SUBJECT : Whaling Industry.

1. From this date the operations of the Japanese whaling industry will be conducted in strict conformity with the terms of the International Conventions regarding whaling except insofar as inconsistent with previous or subsequent directives from this Headquarters.

2. The International Conventions with respect to whaling are:

- a. Convention for the Regulation of Whaling signed at Geneva, 24 September 1931.
- b. Agreement for the Regulation of Whaling, and Final Act signed at London, 8 June 1937.
- c. Protocol amending the Agreement for the Regulation of Whaling signed at London, June 1937, and Final Act of the Conference signed at London, 24 June 1938.

3. Statistical, biological and other reports as required under the terms of these Conventions will be submitted to this Headquarters.

4. Complete utilization will be made of the carcass of each whale taken by the Japanese whaling industry and, insofar as possible, the meat of the whales will be marketed as food.

SUBJECT : Request for termination of responsibility for distribution of relief supplies.

TO : Dr. Marcel Junod, Chief Of Japan Delegation of the International Red Cross Committee.

1. Your request that the International Red Cross delegation for Japan be relieved of further responsibility for the distribution of supplies left by allied prisoners of war and civilian internees is granted effective 15 November 1945; this authority was authorized by letter to you dated 26 October 1945 AG 400 (26 Sep 45) GA.
2. It is requested that a report be submitted to this headquarters as of 15 November 1945 showing the amount of supplies received by your committee from POW and civilian internee sources, the amounts distributed, balance on hand and the number of families or persons to whom supplies were issued. The report should also state the present location of stocks on hand.
3. On 15 November it is further requested that you relinquish custody of all remaining supplies to the U. S. Army or to an agency to be designated by this headquarters.
4. The services of the Japan Delegation, International Red Cross Committee, in aiding foreign nationals by the distribution of these supplies has been an important contribution to the task of maintaining health and welfare standards in Japan. Your work and that of your committee has been appreciated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the necessity for your withdrawal from further responsibility is regretted.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government shall:

a. Submit to this headquarters within ten days after the receipt of this memorandum the name, rank, title, and present location of the chief of the Kempei-Tai and his principal assistants including all headquarters officers; this information to apply, in the case of each such official and officer, to the persons who held office at the time of the dissolution of the organization.

b. Prepare and submit to this headquarters by 30 November 1945 a comprehensive report in English describing in detail the organization structure, functions, jurisdiction, channels of command, policies and methods of operation of the Kempei-Tai. The information requested is that which has application to the time of dissolution of the organization, but wherever information covering any earlier period is important for a proper understanding of the subject, such information is to be supplied. Six copies are requested.

(1) This report shall include but not be limited to the following specific matters:

- (a) Overall organization chart together with a description of the structure of each subdivision.
- (b) Statement describing the military, civil, judicial and administrative functions and activities of each subdivision.
- (c) List of all officers in each subdivision indicating name, rank and title of official position arranged by region or foreign territory in which such personnel operated as of the termination of hostilities.

SUBJECT : Dissolution of Holding Companies.

1. Receipt of the proposed plan for the dissolution of Mitsui Honsha, Yasuda Hozensha, Sumitomo Honsha and Kabushiki Kaisha Mitsubishi Honsha is acknowledged.

2. The plan proposed therein is approved in general and the Imperial Japanese Government will immediately proceed to effectuate it. No disposition of any property transferred to the Holding Company Liquidation Commission will be made without the prior approval of the Supreme Commander. You will submit the legislation through which the Holding Company Liquidation Commission will be created to the Supreme Commander for approval. It should be clearly understood that full freedom of action is retained by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to elaborate or modify the proposed plan at any time and to supervise and review its execution.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will immediately take such steps as are necessary effectually to prohibit the sale, gift, assignment or transfer of any moveable or immoveable property, including securities and other evidences of ownership, indebtedness or control by Mitsui Honsha, Yasuda Hozensha, Sumitomo Honsha and Kabushiki Kaisha Mitsubishi Honsha and the members of the Mitsui, Iwasaki, Yasuda and Sumitomo families or by any person acting on their behalf.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will deliver to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within fifteen days of the receipt of this memorandum, a report listing:

a. All moveable or immoveable property, securities and other evidences of ownership, indebtedness and control in which the members of the Mitsui, Iwasaki, Yasuda and Sumitomo families had any right, title or interest as of November 1st, 1945.

