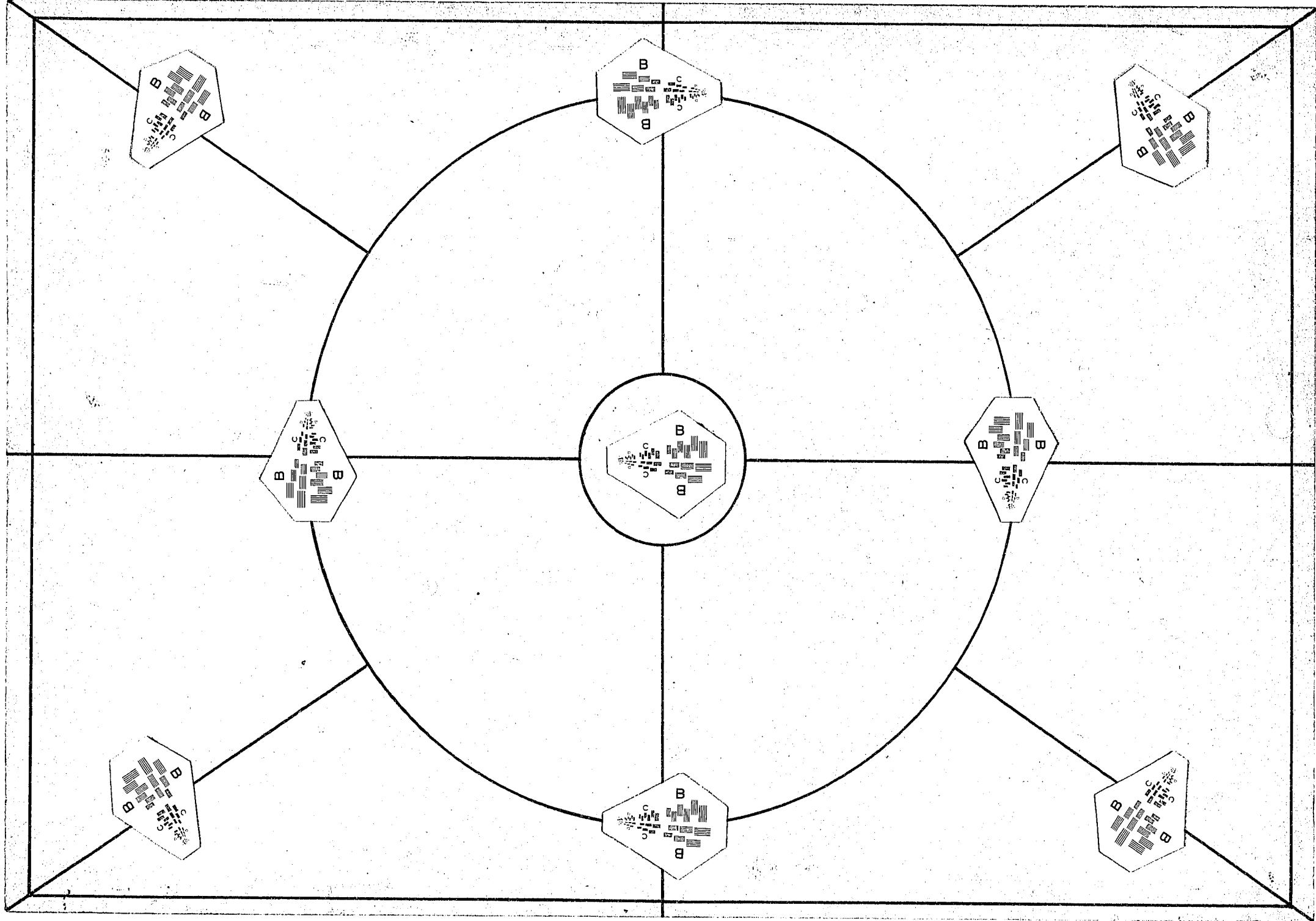

SUBJECT : Entry and Registration of Non-Japanese Nationals in Japan.

