MEMORANDUM FOR: Imperial Japanese Government
THRU : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo
SUBJECT : Housing Program for Occupation Forces and their Dependents.

1. Reference is made to memorandum, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 411 (6 Mar 46) CE-GD, (SCAFIN 799), dated 6 March 1946, subject as above.
2. The Commanding General, Eighth Army, has been delegated authority and responsibility for supervision of the entire production and construction program outlined in the above referenced memorandum.
3. a. The agency to be established in accordance with paragraph 3 of the above referenced memorandum will report directly to the Commanding General, Eighth Army, or his designated representative, and will receive from him instructions governing the renovation or rehabilitation of existing buildings, the construction of new housing, and the equipment and maintenance of family housing and related facilities for members of the occupation forces and their dependents.
b. Pending the issuance of detailed instructions by the Commanding General, Eighth Army, it is desired that branch offices of the agency referred to in paragraph a above be set up at Sendai, Yokohama, Kyoto, and Kure for the prosecution of the work in the respective areas. These branch offices will coordinate procurement and construction with corps or equivalent command headquarters in their respective locations. These branch offices will set up liaison groups at each construction project as later directed by the Commanding General, Eighth Army. It is also desired that main supply depots be set up at Yokohama and Osaka for the funnelling of supplies to the various areas. Intermediate supply depots will be set up as later directed by the Commanding General, Eighth Army.
4. In accordance with general policies furnished him separately, the Commanding General, Eighth Army has been authorized to determine the numbers and types of structures to be rehabilitated or constructed to meet

1. The Japanese Government is directed to collect from all public channels, including warehouses, book shops, book dealers, publishing companies, distributing agents and all commercial establishments, or agencies of the Japanese government where these publications are held in bulk, the following listed propaganda publications:

- a. War & Construction (Asahi Newspaper Company) December 1943.
- b. Senji Shimbum Tokuhon (Manual of Newspaper Reading in Wartime - Tokijiro Hirata) December 1940.
- c. Kindai Kaisen (Modern Sea Battle - Mainichi Newspaper) October 1941.
- d. Bei Ei Chosen No Shinso (The True State of the American-British Challenge to Japan - Hachiro Arita) October 1943.
- e. Shomem Hikohei Tokuhom (Reader for Junior Air Corps - Army Information Department) November 1943.
- f. Bei Ei No Toa Kokuran (American-British Disturbance of East Asia-Hachiro Arita) December 1943.
- g. Bei Ei No Sekai Shinryoku (American World Agression - Kensuku Horiuchi) August 1944.
- h. Dai Toa No Kensetsu (The Building of Greater East Asia - Eigi Amo) November 1944.
- i. Fujin Asia (Asiatic Women - Mainichi Newspaper) Monthly January 1942 to September 1943.
- j. Sakura (Cherry - Mainichi Newspaper Co.) Monthly.

2. These publications will be collected and stored in a central warehouse. Instructions for the disposal of these publications for pulping will be issued by this headquarters at a later date.

2. Compliance with reference 1 b above requires termination, as of 1 February 1946, of all pensions and living aid allowance certificates labelled "Fighting Service."

3. In the case of pension and living aid allowance certificates marked "Civil Service" it will be the responsibility of the Japanese Imperial Government to complete not later than 1 July 1946, a preliminary investigation to determine which certificates are "clear," that is, do not include any period of military service on the part of the holder, and which certificates are "doubtful," that is, may be based partially on a period of military service. Payments due during the month of April 1946 may be made on certificates in cases where the Pension Bureau files have not been examined. However, no payments will be made after 30 April on any except "clear" certificates or certificates which have been revised to eliminate any period of, or credit for, military service. The April payments shall not be made on certificates found "doubtful" prior to that date, and any excess April payments on certificates which are subsequently revised shall be deducted from future payments.

4. Payments on military pensions terminated by reference 1 b above are permitted after 1 February 1946 and prior to 30 April 1946 only in situations where payment was scheduled prior to February but was delayed by a mechanical or technical error. In no event shall any payment be made on military pensions which the Pension Bureau had not approved by 1 February 1946.

A detailed report shall be submitted on the 10th day of each month covering action taken and progress made during the preceding month.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission presents its compliments to the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and has the honour to request that, through its good offices, the following message from the Swedish Government be forwarded, if possible, to the Imperial Japanese Government:-

"The Swedish Consulate General at Bombay, British India, has telegraphed the Swedish Government as follows:-

1) In order to calm the Japanese Civilian Internees it is desirable to receive so soon as possible from the Japanese Government authority concerned a confirmation of Japan's surrender and the substantial contents of the Emperor's Proclamation as well as confirmation that it was in fact Ambassador SAWADA and General ISODA who visited Peoli last December and read out a Proclamation.

Government Agency furnishing the said information should be certified by the Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Tokyo.

2) The Internees at Deoli are in good health and their material conditions are quite satisfactory. However, they are depressed by recent events and over the uncertainty of repatriation. They also regret not having received this New Year the customary message from the Japanese Government.

