  - c. The Military Government officer will assist in making necessary arrangements for inspection of the property.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to investigate and submit a complete report on the location of 35 kg. of gold, shipped from the Netherlands East Indies on the S.S. "Tencho Maru" in July or August 1945.
2. The "Tencho Maru" was torpedoed on 3 August 1945 about two miles northwest of the Island of Sugama, where it sank in shallow water.
3. The master of the vessel, Nonaka Sunao, the chief officer, Muragami Masayoshi, and the steward, Kusuyama Takao, have been repatriated to Japan.
4. It is directed that the report required in paragraph 1 above also include the following information:
  - a. Whether or not the gold was aboard ship.
  - b. If so, whether it was left on board or removed after the ship was torpedoed.
  - c. If the gold was removed from the ship, to whom delivery was made.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission presents its compliments to the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs and, acting upon instructions received from the Swedish Government, has the honour to request the good offices of the Imperial Ministry in order to settle, if possible, the following matter regarding an acknowledgement of paternity and an undertaking to pay a sustenance contribution.

The Municipal Care Visitor at Stockholm, Sweden, of the child Hans Evert, born on 23rd February, 1946, to Miss Karin Ingrid OLSSON, /address: 16 Hybrogatan, Stockholm/ has approached the proper Swedish Authorities with a request to obtain, if possible, the signature of the alleged father of the said child, Mr Hiroshi ONO, a Japanese citizen, on either of the enclosed two types of forms,

The said Care Visitor, on the strength of information furnished by Miss OLSSON, has reported as follows regarding the alleged father, Mr ONO. He is said to have been born on 13th December, 1909, hailing from Tokyo, where his parents are said to have kept a theatre and a restaurant. The home of his pa-

rents at Tokyo is believed to have been bombed, and the parents are now believed to live in the vicinity of the Japanese Capital. Mr ONO had given Miss OLSSON to understand that his parents had sent him to Paris, France, to study restaurant keeping, which he had done there for about 8 years. Thereafter he had been serving with the Japanese Embassy at Rome, Italy, and with the Japanese Consulate at Venice, Italy, as a cook. Then he served as a cook with the Japanese Legation at Stockholm, Sweden. On or about 26th January, 1946, Mr ONO left Sweden to be repatriated to Japan with the Japanese Legation. Miss OLSSON has indicated that Mr ONO had promised to marry her if he would be allowed to remain in Sweden. Upon his departure, he gave her 1.000:- Swedish Kronor. He had never denied his fatherhood of the child, but seemed to rejoice at its expected birth.

The Care Visitor has added a statement that if it will prove possible to get into contact with Mr ONO and to obtain simply his signature on either of the enclosed types of forms about the acknowledgement of the fatherhood and about the undertaking to pay a sustenance contribution, already this will be of great economical importance for the mother of the child, because, in such a case, she may become entitled to receive an advance sustenance contribution from the Swedish municipality, where she now lives, in case a contribution from Mr ONO should fail to be forthcoming for some reason.

The above represents, of course, only one side of the matter. The Swedish Mission would be indebted to the Imperial Ministry, if, by its kind intermediary, it would be possible to obtain the view of Mr ONO, and, if the above statements are correct in substance, his signature to one of the enclosed types of forms.

2. References are memoranda for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- a. SCAFIN 47, Directive Number 3, dated 22 September 1945, paragraph 4a.

3. SCAFIN 47 states that all applications for manufacture of industrial explosives must be approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

SCAFIN 1038 authorizes specific quantities of explosives to be manufactured and used for industrial purposes only. Lead azide and tetrazen are not among the explosives authorized.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will advise General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, when the above individual has been delivered to the authorities of Sugamo Prison. In the event the Japanese Government is unable to make delivery of this individual by 2400 hours, 5 September 1946, it will make a report in detail giving the present location of the individual, and the reason for failure to arrest.

Procurement will be effected by means of a procurement demand, GPA Form 1, served by Military Government personnel on the Imperial Japanese Government through Japanese Liaison Offices or local Japanese governments.
- Members of the occupation force do not have the authority to serve a procurement demand on any Japanese individual or company nor to negotiate for Japanese supplies, real estate, construction, and services for use by the occupation forces except as provided by paragraph 1. A complete report listing all pertinent details will be rendered promptly to this headquarters of deviations from the prescribed procedure.
- It is desired that the above matter be brought to the attention of the Japanese people.

SUBJECT : Property Removed from the Shanghai Dockyards Ltd.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and furnish a complete report on the present location and condition of the machinery and other property of the Shanghai Dockyards Ltd., Shanghai, China, listed on the attached sheets. The required report is to be submitted to Civil Property Custodian on or before 1 Oct 1946.

2. The Mitsubishi Goshi Kaisha took control of the above company after the Japanese occupation of Shanghai and is reported to have disposed of all its machinery. Attached is a separate list of some of the machinery believed to have been sent to the Mitsubishi Hiroshima Shipyard, together with the forwarding symbol said to have been used. It is likely that even more of the Company's property was sent to the Mitsubishi Hiroshima Shipyard, as well as to their shipyards in Nagasaki and other places in Japan.

3. The following named individuals are reported to have knowledge of the disposal of this property:

(a) Mr. Koichi Nakamura, former Manager of the Mitsubishi Chianganan Shipyard (Shanghai) now believed to be in the employ of Mitsubishi at Nagasaki.

(b) Mr. Kusaburo Imoto, an engineer formerly of the Mitsubishi Hiroshima Shipyards, who went to Shanghai in 1944 to take delivery of the machinery for the Hiroshima Shipyards.

4. With reference to memorandum to Central Liaison Office, file 412.3, dated 22 August 1946, subject "Property Looted from Various British Shipping and Dockyard Firms in China," the tug "Gutzlaff" belonging to Mac Kinmon Mac Kenzie & Company, Shanghai, China, mentioned in paragraph 1(c), has been located in China.