1. From time to time non-Japanese nationals, not part of the Occupation Forces, will be granted permission to enter Japan. These persons will reside in Japan on a semi-permanent basis. Absence of Japanese consuls abroad and consequent impossibility of obtaining visas, necessitates the establishment of a procedure for legal entry and residence.

2. It is desired that the Imperial Japanese Government take action to implement its part in the following procedure:

a. This Headquarters will notify persons approved for entry of such approval, informing them that visa requirements are waived, but that they will report for registration to the Japanese Ministry of Home Affairs upon arrival in Japan.

b. The Imperial Japanese Government will be furnished the names of persons approved as described in a above.

c. When such persons report to the Ministry of Home Affairs the Imperial Japanese Government will register them and furnish them with identification and such documents as are necessary to legalize their residence in Japan.

1. References are made to the following documents pertinent to the establishment of an agency by the Imperial Japanese Government which will represent that government in the performance of approved foreign trade functions:

- a. Paragraph 3d of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government AG(091.31) ESS, dated 9 October 1945, which ordered the creation of an agency to be responsible for receiving, and for the distribution of, imports.
- b. Central Liaison Office No. 1176 (1.123) dated 18 December 1945.
- c. Imperial Ordinance No. 703 dated 14 December 1945.
- d. Imperial Ordinance No. 704 dated 14 December 1945.
- e. Foreign Trade Settlement Fund Law, Proceeding of the Diet No. XXVI (c) of 21 December 1945.

2. The Board of Trade, as indicated in C.L.O. 1176 (1.123) dated 18 December 1945, hereinafter referred to as Boeki Cho, is hereby recognized as the exclusive agency of the Imperial Japanese Government to handle all Japanese foreign trade transactions in accordance with the following:

- a. All of the transactions of Boeki Cho will be handled in accordance with, or in a manner consistent with, instructions of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- b. All foreign trade will be handled by Boeki Cho on behalf of the Imperial Japanese Government, except as may be specifically authorized to the contrary by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- c. No other agency of the Imperial Japanese Government, no quasi-governmental or other organization or association, and no natural or legal person under the jurisdiction of the Imperial Japanese Government will perform any foreign trade functions except through Boeki Cho or as specifically authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- d. Boeki Cho will deliver, or cause to be delivered all export

goods as instructed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. It will take delivery or cause delivery to be taken of import goods as instructed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Boeki Cho will deliver or cause to be delivered for export only goods to which full and complete title has been vested in Boeki Cho on behalf of the Imperial Japanese Government, unless otherwise specifically authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and Boeki Cho will transfer title thereto as the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers may direct. Boeki Cho will take title on behalf of the Imperial Japanese Government to imported goods as directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

e. All commercial burdens, risks, claims and other responsibilities and liabilities as to foreign trade will be assumed by Boeki Cho.

f. All imports will be received "as is" and, except as approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Boeki Cho and the Imperial Japanese Government will assert no claims with respect to quality, quantity, condition or any other matter directly or indirectly affecting the receipt of such goods.

g. Boeki Cho and the Imperial Japanese Government will hold all other Governments and agencies and representatives thereof harmless from all loss, cost, damage or expense arising directly or indirectly out of any purchase, sale, disposition or other handling of export or import goods or arising in connection with any foreign trade transaction.

h. The appointment of all personnel of Boeki Cho of the rank of Chief of Bureau or higher, including Advisers and Counselors, will be subject to the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Advice concerning personnel listed in the inclosure to your memorandum CLO No. 1176 (1.123) dated 18 December 1945 will be furnished at an early date.

3. Imperial Ordinance No. 703, dated 14 December 1945, which established Boeki Cho, and other laws, ordinances and regulations pertinent thereto will be amended to give effect to the following:

a. Boeki Cho will purchase export goods only as authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by approval of an "Application to Prepare for Export" or an "Application to Deliver for Export" or by issuance of an export directive from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. Boeki Cho will receive all import goods made available by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. It may allow others to perform acts connected with receipt of the goods, but title will first be vested in Boeki Cho on behalf of the Imperial Japanese Government, unless otherwise directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

c. Boeki Cho will handle, transfer, and receive all import and export goods in accordance with instructions of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and authorizations and policies established by duly empowered agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government.

d. Boeki Cho will be empowered to perform all of the acts

and do all that is necessary to give full effect to paragraphs 2d,
e and f above.