b. All transactions involving moveable or immoveable property, including securities and other evidences of ownership, indebtedness and control by any member of the Mitsui, Iwasaki, Yasuda and Sumitomo families since January 1st, 1945.

The Imperial Japanese Government will:

- 1. Direct Major General Ueda, General Endo, Lt Col Fujimura, former head of Fujiwara Hikan, Lt. Shunichi Matsunoto and Lt. Rensu Sawada, former vice foreign ministers, and Minister Iyon, former Minister for Publicity and Propaganda under Shindza Kodo, to be prepared to depart from Tokyo on or about 12 November for India.
- 2. Ensure that the above six (6) individuals are in Tokyo ready to depart on above date.

5. It is the intention of the Supreme Commander to dissolve the private industrial, commercial, financial and agricultural combines in Japan, and to eliminate undesirable interlocking directorates and undesirable intercorporate security ownership so as to:

a. Permit a wider distribution of income and of ownership of the means of production and trade.

b. Encourage the development within Japan of economic ways and institutions of a type that will contribute to the growth of peaceful and democratic forces. The plan proposed by the Imperial Japanese Government in the memorandum referred to in Paragraph 1 above will be considered only as a preliminary step toward these objectives.

6. Accordingly, the Imperial Japanese Government will promptly present for approval by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. Plans for the dissolution of industrial, commercial, financial and agricultural combines in addition to those mentioned in the communication acknowledged in Paragraph 1 hereof.

b. Its program to abrogate all legislative or administrative measures which create, foster or tend to strengthen private monopoly.

c. Its program for the enactment of such laws as will eliminate and prevent private monopoly and restraint of trade, undesirable interlocking directorates, undesirable intercorporate security ownership and the segregation of Banking from commerce, industry and agriculture and as will provide equal opportunity to firms and individuals to compete in industry, commerce, finance and agriculture on a democratic basis.

7. The Imperial Japanese Government will immediately take such steps as are necessary effectually to terminate and prohibit Japanese participation in private international cartels or other restrictive private international contracts or arrangements.

1. By direction of the Allied Powers, the following instructions are given the Imperial Japanese Government for prompt compliance.

a. The following named Japanese are alleged to have committed atrocities and offenses against persons of United Nations Nationals while confined in Prisoner of War Camps, Internment Camps, or Hospitals in Japan. These persons will be apprehended as suspected War Criminals and delivered to the Commanding General XI Corps, at XI Corps Stockade Number 2 (Omori Prison) Yokohama, at the earliest practicable date.

Its program for the enactment of such laws as will eliminate and prevent private monopoly and restraint of trade, undesirable interlocking directorates, undesirable intercorporate security ownership and assure the segregation of Banking from commerce, industry and agriculture and as will provide equal opportunity to firms and individuals to compete in industry, commerce, finance and agriculture on a democratic basis."

1. Attention is directed to the importance of the preparation without delay of reception centers for repatriation as directed in Memo to your government file AG 370.05 (15 Oct 45)GC, subject: "Reception Centers in Japan for Processing Repatriates." dated 15 October 1945. The rate of flow will increase sharply. Within a month 85 LST's capable of transporting 1000 individuals each will shuttle between China and Korea and the ports of Sasebo, Hakata, Kagoshima and Kure. Present plans contemplate increasing in the near future the rate of flow into Uraga and Yokohama to approach the combined capacity of those ports (10,000 daily). This increase will be carried in US amphibious and Liberty ships. In addition, 10 Liberty ships are being placed on shuttle between Ryukyus and Japan. Necessity for speed in the preparation of the reception centers is thus apparent.