3) The Internees request eagerly a small regular supply of Japanese reviews and newspapers. They are also in great need of school books and again request that such be sent, unless repatriation is to be expected within the next few weeks."

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission, Tokyo, ventures to add to the above message that, according to messages received, a considerable part of the Japanese Internees at Deoli, refusing to believe in the surrender of Japan and in the identity of the above Japanese Emisseries, armed themselves and attacked those internees, who believed in the surrender, as well as the guards of the camp and tried to break out. The warnings of the Camp Commandant and the local Civil Authorities being disregarded by the mutineers, the guards considered themselves obliged to open fire, which, unfortunately, killed 15 and wounded 16 persons before the mutiny was stopped. The Swedish Consulate General having confirmed the surrender of Japan to the mutineers, the latter now declare that they understand

the situation. To shatter all doubt it would, however, be highly desirable to telegraph the above confirmations.

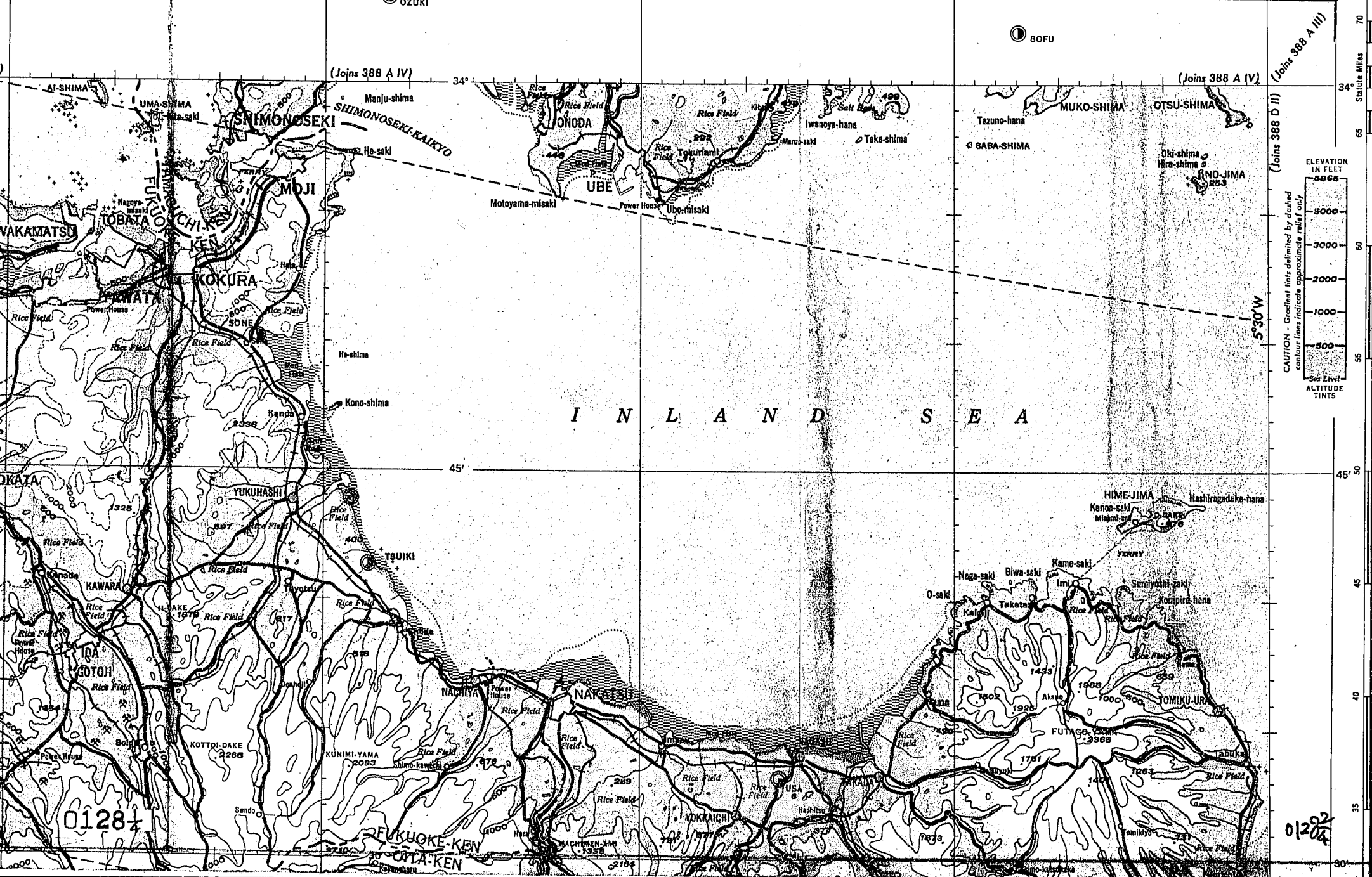

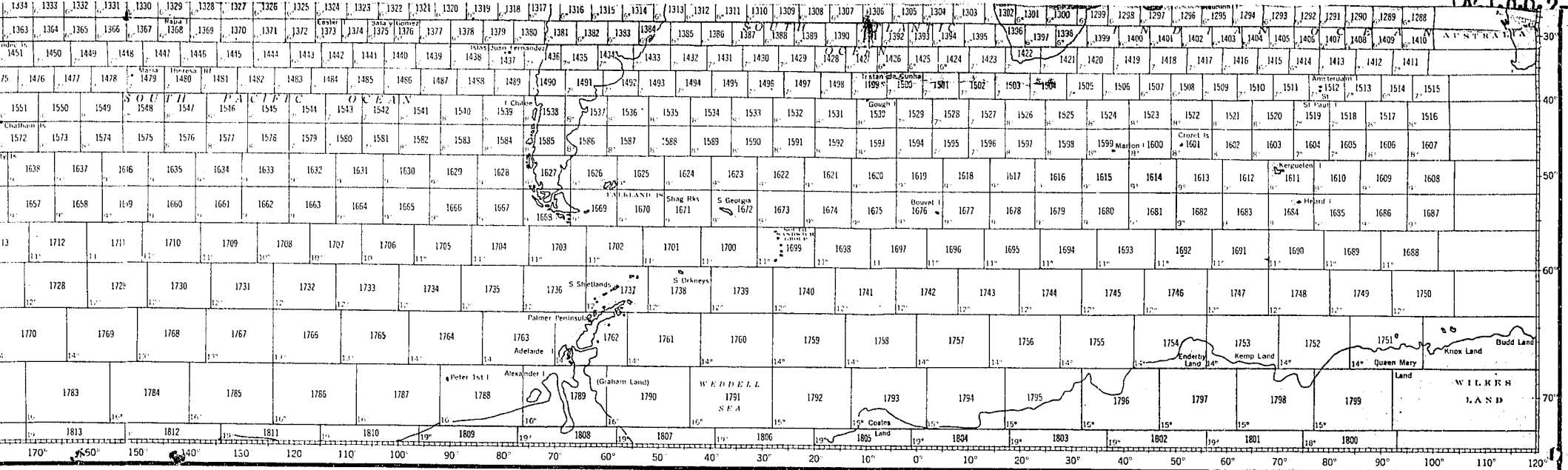

The Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, has been delegated authority to deal with the Central Liaison office or official representatives designated thereby for the purpose of offering for sale to the Imperial Japanese Government certain items of subsistence and of scrap and waste from the United States Government, from time to time as these items become available.

2. The official representative of the Imperial Japanese Government will furnish to the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, at the point of delivery, a quantitative receipt in triplicate and in English for each transfer of material made under this directive.

3. Method of payment, as a part of the program for imports into Japan, will be determined later.

4. All items will be used for civilian relief or in the civilian economy. Items of subsistence will be distributed in accordance with the policy of equitable rationing of food supplies throughout Japan.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government will furnish, prior to the fifteenth of each month, beginning 15 April 1946, a complete report in triplicate in English of all items of subsistence and of scrap and waste received from the United States Government during the previous month. This report will indicate quantities of each item received, quantities in storage at the end of the month covered by the report and quantities distributed during the month, in each local area. A fourth copy of the report will be furnished the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

