The Japanese Delegation of the International Red
Cross Committee presents its compliments to the Central
Liaison Office and with reference to the request of the
Gaimusho for information on the subject parties, has
pleasure in informing that the Delegation has just come
into receipt of a communication from the International
Red Cross Committee, London, dated May 31, 1946, to the
effect that Consul General Beppu and Mrs. Beppu, as well
as Consul Ichihashi are still living in ~~the~~ Dublin.

During a conversation which Consul General
Beppu had with a representative of the Swiss Legation
in Dublin, he stated that they were prevented from
leaving Ireland because "not only normal travelling means
are not available to them as yet but also facilities are
denied to them by the Allies' Representatives in Dublin
who have refused to accept delivery of the archives and
the property of the Consulate General in spite of the
Consul General's repeated requests made to them in
execution of the Gaimusho's relative directives.

In this connection, copy of Consul General Beppu's
letter of May 24, 1946 to the Charge d'Affaires of the
Swiss Legation, Dublin, is enclosed herewith.

The Consul General wishes that their immediate repatriation will be arranged, without any quid pro quo to be imposed on the arrangements, by the International Red Cross. May, 24th, 1946".

No. 1556 (PP), 4 April 1946, and approved by SCAPIN 975-A, 12 April 1946, by substituting the words "1 October 1946" for "January 1947" in section eleven. (11).

2. Section eleven (11) of the Plan will be further amended to provide for furnishing all local government offices, not later than 1 October 1946, with standard printed forms of uniform size, content and arrangement for use in making declarations and medical certifications which will serve as a source of information for statistical schedules of birth, death, stillbirth, marriage and divorce.

SUBJECT : Repatriation Ships.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 370.05 (7 May 46) GC, (SCAPIN-927), dated 7 May 1946, subject: "Repatriation."

2. Specific orders implementing paragraph 4, Annex I of references paragraph 1 were issued in the case of the United States Liberty Ship VO75, and the United States Landing Ships, Tank QO74, QO76, QO91 and QO94 to sail from Sasebo by United States Naval Shipping Control Authority for Japanese Merchant Marine. These ships failed to sail as ordered, the reason advanced by Civilian Merchant Marine Committee was to the effect that the Japanese crews of the ships listed above are on strike until demands of the Seamen's Union are met.

3. Strikes, walk-outs or other work stoppages which are inimical to the objectives of the military occupation are prohibited. Repatriation is interpreted as an objective of military occupation and consequently any strike or other act which interferes with this program is prohibited.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government, without the use of police force, will:

a. Man and operate ships mentioned in paragraph 2 above in accordance with duly issued orders of the Civilian Merchant Marine Committee in furtherance of the repatriation program.

b. Take necessary action to prevent a recurrence of similar incidents.

c. Report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, without delay, action taken.

5. In event desired result cannot be obtained as prescribed herein without the use of police force, prompt report thereof will be rendered to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

(1) Standard or Basic Section:

- III - International Index number of station.
- GG - Time of beginning of ascent, nearest whole hour GMT.
- P₀P₀P₀''' - Pressure at surface, whole millibars.
Note: The convention of writing P for hundreds place, P prime (P') for tens place and P double prime (P'') for units place has been adopted.
- T₀T₀ - Temperature at surface, whole degrees C.
- U₀U₀ - Relative humidity at surface, whole percent.
- x₁x₂x₃ - Indicator figures to show units used and inclusion of wind groups; x₁ for heights and temperatures, x₂ for wind and x₃ for moisture (u'u'). Tables are in paragraph d. below.
- 0 - Indicator figure for wind group (radio or radar wind). Data in the wind group always refers to the level immediately preceding.
- dd - Wind direction, tens of degrees.
- vv - Wind speed. (See paragraph f (8) for wind speeds over 99 knots.)
- P₁P₁, P₂P₂ - Pressure in 10's of millibars of the first (lowest) second, etc. pressure levels. 00 = 1000 mb., 90 = 900 mb., 85 = 850 mb., etc.
- h₁h₁h₁, h₂h₂h₂ - Height of P₁P₁, P₂P₂, etc. in tens of feet.
- T₁T₁, T₁T₁ - Temperature of P₁P₁, P₂P₂, etc in whole degrees C.

f. The following practices and conventions in the use of the above code will be followed:

- (1) The mandatory levels (basic section) transmitted will be the 1000, 850, 700, 500, 300, 200, and 100 millibar levels.
- (2) Transmission of the data will be in two parts. First transmission will include all data to the 400 mb. level. Second transmission will include all the available data above 400 mb. Fifty will be added to Greenwich Time of ascent in the second transmission to designate it as such.
- (3) The temperature, moisture group, and wind group for any pressure level will be omitted when the level is below the surface of the station. Omission of these groups will be clearly indicated by the negative value for height when the surface is below sea level (see paragraph (4)), by the value for surface pressure, and by the first two figures of the next group.
- (4) To report heights below sea level the convention of adding 500 to the code figures (5000 to the actual values in feet) will be used. Example: If the height of the 1000 mb. surface is 1280 feet below sea level 5000 is added and the figures 628 are coded for hhh.
- (5) Temperature will be reported in whole degrees Centigrade with code 0 being used for x₁ (paragraph d(1) above). The convention of adding 50 for negative values will apply. Example: - 15°C is coded as 65.
- (6) Moisture content (u'u') will be reported as indicated by 0 in code table d(3) above.

- (7) When combination rewin and radiosonde flights are made, code number 4 will be used for x₂ (paragraph d(2) above) and wind data will be included for mandatory constant pressure levels in the basic section of the radiosonde transmission. This wind data will not take the place of the regular transmission, but complete transmission will be sent. Wind data taken by other methods (Pibal, etc.) will not be included in the radiosonde report.
- (8) The following convention will be used for reporting wind speeds over 99 knots:
 - (a) In the range 100 to 199, 50 is added to dd, and vv gives the actual speed 100. Example: a speed of 135 from the west (270 degrees) is coded 07735.
 - (b) In the range 200 to 299, the group 00200 is inserted immediately following the Oddvv group. dd gives the actual 10's of degrees and vv gives the actual speed minus 200. Example: a speed of 235 from the west (270 degrees) is coded 02735 00200.
 - (c) In the range 300 to 399, the group 00200 is inserted immediately following the Oddvv group, 50 is added to dd, and vv gives the actual speed minus 300. Example: a speed of 335 from the west (270 degrees) is coded 07735 00200.
- (9) The figures 9, 99 and 999 will be used for missing data in all positions except surface pressure. It is assumed that surface pressure will always be available.
- (10) Additional information such as icing data, cloud data, special phenomena, etc., will be included in supplemental groups as required.
- (11) The group 101DD (paragraph 3b) giving the day of the month, will be the last group in both first and second transmissions.
- (12) The group 101AA will be the next to last group in second transmission when ascent fails to reach 100 millibar level.

g. Reports prepared for transmission will be in the hands of the radio operator at least five minutes before transmission time.

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MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Radio Wave Monitoring Stations.

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1. The Ministry of Communications' plan for supplementing the four radio wave monitoring stations now operating at Tokyo (Iwatsuki), Sapporo (Kotoni), Osaka (Kire) and Fukuoka (Koga) with six additional stations is approved. Inclosure 1 is a list of the approved stations and includes a list of the equipment authorized for installation at the respective stations. Upon completion of the Hatsuse location, use of the Tokyo (Iwatsuki) station will be discontinued. No additional equipment is to be installed without prior approval of Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The transmitters authorized are to be used only for inter-communication between stations comprising the radio wave monitoring network. Their use will be discontinued as soon as satisfactory wire telephone or telegraph service can be established. Thereafter the transmitters will be used for emergency service only.
2. Construction and installation work will be scheduled so as to assure completion of the project by 1 July 1947. A monthly progress report of construction and installation will be submitted on or before the tenth day of each month to the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
3. The scheduling of the installation of the equipment will be so arranged as to make the services available in the following order: Receiver monitoring, frequency monitoring, inter-station communication (transmitter), field intensity measuring, and direction finding.
4. Monitoring stations will make and retain complete and accurate records of all monitoring operations. Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the

Allied Powers, will indicate to the Ministry of Communications the reports and records of operation that will be required by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. The Japanese Government will maintain a continuous twenty-four hour monitoring service to insure that no unauthorized stations are allowed to operate and that all stations are operated in accordance with (SCAPIN 1166), subject: "Control of Radio Communications", dated 29 August 1946, and other directives of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as well as current Japanese laws and regulations.

6. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications is authorized concerning all matters within the scope of this memorandum.

SUBJECT : Control of Radio Communications.

