THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.
SUBJECT : Production of Silk.

1. Reference is made to paragraph 3 of memorandum to the Imperial Japanese Government, dated 9 October 1945, Subject: "Import of Essential Commodities".
2. You will revoke such orders as have been issued that will result in the reduction of the areas devoted to growing of mulberry trees for the ultimate production of silk except for such areas as will clearly be more valuable for growing food than for growing mulberry trees.
3. You will furnish, by 1 November 1945, a statement containing the following:
 - a. The quantity of silk, by grade and size, presently available that is suitable for export.
 - b. Estimate of raw silk production between 1 November 1944 and 30 June 1945.
 - c. Estimate of raw silk production between 1 July and 31 December 1945.
 - d. The breakdown of the production forecasted in (a) and (b) above by grade and size.
 - e. The condition of the raw silk testing and conditioning laboratories and their ability to function. If the laboratories cannot function at this time, state when they will be in a position to do so.
 - f. Such information as will provide a complete understanding of the present and prospective position of the raw silk industry.
4. You will dissolve:
 - a. The Nippon Sanshi Tosei Kabushiki Kaisha Inc. (Japan Silk Controlling Company).

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Memo, Japanese Govt, dtd 11 Oct 45, Subj: Production of Silk (cont'd).

b. The Nippon Sanshi Seizo Kabushiki Kaisha Inc. (Japan Raw Silk Manufacturing Company).

c. The Kyoai Sanshi Kumiai (Mutually Prosperous Silk Reeling Company).

5. You will submit to this headquarters for approval, by 1 November 1945, your plans to establish a public agency composed of representatives of the various phases of the sericultural industry, whose function will include but are not limited to:

- a. The coordination of technical problems within the industry.
- b. The supervision of the testing and grading of silk.
- c. Advising the sericultural industry of the quality, types and sizes of silk required for export.

You will prohibit the selection of anyone who has been an active exponent of militant nationalism and aggression for positions on this agency.

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Continuation of Ionosphere Measurements and Associated Research in Japan.

1. It is desired that systematic observation of the ionosphere over Japan, and associated research on the propagation of radio waves be continued.

2. A preliminary survey of the status of this work at the termination of the war has been made, and the following list of actions and reforms has been prepared for initial execution:

a. The existing "Physical Institute on Radio Waves" (Dempa-butsumi Kenkyujo) under the Department of Education (located at Tanegawa, Kaminogecho, Setagaya-ku, Tokyo) should form the core of the postwar nonmilitary organization to conduct the work.

b. Those research facilities, equipments, and necessary personnel of Naval and Military organizations hitherto contributing to the overall wartime program of work on radio wave propagation, should be transferred to the new nonmilitary organization above.

c. Additional laboratory space should be made available, presumably from military sources, to compensate not only for that space lost as a result of the fire raids, but also to provide for any net increase in size of the final organization which results from consolidation.

d. Hourly virtual height versus frequency measurements (p'f measurements) should commence again in the Tokyo area at the earliest possible date. This work should conform to the internationally adopted procedures for making and interpreting ionospheric observations now in general use among the Allied Powers.

e. To replace those overseas observing stations no longer under Japanese control, and to form the basis for a permanent peacetime program of routine ionospheric observation, plans should be made for eventual p'f stations in the regions of:

BASIC: MEMORANDUM FOR IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT, dtd 10 Oct 45, subj: "Continuation of Ionosphere Measurements and Associated Research in Japan".

- (1) Asahigawa (Hokkaido)
- (2) Akita - Sendai (Northern Honshu)
- (3) Kagoshima (Southern Kyushu)

These new stations should be operated on a continuous basis of hourly measurements, and should conform to those observational procedures prescribed in paragraph "d", above.

f. Steps should be taken to assure that separate magnetic and other geophysical observation and research programs, as well as work on solar physics, which contribute essential data to the ionospheric research, are continued.

