SUBJECT: Three Thousand Kan Sakusan (tussur) Wild Silk and 451 Bales Raw Silk in the Warehouse of Junzo Sakai, Mitsuke-machi, Niigata ken.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to submit a complete report on the origin and subsequent movement of the merchandise described in the subject matter of this Memorandum, particularly the following:

- a. The first or original owner of the goods;
- b. The date the goods passed into the hands of the Japanese;
- c. Whether the first Japanese possessor was an individual or a government agency, and the name and address of such individual or agency;
- d. The consideration or amount paid for the goods;
- e. Give details of all successive possessors, the dates possession was acquired and the consideration paid for the goods;
- f. When Shigetaro Shinke acquired the goods, from whom he purchased them, and what he paid for the goods;
- g. A history of Shigetaro Shinke, including his present business or occupation, previous business or occupation, and financial standing;
- h. All other facts which have to do with these goods, the origin, movement, possessors or owners.

SUBJECT : Property of Dissolved Organizations.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 091(4 Jan 46)GS, SCAPIN 548, subject: "Abolition of Certain Political Parties, Associations, Societies and Other Organizations", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is hereby instructed that the Japanese Army and Navy organizations named "KAIKOSHA" and "SUIKOSHA" are deemed to fall within the purview of the Memorandum, referred to in paragraph 1, above. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to dissolve at once the organizations named, with all their branches and successor organizations.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is further instructed to take such action as may be necessary to prevent all transactions involving property owned or controlled, directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, by the designated organizations. The Imperial Japanese Government will execute within sixty (60) days, hereafter, Inclosure No. 1, "Information and Inventory Report", for the designated organizations and their successor organizations as of the date of this Memorandum, and will separately report all property transactions from 15 August 1945 to date of dissolution. Reports will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in quadruplicate.

SUBJECT : Radium from Philippine General Hospital.

1. The Dean of the College of Medicine of the University of the Philippines, Manila, has reported the removal of radium from the X-Ray Department of the Philippine General Hospital at the time of the occupation of the Philippines by the Japanese forces. The person responsible for the removal is Doctor Isamu Ono, now chief of the Sanitation Section, Gifu Prefecture.

2. Doctor Ono has been interviewed by the 107th Military Government Headquarters and Headquarters Company and stated that, acting under orders from Lt. Col. Nakayama of Tanaka Military Government and Major Inuzuka of Wachi Military Government, he removed one half of the radium from the hospital. He believes the radium was sent to some Japanese Air Force unit in Hongkong to be used in the manufacture of airplanes. Gifu Prefecture authorities have instructions that they are responsible for Doctor Ono until this question is settled.

3. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate the seizure and to furnish the Civil Property Custodian information as to the actual amount and specifications of the radium removed from the Philippine General Hospital, as well as a complete report as to the disposition of the said property.

1. Reference is made to letter C. L. O. No. 3389 (CC) of 10 July 1946, subject: Establishment of Mail System Between Northern Korea and Japan.

2. Reference is also made to Memorandum, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 311.7 (23 Feb 46) CCS, (SCAPIN 766) subject: Transportation and Handling of Repatriation Mail, authorizing establishment of a limited postal service between Japan and Japanese awaiting repatriation in formerly Japanese occupied areas.

3. Mail exchanges between the two zones in Korea have been temporarily suspended due to cholera outbreak in Korea north of 38°. Repatriation mail to addresses in Korea north of 38° may now be dispatched from Japan to Korea south of 38° north latitude for delivery in Korea north of 38° when mail exchanges are resumed. No assurance can be given that such mail will be delivered to the addressees.

The Imperial Japanese Government will immediately put into effect the quarantine procedures as stated in Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government (SCAFIN 927) dated 7 May 1946, subject: "Repatriation", with regard to all ships from Hulutao, except that the port of Hakata will be used in addition to the ports mentioned in paragraph 3c of Annex V for processing of cholera suspect ships.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will establish processing facilities for ships from cholera suspect ports so that the combined capacity of Sasebo and Hakata are 10,000 cholera suspects per day. This will be accomplished by 10 August 1946.

4. A report will be made to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by the most expeditious means when the requirements of paragraph 3 of this Memorandum have been met.

The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to grant permission to Doitsu Senryo Gomei Kaisha to transfer the packages of dyestuffs, dyeing assistants and textile chemicals as set forth in its application of 28 June 1946, from their present locations to the warehouse of Doitsu Senryo Gomei Kaisha, Hyogo-ken, Muko-gun, Honjo-mura, Nishi-Ogi, Torashinden.

