertainment.

SUBJECT : Manufacture of Medical Supplies and Equipment.

1. Reports reaching this headquarters concerning shortages of medical supplies and equipment indicate an urgent need for increasing production of essential items required for the care and treatment of the sick.

2. The production of an adequate supply of vaccines and sera is particularly important. C. L. O., No. 446 (1), 2 November 1945 reports the quantities that may be produced with available facilities and materials. Recent reports indicate that production of some important items is far below existing capacity.

3. You are directed to submit to this headquarters, not later than 20 February 1946, a plan covering the manufacture of medical supplies and equipment, with particular reference to the production of vaccines and sera. The plan will indicate proposed action for implementation. Consideration will be given the following:

a. Full utilization of raw materials, manufacturing equipment and supplies pertaining to the Japanese Army and Navy, which have been returned to the Home Ministry for civilian use.

b. Manufacture of essential supplies and equipment, as distinguished from items of doubtful value in the care and treatment of the sick.

SUBJECT : Violations of SCAP Directive Number 3, 22 September 1945.

1. Reference is made to Par 7, SCAP Directive Number 3, dated 22 September 1945:

"Imports and Exports. No imports to, or exports from, Japan of any goods, wares or merchandise will be permitted, except with the prior approval of this Headquarters."

2. It has come to the attention of this Headquarters, through official channels, that violations of this order have been and are being committed. The violations have consisted principally of illicit importing (smuggling) of foodstuffs (principally rice) from Korea into Japan, especially to Kyushu and Western Honshu.

3. It is directed that all necessary steps be taken immediately by the Imperial Japanese Government to stop this illicit import trade.

4. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government seize and hold all smuggled goods, wares and merchandise.

5. It is further directed that all instances of this violation be reported to this Headquarters within forty eight hours. The report submitted will contain the following information:

- a. Location and date of incident.
- b. Agency making the arrest.
- c. National identity of smuggler apprehended and registry of ship or vessel.
- d. Quantities and types of goods, wares or merchandise impounded.
- e. Nature of charges made against the apprehended criminals, the scheduled date and location of trials.
- f. Any additional information which would be considered pertinent will be included.

SUBJECT : Production of Radio Receivers.

1. The plan for production and distribution of radio receivers submitted by the Japanese Imperial Government in response to Memorandum from this Headquarters, AG 676.3 (13 Nov 45)CCS, dated 13 November 1945, has been reviewed.

2. The prices shall be established in a manner that will permit appropriate quality and maximum availability consistent with SCAP Directive No. 3.

3. The proposal that set manufacturers be permitted to arrange for the distribution of their products is approved provided this arrangement will not interfere with equitable nation-wide distribution and provided a public agency is made available through which the smaller manufacturers can combine or coordinate their distribution facilities so as to assure fair success to the consumer market.

4. The proposal that the radio sets produced over the amount required to equip an average of 50% of Japanese homes be reserved for export, is not approved at this time.

5. The overall quantity of 3,144,670 home receivers planned for production in 1946 is approved. However, since the productive effort and materials required for the manufacture of all-wave sets and radio phonographs is greater than that required for producing medium-wave receivers, this production shall be limited to a maximum of 200,000 and 80,000 respectively until such time as the attainment of the overall 3,144,670 set production is satisfactorily assured. During any monthly production period, the manufacture of all-wave sets and radio phonographs will not exceed ten percent of the total receiver set production.

6. The plan submitted does not fully comply with the Headquarters Memorandum mentioned in Paragraph 1 above, in that it does not indicate the specific plans of the Japanese Government to allocate materials nec-

1. Reference is made to letter C.L.O. No. 167 (3.2) dated 12 January 1946, concerning the request of the Japanese Hydrographic Department for assistance in obtaining chemical materials reported to be needed to permit compliance with the Allied Powers directive contained in Memorandum AG 486.8 (14 Dec 45) on the above subject.
2. Inasmuch as a subsequent directive has been issued (Memorandum AG 486.8(14 Jan 46)CE) which specified that smooth sheets (compilation drawings) for areas outside the Japanese main islands be turned over to the Allied Powers, the Hydrographic Department will be required to reproduce smooth sheets for the main islands only. It is therefore desired that the photographic work continue at an accelerated rate for the main islands and that a revised estimate of the date of completion of this work be submitted together with a revised statement of the chemical materials, if any, required to complete the work.