3. Tabulation summaries by months of current observations in the internationally adopted standard forms, and copies of new technical reports will be supplied on a monthly basis to the Chief Signal Officer of this command for transmittal to interested agencies of the Allied Powers. The necessary headings, labels and abstracts will be in the English language.

1. The planting, cultivation, or growth of narcotic seeds or plants is prohibited. All narcotic seeds or plants which are now planted, being cultivated or grown will be destroyed immediately. The quantity so destroyed, date and method of destruction, location and ownership of the fields or areas will be reported to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty days.

2. The importation of narcotics by any person is prohibited, except as authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. The exportation or manufacture of narcotics is prohibited.

4. All stocks of crude, semi-processed or smoking opium; crude or semi-processed cocaine; heroin and marijuana (*Cannabis Sativa L.*) are hereby frozen and the removal, destruction, use or sale thereof or of any books or records thereof is prohibited except as authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. All existing records of narcotic transactions in narcotics shall be maintained.

6. Definitions:

a. Narcotic or Narcotics shall include Opium, Cocaine, Morphine, Heroin, Marijuana (*Cannabis Sativa L.*), their seeds and plants, and every substance in any way derived therefrom, or any mixture or preparation thereof.

b. Heroin shall include any derivative, compound, salt, mixture, or preparation thereof.

1. The instructions contained in the following directives will be superseded by this directive:

a. Memorandum this headquarters AG 370.05 (7 Oct 45)GC, subject: "Establishment of Landing Point Bureaus for the Receiving of Returning Japanese Repatriates", dated 7 October 1945.

b. Radio this headquarters ZAX 6225, subject: "Ports to be Prepared for Use in Repatriating Japanese Nationals", dated 30 September 1945, as amended by Radio ZAX 6354, dated 2 October 1945.

2. The Japanese Government will:

a. Establish, organize and operate reception centers at designated ports (see par 3a) to receive, process, care for and evacuate all Japanese military, naval and civilian repatriates returning to Japan Proper from overseas.

b. Demobilize military and naval personnel returning from overseas at the reception center servicing the port of debarkation.

c. Assemble, process, care for and load non-Japanese nationals to be returned to their homelands. (See par 3a)

d. Exercise control over all reception centers through a single agency of the Japanese Government which will operate the centers and carry out the necessary coordination with other governmental agencies regarding supply, customs,

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transportation, demobilization, physical inspections and quarantine.

3. a. Reception Centers: Location, character and capacity.

Reception centers will be established by the Imperial Japanese Government as indicated below, and only these centers will be used for repatriation purposes:

b. Facilities:

Adequate facilities will be established at each of the above designated ports to receive, process and evacuate repatriates in the numbers indicated. They will include necessary storage space for food, clothing and medical supplies as well as space for administration, necessary medical examinations, quarantines and quarantine hospitals. Arrangements will be made with the Commanding Generals of Sixth and Eighth United States Armies for assignment of necessary space for these facilities.

c. Quarantine:

Adequate inspection and quarantine stations

will be established immediately at each of the above designated ports to control:

- (1) The entry into the home islands of persons (military, naval or civilian) with contagious diseases which would endanger the health of the Occupation Forces or the Japanese population.
- (2) The departure of non-Japanese nationals with contagious diseases which would endanger the health of the outgoing shipment of non-Japanese nationals or the populations of countries of destination.

d. Supply:

- (1) Adequate food and medical supplies will be provided repatriates while in the reception centers.
- (2) Vessels leaving designated ports in the home islands will be provided by the reception centers with sufficient stocks of food, medical supplies, clothing and other items required for the ships' crews and repatriates on the outgoing and return voyages.

e. Transportation:

