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MEMORANDUM FOR: Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Reports on Organization and Finances of Imperial household.

1. This is to confirm our oral request for the submission to this Headquarters of certain documentary information concerning the Imperial Household. The request was made at the conference held 17 October 1945 at 10 A.M. in room 252 of this Headquarters, attended by Messers. M. Kuroda, S. Kato, Y. Miura and M. Inumaru representing the Imperial Household, Mr. Y. Tasaki of your office and Messers. Alk, Blake, Major Abrams and Lieutenant Akin of this Headquarters.

2. Delivery to this Headquarters of copies of the following documents was requested:

- a. The Imperial House Law and Annexes thereto (in English only).
- b. One of the leading Japanese books written on the subject of the Imperial Household (in Japanese only).
- c. Chart of Organization of the Imperial Household (in English only).
- d. Final Reports of the Treasury Bureau of the Imperial Household for the years 1937-43 inclusive (in both English and Japanese).
- e. Monthly reports of Bureaus of the Imperial Household for the months of January to September 1945 inclusive (in English only).
- f. All Budgets of the Imperial Household for the year 1945.
- g. The Final report of the Treasury Bureau of the Imperial Household for 1944.
- h. A statement of all holdings of the Imperial Household with the estimated value of each.

3. There were delivered at 2 P.M. 18 October 1945 what we understand to be the Japanese text of Budgets of the Imperial Household for 1937-45 and annual final reports of the Treasury Bureau (concerning the fiscal operations of the Household) for the years 1937-43. At 2 P.M. 20 October 1945 there were delivered an English copy of the Imperial House Law, the Japanese text of the holdings of the Imperial Household and the book, in Japanese dealing with the Imperial Household.

4. It was understood that the chart of organization of the Imperial Household in English will be delivered 22 October 1945; the final report of the Treasury Bureau of the Imperial Household for 1944, in Japanese, will be delivered 25 October 1945; a summary in English of the organization and fiscal provisions of the Annexes to the Imperial House Law will be delivered by 31 October 1945; and the remainder of the English translations by 15 November 1945. It will be unnecessary for you to translate any of the budgets for periods prior to 1945 if the final reports for the years 1937-44 are furnished in English. It will be appreciated if you will translate the documents of current data first, delivering them as translations are completed, and leave the earlier years to the last.

Inclosure 1 To Be Used in Reporting Commercial and Industrial Companies

1. Each of the reporting companies will submit a separate report for itself and for each of its subsidiaries on financial and other allied matters as more fully described in the following paragraphs.

2. For the purpose of this directive, a subsidiary is defined as any corporation, partnership, or association for the purpose of doing business in which the reporting company is directly or indirectly the owner, or, or enjoys other beneficial interest in 10% or more of any one class of stock or indebtedness outstanding, or exercises control to the extent of 10% or more over voting controlling operations or policy.

3. a. All reports will be prepared in English according to the principles and in the form of the best accounting practice current in the United States.

b. Reports will be typewritten on white paper eight (8) by eleven (11) inches. If that size is not available, paper used will be approximately that size, but in any case all pages of any one report will be uniform.

c. Text will be single spaced, while double spacing will be used for financial statements, schedules, tabulations, lists, rosters, and other such matters.

d. Five copies of each report will be submitted.

e. In the upper right hand corner of each page, one-eighth (1/8) inch from the top of the page, will be typed the abbreviated name of the company and the number of the section of the report.

4. Each report submitted will be for the reporting company only. It will not be consolidated to include both the company and its subsidiaries and affiliates.

5. Reports will be compiled on the basis of the calendar year, excepting that if any company's books or records are kept on a fiscal year basis, the fiscal year corresponding most closely may be substituted. In all cases, however, the same basis will be used for all periods under review in any one report. Furthermore, the reports of parent companies and of their subsidiaries will be submitted on the same basis, unless the books of such companies are ordinarily kept on a different basis.

