MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Repatriation of Ryukyans now in Japan.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 370.05 (7 May 46)GC, (SCAPIN-927), dated 7 May 1946, subject: "Repatriation", as amended.

2. All instructions contained in the memorandum referred to above, which are in conflict with this memorandum, are superseded.

3. The following plan governs the repatriation of Ryukyans now in Japan, who desire to return to their homes in the Ryukyu Islands.

4. Japanese-manned ships are being scheduled to shuttle between the ports of Kagoshima, Kure, Nagoya and Sasebo in Japan, and the islands of Okinawa, Miyako, Ishigaki and Amami Oshima.

a. Repatriates destined for Amami, Kikai, Tokara Retto, Tokuna, Yoron, and Okinoerabu will be repatriated to Koniya, Amami Oshima.

b. Repatriates destined for Okinawa, Okinawa Gunto, Kerama Retto and Minami Daito will be repatriated to Katchin Wan, Okinawa.

c. Repatriates destined for Miyako Retto will be repatriated to Miyako.

d. Repatriates destined for Yaeyama Retto will be repatriated to Ishigaki.

e. Ryukyans, paragraphs 4a, b, c and d above, will be evacuated from ports at the weekly rates indicated below:

f. Except as noted below, Ryukyans now located in Kyushu will be processed and outloaded through Kagoshima and Sasebo. Ryukyans now located on Honshu, Hokkaido and Shikoku will be processed and outloaded through Kure and Nagoya. Exceptions follow: all Ryukyans destined for Yaeyama Retto and Miyako will be outloaded at Kagoshima and Nagoya respectively.

g. Repatriates destined for Okinawa will be outloaded so that repatriates aboard each ship are destined exclusively for either Northern or Southern Okinawa; except that repatriates bound for islands in Okinawa Gunto other than Okinawa may be transported with either group. The mura (areas) included in each geographical location are as follows:

Northern Okinawa: Kushi, Nago, Motobu, Nakijin, Ie Shima, Manaji, Ogimi, Higashi, Kunijami, Chatan, Goeku, North Misato, South Misato, Gushikawa, Nonagusuku, Yontanza, Ishikawa, Kir, Jizuza and Onna.

Southern Okinawa: Nakagusuku, Ginowan, Urasoe, Nishibaru, Shuri, Mawashi, Naha, Haebaru, Oroku, Tomigusuku, Kanegusuku, Kochinda, Ozoto, Sashiki, Chinen, Tamagusuka, Gushichan, Itoman, Takamine, Makabe, Kiyamu and Mabuni.

h. Repatriates, upon arriving at primary debarkation ports in the Ryukyus, will be further distributed to their home islands.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Hold repatriates in quarantine for a six (6) day period prior to placing them aboard repatriation ships.

b. Administer two inoculations against cholera during the appropriate seasons and one vaccination against smallpox to each repatriate prior to embarkation.

c. Backlog sufficient Ryukyans in the appropriate reception centers to insure that repatriates are available at the rates prescribed in paragraph 4e above.

d. Outload Ryukyuan repatriates as prescribed in paragraph 4 above.

e. Provide one (1) doctor and two (2) medical orderlies on each ship engaged in repatriating Ryukyans.

f. Require the ship's master, upon arrival, to report to the responsible United States agency in the Ryukyuan port of entry of the presence of any quarantinable diseases aboard ship. When applicable, the ship's master will report the ship free from contagious diseases.

g. Preserve the integrity of the family group during repatriation.

h. In processing individuals destined for Katchin Wan, Okinawa:

(1) Assign a low priority date for repatriation of family groups, any members of which are seriously ill or require hospitalization.

(2) Furnish each ship's master with six (6) copies of an itemized list showing the number of repatriates aboard by mura destination. Instruct the ship's master to turn over five (5) copies of this list to repatriation officials in Okinawa prior to debarkation of passengers.

Dear Sir:

The Toyooka Bussan Co., Ltd., of Toyooka, Saitama Prefecture, desire to establish an office in Tokyo. An employee of this company holds ownership on a very desirable house at No. 812, 3 cho-me, Tsukiji, Kyobashi-ku, Tokyo. However this house is under the indefinite lease to the Nippon Theatrical Association. This lease provides that it may be terminated by either party by giving 90 days notice. Back in February 1946, the dissolution of this Association was officially announced to the owner of the house with an agreement that the house in question should be vacated in accordance with a provision of the lease. Then owner has officially served notice on the Association at that time.

Now the Association is refusing to vacate the house unless the owner of the house pays them the amount of ¥ 30,000.00. We consider such a demand is unreasonable, especially in view of the fact the rent is only ¥ 150.00 per month. We have applied several times to the Tsukiji Police Station to solve this matter, but were so much disappointed to know that no satisfactory solution could be given by their hands.

This Company desires an office in Tokyo because of the business enterprises with PACUSA Headquarters. We have a Government Contract for Laundry and Dry-cleaning, operating laundry booths in all PACUSA buildings and all Army Base in Tokyo area, and a Contract for garbage disposal. And also we are operating Gift Store in the Kaijo Building. An office is urgently needed in order to operate efficiently and give the best possible service.

This Company would greatly appreciate legal advice on the quickest and best method to evict the Nippon Theatrical Association from this house.

An application also is being submitted to the Metropolitan Police Station with a copy of this letter.