- (1) Each reception center will arrange for the necessary transportation to move incoming repatriates from its area within twenty-four hours after completion of processing.
- (2) Each reception center will regulate the flow of non-Japanese repatriates to be returned to their homelands from Japan in accordance with shipping schedules. These schedules will be established by this headquarters and copies thereof will be furnished the Central Liaison Office, Tokyo. Changes in schedule, ports of destination, estimated time of arrival and loadings

will be furnished the same office by this headquarters as information is received.

f. Currency:

- (1) Reception center commanders will permit non-Japanese repatriates returning to foreign countries to take with them yen currency in amounts not to exceed ¥ 1,000.00 per person.
- (2) Reception center commanders will take up against individual receipt yen currency in excess of ¥ 1,000.00 per individual and all other currencies and such other items as are enumerated in Memorandum, this headquarters, dated 22 September 1945, Subject, "Controls over Exports and Imports of Gold, Silver, Securities and Financial Instruments."

4. The establishment, organization and operation of each reception center will be under the supervision of the United States Army Commander who exercises control over the area in which the reception center is located.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to this headquarters for approval its plan for the organization and proposed operation of each reception center exclusive of Hokodate, indicated in paragraph 3 above, by 31 October 1945.

6. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit the reports as called for by radio, this headquarters, ZA6361, dated 3 October 1945.

on Air Courier

1. Refer to our radio ZAX 6696 in which it was stated that details as to control of Japanese mail and passengers carried by air courier service would be issued at a later date. You are informed that effective this date the following regulations will govern control of mail, baggage and passengers carried by air courier service:

a. All baggage including mail bags will be subject to inspection by the pilot of the aircraft to insure that nothing is being carried that will jeopardize the safe conduct of the flight, such as weapons, explosives and the like.

b. The Japanese Government will insure that only those persons conducting official business authorized by the Japanese Government will use this air courier service. This courier service will not be used to conduct commercial or private business.

c. A passenger list for each flight will be furnished to the pilot of the aircraft before loading. This list will contain each passenger's name, his official title, a brief statement of business he is conducting, point of departure and destination.

d. The pilot of the aircraft has the right to refuse passage to anyone violating these and other regulations governing this air courier service.

SUBJECT : Materials, Supplies, and Equipment to be turned Over to the Imperial Japanese Government by Allied Forces.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your memorandum, file number 219, same subject, dated 10 October 1945.

2. All policies relating to the subject material, supplies, and equipment are to be formulated on the basis of, (1) alleviating suffering and starvation, (2) restoration of the production and distribution of foodstuffs, (3) production of consumer goods and (4) the restoration of other civilian economy, mentioned in the order of priority.

3. The use of existing civilian channels in the distribution of these materials, supplies and equipment is satisfactory and is approved.

4. It is to be clearly understood that proceeds from the sale of any of the subject material, supplies, and equipment are to go to public (governmental) funds and are to be used solely for the relief of the civilian population. Detail records are to be kept which will clearly indicate not only the disposition of all items turned over to the Imperial Japanese Government but also disposition of funds which accrue from the sale of any of these items.

5. The program as submitted does not reflect adequate provision for holding stocks of staple food, clothing and medicine for distribution as direct relief in the future. It is recognized that need for all three materials currently exists throughout Japan. It is felt, however, that the need will be much more urgent and widespread in the late winter months of February, March and April. As the only known reserve for this critical period, these stocks of food, clothing, and medicines must be carefully husbanded. The exact time and place of greatest need, requiring use of these stocks, is to be determined by the Japanese Government giving full consideration to the objective that the stocks provide relief to the maximum number of Japanese civilians.

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6. It is noted that the term "military repatriates" is used. With the complete demobilization of the Japanese Armed Forces, this headquarters recognizes no such group of "ex-military" personnel. The stocks in question are to be distributed to Japanese civilians. Included in the term "civilians" are, of course, demobilized military personnel, however distribution for relief is to be based on current need of the individual and in no case is any consideration to be given to the prior status of such individuals.