6. The report will be divided into sections, each section to correspond in numbering and in content with the following subparagraphs.

a. Section 1. EARNINGS

A record of earnings for each of the years 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive. Such statement will show sales, cost of sales, charges for depreciation and depletion, income from investments, taxes paid, dividends paid, and surplus earnings transferred to surplus.

b. Section 2. BALANCE SHEET.

A balance sheet as at the close of each of the years 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive. Such statements will show plant and property gross and net of reserves for depreciation and depletion, investments, patents and processes if carried separately, and itemization of current assets to show cash, bank deposits, receivables, and inventories. The basis on which inventories are calculated will be noted. Capital liabilities will be shown in detail, and current liabilities will be broken down as to type, such as bank loans payable, accounts due, and so forth.

c. Section 3. CAPITALIZATION.

(1) A tabulation as at the close of 1944 of the authorized, issued, and outstanding amounts of each class of capital stock, voting trust certificates, or other evidences of equity in assets or earnings; and of each class of bond, debenture, or other evidence of indebtedness excepting only those included in current liabilities.

(2) A tabulation by years for the period 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive, of all changes in capitalization, the number of shares or face value of capital stock or indebtedness issued or retired, the proceeds of issue or cost of retirement, and the purpose of the sale or retirement.

(3) A complete description of each class of security listed in subparagraphs (1) and (2) above, including the rights and privileges of each class of security, particularly the voting rights, participation in profits, and preferences as to assets and earnings.

d. Section 4. CONTROL.

(1) A list of all holders of record at the close of 1944 who held 500 shares or Y 100,000 or more of any class of the company's securities. Such list will include the number of shares or the face amount held.

(2) A list by years of all holders of 1% or more of any one class of stock or indebtedness in such cases as additions or subtractions from the holdings occurred during the course of the year, together with the extent of the change.

(3) A list by years, to be compiled at the close of each year from 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive, of foreign nationals having any ownership of or interest in the capital stock or indebtedness of the company. Reference may be made to reports previously made on this subject, and copies of such reports attached.

(4) Lists called for in subparagraphs (1), (2) and (3) may be prepared by company's registrar, transfer agent, or other fiscal agent acting in those capacities, but the reporting company will not thereby be relieved of responsibility for the accuracy of the lists.

e. Section 5. REAL ESTATE, PLANT & EQUIPMENT.

(1) A schedule of all installations or groups of installations, each amounting to Y 200,000 or more in gross value before charges for depreciation and depletion and located as a geographical unit, such schedule to be prepared as of the close of 1944.

(2) A brief description of each of the foregoing properties. Detailed and itemized descriptions of plant and equipment are not desired.

(3) The location of each installation, with particular references to location outside of the home islands of Japan.

(4) A list of products and capabilities for each installation with particular reference to items described in paragraphs 4 and 5, Directive Number 3, dated 22, September 1945. Reference may be made to inventory submitted in accordance with paragraph 6 of aforementioned directive, and a copy of same attached.

(5) Note of damage to plant or equipment due to bombing, fire, or other causes incidental to the recent war in such cases as the value of plant or property, or the capacity to produce has been affected to the extent of 10% or more.

(INCL 1, CONT'D)

(6) A list by years for each year from 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive, of all additions to installations or groups of installations described in subparagraph 6.e.(1) above, or deductions therefrom, in such cases as the addition or subtraction for the year amounted to \$ 100,000 or greater. Decreases in plant and property due to charges for depreciation and depletion as shown in Earnings, are specifically excluded.

f. Section 6. INVESTMENTS.

(1) A list at the close of each year, 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive, showing the amounts held of all stocks, voting trust certificates, equities in ownership, or other evidences of participation in earnings or profits; and of all bonds, debentures, notes, and other evidences of indebtedness excluding only those which are included among Receivables in Current Assets.

(2) A complete description of each investment listed, including voting rights, profit participation, and the percentage of the investment to the total outstanding securities of that class by the issuing company.

(3) The cost, book value, and date of acquisition of the investment to the holding company.

