c. Action taken to comply with this memorandum.

SUBJECT : Clarification of Directive 3 as Regards Conversion

SUBJECT : Repatriation of Formosans from Japan.

1. Memorandum, Imperial Japanese Government, CLO No. 626(2), dated 18 November 1945, requested this headquarters to clarify the term "conversion" as applied to industrial installations in paragraph 3b of Directive No. 3, dated 22 September 1945.

1. Reference is made to the request in C.L.O. No. 661 (5.1) dated 20 November 1945, subject: same as above.

2. "Conversion" as used in paragraph 3b of the above directive is intended to apply to cases where the physical modification or conversion of the equipment or facilities of a plant is required before such plants, which were engaged in production of war materials, can begin production of consumer commodities. For example, a plant containing machines designed for the production of aircraft cannot be used for the production of consumer goods until the machinery itself is converted. In this case application for conversion shall be made as specified in paragraph 3b of Directive 3. A textile establishment formerly manufacturing military uniforms or blankets for military use can produce clothing and blankets for civilian use without conversion, and may immediately proceed to do so as directed in paragraph 3a of Directive 3.

2. Formosa has not been opened for repatriation. Therefore the repatriation of the Formosans, subject of cited reference, is not favorably considered.

You are directed to limit the shipment during this month to a total not exceeding 75,000 tons. No backlog accruing up to 1 November 1945 will be shipped unless specifically directed. 1. Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government, Subject: Reserve Supplies Held for Relief Distribution, AG 400 (22 Nov 45)PH, dated 22 Nov 1945, is hereby rescinded.
2. Receipt is acknowledged of your memorandum, file number 372, dated 26 October 1945 on the subject of materials, supplies and equipment to be turned over to the Imperial Japanese Government by the Allied Forces.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will furnish this headquarters without delay a detailed inventory of all stocks of staple foodstuffs and clothing listed in paragraph 3 (1) and 3 (2) of memorandum number 372, showing their exact location within each prefecture.
4. Prior to the distribution of any of the listed foodstuffs and clothing, and before 15 December 1945 a distribution plan will be submitted by the Imperial Japanese Government to this headquarters for approval. This plan will make provision for:
 - a. Control of relief distribution to be exercised by a central agency operating through prefectural governments;
 - b. A social welfare agency in each prefecture, staffed by personnel selected for their training and skill in the handling of welfare problems, and specifically not for their present or former military or naval status;
 - c. Eligibility for receipt of relief supplies based only upon individual need determined by family budgetary deficiency;
 - d. Prevention of the use of supplies in mass feeding or distribution schemes without specific authority from this headquarters;
 - e. Issuance of relief supplies without cost to the recipient;
 - f. The maintenance of a record for each family to whom supplies are issued containing necessary identifying data;

- (1) Number of non-Japanese repatriates being transported.
- (2) Number of rail cars in the train scheduled specifically to carry non-Japanese repatriates.
- (3) Destination of train.
- (4) Time required for round trip.

b. Submit requests to local military authorities in sufficient time to permit orders to be issued and guards to be placed aboard.

c. Provide suitable sleeping cars as quarters for US guards during entire trip. US guards will remain quartered aboard cars while in port area.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will insure that no discrimination will be exercised or permitted for or against any worker either in private or government work, in wages, hours or working conditions by reason of nationality, creed or social status.
2. Koreans, Formosans and Chinese nationals who elect to remain in Japan rather than to accept repatriation will be guaranteed the same rights, privileges and opportunities in employment as are extended to Japanese nationals in comparable circumstances.
3. Koreans, Formosans and Chinese nationals awaiting repatriation will be furnished opportunities to work for the occupation forces without discrimination. All such workers will be paid by the Imperial Japanese Government at the same rates as Japanese workers and will be extended all benefits granted Japanese nationals working for the occupation forces.
4. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to revoke, rescind and abrogate all laws, ordinances, rules, regulations and enactments of any kind or character which provide preferential employment and educational opportunities for demobilized military personnel solely on the basis of military service.

1. Reference is made to C.L.O. No. 613(5) from the Imperial Japanese Government, dated 17 November 1945, subject: "Carrying of American equipment by Japanese evacuees."

2. In order that maximum utility may be gained from American military clothing and equipment issued by competent authority to Japanese evacuees, the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take the following action:

a. Collect all American clothing and equipment in the possession of repatriates as they are processed through reception centers.

b. Re-outfit such personnel when necessary with Japanese clothing and equipment.

c. American clothing and equipment, collected as directed in Par a above, may be used by the Japanese Government for relief purposes subject to the following:

(1) All clothing or equipment of textile or fabric material will be dyed a distinctive color prior to issue.

(2) All equipment such as shoes, canteens etc. which cannot be dyed, will be marked or branded in some easily identifiable manner.

(3) Unless so dyed or marked items will be confiscated by Allied authorities.

3. The Japanese Imperial Government will:

a. Report to this headquarters at the earliest practicable date the color of dye and the type marking to be used for the above purpose.

b. Report to this headquarters as of the last day of each month, commencing 31 December 1945, the quantities of each item of American clothing and equipment dyed and marked and re-issued to needy individuals during the past month.

