MEMORANDUM FOR: THE IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Establishment of a Schedule of Restricted Concerns.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum this Headquarters, AG 004 (31 Oct 45)ESS, subject: Sale or Transfer of Securities of Certain Business Firms and to Central Liaison Office Memorandum No LO 24, dated 29 November 1945 same subject.

2. It will be considered a sufficient compliance with the terms of the reference memorandum of this Headquarters if the action directed therein is applied to the capital stocks, bonds, debentures, voting trusts or other forms of capital securities issued by the holding companies and subsidiaries listed on the inclosure attached hereto. This list hereafter will be referred to as the "Schedule of Restricted Concerns".

3. a. Sales, trades, pledges or other forms of transfers will be exempted from the requirements of the reference memorandum if both of the following exist:

- (1) Neither the beneficial owner nor the record owner of the securities desired to be transferred or otherwise dealt in owns or controls directly or indirectly more than 1% of the outstanding securities of the issue of which his securities are a part.
- (2) The person by whom or on whose behalf the securities are to be acquired does not, and will not by such acquisition, own or control directly or indirectly more than 1% of the securities of the issue proposed to be acquired.

b. In computing the holdings of any person, the combined holdings of his immediate family shall be considered as his holdings.

c. For the purposes of the reference memorandum the following will not be considered as a "sale, trade or other transfer adjustment" and are therefore exempted from its provisions:

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Application of Memorandum regarding Elimination of War Profits and Reorganization of National Finances (AG 121.7 24 Nov 45).

1. Reference is made to letter of 1 December 1945 from the Liaison Office, Ministry of Finance (LO 26).

2. The language in paragraph 4 of the subject memorandum *** any claim arising *** from war damage *** includes claims arising from measures taken to prevent war damage.

3. The words *** agencies or instrumentalities *** where used in paragraph 8 of the subject memorandum do not include private banks or other private financial institutions. Special banks and the Deposit Fund Section of the Money and Banking Bureau of the Ministry of Finance may continue their normal credit functions insofar as they do not conflict with other portions of the subject memorandum and provided that they shall not be permitted to issue bonds, debentures or any other securities directly or indirectly guaranteed by the government except as authorized by this Headquarters.

4. Paragraph 8-d of the subject memorandum does not apply to subsidies, tax exemptions, tax allotments, rebates, or any similar benefits granted by existing legislation.

5. Direct communication between the Ministry of Finance and interested staff sections of this Headquarters is hereby authorized to implement the subject memorandum.

MEMORANDUM FOR: THE IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Applications for Reconversion of Industrial Plants.

1. Reference is made to your CLO No. 659(2.3), dated 20 November 1945 in which you request that a standard form be adopted for use in applications to the occupation forces for reconversion of industrial plants and in which you asked that the procedure for submission of such applications be revised so that the applications may be made to General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander rather than to the Sixth and Eighth Armies.

2. On 7 November 1945, this headquarters forwarded to the Sixth and Eighth Armies a standard form to be used with applications for reconversion and suggested that the two armies instruct Japanese authorities in the use of the forms. You will obtain all necessary information and instructions in this matter from the Sixth and Eighth Armies.

3. Applications for conversion will not be accepted by this headquarters. You will continue to address them to the Sixth and Eighth Armies or such subordinate headquarters as those armies may direct.

2. Compliance with memorandum from this headquarters subject: Official Relations Between Japanese Government and Representatives of Neutral Nations, file AG 091.1 (4 Nov 45)GS, will not relieve the Japanese Government of its responsibility to provide suitable quarters, fuel, subsistence, medical and other care to foreign diplomats on the standard scale and in accord with international custom as announced in memorandum from this headquarters, subject: Treatment of Foreign Diplomats in Japan, file AG 091.112 (21 Oct 45)GD.
3. Such contacts will be maintained with foreign diplomats as may be necessary to provide them with food and other facilities in accord with paragraph 2 above. Official matters such as covered in paragraph 1 above will not be discussed.