(4) Notation on each investment of any agreement between holding company and issuing company for management, or any sales or cartel agreements, or any other arrangements or agreements other than purchases and sales in the normal course of current business. Copies of any such agreements will be attached.

(5) A list for each year, for the years 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive, of all investments purchased or otherwise acquired, the cost thereof, and the reason for purchase. A similar list for each of the same years of all securities or other investments sold or otherwise disposed of, together with the proceeds thereof, and the reason for sale.

g. Section 7. CURRENT ASSETS.

(1) A schedule as at the close of each year 1935 through 1944 of all bank deposits, together with the bank of deposit and the rate of interest paid, in every case where the deposit amounts to 3% or more of the company's cash funds and deposits at the year end.

(2) A schedule as at the close of each year 1935 through 1944 of all accounts receivable, together with a description thereof, including the rate of interest, due date, and date item was incurred, in every case where the receivables amounts to 3% or more of the reporting company's receivables at the year end.

h. Section 8. CURRENT LIABILITIES.

(1) A schedule as at the close of each year 1935 through 1944 of all accounts, bills, or notes payable, and all other evidences of indebtedness other than those included among capital liabilities, together with a description thereof, the interest rate paid, the date due, and the date incurred, this schedule to include all payables in every case where the amount of same totaled 3% or more of the reporting company's payables at the year end.

i. Section 9. SALES.

(1) A list by years of customers and the total sales made to such customers for the year where such sales were 3% or greater of the reporting company's total sales for the same year, this list to cover the years 1935 through 1944.

(2) Notation on the foregoing list of persons listed in Investments, Section 6, or in Management Agreements, Section 11.

(INCL 1, CONT'D)

j. Section 10. COST OF SALES.

(1) A list for each of the years 1935 through 1944 of vendors and the total purchases made from such vendors in such cases as those purchases were 3% or more of the reporting company's purchases of material for the same year.

(2) Notation on the foregoing list of persons listed in Investments, Section 6, or in Management Agreements, Section 11.

k. Section 11. MANAGEMENT FEES.

A schedule for each of the years 1935 through 1944 of all fees or other compensation paid or received for the management of this or other properties, for research and development, for manufacture and sale under license of any nature, for the granting of financial assistance, for agreements to provide loans or capital--in short, fees of any nature whatsoever, excluding only wages and salaries, and fees for legal work, auditing, or accounting made in the ordinary course of business.

l. Section 12. PUBLIC STATEMENTS.

(1) A copy of all reports made to shareholders during the years 1935 through 1944, whether or not formal annual reports, including balance sheets, statements of earnings, addresses by the president, chairman of the board, or other official of the company, or other matters published for the information of stockholders.

(2) A copy of the articles of incorporation together with any amendments thereto.

7. If reporting company cannot comply with any of the terms of this directive or the attached annex, a report of non compliance will be submitted together with the reasons therefor. Reference will be made in such report to the corresponding paragraph in this letter of instructions.

8. Inasmuch as time is of the essence each section of this report will be submitted separately promptly after completion.

Enclosure No. 2. To be used in Reporting Banks or other Financial Institutions

1. Each banking institution will submit a report providing the information as detailed below. Where certain banks have in the course of the past ten years absorbed other banking firms, a separate report will be submitted for each bank so absorbed from the initial date until the date of absorption by the parent institution.

2. Each banking institution will submit a report for each of its subsidiary or dependent bank. A subsidiary or dependent bank is considered for the purposes of this report to be one in which the reporting institution is directly or indirectly the owner of, or enjoys other beneficial interest in 10% or more of the paid up capital or exercises control to the extent of 10% or more over voting controlling operations or policy.

3. a. All reports will be prepared in English according to the principles and in the form of the best accounting practice current in the United States.

b. Reports will be typewritten on white paper eight by ten and one half inches; if that size is not available, paper used will be approximately that size, but in any case all pages of any one report will be uniform.

c. Text will be single spaced, while double spacing will be used for financial statements, schedules, tabulations, lists.

d. Five copies of all reports will be submitted.

e. In the upper right hand corner of each page one eighth (1/8) inch from the top of the page, will be typed the abbreviated name of the bank and the number of the section of the report.