The Imperial Japanese Government will not print or issue, nor permit the printing or issuance of new types or series of Bank of Japan notes, state notes, subsidiary currency or any other currency without the previous consent of this Headquarters. No planning for or designing of new types or series of bank notes, state notes or other currency shall be initiated without first submitting a complete report to this Headquarters, stating the reasons for, and the types and quantities of new notes and currencies desired.

2. On or before the tenth day of each month, the Ministry of Finance will submit a report to this Headquarters on the present note issue of the Bank of Japan as of the end of the previous month, showing for each denomination: Amount in Circulation, Amount Unissued, Amount Withdrawn and Cancelled Total Amount Printed. The first report will be submitted on or before 10 December 1945. A sample of the report form will be submitted to this Headquarters for approval within five days from receipt of this memorandum.

In addition to the measures outlined in memorandum of 21 November 1945 for the Imperial Japanese Government, Subject: "Prevention and Control of Typhus Fever in Japan" (Reference: AG 710 (21 Nov 45)PH), it is desired that the responsible Japanese agency immediately institute further measures for the control of typhus fever as follows:

- a. Disinfestation by use of Insecticide, spray, DDT, residual effect at thirty (30) day intervals of the following:
 - (1) All railway cars assigned for use of Allied military personnel.
 - (2) All ferries operating between Aomori and Hakodate.
 - (3) Such other public conveyances that may be assigned for use of Allied military personnel.

b. After each disinfestation all conveyances will be plainly and uniformly marked as directed by the military command concerned to show date and place of treatment.

- 2. Military commands have been authorized to make Insecticide spray and equipment available as required for disinfestation.
- 3. Japanese civilian personnel will be provided by the Japanese agency concerned to carry out required disinfestation procedures.
- 4. United States military personnel will be available only for instruction and supervision of Japanese civilian personnel required to carry out the provisions of this memorandum.

This Headquarters will not grant permission for any delay in the delivery of suspected war criminals to the designated place of custody.

1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government instruct the Bank of Japan to transfer all cash, negotiable securities, other negotiable financial paper and other readily transportable property of high value, now in Japan, and belonging to subject organizations, to the vaults of the Bank of Japan for safekeeping.

2. It is therefore directed that these personnel be delivered to the Sugamo Prison with the least practicable delay in accordance with the request contained in Memorandum AG 000.5 LS, dated 6 November 1945, subject as above.

2. For each branch of the closed organizations an accurate inventory will be prepared at time of removal of the property, and the property of each such branch will be carefully segregated from property of other organizations, and earmarked. The preparation of inventories, transfer and placing in storage will be conducted in the presence of representatives of this Headquarters. Three copies, in English, of such inventories with a report of the action taken and location of vaults of storage will be furnished to this Headquarters and two copies to the Ministry of Finance.

Memorandum this headquarters dated 21 November 1945, subject: "Regulations governing Communication over International, Foreign and External Telegraph, Telephone and Wireless Facilities," and any subsequent memoranda governing censorship will apply to this service, except that sender composition messages shall be in clear English text and contain no code.

4. There is no objection to the rates which you propose for the transmission of prepaid sender composition messages from Tokyo to the United States. Those rates are to be as follows:

5. Every effort will be made to apportion evenly the total volume of sender composition message traffic to the United States among the various American international telegraph companies.

The initial stations for the acceptance of sender composition messages in the Tokyo area shall be established by the Imperial Japanese Government at American Red Cross, Bankers Club, Marunouchi, Kojimachi Ward, Tokyo and the American Red Cross Club, Finance Building, Kasumigaseki, Kojimachi Ward, Tokyo. Other stations will be established as rapidly as possible as they are required. In this connection, this headquarters has under contemplation permitting the opening of a radio circuit to the United States from Osaka. In such event, sender composition message service in the Osaka area will be provided. It is understood that in the event of the establishment of sender composition message service from regions more than 50 miles from Tokyo (and more than 50 miles from Osaka, in the event the Osaka-United States circuit is opened), an additional 30 sen per word will be charged, to cover land haul. No objection to this land haul service charge is made by this headquarters at this time.

7. The sender of a message will be required to state on the message the following information: If military personnel his name, rank, serial number, unit or organization and APO number; if a civilian, his name, address in Japan, and military unit to which accredited.

8. Copies of all messages sent or received will be kept on file for a minimum period of one (1) year.

9. All messages received from the United States addressed to personnel in Japan will be forwarded by the Japanese Government to the Postal Officer, United States Army, APO 181, Tokyo.

- c. 401489 Sgt Brown, D. S. left Rabaul Camp in late May or early June 1942 with 2 American airmen PW, Sgt Lutz and Cpl Reid, both of whom have since confirmed that Brown was separated from them on the wharf at Rabaul, and they do not know whether he travelled by the same vessel or remained at Rabaul.

2. It is not desired to provide masters of Japanese repatriation ships with foreign currency for the purchase of supplies locally in foreign ports.