1. At the request of the Royal Swedish Legation, Tokyo, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, hereby transmits to the Imperial Japanese Government the contents of a Note Verbale, dated 22 February 1946, from the Royal Swedish Legation to the Imperial Japanese Government:

"The Royal Swedish Legation, in charge of Italian interests, presents its compliments to the Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs and has the honour to request the refund of a sum of ¥20,241.36, paid to the Imperial Ministry by the Embassy of the Italian Social Republic with their Note Verbale No. 286, dated July 5th, 1944.

The sum referred to was intended to cover the expenses incurred by the Japanese Embassy in Moscow for account of the Italian Embassy there, as recognized by the Imperial Ministry in Note Verbale No. 14/P4 of July 17th, 1944. The payments for the Italian Embassy in Moscow do not seem to have been effected by the Japanese Embassy, and in an aide-memoire No. 319, dated July 31, 1945 and addressed to Mr. Yoshiura of the Imperial Ministry, Mr. de Prospero of the Embassy of the Italian Social Republic requested reimbursement of the amount in question. Mr. de Prospero's request has never been answered by the Imperial Ministry, and an early refund of the amount in question should therefore be appreciated."

2. Permission is granted the Imperial Japanese Government to make the repayment of ¥20,241.36 to the Royal Swedish Legation for account of the Italian Government. The yen funds in question may be used only for purposes specified in

to Mr. S. de Champeaux, Manager, to be disbursed proportionately as indicated in paragraph 2 above.

4. The above instructions are not intended to permit disbursements from the account of Mr. S. de Champeaux contrary to the provisions of Ministry of Finance Ordinance No. 12 of 1946, subject: "Enforcement of Regulation of the Emergency Financial Measures Imperial Ordinance."

5. This memorandum shall not be construed as a release of this account from the blocking provisions of any memorandum issued by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, with exception of those listed in paragraph 1 above.