4. Reports will be compiled on the basis of the calendar year, excepting if the bank's books or records are kept on a fiscal year basis, the fiscal year corresponding most closely may be substituted. In all cases the same basis will be used throughout.

5. The report will be divided into sections, each sections to correspond in numbering and content with the following sub-paragraphs.

a. Section 1. EARNINGS

A record of earnings for each year, 1935 through 1944, each year inclusive, Such record will show income, taxes paid, dividends paid and surplus earnings transferred to surplus.

b. Section 2. BALANCE SHEET

(1) A balance sheet as at the close of each year, 1935 through 1944, both years inclusive, and for 30 September 1945. Such balance sheet will show detailed breakdown of assets and liabilities, including loan accounts, collateral on loans, bills discounted, accounts due from foreign correspondents and due to foreign correspondents, acceptances and guarantees, securities and an itemized list of deposit accounts showing the following:

- Current Accounts
- Special Current Accounts
- Deposits at notice
- Fixed Deposits
- Savings Deposits

- Trust Accounts
- Restricted Deposits
- Special Accounts (Tax accounts, insurance accounts, etc)

(2) An attached list showing all loans amounting to more than ¥100,000 each, made since 1935 and the name of the individual or firm to whom loan was made and date of repayment or other disposition.

(3) A loans classification sheet showing as of 30 Sept 1945 loans secured by government bonds, other bonds and debentures, stocks commodities real estate mortgages, guarantees, assets of business firms and unsecured loans.

c. Section 3. CAPITALIZATION

(1) A tabulation as at the close of 1944 or the close of the nearest fiscal year of the authorized, issued and outstanding amount of each class of capital stock, voting trust certificates or other evidences of equity in assets or earnings; and of each class of bond, debenture, or other evidence of indebtedness excepting only those inclosed in current liabilities.

(2) A tabulation by years for the period 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive, of all changes in capitalization, the number of shares or face value of capital stock as indebtedness issued or retired, the proceeds of issue or cost of retirement and the purpose of the sale of retirement.

(3) A complete description of each class of security listed in subparagraph (1) and (2) above, including the rights and privileges of each class of security, particularly the voting rights, participation in profits, and preferences as to assets or earnings.

d. Section 4. CONTROL

(1) A list of all holders of record at the close of 1944, or the close of the nearest fiscal year who held 500 shares or ¥100,000 or more of any class of the company's securities. Such list will include the number of shares or the face amount held.

(2) A list by years from 1935 to 1944, of all holders of 1% or more of any one class of stock or indebtedness in such cases as additions or subtractions from the holding occurred during the course of the year, together with the extent of the change.

(3) A list by years, to be compiled at the close of each year from 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive, of foreign nationals having any ownership of or interest in the capital stock or indebtedness of the company. Reference may be made to reports previously made on this subject, and copies of such reports attached.

e. Section 5. BRANCH INSTITUTIONS

(1) A schedule of all branch offices or agencies of the parent institution in Japan located by city and prefecture, with total deposits of each for the years 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive.

(2) A schedule of all branch offices or agencies outside Japan, located by city and country with brief statement of main business handled by each such foreign branch and balance sheet for each as at the close of business for such institution. A statement as to location of assets held by foreign branches as at the close of business of such branches.

f. Section 6. INVESTMENTS

- (1) A list at the close of each year 1935 to 1944, both years inclusive, showing the amounts held of all stocks, voting trust certificates, equities in ownership or other evidences of participation in earnings or profits; and of all bonds, debentures, notes and other evidences of indebtedness.
- (2) A complete description of each investment listed, including voting rights, profit participation and the percentage of the investment to the total outstanding securities of that class by the issuing company.
- (3) The cost, book value and date of acquisition of the investment to the bank.
- (4) Notation on each investment of any agreement between bank and issuing company for management or any other agreements. Copies of such agreements will be attached.

