1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 091.31 (14 Mar 46) ESS/IE, (SCAPIN 814), 14 March 1946, subject: "Export Procedure." Attachment 1 to the reference memorandum is superseded by Attachment 1 (Revised), Export Procedure. This revision clarifies the export procedure originally outlined in Attachment 1 of the memorandum of 14 March 1946 and makes the following substantive changes in case of shipment to countries other than the United States:

a. Documents will be delivered to the Military Port Director rather than to the War Shipping Administration, and certification will be made.

b. Form IE-200, "Application to Deliver for Export," will be countersigned by Civilian Merchant Marine Committee when shipment is made in a vessel of Japanese registry.

2. Documents pertaining to all exports since 2 September 1945 will be submitted on or before 1 August 1946 to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. Attachment 7 to the reference memorandum is superseded by Attachment 7 (Revised) - Invoice of Consigned Merchandise.

4. Attachment 9 (Cargo Receipt) is added to the reference memorandum.

SUBJECT : Plan for Receiving Payments Due American Carriers for Messages and Radio-telephone Calls Filed by United States Military and Accredited Civilian Personnel for Transmission to or Through the United States Prepaid in Japan.

1. The provisions of this memorandum and inclosures herein are effective 19 July 1946 at 0001 hours. Effective the same date and time there is rescinded the Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 311.2 (17 May 46) CCS, subject: "Plan for Receiving Payments Due American Carriers for Messages to the United States Prepaid in Japan".

2. Attention of the Ministry of Communications is directed to Memoranda for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 600 (8 Oct 45) GD, subject: "Establishment of Expeditionary Force Message Service Between the United States and the Tokyo-Yokohama Area"; file AG 676.2 (1 Dec 45) CCS, subject: "Establishment of Sender Composition Message Service Between the United States and the Tokyo Area"; and file AG 311.3 (8 Jan 46) CCS, subject: "Establishment of Telephone Service Between the United States and Tokyo"; and also to the letter from the Board of Communications of 28 November 1945 to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the supplement thereto of 5 January 1946.

3. EFM and SCM telegraph messages and radio-telephone calls to or through the United States filed for transmission by United States military and accredited civilian personnel will be prepaid in Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A".

4. Within the first 24 hours following receipt of this memorandum and prior to its effective date, the Ministry of Communications will instruct its representatives at all public communications offices in Japan where EFM and SCM messages and radio-telephone calls, described in paragraph 3 above, are filed that effective 19 July 1946 at 0001 hours, the public offices will not accept Japanese yen as prepayment for such messages and radio-telephone calls but must require prepayment in Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A"; and that any currency exchange between the senders filing such messages and radio-telephone calls, and the public offices, must be made in Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A".

5. Paragraph 2, Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 123.7 (4 July 46)FD, subject: "Authorization to Use Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type 'A'", is hereby amended to authorize the withholding of fifty thousand (50,000) Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" by the public offices of the Ministry of Communications for change-making purposes, in amounts allocated to each public office as shown on Inclosure 1. This amount authorized for change-making purposes will be withheld from the Ministry of Communications' share of the revenue derived from EFM and SCM messages and radio-telephone calls, described in paragraph 3 above, and will not be withheld from the share due the American carriers. The amount authorized for change-making purposes for each public office (as shown in Inclosure 1) will be withheld from Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" collected at each public office for such prepaid messages and radio-telephone calls. Until the amount authorized for change-making purposes is thus obtained, the senders of such messages and radio-telephone calls must pay the public offices the exact amount of the charges in Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A". Each public office where such messages and radio-telephone calls are filed will never have on hand an amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" in excess of the collections made since the last forwarding of collections to the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications plus the amount authorized for change-making purposes. The amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" authorized to be in the possession of any public office will be shown by that office's accounting records which will be open for inspection at all times by Eighth Army representatives. The amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" on hand at any time will not be less than the amount authorized for change-making purposes at any public office. The amount withheld for change-making purposes at any public office, and the number of public offices shown on Inclosure 1, will neither be increased nor decreased without the approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. By pre-arrangement, large denominations of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" may be exchanged by public offices of the Ministry of Communications with the nearest United States Finance Office or Post Exchange for small denominations so that a proper balance in denominations will be available to facilitate change-making.

6. The Ministry of Communications will deposit on 25 July 1946 with the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" the amount of Japanese yen that is due each American carrier as its share of the revenue collected for the transmission of EFM and SCM messages and radio-telephone calls, described in paragraph 3, for the period 1 July 1946 to 18 July 1946. No Japanese yen may be deposited for payment to the American carriers subsequent to 25 July 1946, unless approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The deposit to be made on 25 July 1946 will consist only of Japanese yen. This deposit will be accompanied by five (5) copies of a preliminary statement showing the amount of Japanese yen due each American carrier for the period 1 July 1946 to 18 July 1946 inclusive, or as a result of adjustment made for previous periods. This preliminary statement will include the statement set forth in Inclosure 2.

