SUBJECT : Shipment of Subsistence Stocks to Japan

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to eight shiploads of subsistence stocks being made available for future Japanese consumption:

a. Accept deliveries as indicated below:

c. Store the cargo so that it is protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards and is under proper custody at all times.

d. Insure that no distribution is made of the cargo until official authorization for release is given by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. This does not preclude processing or the transportation of the cargo to areas of greatest anticipated need.

SUBJECT : Dissolution of Japan Lumber Company, Ltd., and Local Lumber Companies.

1. In order to obtain a substantial increase in the production and distribution of available timber, lumber and wood products, and to stimulate revival of construction of all types of dwellings, factories and buildings during the present emergency, the Imperial Japanese Government is hereby directed to take the necessary action to:
 - a. Dissolve the Japan Lumber Company, Ltd., and the Local Lumber Companies; repeal or rescind all laws and regulations giving them legal existence; and preserve complete records of such companies within the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry of the Imperial Japanese Government.
 - b. Provide for formation of voluntary democratic associations, subject to Government supervision, which will be open to all loggers, saw mill and other woodworking industry operators and owners, and forest owners, on local, prefectural and national levels; and create from such associations an advisory body designed to work with and assist the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry and the Economic Stabilization Board.
 - c. Integrate into the newly organized Economic Stabilization Board the functions of allocating all materials and planned production, distribution, appropriate rationing and price control for all wood using, processing and producing industries; and provide that the Economic Stabilization Board shall consult with the advisory body specified in subparagraph b, above, on all matters outlined in this subparagraph.
 - d. Take the necessary and appropriate steps to effectuate: allocation of materials, planned production and distribution, rationing and price control, as specified in subparagraph c, above, by transmittal of proper orders, plans, decisions or determinations of the Economic Stabilization Board, to the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, which is hereby charged with responsibility for carrying out and effectuating said orders, plans, decisions or determinations by any additional means deemed advisable, which are not inconsistent with policies of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to put into opera- tion the program outlined in subparagraphs la through e, above, within thirty (30) days of the date of this Memorandum and shall furnish a report of action taken, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within fifteen (15) days thereafter.

3. Direct communication between agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government and interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is authorized to implement this Memo- randum.

1. Reference is made to letter from the Imperial Japanese Government, C. L. O. 2186 (DT), 8 May 1946, subject: "Import Program of DDT".

2. The above mentioned program included considerable quantities of DDT concentrate which is to be utilized in the preparation of dusting powder and insecticide spray. In order that authentic information may be available covering preparation of DDT preparations and their use a circular of information has been prepared on the subject. Fifty (50) copies of this circular are inclosed for distribution to interested health officials and manufacturing agencies.

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Technical DDT is a fine white powder which varies from yellowish white to white in color. Storage at high temperatures or exposure to sunlight does not cause deterioration. Under conditions of high humidity it tends to cake. Some producers offer a product so treated as to prevent hard clumping.

DDT acts both as a contact poison and a stomach poison for insects. The toxic effect is exerted principally on the nervous system and results in characteristic "DDT tremors", progressive paralysis and death. DDT when applied in the form of a spray or powder will continue to kill insects which come in contact with treated areas for several weeks or months.

DDT is a toxic substance to humans and care should be exercised in handling. All persons working with this material should be well trained in methods of application. Poisoning may occur from ingestion of DDT or by absorption of solutions of DDT through the skin. Therefore care should be taken to prevent contamination of foods (particularly butter, milk, etc) by DDT. Contact with oil and organic solvent DDT spray solutions should be avoided. Inhalation of dusts containing DDT is not particularly dangerous, but when the dust cloud is dense use of respirators is advisable.

DDT Insecticide Preparations: DDT may be incorporated in the preparation of various insecticidal and miticidal formulas.

A. Dusts

Insecticide powder, louse

DDT (concentrate) 1 part
Pyrophyllite 9 parts
To form a 10% DDT content dust.

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Larvicide DDT, powder, dusting

DDT (concentrate 1 part
Talcum 9 parts

To form a 10% DDT content dust.

Manufacture of 10% DDT Insecticide Dusts:

"Either pyrophyllite or talc can be mixed with DDT to produce louse powder. While 10% is used in the standard Army product, the concentration is not critical and from 5% to 10% will be effective. The pyrophyllite or talc should be neutral or very slightly acid. Alkaline dusts will cause the DDT to decompose.

"A hammer mill should be used for this operation. Do not attempt to use a stone mill, ball mill, paint mill or edgerunner, since the frictional heat developed will cause the DDT to soften and cake-up. A hammer mill of the blade type is to be preferred to the saddle type.