- (3) A complete list of major officers of the bank as of 30 September 1945 and a statement as to method of payment of officials and employees, including scale of bonuses, method of hiring, advancement and retirement.
- 6. If reporting company cannot comply with any of the terms of this directive, a report of noncompliance will be submitted together with the reasons. Reference will be made in such report to the corresponding paragraph in this letter of instructions.
- 7. Each section of this report will be submitted separately, promptly upon completion.

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.  
THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.  
SUBJECT : Administration of the Educational System of Japan.

1. In order that the newly formed Cabinet of the Imperial Japanese Government shall be fully informed of the objectives and policies of the occupation with regard to Education, it is hereby directed that:

- a. The content of all instruction will be critically examined, revised, and controlled in accordance with the following policies:
  - (1) Dissemination of militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology will be prohibited and all military education and drill will be discontinued.
  - (2) Inculcation of concepts and establishment of practices in harmony with representative government, international peace, the dignity of the individual, and such fundamental human rights as the freedom of assembly, speech, and religion, will be encouraged.
- b. The personnel of all educational institutions will be investigated, approved or removed, reinstated, appointed, reorientated, and supervised in accordance with the following policies:
  - (1) Teachers and educational officials will be examined as rapidly as possible and all career military personnel, persons who have been active exponents of militarism and ultra-nationalism, and those actively antagonistic to the policies of the occupation, will be removed.
  - (2) Teachers and educational officials who have been dismissed, suspended, or forced to resign for liberal or anti-militaristic opinions or activities, will be declared immediately eligible for and if properly qualified will be given preference in reappointment.

- (3) Discrimination against any student, teacher, or educational official on grounds of race, nationality, creed, political opinion, or social position, will be prohibited, and immediate steps will be taken to correct inequities which have resulted from such discrimination.
  - (4) Students, teachers, and educational officials will be encouraged to evaluate critically and intelligently the content of instruction and will be permitted to engage in free and unrestricted discussion of issues involving political, civil, and religious liberties.
  - (5) Students, teachers, educational officials, and public will be informed of the objectives and policies of the occupation, of the theory and practices of representative government, and of the part played by militaristic leaders, their active collaborators, and those who by passive acquiescence committed the nation to war with the inevitable result of defeat, distress, and the present deplorable state of the Japanese people.
- c. The instrumentalities of educational processes will be critically examined, revised, and controlled in accordance with the following policies:
- (1) Existing curricula, textbooks, teaching manuals, and instructional materials, the use of which is temporarily permitted on an emergency basis, will be examined as rapidly as possible and those portions designed to promote a militaristic or ultra-nationalistic ideology will be eliminated.
  - (2) New curricula, textbooks, teaching manuals, and instructional materials designed to produce an educated, peaceful, and responsible citizenry will be prepared and will be substituted for existing materials as rapidly as possible.
  - (3) A normally operating educational system will be re-established as rapidly as possible, but where limited facilities exist preference will be given to elementary education and teacher training.

2. The Japanese Ministry of Education will establish and maintain adequate liaison with the appropriate staff section of the Office of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and upon request will submit reports describing in detail all action taken to comply with the provisions of this directive.
3. All officials and subordinates of the Japanese Government affected by the terms of this directive, and all teachers and school officials, both public and private, will be held personally accountable for compliance with the spirit as well as the letter of the policies enunciated in this directive.

1. I have been directed to approach you concerning the British owned Pilot boat "SHIN YANGTSE" of 870 tons and 186 feet length, registered at Lloyd's, Official No. 557 GB GI STRU SHANGHAI. This vessel was specially designed and built at Shanghai for pilotage work at the mouth of the Yangtse.

2. It is understood that the Shanghai Licenced Pilots Association urgently require this vessel for use at Shanghai. A local Japanese POW has stated that she has been in use as a Patrol Vessel, presumably in Japanese waters.