2. In connection with the preparation of reception centers, it is reported to this headquarters that representatives of the Commanding General X Corps have been unable to establish contact with your official in charge of the reception center at Kure. It is desired that you direct him to report at once to a representative of the Commanding General X Corps at his headquarters in Kure.

3. Certain Japanese operated vessels are making unauthorized repatriation trips between Korea and ports in the Shimonoseki area and on the coast of Honshu to the north thereof. This traffic constitutes a serious health menace both to Korea and Japan. It is directed that necessary steps be taken by the Japanese Government to restrict vessels engaged in repatriation to those schedules and ports authorized by SCAJAP.

- (6) The Seal of the Imperial Japanese Government will be impressed in the lower left hand corner over the signature of above-mentioned representative.
- (7) Colonel A. W. STUART, Dai Ichi Building, will be consulted for any clarification of farther information regarding the printing of these credentials.

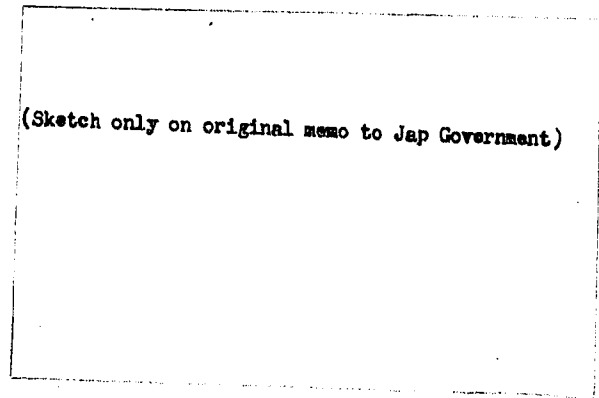

1. Reference is made to letter from First Demobilization Headquarters Liaison Commission, Yokohama file K-120 dated October 29, 1945.

2. The request to modify 115 tanks for use as bulldozers and 50 armored cars for tractors as stated in the reference letter, is approved.

3. Before these tanks (tanks to be Model 97 or Model 97 improved Medium Tanks only) and armored cars are placed into operation as bulldozers and tractors the following action will be taken by you to render these items useless as combat vehicles:

- a. All armament will be removed and destroyed.
- b. All fire control equipment and inter-communication equipment will be removed and destroyed.
- c. Turrets will be removed and the armor plate of the hull will be cut away as far as can be done without destroying the usefulness of the vehicle for its new purpose. In any case enough mutilation of the hull will be accomplished to make it impossible to replace the turret.

4. Spare parts will be obtained from stocks on hand only. The Commanding General Eighth U.S. Army will be furnished estimates as to the spare parts needed for two years operation.

5. The Commanding General Eighth U.S. Army has been charged with the supervision of this project. Direct arrangements will be made with him for the accomplishment of the modifications and clearance will be obtained from him before any of the converted vehicles are put into operation.

The evacuation of Lieutenant General Kozuki, Yoshio and the remainder of Headquarters, Seventeenth Area Army totalling about 230 individuals is to be accomplished on or about 21 November 1945 from Fusan. Southern Korea will then be cleared of Japanese naval and military personnel except for approximately 2650 kept at Fusan for assistance in processing civilian personnel.

 - a. Collections, structures and separate objects classed as "National Treasures", including important shrines and temples (the content of treasures or collections belonging to shrines and temples will be summarized).
 - b. Buildings and sites classed as "Protected Areas", including national parks, historic and scenic spots, and natural history preserves of importance.
 - c. Installations, (palaces, villas, etc.) of the Imperial Household Department.
 - (1) Currently used as places of residence by the Imperial family.
 - (2) Maintained as historic spots.
 - d. Museums and collections of the Imperial Household Department.