BASIC: Memo for IJG, GHQ, SCAP, file AG 311.3 (16 Jul 46)CCS, (SCAFIN- 1066).

7. The Ministry of Communications will deposit on 21 August 1946 with the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" the total amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" that has been received for the period 19 July 1946 to 31 July 1946 inclusive, less the amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" authorized for change-making purposes in paragraph 5 above. The Ministry of Communications is further instructed to deposit thereafter at semi-monthly intervals with the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" within twenty-one (21) days after the close of a semi-monthly period the total amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" that has been collected at its public offices, less the total amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" authorized for change-making purposes. The deposit to be made on 21 August 1946 and all subsequent semi-monthly deposits will be accompanied by five (5) copies of a preliminary statement showing the amount of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" due each American carrier for the period involved or as a result of adjustment made for previous periods. This preliminary statement will include the statement set forth in Inclosure 3.

8. At the time the Ministry of Communications makes a semi-monthly deposit of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" with the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" that agent will arrange with the United States Finance Officer, or such other agency as may be designated by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to convert the Ministry of Communications' share of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" to Japanese yen. The "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" will deliver the Japanese yen to the representative of the Ministry of Communications who will give a receipt for the yen to the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds."

9. In connection with handling the deposit of 21 August 1946, the Ministry of Communications will give to the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" a receipt as set forth in Inclosure 4.

10. In connection with handling the deposit of 5 September 1946, and subsequent deposits, the Ministry of Communications will give to the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" a receipt as set forth in Inclosure 5.

11. The deposits referred to in paragraphs 9 and 10 above will contain less than the full amount of the Ministry of Communications' share of Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" collected for radio-telephone calls to or through the United States, because of advance prepayments made by filers of radio-telephone calls prior to 19 July 1946, in Japanese yen. The statements accompanying these deposits will show clearly the accounting details of the payments made prior to 19 July 1946 for calls which were completed after 19 July 1946.

12. The "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" will acknowledge, over his signature, receipt of the funds and the accompanying preliminary statement by writing the word "RECEIVED" and date of receipt on one (1) copy of the statement and will return it to the representative of the Ministry of Communications who deposited the funds.

13. Final statements will be submitted monthly showing payments made and adjustments, if any. Each American carrier will prepare a similar statement which, when received by the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds", will be forwarded to the Ministry of Communications.

14. All communications relative to fiscal or accounting matters will be transmitted through the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds". All matters pertaining to basic rates and underlying policies will, as heretofore, be directed to the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

15. The Ministry of Communications will not permit Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" received by its public offices for prepaid EFM and SCM messages and radio-telephone calls, as described in paragraph 3, to be turned over to any banking agency or any individual, until after this currency has been received by the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications, Tokyo To, Azabuku, Iigura, Rokuchome. The Treasury of the Ministry of Communications may, as a temporary measure only, deposit such currency for safekeeping in the Bank of Japan, Tokyo To, Nihonbashi Ku, Muromachi, San-chome, from which it will be withdrawn on settlement days for deposit with the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds". However, within twenty-four (24) hours after the opening of the Tokyo branch of the National City Bank of New York the Ministry of Communications will use the National City Bank of New York as its depository for the Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A" pending the time this currency is deposited with the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds", and will not thereafter use the Bank of Japan as a depository for Supplemental Military Yen Currency Type "A".

16. It is directed that within three (3) days after the receipt of this memorandum, a representative of the Ministry of Communications contact the Special Service Officer, Eighth Army, Yokohama, to receive any further directions or instructions necessary to accomplish the purpose of this memorandum.

2. Cholera vaccine will be given during spring and summer to all outgoing repatriates.

(b) Only the initial dose of a multi-dose vaccine need be administered at the reception centers if the flow of outgoing repatriates would be impeded otherwise.

(c) A certificate, in the English language, indicating that smallpox and cholera vaccine have been administered during the appropriate seasons, will be furnished each outgoing repatriate prior to embarkation on repatriation ships.