3. It is therefore requested that inquiries may be made to locate the "SHIN YANGTSE" and that I may be informed of her present position and condition. It is further requested that the competent authorities may be informed with a view to priority being given to her release and dispatch to Shanghai as soon as possible, to assist with pilotage of Allied shipping.

4. I understand that a pilot vessel from Shanghai has already been located and it is possible that it may be the "SHIN YANGTSE" under a Japanese name.

SUBJECT : Instructions Concerning the Surrender of Arms  
by the Civilian Population of Japan.

1. The following instructions supplement those issued by this headquarters in a Radiogram to the Imperial Japanese Government, above subject, dated 24 September 1945:

a. The Imperial Japanese Government shall surrender all firearms, swords, bayonets, daggers and other weapons, ammunition, explosives and components thereof collected from the civilian population to U.S. Army representatives in accordance with instructions issued by the Commanding Generals of the Sixth and Eighth Armies and the Commander of the Fifth Fleet, USN.

(1) The following exceptions will be allowed:

- (a) Firearms and knives required for hunting purposes, and swords considered objects of art.
- (b) Explosives required by legitimate business or industrial organizations.

(2) Individual licenses and permits covering the above exceptions will be issued by the Imperial Japanese Government and reported monthly, by list, to this headquarters, the Commanding Generals of the Sixth and Eighth Armies, the Commander of the Fifth Fleet, USN, or other appropriate Occupation Force Commanders.

(3) Individuals and organizations duly licensed to retain and use firearms and explosives, or components thereof, shall comply with such instructions as may be issued by the appropriate Occupation Force Commander in the area.

b. The Imperial Japanese Government shall take whatever action is necessary to comply with these instructions and prevent violations or deception in the issuance of licenses or permits. Initial collection of arms, ammunition and explosives and issuance of licenses for authorized retentions shall be completed by 1 December 1945. Such subsequent checks and inspections shall be conducted as are necessary to detect violations and evasions of these instructions.

c. The Imperial Japanese Government shall submit a complete report to this headquarters not later than 1 December 1945 and monthly thereafter, indicating the number of firearms and weapons and the amount of explosives or components thereof confiscated or licensed, by type and location, together with copies of instructions to prefectural governors and Police Chiefs and proclamations issued to effectuate the instructions issued by this headquarters.

SUBJECT : Violation of Religious Freedom.

1. The attention of this headquarters has been directed to certain acts on the part of officials of educational institutions, founded and supported by Christians of foreign nations, which represent inexcusable and unjustifiable subversion of such institutions to militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ends.

2. The case of Rikkyo Gakuin (St. Paul's University and Middle School) is cited as a specific example of such flagrant violation of religious freedom and unwarranted vandalism.

a. Originally founded in 1874, Rikkyo Gakuin was given a charter on 7 July 1931 by the Japanese Government. Articles of the Act of Incorporation state "the object of the Zeidan is to administer education in Japan in accordance with the principles of Christianity....."

b. In 1943, certain officials of the university, ignoring their obligations to maintain a Christian institution of learning, did, without provocation and with or without the approval of the Ministry of Education, abolish Christian services and teachings; caused the removal from office of Christian members of the faculty and the Board of Directors, and caused to be committed acts of vandalism in All Saints' Memorial Chapel and against other property of the university. Christianity was abolished by order in Rikkyo and the university Chapel was closed in January 1943.

3. No action has been taken by university officials or by the Ministry of Education since the termination of the war to rectify this violation of freedom of religion and of moral trust.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed immediately to:

a. Dismiss from their present positions, the following officials of Rikkyo Gakuin:

- (1) Kinzo Sambe, President (Socho)
- (2) Hidesaburo Hoashi, Dean (Gakkan) of the University and Principal of the Middle School

b. Direct that none of the individuals designated in paragraph 4a be re-employed or placed in any position in any public or private educational or religious institution or in any government position.

c. Direct that Rikkyo Gakuin be reorganized and henceforth conducted in accordance with the Articles of Incorporation.

d. Direct the conduct of a survey of all educational institutions in Japan, which were founded and maintained by missions or public contributions of Christians of foreign nations and deliver to this headquarters not later than 15 November 1945 a detailed report covering the following:

- (1) Name and location of institution.
- (2) List of all officials or faculty removed from office during the war, with reasons for removal.
- (3) List of individuals appointed or employed as replacements for individuals listed above (par d(2)), and the circumstances leading to their appointment.
- (4) Itemize all changes made affecting Christian worship and instruction.
- (5) Any acts of vandalism, destruction or damage of the institution's property, accompanied by details as to when, by whom and why such acts were committed.