1. Changes in repatriation plans are under consideration by this headquarters. Advance information herewith is furnished for planning purposes. It is emphasized that no changes will be made in procedures now in effect without specific instruction from this headquarters.

2. The following information deals with repatriation from China (including Formosa):

a. The allocation of Japanese repatriation shipping spaces (approximately 18000) now assigned to the China - Japan shuttle remains unchanged.

b. US manned LSTs now assigned to the China - Japan shuttle will be progressively withdrawn during the period 1 February to 1 April 1946. Thereafter it is expected that these vessels will cease operations in repatriation.

c. 85 LSTs and 100 Liberty Ships manned by Japanese crews will be assigned to the China - Japan shuttle during the period 29 January 1946 to 30 March 1946 as follows:

e. The daily lift from all Chinese repatriation ports is expected to reach approximately 28,100 on 30 March 1946 and to be maintained at that rate thereafter.

f. It is contemplated that the Japanese Government will furnish the vaccines necessary for medical processing at all repatriation ports in China and Japan. The following minimum immunization requirements are expected to be met:

- (1) All repatriates to be vaccinated for small-pox.
- (2) Typhus vaccines to be administered to all repatriates travelling to or from the Asiatic mainland.
- (3) Cholera vaccine to be administered to all repatriates during spring and summer.

g. Requisitions by SCAP on the Japanese Government for vaccines to be used at Chinese repatriation ports will be based on the expected lift from those ports. Requirements will increase daily as the lift increases until the level shown in paragraph 2e above is reached. Where it is not practicable for the Japanese Government to furnish vaccines in the required amounts arrangements will be made with this headquarters for procurement of deficiencies.

h. Japanese manned vessels on the Formosa - Japan shuttle will be provisioned for the return trip from Japanese supplies now in Formosa.

i. Japanese repatriates from Formosa will be outfitted with clothing from Japanese Army stocks now in Formosa.

3. The following information deals with repatriation from areas other than China:

a. With the exception of a very few individuals there will be no further repatriation of Japanese from the Philippine Islands until 1 July 1946.

4. It is contemplated that the Japanese Government will be responsible for the performance of the following additional provisions:

a. Operating, manning, victualling and supplying (except as noted in paragraph 2h above) all Japanese manned shipping in repatriation service.

b. Furnishing Japanese medical personnel for permanent duty on all Japanese shipping, with the exception of Japanese manned Liberty Ships and LST's servicing Chinese areas, as follows:

- (1) On ships making voyages of less than four days duration, two medical orderlies.
- (2) On ships making voyages of four days or longer duration, a doctor and two medical orderlies.

c. Informing captains of repatriation ships leaving Japanese ports whether or not the minimum medical requirements prescribed in current directives from this headquarters have been met.

d. Thoroughly cleaning and disinfecting all repatriation ships at Japanese ports.

e. Disinfecting all passengers, repatriates and their baggage at Japanese reception centers, DDT will be used when available.

SUBJECT : Governmental and Administrative Separation of
Certain Outlying Areas from Japan.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to cease exercising, or attempting to exercise, governmental or administrative authority over any area outside of Japan, or over any government officials and employees or any other persons within such areas.
2. Except as authorized by this Headquarters, the Imperial Japanese Government will not communicate with government officials and employees or with any other persons outside of Japan for any purpose other than the routine operation of authorized shipping, communications and weather services.
3. For the purpose of this directive, Japan is defined to include the four main islands of Japan (Hokkaido, Honshu, Kyushu and Shikoku) and the approximately 1,000 smaller adjacent islands, including the Tsushima Islands and the Ryukyu (Nansei) Islands north of 30° North Latitude (excluding Kuchinoshima Island); and excluding (a) Utsuryo (Ullung) Island, Iancourt Rocks (Take Island) and Quelpart (Saishu or Cheju) Island, (b) the Ryukyu (Nansei) Islands south of 30° North Latitude (including Kuchinoshima Island), the Izu, Nanpo, Bonin (Ogasawara) and Volcano (Kazan or Iwo) Island Groups, and all other outlying Pacific Islands / including the Daito (Chigashi or Ogari) Island Group, and Parece Vela (Okino-tori), Marcus (Minami-tori) and Ganges (Nakano-tori) Islands /, and (c) the Kurile (Chishima) Islands, the Habomai (Hapomaze) Island Group (including Suisho, Yuri, Akiyuri, Shibotsu and Taraku Islands) and Shikotan Island.
4. Further areas specifically excluded from the governmental and administrative jurisdiction of the Imperial Japanese Government are the following: (a) all Pacific Islands seized or occupied under mandate or otherwise by Japan since the beginning of the World War in 1914, (b) Manchuria, Formosa and the Pescadores, (c) Korea, and (d) Karafuto.

