MEMORANDUM FOR: THE IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo  
SUBJECT : Import of Phosphate Rock from Angaur Island

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate action and assume responsibility for taking delivery of newly mined and existing stockpiles of phosphate rock at Angaur Island, Palau Group.
2. The following requirements will be furnished by the Imperial Japanese Government:
  - a. Shipping - The necessary ship tonnage will be provided to lift 30,000 tons per month from the present date to 1 January 1947. Shipping schedules will be subject to approval by the Shipping Control Authority for the Japanese Merchant Marine.
  - b. Lighters - Loading will be done entirely by lighters. Not less than twenty (20) self-propelled barges of a type suitable for the efficient handling of cargo in the open sea will be provided. The weight of the barges should not be greater than can be effectively handled by ships' gear. An adequate supply of spare engine parts, caulking and other materials for maintenance will be furnished with the barges.
  - c. Labor - Sufficient and experienced manpower for loading 1,000 to 1,200 tons of ore per day will be furnished. The labor group will consist of stevedoring and lightering gangs operating on three shifts during a twenty-four (24) hour period. In addition, mechanics, ship's carpenters, cooks, mess and medical attendants will be provided. Housing and cooking facilities will be furnished by island authorities for Japanese labor on shore at Angaur Island. Japanese working parties are to be completely self-supporting in regard to all food (initial supply of three (3) months required) clothing, foot wear, cooking utensils, mess gear, personal gear, medicine and other supplies. A competent English speaking Japanese supervisor, who will deal with the contractor at Angaur, will be in charge of the Japanese working parties. The terms and conditions of employment of all labor is subject to the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The working parties will remain ashore at Angaur until 1 January 1947 or at least between departure of one ship and arrival of the next ship. These working parties will be directly responsible to the Shore Project Manager and will comply with his instructions.

d. Gear - An adequate number of canvas cargo slings, shovels, picks and tools, lines for securing boats, life preservers and any other gear required for self-supported loading operations will be provided.

3. It is directed that the first steamer be dispatched to Angaur on or about 10 July 1946 with the full complement of labor, supplies and as many barges as can be safely stowed on board. The Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate steps to have labor and equipment assembled and on board vessel in ample time to permit departure as scheduled. The departure of the second steamer carrying the balance of barges and any remaining gear shall be tentatively scheduled two weeks after the first ship sails.

4. Quantitative receipts for all shipments will be furnished the representative of the Commander in Chief of the Pacific Fleet on Angaur Island. Two of the original signed copies of each receipt will be forwarded to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. Price of the phosphate rock, as well as terms and conditions of payment, shall be determined at a later date.

6. Ports of discharge for all cargoes are to be coordinated with the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and are to be declared prior to vessels' departure from Japan.

7. All of the phosphate rock in these shipments will be processed within the shortest possible time into superphosphate in the factories nearest the ports of discharge. The superphosphate will be sold through official channels at ceiling prices in the areas of greatest need. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will be furnished with a complete accounting of the distribution made by prefectural areas.

8. All ministries and agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government concerned will assist in the execution of this project.

2. Reference is also made to C.L.O. No. 1112 (5.3), 14 December 1945, which inclosed the 25 November 1945 application of K.K. Irisu Shokai. This application was approved for payment and forwarded by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Imperial Japanese Government on 27 June 1946.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is instructed not to pay salaries to the German employees of K.K. Irisu Shokai for any part of 1945. If it has made such payments, they will be recovered and deposited in a blocked bank account of K.K. Irisu Shokai.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to exercise extreme care in processing such applications so as to avoid any duplication of payment in all future cases.

SUBJECT : Census of Foreign Films in Japan

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take a census of foreign films in Japan as of 15 July 1946.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will issue an official ordinance, requiring all Japanese exhibitors, distributors, producers or other persons and firms having in their possession any foreign motion picture films to submit detailed information as follows:

- (a) Name of Reporter
- (b) Address of Reporter
- (c) Title of film
- (d) Name of Producer
- (e) Number and length of reels
- (f) Country of origin
- (g) Number of prints and whether negative or positive.
- (h) Location of film

(i) Each reporter or owner will furnish to the Imperial Japanese Government details showing how he acquired possession or ownership of the films and his present right to such possession or ownership.