1. The frequency assignments for authorized Japanese radio stations recommended by the Ministry of Communications are approved.
2. Inclosure 1 lists the recommended and approved frequency assignments, and Inclosure 2 lists definitions and abbreviations pertaining to these frequency assignments.
3. The approved frequency assignments will become effective 0001H, 25 August, 1946. Operation of radio stations or use of frequencies other than those listed in Inclosure 1 will be discontinued on or before 1 October 1946.
4. Limitations under which the recommended frequency assignments were approved are stated in Inclosure 3. The Imperial Japanese Government will take the necessary action required to insure strict compliance with these limitations by all radio stations.
5. Additions, deletions or changes to the approved frequency assignments shown in Inclosure 1 will be made in accordance with the provisions of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 676.3 (20 Nov 45) CCS, (SCAFIN 321), dated 20 November 1945, subject: "Control of Radio Communications".
6. The Imperial Japanese Government will require that a station license be issued to each radio station listed in Inclosure 1. The license will bear the SCAP REGISTRY NO. appearing in the first column of the "List of Assigned Frequencies". A license will be issued to additional radio stations only when operation of such stations is authorized by the Ministry of Communications and the authorization approved by the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Licenses will be printed in both Japanese and English language. Licenses will be issued to authorized radio stations prior to 1 October 1946, and will be posted in a conspicuous place in the transmitter room of the licensed station.
7. The Imperial Japanese Government will require that all unauthorized radio stations be dismantled prior to 15 October 1946. Component parts of dismantled stations may be stored by the agency concerned and used as replacement equipment for authorized stations. The following classes of radio stations are authorized in Japan effective 1 October 1946:

BASIC: Memo, GHQ, SCAP, to IJG, file AG 676.3 (29 Aug 46)CCS, (SCAFIN -1166).
dtd 29 Aug 46, subject: "Control of Radio Communications".

- a. Radio stations operated by Japanese agencies for the Occupation Forces.
- b. Radio stations included in the approved frequency assignment list (Inclosure 1).
- c. Specific radio stations for which authority for retention is obtained from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers prior to 10 September, 1946.
8. The assignment of the frequencies listed in Inclosure 1 which are marked, "For Assignments to Ships", will be covered by separate correspondence.
9. Direct correspondence is authorized between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Japanese Ministry of Communications on matters within the scope of this memorandum.

2. Their letter, in part, is stated below:

The Imperial Japanese Government, having verbally accepted the offer of relief supplies from the Licensed Agencies for Relief in Asia, will immediately prepare to accept title at dockside, guard, transport, store and distribute these relief supplies being donated by private agencies in the United States, to be used for Japan's destitute. These supplies will total not more than two thousand (2000) tons per month.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will assume sole responsibility for the security, movement, allocation and distribution of these relief supplies from dockside to the using agency. Full police protection will be given the unloading, transportation, warehousing and distribution of these supplies, and the Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for any pilferage, wastage, or other preventable loss that occurs. Prompt removal of supplies from shipside will be accomplished.

3. On or before 1 September 1946 the Imperial Japanese Government will present a general operational plan covering the distribution of these relief supplies, which is to include the following information:

- a. Method of accounting.
- b. Plan for storage.
- c. Plan for distribution.
- d. Detail of security plan.

4. Paragraph 3a above will include a report form which is to be sent monthly to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, giving the following detailed information:

- a. Record of total supplies received.
- b. Total supplies distributed.

SUBJECT : Two Gold Bars Taken from Captain Perrotti of Italian Navy by Japanese Military Authorities.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report the location and/or disposition of two gold bars, personal property of Captain Francisco Perrotti of the Italian Navy, which are alleged to have been confiscated by Japanese Military Authorities in September 1943.

2. Captain Perrotti was the surgeon aboard the cruiser "Calitea" of the Italian Navy when it was scuttled by her crew in the harbor of Kobe on 9 September 1943. Captain Perrotti states that when he was searched by the Japanese water police at Kobe harbor he showed them two gold bars which were his private property. Each of them weighed 500 grams.

3. Having no safe place to keep the gold bars, Captain Perrotti turned them over to Lt. Paymaster V. Boso who placed them in a small valise with the bank notes of the "Calitea." Two days later a Lt. Paymaster of the Japanese Navy asked Lt. Paymaster Boso to deliver the bank notes of the "Calitea." The suitcase was opened in front of the Japanese officer who insisted upon taking the two gold bars, notwithstanding the fact that they were the private property of Captain Perrotti. Captain Perrotti states that the Japanese authorities, when asked by Lt. Boso to return the gold bars, admitted that they had been confiscated by the Japanese Government.

4. There is inclosed a copy of a statement of 24 June 1946 made by Toyokichi Kikuchi, retired Japanese Naval Captain, in regard to Captain Perrotti's two gold bars.

