MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT: : Quarantine Procedures for Cholera in Repatriates.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take the following measures immediately to prevent the introduction of cholera into Japan by individuals being repatriated from China.

2. In the case of ships with repatriates from China which arrive without cases of cholera aboard:

a. Where the voyage has taken more than six days, all personnel will be inoculated with 1.5 cc of cholera vaccine and debarkation and processing procedures will be performed as usual.

b. Where the voyage from China has taken less than six days, all personnel will be held aboard the ship until six days have elapsed, the personnel physically examined for cholera, and if no cases are found they will be disembarked as described in paragraph 2 a. above. In the event cholera is found, the procedure will be as directed in paragraph 3.

3. Ships which arrive in Japan with cholera aboard will use only the ports of Uraga or Sasebo until directed otherwise by this Headquarters.

a. Ships will be anchored sufficiently far from shore to preclude the possibility of anyone swimming to shore or contamination from the vessel washing ashore.

b. All personnel will be held on board for fourteen days after the development of the last case.

c. Cases of cholera will be removed from the ship to a hospital ship provided for that purpose. Before the arrival of hospital ships at the ports of Uraga and Sasebo, cholera patients will be removed to the isolation hospital at the reception center where strict isolation procedure will be maintained. Great care will be exercised in sterilizing all discharges from the patients (using 2% cresol solution), screening to protect from flies and isolation of attendants.

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BASIC: Ltr, AG 720.4 ( 6 Apr 46)PH, this Headquarters to Imperial Japanese Government, subject: "Quarantine Procedures for Cholera in Repatriates", 6 April 1946.

d. All personnel (except cholera patients) will be inoculated with 1.5 cc of cholera vaccine.

e. During the quarantine period the feces and urine of all personnel will be treated with a two percent cresol solution before being discharged into the sea.

f. A stool examination will be performed on all personnel to detect carriers. All carriers discovered will be isolated in the same place as cholera cases and kept until three negative stool specimens have been obtained at two day intervals.

g. The baggage and clothing of all personnel will be sterilized.

4. A hospital ship will be anchored off shore at the ports of Uraga and Sasebo to receive and treat cholera cases among the repatriates.

SUBJECT : Release of Silk Fabrics in Retail Stores.

1. Reference is made to Directives AG 091.2 (25 Sep 45) ESS, subject: "Operation of Manufacturing Industries" dated 25 September 1945, and AG 423 (6 Feb 46) ESS-IB, subject: "Restriction on Release of Silk for Civilian and Military Use" dated 6 February 1946.

2. It is hereby directed that the Imperial Japanese Government take immediate action to release for sale to consumers the present stocks of silk fabrics which are physically in the possession of retail establishments.

3. Stocks owned by the retail establishments, but presently stored in warehouses, are not affected by the provisions of this directive, and will remain in storage as indicated in above Directive AG 423 (6 Feb 46) ESS-IB.

4. No retail establishment will be permitted to purchase or accept delivery of any silk fabric on order or on contract with manufacturers or from any other source.

d. Memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 676.5 (20 Nov 45) CCS (SCAPIN- 321), subject: "Control of Radio Communications" dated 20 November 1945.

2. Study of the report cited in reference to above indicated generally satisfactory progress in the establishment of the Nagoya Reception Center.

3. The progress reported is unsatisfactory in the following respects. Special attention will be directed to the correction of these points and the report of 6 April will indicate action taken and status of items mentioned.

a. Selection of office personnel will be completed at once and all personnel at their post of duty prior to 7 April.

b. Positive steps will be taken to insure adequate daily supply of food and other necessary supplies.

4. There is no objection to the use of the Maritime Bureau wireless equipment at Nagoya for shore to ship communication. However, application will be made as prescribed in reference to above.

2. A report has been received which indicates that the Japanese repatriation hospital ship Hikawa Maru was not sufficiently stocked with medical supplies for repatriates and crew during her last voyage.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will take the necessary action to insure that sufficient medical supplies for repatriates and crew for trip from Japan until its return are placed aboard all Japanese repatriation hospital ships prior to departure from Japan.

SUBJECT : Anti-Aircraft Artillery Range.

