 - b. C.L.O. No. 1313 (CM), subject: "Unsatisfactory Conditions Aboard Repatriation Vessels", dated 20 March 1946.

2. The following deficiencies are noted in the plan for improvement of sanitary conditions aboard repatriation vessels.

a. No provision is made to avoid delay in cleaning and disinfection of ships. It is believed that additional personnel and equipment should be made available at each port to expedite this work. In all cases ships will be thoroughly cleaned prior to their departure from Japan and in the shortest practicable time.

b. Disinfection with DDT will be accomplished monthly on all vessels operating on shuttles where less than a month is required for a round trip. Vessels assigned to voyages requiring more than a month for a round trip will be disinfested with DDT prior to departure from Japan on each voyage.

c. Ships masters will be provided with the necessary means and equipment to maintain a high degree of sanitation while at sea. They will be required by the Imperial Japanese Government to enforce the desired high standard of cleanliness and sanitation.

3. Above noted deficiencies in plan submitted as C.L.O. No. 1313 (CM), subject: "Unsatisfactory Conditions Aboard Repatriation Vessels", dated 20 March 1946, will be rectified at once and the corrected plan put into effect without delay.

1. Reference is made to CLO Memorandum No. 425 (1.13), 28 Jan 1946, and the proposed Ministerial Ordinance inclosed therewith concerning the prohibition of purchase of articles from Allied Occupation Forces personnel.

2. There is no objection to the proposed ordinance but it is suggested that Articles I and II be reworded as follows:

Article I: "No person or persons shall receive through purchase or exchange, supplies belonging to the United States or any Allied Government, or other articles or supplies intended for use by personnel of the Allied Occupation Forces in Japan which are issued or sold to authorized personnel by agencies of Allied Governments or welfare agencies authorized by such governments to provide supplies to Allied troops."

Article 2: "No person or persons shall, knowing the supplies have been obtained in contravention of the regulations of the preceding article, sell or purchase, or through exchange, transfer or receive such supplies."

Japanese whaling vessels shall not anchor or use any harbor on any of the Bonin (Ogasawara) or Kazan Islands and no personnel from such vessels shall land or have any contact with the above mentioned Islands. Land bases for the whaling operations in the Bonin (Ogasawara) and Kazan Islands area may be established only within the area previously authorized in references (a), (b), and (c) above.

Cause all such volumes now owned by Tokyo Imperial University together with the United States Code Annotated (USCA) to be placed in one room, or series of connecting rooms, in one building on the University Campus, which is well lighted both naturally and artificially, adequately heated, and furnished with tables and chairs, to which access may be had by Allied Personnel from 9:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. daily, except Sunday. Action required in this subparagraph will be completed within twenty (20) days from date of this Memorandum.

d. Supplement and bring up to date insofar as possible the English text legal library at Tokyo Imperial University.

- a. Sekai Daisen Futatabi Okoruka (Is a Second World War Possible - Tokyo Nichi Nichi) August 1935
- b. Characteristics of Japanese Culture (Mr. Thain Maung) March 1944
- c. The Assembly of Greater East-Asiatic Nations (Nippon Times Co) March 1944
- d. British Misdeeds in India (Rash Behair) December 1942
- e. Kuruu Speaks (Nippon Times Co) February 1944
- f. Kanren (Training Magazine published by Military Service Section of War Ministry)

3. These publications will be collected and stored in a central warehouse. Instructions for the disposal of these publications for pulping will be issued by this headquarters at a later date.

4. The aforesaid Japanese Government agency shall be empowered and instructed, immediately upon delivery of the raw silk, to execute and deliver to:

a. Ship's Master (War Shipping Administration) in an envelope addressed to U.S. Commercial Company one copy of each of the following documents.

- (1) One signed copy of the on-board ocean bill of lading.
- (2) Invoice per attached copy annexed hereto and marked "A".
- (3) Packing List, including weights and measurements.
- (4) Japanese Government test certificates.

b. Commanding General, United States Eighth Army:

of thirty (30) new members to the House of Peers. Investigation
by this Headquarters revealed that the Imperial Japanese Govern-
ment did not obtain the required questionnaire as outlined in
SCAFIN 550, 4 January 1946, subject: "Removal and Exclusion of
Undesirable Personnel from Public Office", nor did they officially
determine and certify that such appointees were not barred from
public office by the terms of the above directive or the official
Imperial Japanese Government's interpretation thereof.

2. Furthermore, this departure from the required procedure
is aggravated by the fact that representatives of Counter Intelli-
gence Section had previously and on several occasions instructed
the proper officials of the Japanese government to obtain the
required questionnaire and to determine that any proposed appoint-
ee was not barred from public office prior to effecting his
appointment and releasing public notification thereof.