SUBJECT : Relief and Welfare Plans.

1. Imperial Japanese Government will submit to this headquarters, by 31 December 1945, a detailed and comprehensive plan for providing food, clothing, housing, medical care, financial assistance, and welfare services to unemployed and other needy persons in Japan during the period January-June 1946.

2. The plan will include:

- a. A statement of the basis used in calculating requirements;
- b. A list, by prefecture, of the estimated number of persons who will monthly require direct assistance because of unemployment, physical incapacity, or other cause of dependency;
- c. A description of the local administrative machinery to be used for investigating and meeting relief needs, including a statement of personnel policy;
- d. The method of securing supplies, materials, and shelter from the overall sources available to the economy of Japan;
- e. Estimated monthly cost of relief by prefecture.

3. It is the intention of this directive to require the development of adequate measures for the care of persons whose financial and/or other resources are inadequate to maintain minimum living standards during the period indicated. The Imperial Japanese Government will inaugurate immediately necessary measures to prevent any person or group of persons in Japan from being discriminated against in the distribution of available supplies because of inability to work, inability to obtain remunerative employment, or for political, religious or economic beliefs.

4. In the event that current relief legislation, appropriations and/or administrative facilities are believed to be inadequate to prevent discrimination against unemployed and other needy persons in the distribution of available supplies, the reply to this memorandum will set forth proposed new legislation, appropriations and/or improved relief administrative facilities

which will be developed, with the anticipated date of their inauguration. - e. Authoritative government control over farmers and farm organizations without regard for farmer interests.

Arbitrary crop quotas established by disinterested control associations often restrict the farmer in the cultivation of crops for his own needs or economic advancement.

Emancipation of the Japanese farmer cannot begin until such basic farm evils are uprooted and destroyed.

3. The Japanese Imperial Government is therefore ordered to submit to this Headquarters on or before 15 March 1946 a program of rural land reform. This program shall contain plans for:

- a. Transfer of land ownership from absentee land owners to land operators.
- b. Provisions for purchase of farm lands from non-operating owners at equitable rates.
- c. Provisions for tenant purchase of land at annual installments commensurate with tenant income.
- d. Provisions for reasonable protection of former tenants against reversion to tenancy status. Such necessary safeguards should include:
 - (1) Access to long and short term farm credit at reasonable interest rates.
 - (2) Measures to protect the farmer against exploitation by processors and distributors.
 - (3) Measures to stabilize prices of agricultural produce.
 - (4) Plans for the diffusion of technical and other information of assistance to the agrarian population.
 - (5) A program to foster and encourage an agricultural cooperative movement free of domination by non-agrarian interests and dedicated to the economic and cultural advancement of the Japanese farmer.

6. The regular ten-day report of the Bank of Japan will be prepared in accordance with the form now in use. The special ten-day report of the Bank of Japan will be prepared in the same form as the daily statement of assets and liabilities now employed by the Bank of Japan. The monthly report of the Deposit Funds Management Bureau will be in the same form as the present quarterly report issued by that Bureau. 1. The Supreme Commander desires factual information on the nutritional health and actual food consumption and food requirements in Japan.
2. The Japanese Government is directed to establish study groups of properly qualified physicians and nutritionists who will conduct nutrition surveys among the civilian population. These groups will gather factual data on the physical status and the food consumption of individuals, using statistical sampling methods and areas approved by this headquarters. Urban areas are of primary concern and initial surveys will include the largest cities.
3. The methods to be employed by these survey groups and their work in the field will be standardized, coordinated and directed by a central agency in the Japanese Government in accordance with plans submitted to and approved in advance by this Headquarters.
4. A complete operational plan for this work will be submitted to this Headquarters for approval not later than 20 December 1945.
5. The operational plan will be put into effect immediately upon approval. English translations of survey data received from the field will be submitted to this Headquarters each week. Final compilations and analysis of the data will be submitted not later than one week after any one survey is completed.