7. Under the items of particular emphasis listed in paragraph (3), page 2 of your memorandum, should be the construction of emergency housing. Maximum utilization must be made of building materials of all kinds for emergency housing in devastated areas.

8. Nothing in this letter is to be construed in such a manner as to prohibit the immediate disposal by the most expeditious means of any foodstuffs which are in danger of spoiling or becoming otherwise unfit for human consumption. Aggressive action to prevent such waste is directed. Retention of stocks for future distribution for civilian relief is to be limited to those which can be stored for the required time without serious deterioration.

9. The Imperial Japanese Government will take the necessary steps to provide adequate protection and maintenance for all stocks of supplies, materials and equipment received under the provisions of this program until final disposition of such stocks is made.

10. Subject to the provisions outlined in the foregoing paragraphs, authority is granted to initiate immediately distribution of the subject supplies, equipment and materials. As a matter of record, a revised program reflecting the indicated changes will be submitted to this headquarters without delay.

SUBJECT : Elimination of Japanese Government Control of the Motion Picture Industry

1. Further to the directive of 27 September 45 from the Supreme Allied Commander, titled "Further Steps toward Freedom of Press and Speech," the Japanese Government forthwith will render inoperative the procedures for enforcement of peace-time and war-time restrictions on freedom of speech in motion pictures, including newsreels.
2. The directive of 4 October 45, titled "Removal of Restrictions on Political, Civil, and Religious Liberties," also shall apply.
3. Pending repeal of laws imposing restrictions on the motion picture industry, making it a channel for dissemination of propaganda, their enforcement shall be suspended.
4. No punitive action will be taken by the Japanese Government or any of its agencies against motion picture companies, producers, actors, directors or other persons or associations of persons engaged in the motion picture or legitimate theater industry for exercising their lawful freedom of speech.
5. Steps shall be taken to repeal the following laws and/or regulations which are inconsistent with the Supreme Commander's directives enumerated in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this order, subject laws including but not restricted to:

- Elgaho, Kaisei, Horitsu Dai 35, Showa 16 (1941)

6. In addition to rendering the foregoing laws inoperative, necessary instructions will be issued to prefecture and metropolitan authorities, including police agencies, directing their repeal of any and all local censorship rules, regulations or laws, to insure that the spirit of the directives is observed by them.

7. Steps shall be taken to repeal the following Tokyo Metropolitan Police Regulations:

- a. "Metropolitan Police Station Official Publication - (Supplement) April 1, 1944 Showa 19 Saturday -- Metropolitan Police Rules # 9. Rules and regulations governing all forms of public performances -- April 1, 1944 (Showa 19)" (Sections 1 to 95)
- b. "Metropolitan Police Rule # 10 Rules and Regulations governing all motion pictures -- April 1, 1944 (Showa 19)" (Sections 1 to 40)
- c. "Public Morality # 682 -- April 15, 1944 (Showa 19) Notification of Rules and Regulations governing all public performances and motion pictures." (Sections 1 to 25) (Appendix) "Rules and Regulations of executing the Motion Picture Law." (Sections 1 to 28)

These laws, rules or regulations give broad supervisory powers to the police, in addition to their censorship provisions. Such

powers include deciding who shall work in the industry, passing on the financial condition of an owner, checking on the behavior or attitude of an employee, controlling the proportion of foreign films exhibited, preventing actors from walking on the street in stage costume, determining the issuance of passes, and examining the minutes of a stockholder's meeting. These powers, no free people can entrust to a police.

8. The few sections of these rules which deal with matters of Safety Regulations and Building and Zoning restrictions shall remain in effect until the Japanese Government shall re-enact such regulations for the protection and safety of the public against fire and structural hazards in the motion picture industry.

9. Necessary instructions will be issued to Prefectural Authorities including all police agencies, directing the repeal of any and all similar local rules, regulations or laws which conflict with the spirit or intent of this directive.