5. The required report will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 30 September 1946.

I declare

1) that during my period of duty as Liaison Officer on the Italian Auxiliary Cruiser "Calitea", talking with Srug. Lieut. F. Perrotti, I was informed by him that he had two gold bars, each one of 500 gms., bought in Shanghai;

2) that a few days after the members of the crew of the "Calitea" were taken as prisoners of war on account of the Italian surrender which happened on the 9th Sept. 1943--I witnessed the confiscation of the abovementioned gold bars executed by a Lieut. Paymaster of the Japanese Navy who had come for the confiscation of the money belonging to the ship "Calitea". The Lieut. Paymaster V. Boso, of the Italian Navy, protested explaining that the gold bars were private, but the Japanese officer paid no attention. Later the Lieut. Paymaster V. Boso protested also to me about it asking me to investigate into the matter.

SUBJECT : Resumption of International Postal Service between Japan and all other Countries except Germany.

1. Resumption of International Postal Service between Japan and all other countries, except Germany, is authorized effective 10 September 1946 subject to the following provisions:

a. The service will be restricted to postal cards to and from Japan; one-way gift parcel post to Japan; and the mailing from Japan of such scientific and professional publications as may be approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. Communications on postal cards must be of a personal or family nature written in Chinese, English, French, Japanese, Korean, Russian, or Spanish. Letters (other than official mail pertaining to repatriation) and commercial and financial communications are prohibited.

c. Gift parcels to Japan will be limited to eleven pounds in weight and contents will be restricted to relief items such as non-perishable foods, clothing, soap, and mailable medicines.

2. The regular-mail service will be governed by the provisions of the Universal Postal Union Convention of Buenos Aires, of 23 May 1939. The maintenance of records essential to settlement of accounts under the conditions of the Universal Postal Union Convention and the preparation of accounts for settlement will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

3. Parcel post service, as authorized, will be operated by the Japanese Government under the terms of the bilateral or other agreements in effect between Japan and the respective countries at the time the service was suspended. The maintenance of records and preparation of the accounts required under the terms of the various agreements will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

SUBJECT : Naming and Marking of Streets in the Tokyo Area.

4. Amounts due Japan from the United States on bills for parcel post terminal charges will be deposited in the United States Treasury trust fund receipt account "Deposits, proceeds of remittances to and exports from occupied areas" symbol 218905.1 Japan. Payments due from Japan in connection with international postal services will be made from that trust fund account upon recommendation of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Statements of such accounts will be prepared under direction of the Ministry of Communications, Imperial Japanese Government and certified to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. International mails will be dispatched from Japan on Japanese, or vessels of any other registration, excepting those of German registry.

6. All incoming and outgoing International Mail will be subject to censorship to the extent deemed advisable by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Mail will be made available to the Civil Censorship Detachment, G-2, General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, and submitted for censorship as directed from time to time through the liaison officer of the Ministry of Communications assigned to censorship.

7. Repatriation mail service authorized 28 October 1945, (SCAPIN 202) will be discontinued effective 10 September 1946. Thereafter all repatriation mail, including official correspondence pertaining only to repatriation of Japanese forces and Japanese Nationals, will be handled as International Mail.

8. Direct communication between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications is authorized concerning all matters within the scope of this memorandum.

1. In order to facilitate the travel of Allied Force personnel and in order to provide a basis for the future development of the Tokyo street system, a plan has been prepared for designating streets in the city of Tokyo. Three copies of a map outlining the plan are attached.
2. It is desired that the streets indicated on the attached map be marked with an adequate number of street signs by 1 December 1946. The Commanding General, Eighth Army, will issue necessary instructions to you concerning the preparation and posting of these signs.

1. During the months of September to November 1945 a conference was held at the First Demobilization office of the War Ministry in Tokyo. Colonel SUGITA was chairman of a sub-committee instructed by General WAKAMATSU to report on the Chinese massacre in Singapore in February 1942. Members of the sub-committee included Lieutenant Colonels KUNITAKE, HASHIZUME, OISHI and FUJIWARA. The sub-committee's responsibility was to record the facts. These facts were incorporated into a report handed to General WAKAMATSU in October or November 1945.

2. The IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT is directed to identify, locate and submit the records and minutes of the committee, referred to in paragraph one (1) above, including the report of Colonel SUGITA's sub-committee, on or before 11 September 1946.

c. Payment of purchase price from accounts blocked in accordance with memo to Imperial Japanese Government, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 121 (24 Nov 45) ESS/FI, 24 November 1945, SCAFIN-337, subject: "Elimination of War Profits and Reorganization of National Finances."

5. In order that full publicity be given to all sales of government property, monthly statements showing all transactions by property, selling price, and purchaser shall be furnished to accredited news agencies.