3. Five copies of this information in tabulated form will be furnished General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and will be submitted in the English language, by 15 August 1946.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will instruct the possessors of foreign motion picture films who, after investigation, have been found to be illegal owners, to place such films in the custody of the Home Ministry, pending further disposition instructions.

5. The Ordinance will provide that no foreign film will be exhibited until General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is satisfied that the film is legally possessed. It will also provide adequate penalties for violators. Three copies of the proposed Ordinance both in English and Japanese will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of the date of this directive.

6. Direct communication between the Home Ministry and the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is authorized in order to implement the provisions of this memorandum.

RECEPTION CENTERS IN JAPAN FOR  
PROCESSING REPATRIATES

1. The Ministry of Public Welfare, having been designated by the Japanese Government to handle repatriation matters, will:

a. Establish a central agency to effect coordination with other Japanese governmental agencies regarding supply, customs, transportation, physical inspections, quarantine and demobilization, and to effect liaison with the headquarters of the Eighth United States Army.

b. Establish and operate reception centers at designated ports (see paragraph 2a) to:

- (1) Receive, process, care for and evacuate all Japanese repatriates returning to Japan proper from overseas.
- (2) Assemble, process, care for and load non-Japanese nationals, as outlined in Annex III.

c. Designate a resident director at each reception center responsible for its operation and for maintaining liaison with local Allied military authorities responsible for supervision of the reception center.

2. a. Reception Centers: Location, character and capacity.

Reception centers will be located as indicated below, and only these centers will be used for repatriation purposes:

b. Facilities.

Adequate facilities will be established at each of the above designated ports to receive, process and evacuate repatriates in the numbers indicated above. They will include necessary storage space for food, clothing and medical supplies as well as space for administration, necessary medical examinations, quarantine stations and quarantine hospitals. The Ministry of Public Welfare will make arrangements with the Commanding General of the Eighth United States Army for assignment of necessary space for these facilities.

c. Medical procedures.

Adequate inspection and quarantine stations, established at the above designated ports, will be operated in accordance with the procedures prescribed in Annex V.

3. The establishment, organization and operation of each reception center will be under the supervision of the Allied military commander who exercises control over the area in which the reception center is located.

REPATRIATION TO AND FROM JAPAN

SECTION I - GENERAL PLAN.

1. a. The following plan governing the repatriation to and from Japan, now in effect, will continue until otherwise directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. The entire plan revolves around the use of reception centers and the flow of persons to be repatriated through these centers in the numbers that can be accommodated by the available shipping and rail transportation.

c. Under this plan non-Japanese nationals who, having registered as being desirous of repatriation, refuse to comply with plans of the Imperial Japanese Government for movement to reception centers forfeit their privilege to repatriation and will not be considered in any future repatriation plans. A list of such persons by name will be maintained by the Japanese Government. The number of persons so listed as of 31 May 1946 will be reported to General Headquarters not later than 25 June 1946. Thereafter monthly reports will be furnished on or about the 10th day of the month following the month reported on.

d. Exception to paragraph 1 c above may be made in the case of families which cannot comply with plans of the Imperial Japanese Government for movement to reception centers, due to circumstances over which they have no control. Insofar as practicable the immediate family group should be considered a unit, and should be repatriated as a unit, unless members thereof have forfeited their privilege of repatriation. Persons, who cannot comply with repatriation plans, due to circumstances beyond their control, will not be included in the reports directed in paragraph 1 c above.

2. The following reception centers will be used to process non-Japanese repatriates leaving Japan:

- Hakata and Senzaki      Primarily to process Koreans.
- Kagoshima              Primarily to process Ryukyans now domiciled on Kyushu.
- Kure Area              Primarily to process Ryukyans not processed through Kagoshima.

b. Those agencies enumerated in Items 3 and 5, under the headings "Enumerated by the Memorandum AG 091.3 (11 Oct 45)ESS" and "To be dissolved by the Memorandum AG 360 (18 Nov 45)ESS-FT", may be considered as excluded from the provisions of paragraph 1-b of reference 1-b, (SCAFIN 338) above.