3. The appointees referred to will exercise no prerogatives
pending compliance by the Japanese Government with the above pro-
cedure. Specifically, the Japanese Government will secure from
each such individual the required questionnaire, will determine
whether the individual is barred from government service and will
submit their action for final review by the Supreme Commander.

c. Store the subject grain so that it is protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards and is under proper custody at all times.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.112 (13 Sep 45) MG, dated 13 September 1945, subject: "Protection of Allied and Axis Property" and Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.4 (2 Oct 45) ESS, dated 2 October 1945, subject: "Authorization No. 1, Living Expense Allowances to Axis Nationals Domiciled in Japan," and to the Ordinance of the Ministry of Finance on the Preservation of the Property of the Specified Powers, dated 20 September 1945.

2. Violations of the reference memorandums and ordinance have occurred and it is apparent that adequate enforcement measures have not been taken. German nationals have informed General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of numerous instances of sales and attempted sales of property owned by such nationals.

3. In many instances withdrawals in excess of amounts stipulated in the Memorandum, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.4 (2 Oct 45) ESS, have been made from bank accounts after blocking provisions were in effect and in addition large sums of cash not deposited in banks have been expended. The following specific violations have come to the attention of this Headquarters:

a. Payment of ¥360,000 (¥40,000 each) to nine German engineers on 25 September 1945 by the Imperial Japanese Navy through Dr. Paul Witting, former manager of the Deutsche Bank fur Ostasien.

b. Expenditure by Bayer Yakunin Gomei Kaisha of ¥71,163.51 from its reported cash balance as of 26 September 1945 of ¥98,185.97.

c. Payment by Carl Zeiss K.K. for obituary notices in 7 and 10 February issues of Nippon Times.

d. Discrepancies between amounts reported as owned by German nationals in September 1945 and amounts seized from such individuals by CIC, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at later dates, and now claimed by such individuals as private funds. Specific cases are as follows:

- (1) Paul Matzing, No. 1377, Karuizawa, reported ¥400 cash on hand 22 September 1945, and on 27 January 1946, ¥5,500 was seized from him by CIC.
- (2) No record can be found of a report of assets as of September 1945 having been filed by J. Altendorf, No. 1385, Karuizawa. On 27 January 1946 approximately ¥39,000 was seized from him by CIC.
- (3) Gertrud Sahl, No. 720, Karuizawa, reported in September 1945, "furniture, household objects, clothing, bedding, linen, books, provisions, etc" of value of ¥212,000 but no cash was reported. On 27 January 1946 ¥14,920 was seized from her by CIC.
- (4) Ingeborg Hribar, No. 1385, Karuizawa, reported no assets in September 1945, and alleges that ¥2,300 was seized from her by CIC on 27 January 1946.
- (5) Otto Burmester, No. 1241, Karuizawa, reported no cash on hand on 25 September 1945, and alleges that ¥5,500 was seized from him by CIC on 27 January 1946.

(6) No record can be found of a report of assets as of September 1945 having been filed by Leni Abt, Gohra Hotel, Gora. On or about 2 November 1945, ¥33,000 was seized from her by CIC, which sum she now claims as private property.

(7) Report of Properties submitted by K.K. Irisu Shokai on 20 September 1945 listed bank deposits of ¥2,038,035.14 maintained in banks in Tokyo, Miyashita, Karuizawa, Kobe, Osaka, Kanakura. Application for withdrawal of blocked bank accounts submitted by K.K. Irisu Shokai on 25 November 1945 showed bank deposits of ¥1,706,852.01 maintained in banks in Tokyo, Miyashita, Gora and Kanakura.

4. These cases indicate deliberate violations of memorandums and ordinance, either by failure to correctly report assets on hand in September 1945, accumulation of cash by sale of other assets, or disappearance, alteration, or transference of assets.

5. You are directed to:

a. Take immediate and adequate measures to enforce the provisions of the above-mentioned memorandums and ordinance and to report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, steps taken to prevent violations. In case of prosecution of alleged violators, a full report of the proceedings will be made to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. Require the examination of the records of all bank accounts and property blocked under reference memoranda

The vessels will be placed in first class operating condition and sufficient supplies and personnel will be placed aboard to undertake voyage to Shanghai where the vessels will be delivered to National Chinese Government authorities. The condition of the vessels for delivery and the method and time of undertaking voyage to Shanghai will be subject to Commander Naval Activities Japan approval. You will coordinate your action in this respect with that activity.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will acquire title to subject vessels in the name of the Imperial Japanese Government and will in turn transfer such title to the National Chinese Government. The Imperial Japanese Government will obtain receipt in prescribed form from the National Chinese Government for delivery at Shanghai and will forward certified copy of such receipt to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. You will be furnished with blank receipts in prescribed form prior to departure of vessels.