Attached to this letter is a report of the activities of this Company with the United States Army in Tokyo area.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will, on or before 25 August 1946, concentrate in suitable storage, all items reported under the above memorandum which are not being used by the Allied Occupation Forces, the Imperial Japanese Government or commercial companies performing work essential to the Occupation, except that where it is impracticable to move certain items because of their size, weight, present locations, class of property or fixed positions, such as secured to permanent foundation, they may be left in place under custody of the Imperial Japanese Government.

3. It will be the responsibility of the Imperial Japanese Government to pack properly all items to insure that they are not damaged in transit or during storage and to safe-guard them while they are in storage.

4. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will be notified of the location of storage facilities to be used and the condition and location of items which it is considered impracticable to move to such facilities. Items stored will be cataloged and so arranged as to be readily available for inspection. Five copies, in English, of all catalogs will be furnished the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. Direct communication between the appropriate agency of the Imperial Japanese Government and the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is hereby authorized to implement this move.

1. References are memoranda for General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, from the Imperial Japanese Government, CLO No. 2966 (EF), 19 June 1946, subject: "Taxation on Foreigners in Japan" and LO 627, 6 June 1946, subject: "Taxation on Chinese Residents in Japan."

2. There is no objection to the applicability of local and national ordinary taxation to all non-Japanese nationals except as specified in paragraph 3 below, provided that such taxes are not discriminatory against non-Japanese nationals.

3. No tax will be imposed by the Imperial Japanese Government on the official salaries of military personnel, of civilians attached to the occupation forces, and of personnel accredited by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as having a diplomatic status.

4. For purposes of this memorandum the term "ordinary taxes" includes all general taxes presently imposed by the Imperial Japanese Government and by the various local governments. This memorandum will not apply to the impending Capital Levy Law and other taxes of an extraordinary nature.

The dollar proceeds of such remittances will be available for payment of essential imports into Japan and other approved purposes.

2. The following procedure has been established for effecting such remittances to Japan:

a. Funds in United States dollars will be accepted for remittance to Japan and will be deposited with the United States Secretary of Treasury in a special account in the name of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Advice of deposits will be forwarded to Japan and will include all pertinent information necessary to locate, properly identify, and effect payments to the remittee in Japan.

b. The Bank of Japan, as Fiscal Agent for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will make payment to the remittee in yen at the prevailing military conversion rate to the debit of the "Special Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers' Account for Remittances from the United States."

3. At the close of each month the Bank of Japan will submit a statement in triplicate to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers showing:

a. Total yen amount of remittances effected under the above procedure prior to the month covered by the report.

b. List of individual remittances effected during the month covered by the report.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and supply full information concerning the present location and condition of six national seals of Korea, taken to Japan by the retiring Japanese government of Korea at the close of the war.

2. The seals are described as follows:

- A. Seal of the State of Korea - Made of silver; used in matters pertaining to foreign nations.
- B. Seal of the Emperor - Made of silver; used for decorations and awards, and for military purposes and to declare a mobilization or a state of siege.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to approximately 22,000 short tons of wheat being made available for future Japanese consumption.

1. The Italian freighter "Carignano" has been reported to have taken shelter in Formosa when Italy declared war on France and later to have been moved to Kobe.

a. Accept delivery of approximately 22,000 short tons of wheat at points in Kobe designated by the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

2. The Central Liaison Office is directed to furnish General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers a report as to disposition of cargo on board the "Carignano" and her destination. Report will include information as follows:

b. Furnish the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, with quantitative receipts for the wheat at points of delivery.

c. Store the wheat so that it is protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards and is under proper custody at all times.

d. Ensure that no distribution is made of the wheat until official authorization for release is given by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. This does not preclude processing or the transportation of the grain to areas of greatest anticipated need.

2. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 430 (11 Apr 46)ESS/PC, (SCAPIN 960-A), 11 April 1946, subject: "Maintenance of Records of Storage and Distribution of Imported Foodstuffs." A report providing the information in paragraph 1 a of the above memorandum will be made to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers concerning the storage of this wheat.

2. The group of Generals was transferred from Sjuritawa Camp to Haito Camp and thence to Cheng Chia Tun (Idaoyang) in Manchuria via Beppu, Fukuoka, Fusan and Mukden. Heavy baggage was left behind to follow but did not arrive in Cheng Chia Tun prior to repatriation after VJ-Day.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 311.3 (8 Jan 46) CCS, dated 8 January 1946, subject: "Establishment of Telephone Service Between the United States and Tokyo."

2. It is directed that the two-channel, single side band transmitting and receiving equipment recently constructed by the International Telecommunications Company be placed in operation on the circuit providing telephone service between Tokyo and the United States using both voice channels for commercial operation on or about 1 August 1946. The double side band equipment may be used when the single side band equipment is not in use.

3. At present, two channel, single side band operation is authorized only on frequencies 15860 kc and 18910 kc. Single channel (Channel A), single side band operation on 7780 kc is temporarily authorized until such time as another similar frequency is cleared and assigned for two-channel operation.

4. Telephone calls will continue to be accepted from military and accredited civilian personnel only. "A" priority calls must be approved by designated approving officers whose names are on file at Tokyo Central Telephone Office. All other calls need not be approved.

5. This directive modifies paragraphs 2 and 4 of the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 as stated herein.