1. The action taken by the Imperial Japanese Government to implement paragraph 3 of the directive of this headquarters, subject, "Production of Coal", AG 463.3 (6 Dec 45)GD is considered to be inadequate and unsatisfactory.
2. The representatives which the Japanese Government sent to this headquarters at the end of the 48 hour period were not qualified to discuss the overall aspects of the coal production problem. Neither were they in any official position to give authoritative guarantees that positive and aggressive action had been or will be taken by the Japanese Government to insure the coordination of all agencies which the solution of this problem requires.
3. Rather than a summary of positive action taken by the Japanese Government in compliance with the directive AG 463.3 (6 Dec 45)GD, the report submitted by the representatives of the Japanese Government was a lengthy narrative of programs and interim measures taken or proposed during the past three months. All information contained in this report was already well known to this headquarters. The issuance of the directive AG 463.3 (6 Dec 45) clearly indicates the position of this headquarters as regards the inadequacy and the unsatisfactory state of current plans and action.
4. As a case in point, the attention of the Japanese representatives was called to the current strike in Hokkaido. They were reminded that on 5 November, the Minister of Welfare issued an order requiring all Prefectural Governors to appoint mediation boards to settle labor disputes. The representatives stated the current strike had not been referred to such a board and that as far as was known no such board existed in the prefectures of this current strike. You are directed to inform this headquarters without delay

SUBJECT : Use of Highways by U. S. Army.

1. A study has been conducted to determine the probable general extent and severity of U. S. Army traffic upon the road system of Japan. The attached map shows in blue color the roads over which it is expected the heaviest concentrations of Army traffic in each general area will pass. Roads indicated in red color will probably sustain medium amounts of Army traffic, while those left uncolored will sustain little or no Army traffic. This does not include short sections of road leading to unit bivouac areas and various other Army installations.

2. It is understood that the Road Section of the Public Works Bureau, under the Japanese Home Ministry is interested in this information in order to plan its overall post-war road expansion, rehabilitation and maintenance program. The attached map is furnished solely for information purposes in this respect and does not constitute a directive to the Japanese government to undertake construction, repair or maintenance of any sort upon the road system. It merely indicates those roads which it may be expected will be subjected to the most deterioration from Army traffic under the present disposition of occupation forces.

3. Specific demands for repair, maintenance and improvement of certain delineated sections of roads will continue to be placed by field agencies.

2. a. Commencing on 14 December 1945 and on alternate days thereafter Landing Ships, Tank will discharge at Kagoshima 2400 Japanese repatriates from North China. The vessels will return to China empty until further orders.
- b. It has come to the attention of this headquarters that reception center facilities at Kagoshima are being used to permanently house Ryukyans. The repatriation of Ryukyans has not been authorized and the Japanese Government has been so informed on numerous occasions.
- c. In accordance with provisions of memorandum mentioned in paragraph 1 above, the reception center at Kagoshima was established to process 3000 incoming repatriates and a like number of outgoing repatriates daily.
3. In view of the above the Japanese Government will:
 - a. Take immediate steps to clear the reception center at Kagoshima of all Ryukyans and care for them elsewhere.
 - b. Be prepared to receive, process and evacuate the repatriates arriving from China commencing on 14 December.

d. Additional schedules will be furnished as they are established.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.
SUBJECT : Reactivation of facilities at Kure Navy Yard.

1. You are directed to place in operation those facilities at the Kure Navy Yard which can be used for salvage and for the maintenance and repair of merchant and demilitarized Naval vessels. Facilities which do not contribute to this purpose will not be reactivated.
2. This directive does not authorize deferment of demobilization of Naval personnel currently employed at this or other Navy Yards. It is contemplated that personnel requirements to place Kure in operation will be met entirely from civilian sources.
3. You will establish at Kure a salvage and scrap center to accomplish salvage, scrapping or stripping of usable parts of shipping in the vicinity which is beyond repair.
4. Reactivation of industrial facilities directed herein will not interfere with the operation of port facilities required for the logistic support of occupation forces.

