MEMORANDUM FOR: THE IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Export of Raw Silk.

1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government release for export 1500 cases of raw silk per Packing List No. 1 dated 4 February 1946, and 1100 bales of raw silk per Packing List No. 2 dated 4 February 1946. The Packing Lists referred to were submitted to this Headquarters per C.L.O. No. 572 (2.1234) dated 7 February 1946.

2. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government empower and instruct an official Japanese Government agency to deliver the aforesaid raw silk to U.S. Commercial Company. Such delivery shall be made in accordance with the port delivery instructions of the Commanding General, United States Eighth Army.

3. The name of the Japanese Government agency charged with the delivery is to be submitted to this Headquarters within two days after receipt of this directive.

4. The aforesaid Japanese Government agency shall be empowered and instructed, immediately upon delivery of the raw silk, to execute and deliver to:

a. Ship's Master (War Shipping Administration) in an envelope addressed to U.S. Commercial Company one copy of each of the following documents.

- (1) One signed copy of the on-board ocean bill of lading.
- (2) Invoice per attached copy annexed hereto and marked "A".
- (3) Packing List, including weights and measurements.
- (4) Japanese Government test certificates.

b. Commanding General, United States Eighth Army:

- (1) Receipt signed by Ship's Master for documents per paragraph 4 a above.

- (2) Five copies of bill of sale covering the raw silk in the form of copy annexed hereto and marked "B".
- (3) Five copies of warranty of clear title executed by the Koeki Eidan covering the 1500 cases of raw silk and by the Japan Raw Silk Control Company covering the 1100 bales of raw silk, in the form of copy annexed hereto and marked "C".
- (4) Two signed and three unsigned copies of the on-board ocean bill of lading.
- (5) Five copies of invoice per form "A" annexed hereto.
- (6) Five copies of Packing Lists including weights and measurements.
- (7) Five copies of Japanese Government test certificates.

5. Delivery of the raw silk to U.S. Commercial Company shall take place upon issuance of on-board ocean bill of lading at port of embarkation and title shall pass to U.S. Commercial Company upon delivery.

6. The aforesaid Japanese Government agency shall immediately communicate with the Commanding General, United States Eighth Army, Yokohama, to receive instructions relative to delivery of the raw silk to port and the handling of the documents.

SUBJECT : Housing Program for Occupation Forces and Their Dependents.

1. It is anticipated that demands for family housing will be placed against the Imperial Japanese Government during 1946 sufficient to accommodate approximately 20,000 family groups. These demands will be progressive during the balance of the year. In order to meet these demands, construction of housing communities and rehabilitation of existing buildings which is being and has been accomplished through the use of Japanese contractors and laborers, will continue. In order that the family housing provided will be suitable for occupancy by the Allied Forces, the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army will furnish plans and specifications for such housing communities and for such rehabilitation of existing buildings as may be planned.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government should be prepared to execute the following in order to meet the need for family housing:

- a. Produce the materials, supplies and equipment required.
- b. Deliver such materials, supplies and equipment to storage sites.
- c. Store and safeguard the items until such time as delivery is made to the construction agency.
- d. Expedite the production and delivery of materials, supplies and equipment to meet the requirements of the construction agency.
- e. Furnish contractors or construction agencies as may be necessary for the entire program as outlined in paragraph 1 above, and furnish all supervision and labor necessary to execute the construction of family housing and related facilities.
- f. Maintain and service such apartment buildings, family housing units, and communities as may be rehabilitated or constructed.

3. An organization or agency should be established by the Imperial Japanese Government which can plan and direct the expeditious execution of this program. This organization or agency should have an office available at all times for liaison with representatives of the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and should in addition, establish local offices and facilities for direct liaison

with local military commanders at or near the major construction sites. The agency should be so organized that it will have direct relations with the highest responsible individuals in the various ministries of the Imperial Japanese Government who have control over the production, transportation, and storage of the various items needed, as well as control of the hiring and direction of labor.

4. In anticipation of the early need for family housing, the production, assembly and storage of the materials, supplies, and equipment needed should be initiated at the earliest possible date so that the construction may be commenced and completed with the greatest rapidity. Inclosed herewith are two (2) approximate bills of materials which give some indication of the types and quantities of items which should be obtained. These lists should not be considered as final, and are furnished only as an indication of the scope of the production involved in order that immediate action may be taken to initiate production.

5. A report of progress in arranging for and accomplishing the production program outlined herein will be delivered to the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army with information copy to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, on Monday of each week.

- (1) One circuit to be available for service on or before 15 March 1946, which will connect the Army signal installation at Atago-Yama, Tokyo; the General Central Meteorological Observatory (GCMO), Tokyo; the GCMO district office, Sendai; the Army airfield, Chitose; and the GCMO district office, Sapporo.
- (2) One circuit to be available for service on or before 1 April 1946, which will connect the Army signal installation at Atago-Yama, Tokyo; the GCMO district office at Nagoya; the Army airfields and GCMO district offices at Osaka and Fukuoka, respectively.

b. Dependable and fast communications over existing telephone, telegraph or radio circuits between GCMO district offices at Fukuoka and Kagoshima.