3. Any payments made by enemy nationals as a result of authority granted by this memorandum will be made by restricted check and will be promptly reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (Attention Civil Property Custodian).

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is further directed to grant permission to Doitsu Senryo Gomei Kaisha to take the necessary measures to ensure the preservation of all dyestuffs, chemicals, or other stocks in its custody. All necessary expenses incurred for such work will be payable from funds available to Doitsu Senryo Gomei Kaisha, after approval by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

1. Reference is made to the following:

a. Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 800.217, (3 Nov 45)NR, (SCAPIN - 233), 3 November 1945, subject: "Whaling Industry."

b. Memorandum from Imperial Japanese Government to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, C.L.O. No. 2416 (EA), 19 May 1946, subject: "Whaling in the Antarctic Ocean," with inclosure thereto.

2. Japanese whaling operations in the Antarctic are hereby authorized for the 1946 - 1947 season. Such operations will be conducted only in that part of the Pacific and Indian Oceans of the Antarctic bounded by south latitude 55 degrees on the north and that part of the Antarctic land mass on the south generally known as Wilkes Land, South Victoria Land and the Ross Shelf and between east longitude 90 degrees on the east of Greenwich and west longitude 170 degrees on the west of Greenwich, hereinafter referred to as the Antarctic Whaling Area, during the period and under the conditions set forth by the International Whaling Conventions or modifications thereof which may be adopted prior to the season.

3. The following vessels are authorized to conduct whaling operations in the Antarctic Whaling Area:

d. The master of each of the factory ships listed in paragraph 3 during the whaling operations in the authorized Antarctic Whaling Area will forward a daily radiogram to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo listing the following information:

(1) Location of his ship at 1200 hours on the date radiogram is dispatched.

(2) Number and kind of whales processed on his ship during the previous 24-hour period and output of whale oil, meat, blubber, and other products.

e. Applications for frequency for radio communications by the whaling fleet will be made to Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

f. Each vessel will proceed to and return from the Antarctic Whaling Area by the most direct route and without approaching any land nearer than 12 miles. The route to be followed by each vessel to and from the Antarctic Whaling Area will be supplied by the Imperial Japanese Government to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Commander, Naval Activities Japan (COMNAVJAP), 15 days prior to departure of each vessel from Japanese ports and from the Antarctic Whaling Area.

g. The master of each of the factory ships on departing from the Antarctic Whaling Area will dispatch a radiogram to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo stating date of departure.

h. On departure from and arrival at their home ports in Japan each vessel will clear its respective port through the duly constituted port authorities of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at that port.

i. The vessels are authorized to leave Japanese ports for the Antarctic Whaling Area during the period 1 November 1946 to 15 December 1946. Return from the Antarctic Whaling Area to the home port of each vessel must be accomplished by one month after the closing of the whaling season in the Antarctic or by 30 April 1947, whichever occurs first.

j. The Japanese Bureau of Fisheries will maintain at its office in Tokyo a file of all radiograms required to be dispatched in accordance with paragraph 4 for reference by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers when desired.

5. The whale oil produced by the operations of the vessels listed in paragraph 3 will be brought to Japan and as soon as possible after arrival the oil will be suitably stored and safely guarded. The Imperial Japanese Government will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers the location of the place or places where the whale oil is stored and amount in storage within ten days after it is safe in storage. Final disposition of the whale oil will be the subject of a further memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Imperial Japanese Government.

6. The attention of the Imperial Japanese Government is called to memorandum on the whaling industry mentioned in reference 1a above. Reports called for in accordance with this memorandum will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 1 June 1947.

In order to release industry from certain wartime production controls and to establish more democratic methods of increasing the production of essential materials and commodities for the reconstruction of a peacetime economy, the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take the necessary action to accomplish the following within ninety (90) days from date of this Memorandum:

a. Dissolve existing Control Associations (Tosei Kai) and repeal or rescind all laws, ordinances, regulations and ministerial ordinances relating thereto.

b. Preserve the complete records of such Associations within the respective bureaus of the Government now supervising such Associations.

c. Concurrently with the actions taken in accordance with the provisions of subparagraph 1a, above, establish such public agencies, divisions and procedures within or under the Economic Stabilization Board as may be necessary to effectuate, under the coordinated direction and supervision of said Board, and in cooperation with the particular ministries concerned, allocations to and within such specific industries as may be selected by such Board for the assured production of essential materials and goods, and to assure that such allocations are adjusted to meet desired production schedules; supervise the establishment and operation of democratically organized and operated trade associations to be used as temporary stabilization devices within the specified industries selected by the Economic Stabilization Board for the purpose of allocating essential raw and semi-processed materials within those industries.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will furnish the following information to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Memorandum:

The existence of all industry trade associations as temporary stabilization devices within selected industries, and the public agencies established by the Imperial Japanese Government in compliance with the provisions of this Memorandum shall be limited to a period of one (1) year from date of this Memorandum, except as authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

Official United States Government radio-telephone calls destined to points in the United States, its territories or possessions, will originate only at the General Headquarters Signal Center, Dai Ichi Building, Tokyo, or at the Tokyo Central Headquarters Office of the Ministry of Communications. The calls will be placed directly with the officer in charge of the overseas telephone service, Tokyo Central Telephone Office.

