SUBJECT : Windows for Quonset Huts.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will institute immediate action and assume responsibility with regard to the procurement and shipment of two thousand (2,000) sets of windows to the Military Government of the Ryukyus. The Imperial Japanese Government will consult with the Foreign Trade Division of the Economic and Scientific Section regarding type, size and packaging for shipment.
2. Shipping schedules will be arranged with the Civilian Merchant Marine Committee subject to the final approval of the Shipping Control Authority for the Japanese Merchant Marine. The entire shipment will be accomplished within thirty (30) days after receipt of this memorandum.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will obtain signed quantitative receipts from an authorized representative of the Deputy Commander for the Military Government of the Ryukyus. Three original signed copies of these receipts together with three copies of the ocean bill of lading will be forwarded to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as soon as possible after completion of the shipment.
4. This shipment will not be regarded as a commercial export. Import-Export forms 100 and 200 will not be submitted. All costs incurred in carrying out the specifications of this memorandum will be carried on a separate interim account subject to future instructions from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers regarding the financing of special shipments.

This memorandum confirms verbal instructions of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to the Japanese Ministry of Communications issued 21 August 1946 regarding inauguration of EFM service between Japan and all points in the British Commonwealth and the extension of SCM service between Japan and all British Commonwealth points, (heretofore limited to service between Japan and Great Britain) effective at 0001 hours 22 August 1946. Transmission and reception of Expeditionary Force and Sender Composition Messages was established in accordance with the provisions hereinafter set forth.

2. The provisions contained in the Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 311.23 (11 January 46) CCS (SCAPIN - 578), subject "Establishment of Senders' Composition Message Service between Great Britain and the Tokyo Area" will continue in effect and be similarly applicable to the newly inaugurated EFM and SCM services between Japan and all British Commonwealth points, with three exceptions, viz:

- a. The rate schedule contained in paragraph 4 relating to SCM messages sent from Japan to Great Britain (United Kingdom) is replaced by the rate schedule included on Inclosure 1 herewith.
- b. Paragraph 5, as related to places where SCM messages will be accepted for transmission, is amended herein (see paragraph 5 below).
- c. Paragraph 10, covering the delivery of messages incoming to Japan, is rescinded and new instructions covering delivery of messages are set forth herein (see paragraph 6 below).

1. Upon receipt of the inclosed petition from the Nagai Agricultural Association, a thorough investigation was made of the proposed construction of dependent housing in the Nagai area.
2. As a result of this investigation, it has been determined that the south end of the Ottawa Airfield, as indicated on the attached sketch, is required for the dependent housing project of Allied Forces at Camp McGill, Japan. Factors determining this decision were as follows:
  - a. No other site is available without taking private property that has been under cultivation for a long period and which contains buildings that would have to be demolished.
  - b. The crops on the arable portion of this site are ready for harvesting and will not be destroyed.
  - c. This site permits construction of the project on a minimum amount of land.
  - d. The cost of construction will be economical to the Imperial Japanese Government because water, electricity, and sewage disposal are readily available; and a minimum of road construction and grading is required.
  - e. It is understood that the Prefectural Government recommended this site for construction purposes.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to inform the Nagai Agricultural Association of the requirement of the Allied Forces and the reasons for this decision as noted in paragraph 2 above.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers dated 28 May 1946 (SCAPIN - 987), subject: "Custody, Control and Protective Maintenance of Japanese Aircraft Plants, Arsenals and Laboratories," together with inclosures and annexes thereto subsequently issued by the Supreme Commander, and to memoranda dated 13 August 1946 (SCAPIN - 1029, 1030, 1031, 1032, 1033, 1034, 1035 and 1036).

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible for the servicing and repair of machinery, equipment and accessories, including auxiliary equipment, at each plant listed in custodial directives to the Imperial Japanese Government cited above to the extent that such servicing and repair is possible without the substantial purchase of replacement parts.

3. The servicing and repair referred to in paragraph 2, above, will include the inspection and testing of existing mechanical equipment and the assembly of accessories, without extensive replacement purchases, with a view to putting each item of equipment in good operating condition and facilitating its ready use when moved to another site. Basically the necessary servicing and repair should be performed by competent mechanics associated with the particular plant and should use only materials, parts, etc., available within the plant or readily available elsewhere. Care should be taken to retain an adequately skilled labor or maintenance force to avoid damage by personnel unfamiliar with equipment.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible for the assembly and maintenance in good condition at each plant of such data, amplified below, as are domestically obtainable or as can be prepared in the respective establishments designated in custodial directives cited in paragraph 1. Instruction for preparation of technical data necessary for reparations transfers and not obtainable as specified will be given at a later date.

  - (1) Records pertaining to construction, such as foundation plans, arrangement drawings, and detailed drawings of equipment.
  - (2) Facilities for which servicing is to be performed and data maintained include not only equipment installed in buildings but also yard equipment such as coal handling facilities, outdoor switchgear and transformers; also special instruments and tools required for operation and maintenance.
- c. Chemical Industries (Sulfuric Acid, Soda Ash, Chlorine and Caustic Soda):

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs and - referring to:-

- a/ the latter's note verbale of 28th November, 1945, No. 66/15-2, and
- b/ the former's reply of 10th January, 1946; communicated in a note verbale of the said date, No. BB-8/46, through the proper intermediary,

by which communications it was made clear that, at the time, there were no internees in BRAZIL of Japanese nationality, and that the Brazilian Government had no intention to repatriate non-interred Japanese citizens from Brazil - has the honour to inform the Imperial Ministry as follows.

The Swedish Government have been notified by their Legation at RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil, that the Brazilian Government have recently issued a Decree of Expulsion affecting eighty (80) Japanese citizens involved in terroristic activities in Brazil; confer the notes verbales of this Mission of 24th April, 1946, No. BB-148/46,

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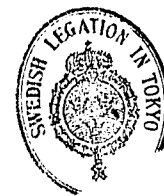
and of 26th July, No. BB-255/46. The Swedish Legation has also stated that expulsion of further Japanese nationals in Brazil is possible, and that it is expected that one thousand (1,000) Japanese will be expelled. The Ambassador of the United States of America has informed the Swedish Legation in Brazil that his Government, at the request of the Brazilian Government, are prepared to assist to arrange transportation of the expelled on the condition that the Brazilian Government provide the necessary funds for the transportation.

The Swedish Mission requests the Imperial Ministry to be good enough to indicate what action, if any, the Imperial Government might desire the Swedish authorities concerned to take in view of the above statement.

Referring to the second paragraph of its above-mentioned note/telex no. BB-255/46, the Swedish Mission seizes this opportunity to inform the Imperial Ministry that it has now been confirmed that the documents delayed en route were received by the Swedish Legation at Rio de Janeiro on 4th instant.