2. The Occupation Forces will furnish and install teletypewriter machines on the circuits specified in paragraph 1a above, in the GCMO offices at Sapporo, Sendai, Tokyo, Nagoya, Osaka, and Fukuoka.

3. Japanese communication personnel will be responsible for the maintenance of the telegraph circuits and telegraph repeaters associated with the facilities being furnished. The Occupation Forces will maintain American teletypewriter machines involved, except that Japanese operators may be given instructions so that they can perform day to day maintenance of these equipments.

4. A carrier telegraph channel having an effective frequency width of 170 cycles, or a battery operated direct current circuit which will pass approximately 0 to 70 cycles, will satisfactorily carry the teletypewriter signals to be used on circuits described in paragraph 1a. The teletypewriters used operate at the speed of 368 seven impulse characters per minute, and direct current telegraph repeaters used on these circuits must be capable of operating at this impulse speed.

5. Circuits to be provided as directed above, are to be used for collection and distribution of hourly weather information and will be in addition to weather service now being furnished the Occupation Forces by the GCMO. Personnel at all GCMO offices involved, will be instructed by representatives of the Occupation Forces as to information which will be entered on the circuit, the time and sequence in which it is to be filed and in other details pertaining to traffic control.

6. The GCMO district office, at Kagoshima, will transmit required information at times to be determined to the GCMO district office, Fukuoka, using existing communication facilities as provided in paragraph 1b above, and the Fukuoka office will enter this information on the teletypewriter circuit.

7. Engineering details in connection with the establishment of the circuits and services specified will be coordinated between Civil Communications Section, this Headquarters, and the Board of Communications.

8. Details in connection with the maintenance and actual establishment of the circuits will be coordinated between the Army Signal Operations Division, Tokyo, Central Telephone Office, and the Tokyo Bureau of Communications.

Authorities in areas concerned have been requested to show yen equivalent to local currencies on the face of receipts whenever possible. Other receipts have amounts expressed only in Australia, New Zealand and other local currencies.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is authorized to make payment to repatriates indicated in paragraph 2 within the limitations prescribed in reference memoranda.

4. Receipts carried by repatriates will be collected and held in safe custody.

b. Memorandum, file AG 370.05 (29 Jan 46)GC, (SCAPIN-676), dated 29 January 1946, subject: "Projected Changes in Repatriation Procedures."

2. The memorandum referred to in paragraph 1a above established Beppu as a reception center with a daily incoming capacity of 5,000 persons. It states that repatriates will be transported to Honshu by ferry if rail transportation is not available.

3. Paragraph 2d of the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1b above states that subsequent to 23 March 1946, Beppu can expect an incoming daily rate of flow of 3,000 persons.

4. In view of the above, shipping schedules have been established to return repatriates to Beppu at a daily average rate of 3,000 per day in Liberty-type vessels, increasing this traffic progressively until a daily average rate of flow of 5,000 is reached.

5. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has been informed by the Commanding General, Eighth US Army, that facilities are totally lacking at Beppu, and that no provisions, except plans to inspect and process repatriates in city streets, houses, and various hotels scattered throughout the city, have been made.

6. After the advance notice given the Imperial Japanese Government concerning the establishment of Beppu as a reception center and the expected rate of flow to be received thereat, it is not understood why little or no preparations have been made to establish the center. Failure to prepare the Beppu Reception Center by 23 March 1946 to accept repatriates in the numbers stated can only result in the infliction of undue hardships on returning Japanese.

7. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Take immediate action to comply with the provisions of the

4. The plan will contain an outline of the changes in registration laws and procedures necessary to insure that births, deaths, stillbirths, marriages and divorces are reported at the place of actual residence (not "honseki"), as well as the steps to be taken to re-instruct local registration officials about the new procedures.

5. Upon approval by SCAP of the vital statistics plan, the Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate steps to establish the collection of current vital statistics by the methods given in the plan. Such collection will start with data for the month of May and continue.

MEMORANDUM TO: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT
THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo
SUBJECT : Export Procedure

1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government follow the procedure outlined in the attachments hereto in preparing and delivering material for export.
2. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, makes no commitment and assumes no liability in processing or validating Applications to Prepare for Export and Applications to Deliver for Export.
3. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will make every reasonable effort to cause Japanese export items to be disposed of suitably abroad. However, it is distinctly understood that if the commodities covered by any of these applications become unsuitable or ineligible for export or cannot be imported into or sold in another country, approval may be cancelled or modified as to part or all of such commodities.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible for the accuracy of all information presented in applications and for the availability of material as described therein. This includes:
 - a. Responsibility for safeguarding any existing stocks of materials described as available for export, and preventing any disposal until and unless General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, determines that the material should not be exported.
 - b. Responsibility for insuring that Applications to Prepare for Export describe material which can reasonably be expected to be available at the times indicated with due regard for the available supplies of raw materials, coal, labor and any other essential operating supplies and production facilities.
 - c. Responsibility that the material actually shipped conforms to the specifications set forth in applications or shown in samples. Any deviations or substitutions will be made only with specific approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
5. The Imperial Japanese Government will obtain clear title to any material to be exported, except that which is, or has been the property of governments or natural or legal persons outside Japan and of which General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, orders the restitution.

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