It shall not be construed as authorizing any action with regard to pensions or other benefits which have been, or will be suspended, revoked, or annulled by Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers Memoranda for reasons other than those defined by paragraph 1-b.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, a report of all payments made in accordance with this Memorandum.

6. Direct communication is hereby authorized between the Finance Ministry and interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to implement matters relating to this directive.

f. The Imperial Japanese Government will direct the captains of Japanese manned repatriation vessels to notify the responsible control agency in the country of entry of the presence on board ship of any of the diseases listed in paragraph 1a (3) above or of exposed passengers traveling during incubation periods. Notification will also include cases of significant communicable disease, the institutionalization of which is not immediately practicable, i.e. tuberculosis, etc.

g. Persons infected with leprosy will not be repatriated.

2. Japanese medical personnel to be furnished for repatriation shipping.

a. Medical personnel aboard Japanese-manned Liberty ships and Landing Ships, Tank, repatriating Japanese from China, except for hospital ships, will be furnished by the Chinese authorities from Japanese medical personnel now in China. This personnel will be assigned for permanent duty aboard these vessels.

b. The Imperial Japanese Government will assign medical personnel for permanent duty aboard all Japanese-manned repatriation shipping, other than that mentioned in paragraph 2a above, as follows:

- (1) On ships making voyages of less than four days duration, two medical orderlies.
- (2) On ships making voyages of four days or longer duration, a doctor and two medical orderlies.

c. The Imperial Japanese Government will obtain names and itineraries of shipping requiring Japanese medical personnel from the Shipping Control Authority for the Japanese Merchant Marine.

3. Quarantine procedures for cholera among repatriates.

a. The Imperial Japanese Government will take the following measures immediately to prevent the introduction of cholera into Japan by individuals being repatriated from ports infected with cholera. Ports so infected will be designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as "cholera ports."

b. In the case of ships with repatriates from cholera ports which arrive without cases of cholera aboard:

- (1) Where the voyage has taken more than six (6) days, all personnel, except crew members who have been inoculated within the previous one month period (see paragraph 1d above), will be inoculated with 1 cubic centimeter of cholera vaccine and debarked, and processing procedures will be performed as usual.

- (2) Where the voyage from the cholera port has taken less than six (6) days, all personnel will be held aboard the ship until six (6) days have elapsed, the personnel physically examined for cholera, and if no cases are found they will be disembarked as described in paragraph 3b (1) above. In the event cholera is found, the procedure will be as prescribed in paragraph 3c below.

c. Ships which arrive in Japan WITH CHOLERA ABOARD will use only the ports of Uraga or Sasebo until directed otherwise by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

- (1) Ships will be anchored sufficiently far from shore to preclude the possibility of anyone swimming to shore or contamination from the vessel washing ashore.
- (2) All personnel will be held on board for fourteen (14) days after the development of the last case.
- (3) Cases of cholera will be removed from the ship to a hospital ship anchored off shore, which will receive and treat cholera cases among repatriates. Prior to the arrival of the hospital ships at the ports of Uraga and Sasebo, cholera patients will be removed to the isolation hospitals at the reception centers at the above mentioned ports, where strict isolation procedure will be maintained. Great care will be exercised in sterilizing all discharges from the patients (using 2 per cent cresol solution), screening to protect from flies and isolation of attendants.
- (4) All personnel (except cholera patients, and crew members who have been inoculated within the previous one month period) will be inoculated with 1 cubic centimeter of cholera vaccine.
- (5) During the quarantine period the feces and urine of all personnel will be treated with a 2 per cent cresol solution before being discharged into the sea.
- (6) A stool examination will be performed on all personnel to detect carriers. All carriers discovered will be isolated in the same place as cholera cases and kept until three negative stool specimens have been obtained at two day intervals.
- (7) The baggage and clothing of all personnel will be sterilized.

4. The Japanese Government will furnish the vaccine necessary for medical processing at all repatriation ports in China, Manchuria and Japan. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will furnish the necessary instructions concerning amounts and types needed for China and Manchuria. Where it is not possible for the Japanese Government to furnish vaccines in the required amounts, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will be notified of deficiencies with reasons therefore.