(6) Maintenance of records required to comply with International Quarantine procedure.

b. Procedures with respect only to Japanese-manned vessels will provide for:

- (1) Inspection for rodent infestation aboard such vessels arriving from areas in which plague is known to be occurring or is considered endemic, including the Asiatic mainland, Formosa and Netherlands East Indies.
- (2) Fumigation by cyanide, sulfur dioxide, or other method submitted to and approved in advance by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of vessels in which a case of rodent plague has been detected, or in which there is an excessive number of rats as determined by the amount of feces present.
- (3) Examination for infection with plague of all rats recovered after fumigation, or by trapping ashore or aboard vessels in which fumigation is not being carried out.
- (4) Additional measures applicable to prevent the spread of plague, including anchorage in stream, fending off from wharves, rat guards, etc, as well as disinfection (preferably with DDT)

Application to the appropriate Eighth Army Military Government unit is authorized, in accordance with separate instructions to be issued, for desired unaccompanied shipment, as follows:

- (a) Clothing, personal possessions and household effects of value only to the owner, in addition to that authorized above, the total shipment thereof limited in weight to 500 pounds per person.
- (b) Certain light machinery and handicraft tools owned by them, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances as of 2 September 1945 and limited in weight to 4000 pounds.

(2) Permit Ryukyuan to take with them from Japan clothing and personal possessions of value only to the owner, limited in weight to 250 pounds per person.

d. (1) Take up against individual receipt:

- (a) All other currency and yen currency in excess of the amount set forth in paragraph 3a above. All Bank of Japan currency carried by Korean repatriates will be collected and individual receipts will be issued for all that over and above the amount taken in exchange for Bank of Chosen currency (see paragraph 3a (2) above, and memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.31 (30 Mar 46)ESS/FI, (SCAPIN-854-A), dated 30 March 1946, subject: "Conversion of Currency for Korean Repatriates.")
- (b) Gold, silver or platinum bullion or alloy thereof in bullion form.

2. It is reported that the repatriation facilities at the Kagoshima Reception Center are overcrowded by natives of Amami-Oshima awaiting repatriation; and that foodstuffs, medical stores, and other relief and welfare supplies are badly depleted there.

3. Repatriation to the Ryukyu Islands is suspended and, until such time as Ryukyans are moved under the repatriation program, repatriation facilities should not be made available to them. References cited in paragraph 1a and 1b above refer.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will take necessary action to:

a. Correct the local situation mentioned in paragraph 2 above from facilities other than those allocated for use in repatriation.

b. Insure future compliance with the provisions of references cited in paragraph 1a and 1b above.



1. Reference is memorandum from the Imperial Japanese Government, 6 June 1946, CLO No. 2732 (EF), subject: "Budget Estimates for 1946-47" which submitted the proposed General Account Budget for the fiscal year 1946-47.
2. The Supreme Commander has no objection to the submission of the general account budget for the fiscal year 1946-47 to the Diet. The Supreme Commander neither approves nor disapproves of any item in the budget, but reserves the right at any time to require the Japanese Government to provide funds necessary to carry out policies of the occupation, and to prohibit the expenditure of funds for purposes inconsistent with such policies.
3. Upon its final adoption this budget shall become the sole budget for the general account for the fiscal year 1946-47. Any expenditures made or obligation incurred during the 1946-47 fiscal year pursuant to any temporary budget previously authorized by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or pursuant to Article LXXI of the Constitution which made the 1945-46 budget effective pending the adoption of this budget shall become a charge against the corresponding items of this budget as though they had been made pursuant thereto and no further expenditure shall be made nor obligation incurred on account of any such temporary budget or through the operation of Article LXXI of the Constitution. This shall not preclude the adoption of supplemental budgets thereafter, provided such budgets are submitted in advance to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. The Ministry of Finance shall take steps immediately to:

- a. Revise the fiscal procedures and accounting system so that it will currently and accurately reflect the character and object of expenditure by functions, activities and organization units.

b. Limitation on intercorporate security holdings by Restricted Companies.

c. Prohibition of multiple directorates in all Restricted Companies except those of a financial nature, where adequate controls will be established.

d. Prohibition among Restricted Companies of contractual, service or patent arrangements which restrict competition or restrain trade and commerce.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government is, accordingly, directed to submit promptly, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, its proposal for carrying out the requirements of paragraphs 2 and 3, above.

5. As used in this Memorandum, the term "Restricted Company or Companies" shall be construed to mean those companies which are listed in Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 004 (8 Dec 45) ESS/AC (SCAPIN - 403), subject: "Establishment of a Schedule of Restricted Concerns," or subsequent additions thereto. The term "listed families or family members" shall pertain to those families whose activities are restricted by Memoranda for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 004 (6 Nov 45) ESS/ADM (SCAPIN - 244), subject: "Dissolution of Holding Companies," and file AG 091.4 (3 Jun 46) ESS/AC (SCAPIN - 995), subject: "Reports to be Made by Certain Families."