- e. Advisers will be appointed for one year terms.
- f. Advisers will in general act as a body (Board of Advisers). They will act upon a vote of a majority of the advisers, and minutes of all meetings shall be kept. The President of Boeki Cho will request their advice on all important matters. On occasion, they will upon the President's request, individually or as members of committees, assist him in the discharge of operations functions.

4. Imperial Ordinance No. 704, dated 14 December 1945, which established the Committee for the Distribution of Imported Goods, and other laws, ordinances, and regulations pertinent thereto will be amended to give effect to the following:

- a. The Committee for the Distribution of Imported Goods will advise and assist Boeki Cho and other duly empowered agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government in the distribution of imported goods, acting consistently with instructions of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and policies of all duly empowered agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government.
- b. Committee members may act individually or in groups to advise or assist the President of Boeki Cho.

5. The Foreign Trade Settlement Fund, created by Proceeding of the Diet, No. XXVI (c) of 21 December 1945 will be sufficient in amount to meet the obligations of Boeki Cho, and laws, ordinances and regulations will be amended to give effect to the following:

- a. Any loans or appropriations deposited in the fund are to be reported to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- b. The fund will be available solely to Boeki Cho and will be expended upon order of Boeki Cho only to discharge financial obligations reasonably assumed in the performance of the acts mentioned in paragraphs 3a, b, c and d, above, except as may otherwise be specifically authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- c. All sums received by Boeki Cho arising directly or indirectly out of the sale or other disposition of imported goods will be deposited in the Foreign Trade Settlement Fund and will be available to Boeki Cho for the purposes defined above.
- d. No loans for financing distribution of imports nor for processing or assembly of goods for export will be made out of the Foreign Trade Settlement Fund.
- e. The Fund will not be used for any subsidy, direct or indirect, on any imported goods.

6. Direct communication between Boeki Cho, designated agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government and interested staff sections of the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is hereby authorized to implement the instructions contained in this memorandum.

1. Reference is made to the following memoranda of the Minister of Finance:

a. "Compulsory Loans for Payment of Wages, Retirement Allowances and Taxes, when Loans Cannot be Obtained by Ordinary Means" (LO 151), dated 17 January 1946, which requested approval for government guarantees of compulsory bank loans to industry for post-war activities, totalling ¥4,631,908,000.

b. "Issuing of Industrial Bonds under Government Guarantee to accommodate Funds for the Restoration of Ammonium Sulphate Manufacturing Industry" (LO 243), dated 13 February 1946, which requested approval for government guarantee of a loan of ¥371,689,000 to thirteen fertilizer companies from the Industrial Bank of Japan.

c. "Request for approval of Issuing Debentures by Japan Electric Supply Company and Five other Corporations under Government Guarantee" (LO 251), dated 14 February 1946, which requested approval for government-guaranteed borrowing totalling ¥305,000,000 by six corporations, five of which are wholly or partially government-owned.

d. "Request for Approval of the Loan for Ship-building by Industrial Equipment Corporation" (LO 252), dated 14 February 1946, requesting approval for that agency, which is wholly government-owned, to borrow ¥117,411,446 to finance its ship-building activities.

2. With regard to reference 1 a, permission is granted for the issuance of Government guarantees for compulsory loans aggregating not more than ¥2,500,000,000 issued between 15 August 1945 and 24 November 1945.

3. Neither the Imperial Japanese Government nor any of its political subdivisions will make further guarantees of the obligations, of any nature whatsoever, of any corporations or agencies except political subdivisions of the Imperial Japanese Government and such financial institutions as may be specifically designated with the approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Existing guarantees will not be renewed at the termination of the period for which they were granted.