"If either the pyrophyllite or the DDT is lumpy, break up the larger lumps by hand and mix 25 pounds of DDT with 25 pounds of pyrophyllite. This mixing can be done in any type of mechanical agitator or in a tumbler drum. Put this mixture through the hammer mill once, then add 200 pounds of additional pyrophyllite. Mix and put through the hammer mill a second time. Do not try to put unmixed DDT through the hammer mill.

"Blade type hammer mills should be available in plants which formerly ground pyrethrum flours for export".

In the specifications for DDT louse powder as used by the Army the following is stated:

- 90% should pass U. S. Standard mesh #325
- 99% should pass U. S. Standard mesh #100
- 99% of the finished material should go through the U. S. Standard mesh #80

The approximate particle size corresponding to these meshes are as follows:

mesh #325: 44 micra

Mesh #100: 149 micra
Mesh #80: 177 micra

B. Solutions: Several types of solutions for use as sprays may be prepared.

a. Insecticide Spray, residual effect

DDT (concentrate) 5%
Methylated naphthalene 15%
Kerosene 80%

To be used as a 2% water dilution for louse proofing of clothing. May also be used in emulsions for preparation of larvicides, residual spraying against mosquitoes, flies, bedbugs, etc.

For impregnation of clothing, mosquito bar, etc., dilute 1:11 by weight to form 2% aqueous emulsion. 30 gallons is sufficient for 125 suits of winter (50% wool) underwear (or garments of similar weight). One quart of solution per suit of underwear is required. 2% of dry weight of garment should be DDT.

REPATRIATION TO AND FROM JAPAN

SECTION I - GENERAL PLAN.

1. a. The following plan governing the repatriation to and from Japan, now in effect, will continue until otherwise directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- b. The entire plan revolves around the use of reception centers and the flow of persons to be repatriated through these centers in the numbers that can be accommodated by the available shipping and rail transportation.
- c. Under this plan non-Japanese nationals who, having registered as being desirous of repatriation, refuse to comply with plans of the Imperial Japanese Government for movement to reception centers forfeit their privilege to repatriation and will not be considered in any future repatriation plans. A list of such persons by name will be maintained by the Japanese Government. The number of persons so listed as of 31 May 1946 will be reported to General Headquarters not later than 25 June 1946. Thereafter monthly reports will be furnished on or about the 10th day of the month following the month reported on.
- d. Exception to paragraph 1 c above may be made in the case of families which cannot comply with plans of the Imperial Japanese Government for movement to reception centers, due to circumstances over which they have no control. Insofar as practicable the immediate family group should be considered a unit, and should be repatriated as a unit, unless members thereof have forfeited their privilege of repatriation. Persons, who cannot comply with repatriation plans, due to circumstances beyond their control, will not be included in the reports directed in paragraph 1 c above.

2. The following reception centers will be used to process non-Japanese repatriates leaving Japan:

Hakata and Senzaki	Primarily to process Koreans.
Kagoshima	Primarily to process Ryukyans.
Kure Area	Primarily to process Formesans, and such Chinese as were formerly domiciled in south China.
Maizuru	Primarily to process Chinese who were formerly domiciled in central China.
Sasebo	Primarily to process Chinese who were formerly domiciled in north China.

3. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will:

a. The repatriation of Koreans now in Ja-an who were formerly resident in Korea south of 38° north latitude will be completed on or before 30 September 1946, except as noted in paragraph 1d above. A report will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 10 October 1946 showing:

- (1) Names of Koreans, listed by family, who could not be repatriated on or before 30 September 1946, but who have not forfeited their privilege of repatriation, as outlined in paragraph 1d above.
- (2) Approximate date each family, referred to in paragraph 10a (1) above, will be able to move to repatriation ports.

b. Koreans will be outloaded to Pusan from the following ports at the daily rates indicated:

Initial daily rates indicated above will be progressively increased to insure that the prescribed rates are reached by 5 May 1946. Sufficient Koreans will be backlogged in these reception centers to insure the above.

11. Repatriation to Korea north of 38 degrees north latitude.

Repatriation to northern Korea will be held in abeyance pending consummation of appropriate agreements. Koreans destined for northern Korea will be held in Japan until such time as they can be repatriated to northern Korea.

2. Quoted below is message from Irish Government received through Swiss Diplomatic Mission:

"The Irish Government has received and taken note of the message of the Japanese Government stating that Consul General Dublin no longer holds official position. This message and second message addressed to Consul General were communicated at once to Mr. Beppu. He has now requested the assistance of the Irish Authorities in arranging speedy repatriation self and wife and has stated that Consul Kazuo Ichihashi has taken charge of the Consulate General. Consul Ichihashi has informed Irish Foreign Office that he has taken charge of the Consulate General temporarily, pending return Japan with Mr. and Mrs. Beppu as previously instructed. The Irish Government is prepared to afford all possible facilities repatriation and awaits suggestions of the Japanese Government regarding travel."