1. In the lists of cultural and religious works, collections, and sites which will be submitted by the Imperial Government in accordance with the provisions of the basic memorandum, it is desired that the following information be included:

- a. Name or names of the object, collection, structure or site; objects not part of a collection are to be listed separately; contents of collections are to be summarized.
- b. Name of owner or responsible agency.
- c. Exact location, including that of any war emergency repository for objects or collections.
- d. Extent of damage caused by combat operations or military occupation and time when the damage was done.
- e. Estimate of existing risks to preservation.
- f. Emergency repairs and protective measures already effective.

2. It is further desired that reports of damage and estimates of risk (d and e, paragraph 1) include the following entries where appropriate:

- a. Damage (extent of damage and time of occurrence to be indicated).
 - (1) No war damage - to be specifically stated wherever a structure, object or site has been free from injury in direct consequence of combat operations or military occupation.
 - (2) Bomb damage - structural disturbance from bombing, including that from blast. Shell damage should be recorded as such if this cause can be distinguished.
 - (3) Fire damage - destruction or defacement by fire originating from combat action or military occupation.
 - (4) Pillage - removal of objects or parts of objects or structures by personnel of the occupying forces.
 - (5) Abuse - disturbance, injury or defacement by personnel of the occupying forces.

In addition to the winter clothing and equipment being provided for use by Japanese repatriates returning from the Philippines in Japanese shipping as required by memorandum this Headquarters file AG 370.05 (15 Oct 45)GC, subject: "Reception Centers in Japan for Processing Repatriates," dated 15 October 1945, it is desired that winter clothing and equipment be provided for repatriates being returned from the Philippines to Japan in shipping provided by the Allied Powers.

2. It is therefore directed that you arrange to ship to Manila for the Commanding General, United States Army Forces, Western Pacific sufficient winter clothing and equipment to provide for 25,000 repatriates on the return trip to Japan in Allied shipping. This clothing and equipment is to be moved in Japanese shipping scheduled to sail to the Philippines and is to arrive at Manila by 1 December 1945 or as soon thereafter as practicable.

3. When the above equipment has been assembled and is ready for shipment this Headquarters will be informed of the name of the ship and estimated time of arrival at Manila.

2. Subject to the conditions and exceptions set forth in paragraph 3, the Ministry of Finance may grant general approval to the following transactions by branches or agencies in Japan of concerns with head offices abroad;

- a. The payment of wages, taxes and other expenses incurred in the normal operations of the branch or agency prior to 23 September 1945.
- b. The payment of any expenses incurred in maintaining and preserving the property of the branch or agency subsequent to 23 September 1945.
- c. The collection or payment of any claims or debts owed to or by such branch or agency and accruing by reason of operations prior to 23 September 1945.

3. a. There will be submitted to this Headquarters within 30 days reports on each branch or agency affected by paragraph 2 above. Reports will be submitted three copies in English and one copy in Japanese. Reports will contain the following information:

- (1) Name and address of the concern having branch or agency in Japan; address of branch or agency in Japan; principal products manufactured or merchandised in Japan and abroad.
- (2) Place of organization or incorporation of the concern and jurisdiction under which organized or incorporated.
- (3) Type of business and detailed description of the operations and activities of the concern in Japan and abroad from 1 June 1937 to the present time, including activities since 24 September 1945.

This memorandum shall not be deemed to constitute approval of any transaction which is prohibited by any provisions of any directive issued by this Headquarters other than paragraph 1d of the Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government file AG 130 (22 Sep 45) ESS, subject: "Control of Financial Transactions" and paragraph 1 of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government file AG 160 (30 Oct 45) ESS/PI, subject: "Contracts of Persons in Japan with Foreign Concerns".

d. Approval will not be given to the resumption of normal operations of branches or agencies in Japan of concerns with head offices abroad without prior approval of this Headquarters. Applications for permission to approve such resumption of operations by specific branches or agencies must be accompanied by the information specified in paragraph 3a above, if not already submitted prior to application.