10. It is the purpose and intent of this directive to free the Japanese motion picture industry from government domination and to permit the industry to reflect the democratic aspirations of the Japanese people. In due time (when the Japanese motion picture companies have demonstrated good faith), it is envisaged that they will establish an industry-wide committee which will act as a policing agency.

11. The report required of the Japanese Government in paragraph 8 of the directive of 27 September will include a statement of action taken to comply with this directive.

SUBJECT : Control of Venereal Disease

1. Reports submitted by representatives of the Imperial Japanese Government and observations by personnel of the occupation forces show that measures now in operation are inadequate to prevent the spread of Venereal Disease in the population of Japan.

2. The Supreme Commander directs that the Imperial Japanese Government put into effect immediately the following measures:

a. The designation of syphilis, gonorrhea and chancroid as infectious diseases under the terms of Article I of the Law for the Prevention of Infectious Diseases (Law No. 36, 1897, as amended).

b. The reporting of all syphilis, gonorrhea and chancroid cases by name, age, sex and full address of the individual concerned, on a basis similar to that in effect for the reporting of other notifiable infectious diseases.

c. Rigid enforcement of the Law for Prevention of Infectious Diseases, the Law for the Prevention of Venereal Diseases (Home Department Ordinance No. 44, 1900, as amended) and all laws, ordinances, regulations and instructions issued thereunder which relate, directly or indirectly, to the prevention and treatment of the venereal diseases.

d. Bringing under the examination, treatment and health provisions of these laws, ordinances, regulations and instructions all individuals whose occupations or activities subject them to serious hazard of venereal disease transmission.

1. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers directs the Imperial Japanese Government to carry out the following medical and sanitary procedures as a minimum upon the arrival in Japan from abroad of any Japanese repatriate.

a. Procedures with respect to all repatriates will provide for:

(1) Physical inspection for detection of louse-infestation and of cases and suspects of quarantinable disease (cholera, plague, smallpox, louse-borne typhus, yellow fever) or of communicable disease which might prejudice the health of subsequent contacts.

(2) Hospitalization or other effective segregation of persons known or suspected to be infected with quarantinable or significant communicable disease, until communicability has passed.

(3) Appropriate measures for continued observation of persons known to have had contact with quarantinable disease of a type liable to convey infection. Observation will continue during the incubation period of the disease concerned, calculated from the day of last possible contact. For purposes of this requirement the following incubation periods will be observed: smallpox, 14 days; louse-borne typhus, 12 days; plague, 6 days; yellow fever, 6 days; cholera, 5 days. In accordance with risk involved the appropriate measures may vary from detention under observation to notification to and surveillance by responsible public health officials in areas to which repatriates will travel during the possible incubation periods. Notification should include cases of significant communicable disease, the institutionalization of which is not immediately practicable (i.e., leprosy, tuberculosis, etc.).

Disinfestation will include the clothing of such persons, and other articles susceptible to infestation.

(5) Such additional protective measures with respect to contacts with quarantinable disease, as for instance, immunization against smallpox, as are applicable and feasible to diminish likelihood of transmission of disease.

(6) Appropriate modification of the above requirements, when approved by this headquarters, in consideration of administration of approved immunogens, or of disinfestation by approved methods, before departure from abroad or enroute, providing these procedures are acceptably certified. Immunizations will be considered valid for this purpose not to exceed the following periods: smallpox, 1 year; louse-borne typhus, 6 months; cholera, 4 months; yellow fever, 5 years.

(7) Maintenance of records required to comply with international quarantine procedure.

b. Procedures with respect to Japanese vessels only will provide for:

(1) Inspection for rodent infestation aboard vessels arriving from areas in which plague is known to be occurring or is considered endemic, including the Asiatic mainland (including Korea), Formosa, Dutch East Indies, Burma, India, Thailand, Malay States, Singapore, French Indo-China.