3. Arrangements are being made with the authorities who control ports outside of Japan to accept receipts for necessary supplies issued to Japanese ships servicing those ports.

4. Masters of Japanese vessels engaged in repatriation will be instructed to furnish quantitative receipts for supplies obtained outside of Japan. Receipts will specify amount and kind of supplies and whether supplies will be used for Japanese troops or civilians.

5. The Japanese Government will provide fuel, fresh water and victuals for all vessels engaged in repatriation to the maximum extent practicable. Accordingly Japanese vessels will obtain supplies at overseas ports in minimum amounts necessary to complete their scheduled voyages.

2. You are directed to submit to this headquarters not later than 22 December 1945 a list of pharmaceutical wholesale houses who will receive and have custody of such military narcotic stocks, subject to the approval of this headquarters.

3. The list of pharmaceutical wholesale houses submitted for approval will consist of one firm in Hokkaido and three firms in the Eighth Army area of Honshu; and four firms in the Sixth Army area including one in Shikoku and one in Kyushu. The following information will be furnished with the list submitted:

- Name and complete address of firm.
- Name and position of responsible members of firm.
- Facilities for securely storing narcotics.

4. After Japanese military medical stocks are released to the custody of these approved wholesale drug firms a report will be rendered by each such firm so as to reach this headquarters within ten days after the last day of each month. This monthly report will be certified to by a responsible official of the firm and will contain the following information regarding Japanese military narcotics stocks:

- Inventory of stocks on hand on the first day of each month or in the first instance when custody of stocks is assumed.
- Quantity of stocks disposed of during the month, showing in each instance the date and to whom released and authorization for release.
- Inventory of stocks on hand on the last day of each month.

SUBJECT : Use of Maizuru and Ominato Navy Yards for repair of Japanese merchant shipping and vessels engaged in minesweeping.

1. Reference is made to letter of the Imperial Japanese Government N.D. 151 dated 15 October 1945 and to Memorandum from this headquarters, AG 388.3 (7 Nov 45)GD.
2. Recent review of ship repair requirements reveals the necessity for establishing additional repair facilities. Accordingly the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to place in operation those facilities at the Maizuru and Ominato Navy Yards which can be used for the repair of Japanese merchant shipping and vessels engaged in minesweeping. Facilities which do not contribute to such repair will not be reactivated.
3. The Commanding General 6th US Army has an operational requirement for about 50% of the shops at Maizuru Navy Yard until 1 February 1946. This requirement has first priority and will be coordinated with repair reactivation measures undertaken in accordance with this directive.
4. This directive does not authorize deferment of demobilization of Naval personnel currently employed at these or other Navy Yards. It is contemplated that personnel requirements to place Maizuru and Ominato Navy Yards in operation will be met entirely from civilian sources.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum this Headquarters AG 004 (8 Dec 45)ESS, subject: Establishment of a Schedule of Restricted Concerns.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate action to assure that except as otherwise authorized or directed by this Headquarters each concern listed on the "Schedule of Restricted Concerns" will comply with the following directions:
 - a. All cash on hand other than that customarily required for payroll and petty cash expenditures will be promptly deposited in the accounts of such concerns with banks in Japan.
 - b. The proceeds of all sales and loans and all other receipts and income from every source will be promptly deposited upon receipt in the bank accounts of such concerns.
 - c. No payment, transfer, or withdrawal from any account will be made which is not incidental to the normal course of business of the concern.
 - d. No sale, transfer, or other disposition of any capital assets including lands, buildings, major items of equipment and securities will be made.
 - e. No other property will be sold, conveyed, distributed or otherwise disposed of except in the normal course of business and for adequate consideration, and no act will be performed for the purpose of or which has the effect of dissipating assets.
 - f. No new stock or other participating share interest, however described, will be authorized or issued, and the rights and privileges of any existing stock or other participating share interests will not be reduced or added to or otherwise modified.
 - g. No bonded indebtedness will be authorized or created and no loans of any other character will be obtained, except in the normal course of business.

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BASIC: Ltr, GHQ, SCAP, to IJ Government, file AG 300.8 (8 Dec 45)ESS-AC, dtd 8 Dec 45, subj: "Regulations Affecting Restricted Concerns".

h. No dividends will be paid or declared.

i. No salary payments in excess of those paid in June, 1945 will be made to the executive officers, including but not limited to, the president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, directors, managers, advisors and auditors. No bonuses, retirement pay, severance allowances or other emoluments and benefits, except periodic salary payments, will be paid to such executive officers.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will promptly obtain and furnish to this Headquarters statements from each firm listed on the "Schedule of Restricted Concerns" specifying all payments other than periodic salary payments made on or since 1 July 1945, to any person who on or since such date was an executive officer of such firm and the basis for such payments.

4. Request for approval of any transaction covered by paragraph 2 of this memorandum will be accompanied by the written recommendations of the Minister of Finance, and by such additional data as may be necessary for a thorough understanding of the transaction concerned.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government will acknowledge receipt of this memorandum and promptly report the action taken by it in compliance therewith.