CURRENCY, SECURITIES, AND OTHER DOCUMENTS AND POSSESSIONS

1. The Ministry of Public Welfare will carry out the following procedures in processing Japanese being repatriated to Japan, and Chinese, Formosans, Koreans, and Ryukyans to their respective homelands.

2. In processing Japanese nationals being repatriated to Japan, the Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Permit the following currency and Japanese Government Bonds to be brought into Japan:

- (1) Bank of Japan yen currency and supplemental "B" type currency in the following amounts:
  - (a) Commissioned officers - a maximum of ¥ 500.
  - (b) Non-commissioned officers and enlisted men - a maximum of ¥ 200.
  - (c) Civilians\* - a maximum of ¥ 1000.
- (2) Exchange certificates for Japanese yen, issued by demobilization directors at ports of embarkation in north China, exchange certificates for Manchu yuan, issued in Manchuria, and duly certified receipts for yen currency, issued in southern Korea, in lieu of yen currency up to the limits stipulated in paragraph 2a (1) above.
- (3) Japanese Government bonds expressed in yen, in lieu of yen currency and/or exchange certificates up to the limits stipulated in paragraph 2a (1) above.

b. In addition to the amounts of yen currency, exchange certificates, or Japanese Government bonds which may be brought in by all repatriates, permit Japanese prisoners of war to bring in with them additional amounts equal to payments made to them or accumulated by them while interned as prisoners of war.

c. (1) Convert exchange certificates and certified receipts (see paragraph 2a (2) above) into Bank of Japan currency on a

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to release from the terms of the Ordinance of the Ministry of Finance on the preservation of the property of the Specified Powers, 20 September 1945, such funds of the above-mentioned firms as are required to pay all of the expenses listed, with the exception of those which are denied as follows:

(a) No charge incurred prior to 1 September 1945 will be paid.

(b) No capital levy tax will be paid at this time.

(c) No employee will receive aggregate remuneration, including allowances, in excess of ¥2000 a month.

(d) No retirement allowances or other remuneration will be paid which exceed the amounts authorized by laws and/or ordinances in effect at the time such payments became due.

(e) No funds are authorized to Schmidt Shoten, Ltd. for purchasing ¥40,000 worth of equipment.

(f) Action on Schmidt Shoten, Ltd.'s application of 7 December 1945 forwarded with C.L.O. No. 1423 (5.3), 28 Dec 45, for certain September and October expenses has been taken under separate cover.

3. This memorandum shall not be construed to release funds from the blocking provisions of any other memorandum issued by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, or any other ordinance promulgated by the Imperial Japanese Government.

1. Reference is made to C.L.O. No. 2993 (PP-15), 20 June 1946, stating that the Japanese Government intends, as a disciplinary measure, to prohibit police and fire-brigade officers from joining any political association and engaging in, or giving assistance to, any political activities, and requesting the view of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers on this matter.

2. The proposed action by the Japanese Government is not believed to be advisable as it would constitute an unwarranted restriction upon freedom of assembly, association and speech, and be violative of the rights of the individual to freedom of political expression. While long-established democratic custom has viewed with disfavor aggressive political action by police and fire-brigade officers, due to the impossibility of complete delineation between the official and private personality of the individual in such matters, such persons nevertheless, acting as individual citizens, should not be denied freedom to exercise the normal political rights inherent in citizenship. Should such rights be abused to the detriment of the public interest, corrective action in individual cases involved is, of course, quite in order.

2. Limited Commercial Radio Telegraph message service, for Nitto Kogyo Company over the Tokyo-Minami Daito Jima Meteorological facilities effective immediately, is authorized subject to the following:

- a. Messages will be transmitted direct over the Tokyo-Minami Daito Jima Meteorological facilities.
- b. Meteorological reports and messages will have full priority over any and all commercial messages.
- c. Messages will preferably be transmitted during the last fifteen minutes of any hour.
- d. Messages will be limited in context to information pertaining to the production, and transportation of phosphate and administrative matters relating thereto.
- e. Not more than 50 words or 200 letters (Japanese characters) will be transmitted during any one day and all messages must be in clear English or Japanese text.

f. Messages will be submitted for censorship and have censorship approval before being transmitted from a person in Japan to a person outside of Japan, and before delivery to a person in Japan from a person outside of Japan.