3. A message from Consul Ichihashi, Dublin, received through Swiss Diplomatic Mission follows:

"To Foreign Minister Yoshida from Consul Ichihashi Report number one Dublin June 12th 1946. Received your telegram number one. Pursuant to the message that Mr. Beppu no longer holds official position I have taken charge of the Consulate General to carry out your instructions to the best my ability. SUBJECT : Dissolution Plan for the Yokohama Specie Bank.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Central Liaison Office, CLO No. 1718 (EF), dated 13 April 1946, subject: "Reorganization Plan of Yokohama Specie Bank, Ltd., (LO 427)," and inclosed letter from the Ministry of Finance, same subject.

2. The plan proposed for the reorganization of the Yokohama Specie Bank is approved in principle, but the following provisions, in addition to those set forth in the referenced communications, will be observed in the dissolution of the present Yokohama Specie Bank and organization of a new institution.

a. The name of the new institution will bear no similarity, either in Japanese or in foreign translation, to that of the Yokohama Specie Bank.

b. Directors and executive officers of the new bank will not be persons who are subject to the provisions of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.1 (4 Jan 46)GS, subject: "Removal and Exclusion of Undesirable Personnel from Public Office," or who have been associated in similar capacities with the Yokohama Specie Bank since 7 July 1937.

c. The initial paid-in capital of the new bank will be not less than ¥50,000,000.

d. The actual transfer of assets and liabilities from the Yokohama Specie Bank to the new institution will not be effected, except with the prior approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, before announcement by the Imperial Japanese Government of its program for the final disposition of general indemnity and other domestic claims arising out of the war. Any losses to the depositors and other creditors of the Yokohama Specie Bank resulting from the carrying out of the Government's program will be assessed on the same basis as is prescribed for other financial institutions of a like character.

2. Enclosed are nominal rolls of 42 Siamese Nationals to be repatriated on Shipping Control Authority for Japanese Merchant Marine hospital ship Arimasan Maru sailing for Bangkok in early July.

3. Necessary food for the trip is being supplied for these Siamese by the Commanding General, Eighth Army.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Determine the exact date of sailing and port of departure of Arimasan Maru from Civilian Merchant Marine Committee, notify the Siamese repatriates accordingly and insure they are properly embarked.

b. Provide suitable rail accommodations to transport the Siamese and their baggage to the port of embarkation. Payment for rail transportation will be made directly to Japanese Government Railways by the individuals concerned.

c. Provide suitable quarters, facilities, and supplies other than food aboard the Arimasan Maru.

d. Make necessary arrangements to move to the port of embarkation approximately three freight carloads of Siamese government equipment now located in Tokyo and to load this equipment aboard the Arimasan Maru. Maintain liaison with the Operations Branch of the Import and Export Division, Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in this matter.

e. Arrange with the Diplomatic Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for payment by the Siamese prior to their departure for the cost of movement of this equipment to the port of embarkation.

f. The dissolution of the Yokohama Specie Bank and the transfer of its domestic assets to a new institution will be carried out without prejudice to the deposits of foreign governments and their representatives in Japan, the deposits of inter-national organizations of a humanitarian or philanthropic character and of those persons whose property the Imperial Japanese Government is required to preserve and protect in accordance with Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.112 (13 Sep 45)MG, dated 13 September 1945, subject: "Protection of Allied and Axis Property."

After segregation of the domestic assets and liabilities of the Yokohama Specie Bank and transfer to the new institution, the Yokohama Specie Bank will be liquidated under the supervision of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as are those institutions closed by Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.3 (30 Sep 45)ESS, dated 30 September 1945, subject: "Closing of Colonial and Foreign Banks and Special Wartime Institutions."

It is directed that the Japanese Government enact all necessary legislation to make unlawful the possession of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" on and after 10 July 1946 by any person or organization except members of the Allied Occupation Forces and those specifically authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Provisions for the confiscation of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" in the possession of unauthorized persons or organizations, and appropriate punitive measures shall be included.

2. The Japanese Government shall treat Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" as neither legal tender nor a lawful medium of exchange, and it shall turn over all such currency coming into its possession, custody, or control to the Fiscal Director, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. As a matter of information, Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" is identical in appearance to Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "B", now in circulation, except that the letter "A" appears on the face of each note in place of the letter "B".