3. Official United States Government radio-telephone calls will take priority over all other calls.

4. Official United States Government radio-telephone calls will be accounted for as prepaid.

5. The Ministry of Communications will prepare, in duplicate, a monthly statement showing all official United States Government radio-telephone calls originating at Tokyo, itemized by dates; chargeable minutes of each call; report charges; amount of tolls to be credited to the Ministry of Communications; amount of tolls to be credited to the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, including charges for calls destined to points beyond San Francisco. The monthly statement will be forwarded to Commanding General, Eighth Army, Yokohama (Attention: Signal Officer). The duplicate copy of the monthly statement will be delivered to General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific (Attn: Office of the Chief Signal Officer).

6. The Ministry of Communications will submit monthly statements of service rendered, for its share of the tolls for handling official United States Government radio-telephone calls, in the same manner as those submitted for other services. General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, will arrange payment of charges accruing to American Telephone and Telegraph Company and connecting carriers.

2. All instructions contained in the memorandums referred to above, which are in conflict with this memorandum, are superseded herewith.

3. Effective 10 August 1946, the following plan governs the repatriation of Koreans in Japan, who desire to return to their homes in Korea south of 38° north latitude.

4. The repatriation of Koreans in Japan, who were formerly resident in Korea south of 38° north latitude, will be completed on or before 15 November 1946, except as noted in paragraph 1d, Annex III to reference paragraph 1a above.

5. a. Repatriation shipping is assigned to lift 4,000 Koreans per day from Hakata, Japan, to Pusan, Korea. These ships will be returned empty to Japan.

b. Shipping will be scheduled as necessary to lift Japanese from Korea to Sasebo.

6. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Maintain sufficient Koreans in the Hakata Reception Center

d. Continue to comply with the provisions of paragraph 1c, Annex III to reference paragraph 1a above.

e. Submit a report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 30 November 1946 showing:

- (1) Names of Koreans, listed by family, who were not repatriated on or before 15 November 1946, but who have not forfeited their privilege of repatriation, as outlined in paragraph 1d, Annex III to reference paragraph 1a above.
- (2) Approximate date each family, referred to in paragraph 6e (1) above, will be able to move to Hakata Reception Center. In any case, delay in repatriation is not authorized beyond 31 December 1946.

SUBJECT : Revised Procedure for the Handling of Official United States Government Messages Filed at Tokyo Destined to the United States, its Territories or Possessions.

1. This memorandum supplements the Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 311.2 (30 Apr 46)CCS, (SCAPIN-912), dated 30 April 1946, subject: "Broadening Scope of Services Handled Over Radio Telegraph Circuits Between Tokyo Area, and (1) United States, and (2) London, England, to Include the Handling of Official Messages for Government Representatives".

2. Para-graph 5, AG 311.2 (30 Apr 46)CCS, (SCAPIN-912), is changed to read:

"5. Government messages, except United States government messages, shall be sent from Tokyo on a collect basis to Washington and London. United States government messages shall be sent from Tokyo on a prepaid basis to any point in the United States, or its territories or possessions, to which service is available. Government messages sent to Tokyo from London, or to Tokyo from any point in the United States or its territories or possessions, must be prepaid."

3. United States government messages destined to points in the United States, its territories or possessions, will originate only at the General Headquarters Signal Center, Dai Ichi Building, Tokyo. The messages will be dispatched by courier from the General Headquarters Signal Center to the receiving office of the Central Telegraph Office of the Ministry of Communications. The courier will identify himself at the receiving office of the Central Telegraph Office by displaying a letter issued by General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, stating that the named bearer, photograph attached, is authorized to file United States government messages for transmission. The receiving office of the Central Telegraph Office will accept for transmission United States government messages only from the hands of properly identified, authorized couriers. The Central Telegraph Office employee who accepts United States government messages for transmission will issue a signed receipt for each message in the form shown in Inclosure 1. Receipts will be returned to the General Headquarters Signal Center by the Courier.