1. By direction of the Allied Powers, the following instructions are given the Imperial Japanese Government for prompt compliance:

A. In countries where Sweden or Switzerland are acting as protecting powers over Japanese interests, with the exception of those countries enumerated in sub-paragraph B below, the protecting power concerned will be instructed by the Japanese Government to turn over intact and without delay to representatives of the four Allied Powers who have been instructed to receive them, physical custody of all Japanese diplomatic and consular property and archives in the country concerned. The protecting power, however, should continue to exercise routine functions of protection of Japanese nationals.

B. In the United Kingdom, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, China, the United States, the British Commonwealths, France and the Netherlands, including colonies and dependencies thereof, the protecting power concerned will be instructed by the Japanese Government to turn over intact and without delay to the government of the country in which they are located, physical custody of all Japanese diplomatic and consular property and archives in the country concerned.

C. In all neutral countries, the Japanese Government will instruct the Japanese mission in such country to turn over intact and without delay physical custody of all Japanese diplomatic and consular property and archives to representatives of the four Allied Powers who have been designated to receive them. Routine functions of protection of Japanese nationals in such neutral countries may be turned over to Sweden or Switzerland since these powers are acting as protecting powers for Japanese interests elsewhere.

D. The Japanese Government will immediately recall Japanese diplomatic and consular representatives in neutral countries and will cease further relations with foreign governments except as stated in sub-paragraphs A and C above, or in accordance with such procedures as are hereafter established.

2. Copies of all instructions issued to the protecting powers or to Japanese diplomatic representatives or consular officials in the several countries concerned in compliance with this directive, and a prompt report of action taken by the recipient of such instructions will be furnished at the earliest practicable date.

1. In order to eliminate from the educational system of Japan those militaristic and ultra-nationalistic influences which in the past have contributed to the defeat, war guilt, suffering, privation, and present deplorable state of the Japanese people; and in order to prevent the teachers and educational officials having military experience or affiliation; it is hereby directed that:

a. All persons who are known to be militaristic, ultra-nationalistic, or antagonistic to the objectives and policies of the occupation and who are at this time actively employed in the educational system of Japan, will be removed immediately and will be barred from occupying any position in the educational system of Japan.

b. All other persons now actively employed in the educational system of Japan will be permitted to retain their positions at the discretion of the Ministry of Education until further notice.

c. All persons who are members of or who have been demobilized from the Japanese military forces since the termination of hostilities, and who are not at this time actively employed in the educational system of Japan, will be barred from occupying any position in the educational system of Japan until further notice.

2. In order to determine which of those persons who are now actively employed in or who may in the future become candidates for employment in the educational system of Japan are unacceptable and must be removed, barred, and prohibited from occupying any position in the educational system of Japan, it is hereby directed that:

a. The Japanese Ministry of Education will establish suitable administrative machinery and procedures for the effective investigation, screening, and certification of all present and prospective teachers and educational officials.

Make the necessary arrangements with the other Ministries concerned to insure that each of the Reception Centers mentioned in paragraph 2 above is kept filled with outgoing repatriates to the capacities shown in paragraph 3a of Memo to the Japanese Government, file AG 370.5 (15 Oct 45) GC, dated 15 October 1945, subject: "Reception Centers in Japan for Processing Repatriates".

b. Scrutinize carefully the shipping schedules furnished so that Reception Centers do not become congested.

4. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will be guided by the following in preparing plans for the flow of repatriates to Reception Centers.

a. Koreans will be cleared from areas in the following order:

- (1) Moji - Shimonoseki - Hakata Area.
- (2) Osaka - Kobe Area.
- (3) Remainder of Japan.

b. Within the areas mentioned in paragraph 4a, above, priority for Koreans will be given, in order, to: demobilized soldiers, former forced laborers and other Koreans.

c. Controls will be established to fix Koreans desiring to return to Korea in their present abodes until they are directed to move under the provisions of this plan.

d. A special priority will be established for the repatriation of Chinese and Korean coal miners residing in Northern Honshu. They will be evacuated at a rate of 1000 per day beginning not later than 14 November 1945.

e. Chinese formerly domiciled in North China will be returned to Northern Chinese ports at a rate of not to exceed 10,000 per month. Those domiciled in Central China will be returned to Shanghai at a rate not to exceed 2,000 per month.

f. Empty spaces on vessels bound for northern Chinese ports will be filled with Koreans who will be offloaded in Korea.

g. Plans for the return of those individuals formerly domiciled in Formosa, the Ryukyus and South China will be deferred until further notice.

1. a. The following plan governing the repatriation of non-Japanese nationals to their respective homelands will be placed in effect without delay.

b. The entire plan revolves around the use of Reception Centers and the flow of non-Japanese to be repatriated through these centers in the numbers that can be accommodated by the available shipping.

c. Memo to the Japanese Government, file AG 370 (15 Oct 45)GC dated 15 October 1945, subject: "Reception Centers in Japan for Processing Repatriates" and Memo to the Japanese Government, file AG 091 (16 Oct 45)GC, dated 16 October 1945, subject: "Policies Governing Repatriation of Japanese Nationals in Conquered Territory" are included in and become part of this plan.

2. The following Reception Centers will be used to process non-Japanese repatriates leaving Japan:

- Senzaki. Primarily to process departing Koreans.
- Hakata Primarily to process departing Koreans and Chinese formerly domiciled in North China.

Kagoshima

Kagoshima Primarily to process departing Chinese formerly domiciled in Central China.

Kure Primarily to process departing Koreans and Chinese formerly domiciled in North and Central China. Will be used to lessen the load of, Senzaki, Hakata and Kagoshima.

3. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will:

a. Make the necessary arrangements with the other Ministries concerned to insure that each of the Reception Centers mentioned in paragraph 2 above is kept filled with outgoing repatriates to the capacities shown in paragraph 3a of Memo to the Japanese Government, file AG 370.5 (15 Oct 45) GC, dated 15 October 1945, subject: "Reception Centers in Japan for Processing Repatriates".

b. Scrutinize carefully the shipping schedules furnished so that Reception Centers do not become congested.

4. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will be guided by the following in preparing plans for the flow of repatriates to Reception Centers.

a. Koreans will be cleared from areas in the following order:

- (1) Moji - Shimonoseki - Hakata Area.
- (2) Osaka - Kobe Area.
- (3) Remainder of Japan.

b. Within the areas mentioned in paragraph 4a, above, priority for Koreans will be given, in order:

d. A special priority will be established for the repatriation of Chinese and Korean coal miners residing in Northern Honshu. They will be evacuated at a rate of 1000 per day beginning not later than 14 November 1945.

e. Chinese formerly domiciled in North China will be returned to Northern Chinese ports at a rate of not to exceed 10,000 per month. Those domiciled in Central China will be returned to Shanghai at a rate not to exceed 2,000 per month.

f. Empty spaces on vessels bound for northern Chinese ports will be filled with Koreans who will be offloaded in Korea.

g. Plans for the return of those individuals formerly domiciled in Formosa, the Ryukyus and South China will be deferred until further notice.

5. The Japanese Government will be furnished shipping schedules governing the movement of:

a. Japanese merchant and naval vessels in the same manner as at present.

b. United States Landing Ships, Tank, as they are established, through the same channels. Their schedules will indicate which LST's may be outloaded with Koreans, Chinese destined for Northern and Central China.