SUBJECT : Formosans Encamped in Vicinity of Atsugi Airfield.

- Reference is made to Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government from this headquarters dated 13 December 1945, file AG 370.05 (13 Dec 45)GC, subject: "Formosan Repatriation."
- It is reported by Commanding General Eighth United States Army that 7,600 Formosans, encamped in the vicinity of Atsugi Airfield, have been the source of considerable trouble to the local military authorities and constitute a potential threat to the security of the airfield.
 - The Choun Maru is scheduled to depart from Uraga 17 December for Formosa, details are contained in memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 above.
 - Additional shipping to Formosa will be scheduled in the near future.
- The Imperial Japanese Government will:
 - Give first priority to the evacuation of the 7,600 Formosans now encamped in the vicinity of Atsugi Airfield in their plans for repatriation of Formosans in accordance with shipping schedules as published by SCAJAP.
 - Embark 2,000 of the subject 7,600 Formosans now encamped in vicinity of Atsugi Airfield on the Choun Maru scheduled to depart from Uraga 17 December (same instructions given orally to Mr. Ushiba, C.L.O. on 15 December).
 - Take immediate steps to exercise firmer control over Formosans now encamped in vicinity of Atsugi Airfield until their evacuation is completed.

MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Abolition of Governmental Sponsorship, Support, Perpetuation, Control, and Dissemination of State Shinto (Kokka Shinto, Jinja Shinto)

1. In order to free the Japanese people from direct or indirect compulsion to believe or profess to believe in a religion or cult officially designated by the state, and

In order to lift from the Japanese people the burden of compulsory financial support of an ideology which has contributed to their war guilt, defeat, suffering, privation, and present deplorable condition, and

In order to prevent a recurrence of the perversion of Shinto theory and beliefs into militaristic and ultra-nationalistic propaganda designed to delude the Japanese people and lead them into wars of aggression, and

In order to assist the Japanese people in a rededication of their national life to building a new Japan based upon ideals of perpetual peace and democracy,

It is hereby directed that:

a. The sponsorship, support, perpetuation, control, and dissemination of Shinto by the Japanese national, prefectural, and local governments, or by public officials, subordinates, and employees acting in their official capacity are prohibited and will cease immediately.

b. All financial support from public funds and all official affiliation with Shinto and Shinto shrines are prohibited and will cease immediately.

(1) While no financial support from public funds will be extended to shrines located on public reservations or parks, this prohibition will not be construed to preclude the Japanese government from continuing to support the areas on which such shrines are located.

(2) Private financial support of all Shinto shrines which have been previously supported in whole or in part by public funds will be permitted, provided such private support is entirely voluntary and is in no way derived from forced or involuntary contributions.

c. All propagation and dissemination of militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology in Shinto doctrines, practices, rites, ceremonies, or observances, as well as in the doctrines, practices, rites, ceremonies, and observances of any other religion, faith, sect, creed, or philosophy, are prohibited and will cease immediately.

d. The Religious Functions Order relating to the Grand Shrine of Ise and the Religious Functions Order relating to State and other Shrines will be annulled.

e. The Shrine Board (Jinji-in) of the Ministry of Home Affairs will be abolished, and its present functions, duties, and administrative obligations will not be assumed by any other governmental or tax-supported agency.

f. All public educational institutions whose primary function is either the investigation and dissemination of Shinto or the training of a Shinto priesthood will be abolished and their physical properties diverted to other uses. Their present functions, duties, and administrative obligations will not be assumed by any other governmental or tax-supported agency.

g. Private educational institutions for the investigation and dissemination of Shinto and for the training of a priesthood for Shinto will be permitted and will operate with the same privileges and be subject to the same controls and restrictions as any other private educational institution having no affiliation with the government; in no case, however, will they receive support from public funds, and in no case will they propagate and disseminate militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology.

h. The dissemination of Shinto doctrines in any form by any means in any educational institution supported wholly or in part by public funds is prohibited and will cease immediately.