4. Subject to the conditions set forth in paragraph 5, the Ministry of Finance may grant general approval for the payment of allowances to families in Japan of persons employed abroad by business concerns which have branch or head offices in Japan.

5. a. If not already submitted in connection with other applications, concerns paying allowances permitted in paragraph 4 will furnish the information specified in paragraph 3a.

b. Arrangements for payment of allowances must have been made prior to 23 September 1945 and allowances must not exceed those paid prior to such date.

c. Payment of allowances shall not be made from any fund or balance created by a transfer of funds to Japan subsequent to 15 August 1945.

6. Any ordinances, regulations or general licenses issued pursuant to this Memorandum must be approved by this Headquarters in advance of issuance.

It is desired that you make plans to place 1,000 Koreans aboard each of these LST's departing Sasebo. This requires a daily outgoing flow through the reception center at Sasebo of 3,000 Koreans. 1. Reference is made to CLO No. 526(2) requesting permission to revise the present system of collecting, pricing, and distributing perishable foods for consumption in urban areas.

2. The principal points in the proposed plan are:

a. Authorized Agricultural and Fishery Associations and agencies will collect all perishable foods to be sold by producers.

b. Authorized dealers from urban areas will negotiate with Agricultural and Fishery Associations for the bulk purchase of perishable foods.

c. Perishable foods will be distributed from urban markets to licensed retailers for resale to consumers through present rationing organizations.

d. Prices to consumers will be determined by the purchase price from producers' associations plus transportation, handling, and service costs. Prices will be supervised by the government and any profiteering by dealers, handlers, or interested agencies will be subject to penalties under existing laws and regulations.

e. Prices and quantities of foodstuffs to be distributed will be publically announced. Committees selected by members of street and neighborhood associations will supervise price and rationing controls over perishable food distribution to insure equal distribution to all citizens.

f. Farmers and fishermen will be provided daily necessities and inmut requirements at legal prices in proportion to the amounts of perishable foods sold to authorized purchasers.

g. Official prices and restriction of individual transportation of foodstuffs will be removed.

SUBJECT : Elimination of Undemocratic Motion Pictures.

16 November 1945

1. In the past, Japanese motion pictures have been utilized to propagate nationalistic, militaristic and feudalistic concepts; i.e., conformity to a feudal code, contempt for life, creation of the "Warrior Spirit", the uniqueness and superiority of the "Yamato" (Japanese race), the "special role of Japan in Asia", etc. Many such motion pictures are still being distributed and exhibited.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to:

a. Take immediate action to insure against the present or future sale, exchange or exhibition of any of the motion pictures on the attached inclosure.

b. Secure from the owners, producers or exhibitors of these pictures all prints of the same, whether positive or negative, sound or silent, in 16mm or 35mm width.

c. Direct the placing of these motion pictures, prints and negatives in a safe, fire-proof place in Tokyo, subject to the disposition of this headquarters.

d. Direct the producers to mark each film container with the title of each container's contents in English and Japanese.

- Reference is made to the memorandum from this Headquarters, file AG 150 (13 Oct 45), subject as above, dated 13 October 1945 and the reply of the Japanese Government dated 6 November 1945 on the above subject.
- The Japanese reply does not state that the summary of the charges in question is definitive and that no further claims will be presented. Such a statement will be included in the summary in accordance with the final sentence of the memorandum of 13 October 1945 from this Headquarters.
- It is assumed that the statement in the first sentence of paragraph 2 of the report submitted by the Japanese Government that "1, 176, 981.28 Yen, or Fr. 1,200,388.84 in Swiss currency", is an error in conversion. The report should be carefully checked to assure that there are no errors.
- A new summary of the charges in question should be prepared, incorporating the desired statement explained in paragraph 2. This report is to be submitted in quadruplicate, at least two copies of which will be signed.