(2) Fumigation, by cyanide, sulphur dioxide, or other method submitted to and approved in advance by this headquarters, of those Japanese vessels indicated in par. 1-b (1) in which there

is an excessive rodent colony as determined by international quarantine standards or which have had contact with shore likely to permit access of rodents in ports in which plague is known to be occurring; also of vessels in which rodent plague has occurred since last previous fumigation.

(3) Rat-trapping in all vessels in which the rodent colony is excessive in accordance with international quarantine standards and in which fumigation is not carried out.

(4) Appropriate examination for infection with plague of all rodents recovered after fumigation or by trapping aboard vessels.

(5) Those additional measures which are applicable to prevent spread of plague, including anchorage in stream with debarkation by lighter, fending off from wharves, application of effective rat-guards to lines, policing of gang-planks and cargo nets, necessary precautions with respect to cargo which have harbor rats or fleas from areas infected with plague, and appropriate disinfection or disinfestation of personal effects, linen, or other articles which may be infected or infested through contact with persons or rodents infected with quarantinable disease, and of parts of vessels or aircraft which may be similarly affected.

(6) Other sanitary measures approved by this headquarters as appropriate for control of disease aboard conveyances, including assurance of safe drinking water and proper disposal of wastes.

(7) Maintenance of records required to comply with international quarantine procedure.

c. Procedures with respect to ports:

(1) A continuing program of rodent control and sampling autopsies of rodents for detection of rodent plague in harbors used in repatriation movements, especially in traffic from areas specified in par. 1-b (1), with maintenance of appropriate records.

ARAI, Taizo, Head of Police Department

Last seen on 13 June in Mabuni. Not heard of since; very possibly committed suicide.

FURUGORI, Jinsaku (not NISAKA) Head of Agricultural Bureau

Believed to have died in the Naval shelling of Chiyamu shortly after 20 June.

SATO, Kiichi (not IICHISQTO) Head of Special Police Section

Remained in a cave in Ishiki in Makabe when other civilians surrendered on 25 June. Was probably killed in cave, since surrendering natives saw many U.S. soldiers and tanks attacking in vicinity, but is possibly still in cave, which had two months provisions.

1. Receipt is acknowledged of your memoranda, Central Liaison Office No. 160, subject: "Removal of Foreign Diplomats from Fujiya Hotel, Hakone", 4 October 1945, and Central Liaison Office No. 180, subject: "Treatment of Foreign Diplomats in Japan", 4 October 1945.

2. With reference to the treatment of Axis and puppet diplomatic staffs your attention is invited to the following messages:

a. Radio No. CAX 53278, 14th, which directed that Axis and puppet diplomatic staffs would be removed from the Fujiya Hotel at Miyanashita to the Gohra Hotel at Gora and be cared for by the Imperial Japanese Government.

b. Radio No. ZAX 7065, 16th, which exempted the Thailand Diplomatic Staff from the directive described in paragraph a, above.

3. It is the responsibility of the Imperial Japanese Government to provide quarters, subsistence, fuel and other necessities, and to care for the aforementioned diplomatic personnel in accordance with international custom and on the standard scale established by the Imperial Japanese Government for this class of personnel.

4. With reference to the treatment of Allied and Neutral diplomatic staffs, the following information is imparted and policies announced:

a. This headquarters has directed the Commanding General, Eighth U. S. Army, to occupy the Fujiya Hotel at Miyanashita and to use this hotel to quarter, among other personnel, Allied and Neutral diplomatic staffs desiring residence there. The Commanding General, Eighth U. S. Army, will subsist, on a sales basis, these persons on the standard U. S. Army ration.

b. For those Allied and Neutral diplomatic staffs desiring residence in Tokyo it is the responsibility of the Imperial Japanese Government to provide suitable quarters.

c. Further it is the responsibility of the Imperial Japanese Government to subsist, provide with fuel, give medical care, and otherwise care for Allied and Neutral diplomatic staffs on the standard scale and in accordance with international custom.