4. Government financial assistance to any corporation, organization or agency other than a political subdivision or a financial institution specifically designated with the approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will henceforth be given only in the form of a subsidy. Such subsidies will be paid currently during the fiscal year as the need arises, rather than at the end of the year. The Imperial Japanese Government will not pay any subsidy which has not been duly authorized in the budget or equivalent financial measure for the year in which payment is to be made. The necessity for and extent of each subsidy will be determined at the time it is considered for inclusion in the budget or equivalent financial measure.

5. Government agencies and instrumentalities which are not part of the formal government structure of the Imperial Japanese Government or any of its political subdivisions, whether subsidized or not, may henceforth borrow from financial institutions without prior authorization from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Their loans will not be guaranteed by the Imperial Japanese Government or any of its political subdivisions.

6. Reports submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by the Bank of Japan and the Ministry of Finance differ widely as to the total amount of loans made by financial institutions with the guarantee of the Imperial Japanese Government. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to submit within two weeks from receipt of this memorandum a description of the various types of loans which are considered to be guaranteed by the Imperial Japanese Government, together with the supporting evidence on which the claim for guarantee is based. Within one month after delivery of this data the Imperial Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, a statement of all guaranteed loans by types, held by each financial institution as of a current date. This statement will reflect the original amount of such loans and the unpaid balance as of the reporting date.

7. The requests made by LO 243, 251 and 252 are returned for action in accordance with the provisions of this memorandum.

8. Direct communication between the Ministry of Finance and interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is hereby authorized to implement this memorandum.

2. Exportable raw silk is considered to be that of 42 denier and finer and export Grade E and higher.

No. 1333 (5.1) subject "Restrictions of Nationals of Countries with which United Nations have been at War", the following interpretation and clarification is made of Memorandum to the Imperial Japanese Government AG 091.112 (12 Dec 45)CI, subject, "Restriction of Nationals of Countries with which United Nations have been at War".

2. Paragraph "a" of reference memorandum is amended to except from its provisions, in addition to the Siamese (Thailand) diplomatic staff, the diplomatic and consular staff of the Italian Government who declared allegiance to the King of Italy and the Badoglio Government.

3. The provisions of sub-paragraph "a" (2) (as interpreted in paragraph 6 below) and "a" (4) of reference memorandum, prescribing a diplomatic ration and diplomatic treatment, shall not apply to the diplomatic and consular staffs of the following former puppet governments:

- a. Ex-Manking Chinese Government
- b. Ex-Philippine Government
- c. Ex-Burmese Government
- d. Ex-Manchukuo Government

4. The term "diplomatic staff" of paragraph "a", reference memorandum, includes diplomatic and consular representatives with their staffs and families.

5. Diplomatic personnel falling under the provisions of paragraph "a", reference memorandum, will continue to purchase daily food and necessities and rent living quarters at their own expense.

10. The authority for granting permission to nationals of "enemy countries" to travel beyond the prefecture in which they are now living remains with the local Counter-Intelligence Corps Detachment.

2. The development of a vigorous industrial and commercial structure capable of providing full employment and maximum production requires that the government shall not interfere with the basic economic right of a borrower to secure credit from any willing lender and of a lender to extend credit to any sound borrower. Development of a free and independent banking system adjusted to the varying needs of local communities and adhering to sound loan and investment policies is regarded as a vital step in the renewal of peacetime production and the democratization of the Japanese economy.

3. In furtherance of these policies, the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to terminate immediately the system of designating any financial institution as the exclusive source of credit and other banking facilities for any company, corporation, partnership or organization of any kind.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government is further directed to terminate the compulsory loan system under which banks and other financial institutions are ordered to make advances against, subscribe to, underwrite or purchase negotiable securities or undertake or guarantee obligations of any type. The Imperial Japanese Government may prescribe varying loan and investment standards applicable to different classes of institutions but shall not compel any institution receiving

The Japanese Government is directed to make available the use of any scientific laboratory or research institution and the services of the scientists employed therein, for the purpose of making chemical analysis, physical tests, spectroscopic determinations and related tests as may be required on samples and materials submitted by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. These tests are to be expedited, and upon completion, a report in English will be made. The director or official in charge of each laboratory selected to make these tests will be responsible for their accuracy. The developed plates, together with the unused portions of the samples, are to be delivered with the report.