5. The definition of Japan contained in this directive shall also apply to all future directives, memoranda and orders from this Headquarters unless otherwise specified therein.
6. Nothing in this directive shall be construed as an indication of Allied policy relating to the ultimate determination of the minor islands referred to in Article 8 of the Potsdam Declaration.
7. The Imperial Japanese Government will prepare and submit to this Headquarters a report of all governmental agencies in Japan the functions of which pertain to areas outside of Japan as defined in this directive. Such report will include a statement of the functions, organization and personnel of each of the agencies concerned.
8. All records of the agencies referred to in paragraph 7 above will be preserved and kept available for inspection by this Headquarters.

a. AT Uraga:

- (1) Hikawa Maru, capacity 2300.
- (2) Daikyu Maru, capacity 3000.
- (3) Other shipping, capacity 1700; names of vessels will be furnished CMMC by SCAJAP.

b. At Kure, Daian Maru, capacity 4000.

4. All other Formosans desiring repatriation from Japan will be evacuated through Kagoshima by Japanese shipping assigned for this purpose.

5. Detailed information concerning schedules of all shipping will be furnished CMMC by SCAJAP.

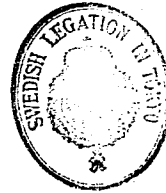

"A report arrived to the SCAP that you have manifested before the local US Army authorities that you are not responsible for matters concerning repatriation and that neither rice nor fuel are available. Although it is believed that such a statement has not been made, you are directed to reply, to meet with the request for investigation made by SCAP."

2. There is no record of report cited in quoted telegram. No request has been made by this headquarters for investigation of this matter.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will bring the contents of this memorandum to the attention of the Minister of Welfare.

1. Reference is made to C.L.O. Memoranda Nos. 1232 (5.3) dated 20 December 1945, 1423 (5.3) dated 28 December 1945 and 227 (5.3) dated 16 January 1946 inclosing applications from the following German firms for withdrawals of funds for payment of salaries and other office expenses:

2. The Ministry of Finance may release from the terms of the Ordinance of the Ministry of Finance on the preservation of the property of the Specified Powers, 20 September 1945, such funds of the above-mentioned firms as are required to pay expenses in the categories hereinafter specified which were incurred by the firms prior to 1 January 1946:

- a. Salaries, wages and other remuneration to which employees are entitled under terms of their employment agreements.
- b. Rentals of offices, houses, godowns and telephones.
- c. Electric light and gas bills.

Funds will not be released for any other purpose including, but not by way of limitation, traveling allowance, taxes, lawyers fees and incidental office expenses.

3. No retirement allowances, bonuses, or other remuneration will be paid which exceed the amounts authorized by laws and/or ordinances in effect at the time such payments become due.

BASIC: Memo, GHQ, SCAP, file AG 130 (1 Feb 46) ESS-FI, dated 1 Feb 46 subject: "Request for use of yen bank accounts by German concerns for the purpose of paying salaries and incidental expenses," to Imp. Jap. Govt.

4. This memorandum shall not be construed to release funds from the blocking provisions of any other memorandum issued by this Headquarters or any other ordinance promulgated by the Imperial Japanese Government.

5. All payments to individuals whose bank accounts are blocked will be made into such blocked accounts.

6. Detailed reports as to exact amounts paid under this authorization shall be submitted to this Headquarters.