4. Japanese crews will be returned to Japan by first available repatriation shipping.

It appears from a study of the reference report that satisfactory progress in the establishment of Nagoya as a reception center has been made and that if energetic supervision of the preparations is exercised by the Imperial Japanese Government this reception center should be in full operation by April 7 as required.

3. Special attention will be given at once to the following to insure that no delay is incurred in the establishment and operation of this reception center. In the 30 March report of progress in addition to report required by reference 1a above, mention will be made of the status of these points showing percentage of completion, estimated date of readiness, availability of supply, etc.

a. Facilities - Mitsubishi aircraft plant will be available to the Imperial Japanese Government.

b. Medical supplies - A special check on status thereof.

c. Land Transportation - A plan for operation to include railway, street car, bus and truck, included positive statements as to feasibility by the responsible operating agencies.

d. Food and clothing and materials for processing, materials etc. - Show progress made, percentage completed, availability and location of supplies needed and arrangements for procuring.

e. Hospital facilities - Percentage completed and bed capacity.

SUBJECT : Return of two (2) Fire Engines to the British Government

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take immediate action to effect the return to the British Government of two (2) fire engines which, during the war, were seized in Hongkong, brought to Japan and are now located at the Imperial Palace, Tokyo.
2. The following will be the procedure of restitution:-
 - a. The Imperial Japanese Government will make the necessary arrangements with the British Government representatives for inspection and proper identification.
 - b. The Imperial Japanese Government, upon receiving assurances from the British Government authorities that the fire engines are accepted in their present condition, will transport them to a port city of Japan to be designated by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
 - c. Delivery of the fire engines will be made to a British Government representative at a loading dock in the designated port against proper receipt, a copy of which will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
 - d. In order properly to coordinate the above procedure of restitution, the Imperial Japanese Government will promptly designate one or more officials to meet with representatives of the British Government and General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. Direct communication is authorized between the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Imperial Japanese Government Ministries concerned, to implement the provisions of this memorandum.

4. A report will be submitted immediately upon completion of the final action taken in compliance with this memorandum.

2. You are directed to authorize the Ministry of Finance to give general permission for repayment of remittance bills which were sold by exchange banks but which have not been paid and will not be paid in the future owing to the fact that:

- a. Such bills have not been sent overseas for payment or
- b. Such bills have been sent overseas and returned to Japan without payment having been effected or
- c. An authorized representative of the paying bank has confirmed the fact that the bills have not been received abroad or, if received, they have not been paid and, in either case, that payment will not be made in the future owing to death or repatriation of the payee or other sufficient reason.

3. The authority granted in paragraph 2 is limited to include only those remittance bills which are expressed in Japanese yen.

1. Reference is made to paragraph 3 of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.31 (12 Oct 45) ESS/FI, dated 12 October 1945, subject: "Supplemental Instructions Relating to Import and Export Controls."

2. Effective 15 April 1946, you will instruct the Bank of Japan to exchange Bank of Chosen currency for Bank of Japan currency for Korean nationals being repatriated from Japan, on a one to one basis, in amounts not to exceed 1,000 yen per person. Such exchange will be effected by branches and agencies of the Bank of Japan at ports of embarkation from which Koreans are being repatriated. All Bank of Japan currency carried by such repatriates will be collected and individual receipts will be issued for all that over and above the amount taken in exchange for Bank of Chosen currency.

3. The Bank of Japan will be responsible for:

a. Receiving Bank of Chosen currency from authorized representatives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, against bulk receipt and apportioning such currency to branches and agencies of the Bank of Japan at ports of embarkation to be designated.

b. Accounting for Bank of Chosen currency received, establishing credits as directed for such currency, and maintaining records of currency given out in exchange for Bank of Japan currency.

c. Depositing Bank of Japan currency taken up in exchange for Bank of Chosen currency in the Custody Account in the Bank of Japan established in accordance with Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 004.2 (1 March 46) ESS/FI, SCAPIN (638-A) dated 1 March 1946, subject: "Accounts in the Bank of Japan for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers." Monthly reports will be submitted showing amounts so deposited. Any Bank of Japan currency in excess of that for which an

exchange is permitted will be held in safe custody in accordance with paragraph 3 b of reference memorandum indicated in paragraph 1 above.

d. Reporting at ten day intervals after the effective date of this memorandum, the amounts of currency converted at each port of embarkation and the balances of Bank of Chosen currency on hand as of date of reporting.

4. Direct communication between the Imperial Japanese Government and the Bank of Japan and interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is authorized to arrange for details of transfer and to implement the action directed.