4. The designation "Official U. S. Army Telegram" will appear in the preamble of each message.

BASIC: Memo, GHQ, SCAP, to Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 311.2 (8 Aug 46)CCS, (SCAPIN- 1114), dtd 8 August 46 , subj: "Revised Procedure for the Handling of Official United States Government Messages Filed at Tokyo Destined United States, its Territories or Possessions."

5. Priority in transmission will be observed in accordance with the International Telegraph Regulations, that is, official United States government telegrams will take precedence over all other telegrams except those relating to the safety of life at sea or in the air.

6. The messages will be transmitted as prepaid.

7. The Ministry of Communications will prepare, in duplicate, a monthly statement showing all United States government messages originating at Tokyo, itemized by filing dates; word count of each message; American carrier through which message was routed; amount of tolls to be credited to Ministry of Communications; amount of tolls to be credited to the American Carrier, including forwarding charges for messages destined to points beyond San Francisco. The monthly statement will be forwarded to Commanding General, Eighth Army, Yokohama (Attn: Signal Officer). The duplicate copy of the monthly statement will be delivered to General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, (Attn: Office of the Chief Signal Officer).

8. The Ministry of Communications will submit monthly statements of service rendered, for its share of the tolls for the transmission of United States government messages, in the same manner as those submitted for other services. General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, will arrange payment of charges accruing to the American Carriers.

9. Each official United States government message will be filed in duplicate. The Central Telegraph Office will enter on the duplicate the word count, time of transmission, and the name of American carrier through which message was routed. The duplicate will be returned to the General Headquarters Signal Center the day after transmission of the original message.

10. This memorandum in no way affects the instructions contained in Memorandum AG 311.2 (13 Jun 46)CCS, (SCAPIN-1019), subject: "Handling of Occupation Force Official Business Over Japanese Domestic Telegraph Circuits".

which communications were transmitted through the good offices of the proper Allied Authorities - has the honour to inform the Imperial Ministry as follows.

The telegraphic Messages and the documents contained in the above note verbale mentioned under /b/ were immediately relayed by the Swedish Mission to the Swedish Legation at RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil, through the intermediary of the proper Authorities. The said documents seem to have been delayed somewhere en route, and the Swedish Authorities concerned are now endeavouring to trace them and to accelerate

their transmission to Brazil. The telegraphic Messages, on the other hand, have reached their destination in due course.

However, by a telegram despatched by the Swedish Foreign Ministry on 23rd instant, this Mission has been informed that new and very serious incidents have been caused by Japanese terrorists in Brazil. Owing hereto, the Provincial Government of the Brazilian State of Sao Paulo, on 19th instant, arranged a meeting with the Japanese extremists at Sao Paulo. According to the wish of the Government of the United States of Brazil, the Swedish Minister to Brazil, Mr Ragnar KUMLIN, was present at the said meeting and read to the assembly the texts of the Rescript of H.I.M. the Emperor of 14th August, 1945, as well as the Message of the Imperial Japanese Government to the Japanese nationals in Brazil of May, 1946, contained in the above note verbale of 11th May, 1946.

In the last-mentioned communication, the Imperial Ministry was good enough to mention that, upon a suggestion from the Swedish Legation in Brazil, it was studying a plan of radio broadcasts to the Japanese citizens in Brazil. The Swedish Mission ventures to ask whether the Imperial Ministry is, now, able to indicate:-

- /1/ whether this plan is likely to materialize, and
- /2/ if so, when.

Reverting to the above-mentioned note verbale of 14th May, 1946, of the Swedish Mission, regarding a suggestion to encourage Japanese persons in Japan to send exhaustive news from home to their relatives in Brazil, the Mission ventures to indicate that - although the said communication was marked "urgent" and, with some insistence, asked for an early reply, whether it be affirmative or negative - no

answer seems, as yet, two months after the despatch of the message, to have been received by the Mission. In view of this apparent delay, The Swedish Mission ventures to ask the Imperial Ministry to be good enough urgently to indicate:-

- /i/ whether it has received the note verbale in question,
- /ii/ if so, what - in the opinion of the Imperial Ministry - is, or might be, the cause of the delay of the answer,
- /iii/ still if so, what is the opinion of the Imperial Authorities concerned of the feasibility of the suggestion.

In the above telegram of 23rd instant from the Swedish Foreign Ministry it was pointed out that, as yet, no correspondence had arrived in Brazil from relatives in Japan. This Mission has ventured tentatively to answer that this might be due to difficulties to arrange an exception from the present general suspension of public postal service to and from Japan. It will no doubt be made clear in the reply of the Imperial Ministry to the questions in the immediately preceding paragraph, whether this assumption conforms to facts.