(1) All teachers' manuals and textbooks now in use in any educational institution supported wholly or in part by public funds will be censored, and all Shinto doctrine will be deleted. No teachers' manual or textbook which is published in the future for use in such institutions will contain any Shinto doctrine.

- (2) No visits to Shinto shrines and no rites, practices, or ceremonies associated with Shinto will be conducted or sponsored by any educational institution supported wholly or in part by public funds.

i. Circulation by the government of "The Fundamental Principles of the National Structure" (Kokutai no Hongi), "The Way of the Subject" (Shinmin no Michi), and all similar official volumes, commentaries, interpretations, or instructions on Shinto is prohibited.

j. The use in official writings of the terms "Greater East Asia War" (Dai Toa Sensu), "The Whole World under One Roof" (Hakkai Ichi-ni), and all other terms whose connotation in Japanese is inextricably connected with State Shinto, militarism, and ultra-nationalism is prohibited and will cease immediately.

k. God-shelves (kamidana) and all other physical symbols of State Shinto in any office, school, institution, organization, or structure supported wholly or in part by public funds are prohibited and will be removed immediately.

l. No official, subordinate, employee, student, citizen, or resident of Japan will be discriminated against because of his failure to profess and believe in or participate in any practice, rite, ceremony, or observance of State Shinto or of any other religion.

m. No official of the national, prefectural, or local government, acting in his public capacity, will visit any shrine to report his assumption of office, to report on conditions of government or to participate as a representative of government in any ceremony or observance.

2. a. The purpose of this directive is to separate religion from the state, to prevent misuse of religion for political ends, and to put all religions, faiths, and creeds upon exactly the same legal basis, entitled to precisely the same opportunities and protection. It forbids affiliation with the government and the propagation and dissemination of militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology not only to Shinto but to the followers of all religions, faiths, sects, creeds, or philosophies.

b. The provisions of this directive will apply with equal force to all rites, practices, ceremonies, observances, beliefs, teachings, mythology, legends, philosophy, shrines, and physical symbols associated with Shinto.

c. The term State Shinto within the meaning of this directive

will refer to that branch of Shinto (Kokka Shintō or Jinja Shintō) which by official acts of the Japanese Government has been differentiated from the religion of Sect Shinto (Shūha Shintō or Kyōha Shintō) and has been classified a non-religious national cult commonly known as State Shinto, National Shinto, or Shrine Shinto.

d. The term Sect Shinto (Shūha Shintō or Kyōha Shintō) will refer to that branch of Shinto (composed of 13 recognized sects) which by popular belief, legal commentary, and the official acts of the Japanese Government has been recognized to be a religion.

e. Pursuant to the terms of Article I of the Basic Directive on "Removal of Restrictions on Political, Civil, and Religious Liberties" issued on 4 October 1945 by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in which the Japanese people were assured complete religious freedom,

(1) Sect Shinto will enjoy the same protection as any other religion.

(2) Shrine Shinto, after having been divorced from the state and divested of its militaristic and ultra-nationalistic elements, will be recognized as a religion if its adherents so desire and will be granted the same protection as any other religion in so far as it may in fact be the philosophy or religion of Japanese individuals.

f. Militaristic and ultra-nationalistic ideology, as used in this directive, embraces those teachings, beliefs, and theories which advocate or justify a mission on the part of Japan to extend its rule over other nations and peoples by reason of:

(1) The doctrine that the Emperor of Japan is superior to the heads of other states because of ancestry, descent, or special origin.

(2) The doctrine that the people of Japan are superior to the people of other lands because of ancestry, descent or special origin.

(3) The doctrine that the islands of Japan are superior to other lands because of divine or special origin.

(4) Any other doctrine which tends to delude the Japanese people into embarking upon wars of aggression or to glorify the use of force as an instrument for the settlement of disputes with other peoples.