1. The following area has been approved for use as an anti-aircraft artillery firing range by elements of the Eighth United States Army:

Mito Area: That sector with a radius of 31,000 yards with its center at 140° 36' 30" East Longitude - 36° 23' 15" North Latitude and limited by points at 140° 45' 50" East Longitude - 36° 36' 50" North Latitude and 140° 50' 40" East Longitude - 36° 13' 45" North Latitude.

2. Firing in this area will be directed seaward from gun positions located in the vicinity of East Mito Airfield. Conduct of practice involves firing at aircraft towed targets. Safety observers will be present.

3. You will notify all agencies concerned, other than Occupation Forces, that the above area will be restricted to all craft after 15 April 1946, except as indicated in paragraph 4 below.

4. Requests to allow fishing in this area when not in use will be honored when made by the Prefecture Governor to the Commanding General Fifth Bomber Command, Johnson Field, Irumagawa.

MEMORANDUM FOR: THE IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Manufacture of Silk Fabric for Export.

1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government release raw silk stocks, manufacture fabrics in Japan, and make disposition of such fabrics in accordance with instructions contained herein.
2. 55,000 domestic bales (83 pounds each) of raw silk stocks will be released immediately for the period 1 April to 30 June 1946 under the following conditions:
  - a. Only opened bales in the hands of weavers and bales of lower than E grade and sizes coarser than 42 Denier of any grade may be used. In no case shall a weaver have fewer unopened bales of expert grades in his possession than the quantities reported in the inventory of 31 December 1945. Export grades are comprised of E grade and higher.
  - b. An authorized agency designated by the Imperial Japanese Government will allocate the raw silk among such qualified weavers as it may select to manufacture for export.
  - c. All allotments will be assigned a number by the agency who will issue to each weaver an allotment number for the raw silk so issued. This allotment number will then be included in all inventories of finished fabrics manufactured from the raw silk so released (see Incl 2). The designated government agency will be instructed to submit a monthly report giving complete details of raw silk allocated and all silk produced in Japan. This inventory shall be retroactive as of 1 January 1946.

3. Silk fabrics will be manufactured as follows:
  - a. Only all-silk broad-loom fabrics will be manufactured.
  - b. Types and percentages of these fabrics will be:

Crepes	28%	Ties Silk	3%
Habutae	38%	Georgette	2.5%
Fuji	10%	Velvet	2%
Satin	3%	Underwear	2.5%
Taffeta	2.5%	Novelty Weaves	3%
Poplin	2.5%	Bolting Cloth	3%

- c. The above quantities will be exported only in the greige unless otherwise directed.
4. Finished silk fabrics will be disposed of as follows:
  - a. Finished products will be collected and stored in suitable warehouses for examination and inspection in accordance with Inclosure 1.
5. Inventories of warehoused silk fabrics for export manufactured in compliance with this directive will be submitted weekly as per Inclosure 2.
6. Samples shall be submitted with the weekly inventory and shall be marked with the manufacturer's designated allotment number. The allotment number will appear on all inventories submitted. The Imperial Japanese Government will be advised by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers as to the disposition of both "Passed and Rejected" fabrics.
7. No manufactured fabrics for which allotments of raw silk were not officially received from the Imperial Japanese Government will be accepted for inspection, and no silk will be submitted for production or for sale, unless previously recorded on inventories under Directive AG 423(13 Dec 45)ESS-IE, subject; "Inventory of Raw Silk, Semi, Greige, and Finished Goods," dated 13 December 1945.
8. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to establish immediately adequate regulations and penalties which will insure strict compliance with the provisions of this Directive.

SUBJECT : Japanese Customs Organization

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to transfer to and centralize in the Ministry of Finance the control of all customs functions and the administration of all matters connected therewith including customs houses and personnel.

2. The Ministry of Finance shall be responsible for the implementation and enforcement of all Japanese customs regulations including any new regulations which may be issued in the future and for carrying out all Directives from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers regarding customs control or requiring action by customs officials. The Ministry of Finance may delegate such authority and responsibility in connection with customs control as may be necessary provided prior authorization and approval are given by the Supreme Commander.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, a statement of the action taken to comply with the provisions of this Directive.

SUBJECT : Control of Traffic in Poisonous Beverages.

1. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government AG 435 (18 Dec 45)PH, subject as above, 18 December 1945, is rescinded.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government will enact and rigidly enforce appropriate enactments to provide:
  - a. That possession of, and selling or trading in, any food or beverage containing methyl alcohol in excess of 1 mg. per cc., or other poison in toxic amount, will be punishable by a fine of not less than 2000 nor more than 10,000 yen, or penal servitude of not less than three nor more than fifteen years, or both such fine and penal servitude.
  - b. That beverages containing methyl alcohol in amounts exceeding 0.2 mg. per cc., and not exceeding 1 mg. per cc. may be sold provided that each bottle or container bears a label stating plainly in both English and Japanese the methyl alcohol content of the beverage.
3. English translations of such enactments and samples of the labels proposed to be used in accordance with the terms of paragraph 2 b. hereof will be forwarded in duplicate to this Headquarters immediately upon preparation and prior to publication.
4. Direct communication with the Chief, Public Health and Welfare Section, this Headquarters, is authorized respecting further details in the execution of the terms of this Memorandum.

SUBJECT : Repatriation of Chinese, Formosans and Koreans.

1. Reference is made to the following memorandums from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. File AG 370.05 (16 Mar 46)GC, (SCAPIN-822), subject: "Repatriation" dated 16 March 1946.

b. File AG 720.4 (9 Mar 46)PH, (SCAPIN-806), subject: "Quarantine and Screening of Formosan Repatriates", dated 9 March 1946.

c. File AG 370.05 (19 Mar 46)GC, (SCAPIN-829), subject: "Suspension of Repatriation from Japan of Koreans Residing in Northern Korea", dated 19 March 1946.

2. Reference 1b above is rescinded effective 5 May 1946.

3. In accordance with the provisions of reference 1a above and subject to the restrictions imposed by reference 1c above, all Koreans, Formosans and Chinese who registered as desirous of repatriation will be cleared from Japan as follows:

a. Koreans not later than 30 August 1946.

b. Formosans during the week 5 - 11 May 1946.

c. Chinese not later than 13 May 1946.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Deliver Koreans desiring repatriation commencing 15 April 1946 to the following reception centers at such rates that these centers are at all times filled thereby insuring a backlog of processed repatriates sufficient to fill to capacity the indicated daily allocation of shipping spaces.

Reception Center	Daily Center Capacity	Daily Allocation of Shipping Spaces
Senzaki	5000	1500
Hakata	5000	4500

b. Assemble, process and prepare for shipment all Formosans desiring repatriation at the Kure Reception Center during the week of 5 - 11 May 1946. Daily arrivals will be spaced evenly throughout specified period.

The Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate steps to correct these defects, institute a procedure which will prevent re-occurrence on all repatriation ships by assuring that assigned medical personnel are instructed in the proper conduct of standard recognized medical methods aboard ships and that sufficient supplies are aboard to accomplish this purpose.

"According to a Protocol, signed on 6th March, 1946, the following agreement has been reached with the American, British and Chinese Embassies:

- (A) The Legation is to hand over:
- 1) \$134,000:- in banknotes;
  - 2) 539,735 Cruzeiros 30 centavos being the balance at Brazil Exchange, Rio de Janeiro, on 6th March, Consulate balances not included;
  - 3) A statement showing the Cruzeiros balance at the end of the year 529,944 Cruzeiros 80 centavos kept by the Legation and belonging to institutions.
- (B) Notice is to be given to the Japanese Embassy hiring contract as per 30th April.
- (C) The Legation has undertaken to sell at public auction the real estate at Sao Paulo and all other property available in all other places, with the following exceptions:-
- 1) Card-Index effects, necessary for the continuation of the protection of the interests of Japanese citizens by the Swedish Legation, will be kept;
  - 2) Libraries, belonging to institutions, will until further notice be kept at the Legation;
  - 3) The own property of Japanese citizens will be kept until further notice.
- (D) The amount mentioned above under A.2) and the incoming proceeds of the sale mentioned above under C) are to be placed in a joint trust account of the above three Embassies with the Banco Brazil from which the Legation is to be authorized to draw up to 500,000 Cruzeiros yearly. Protecting Power expenses above that, may be authorized according to agreement.
- (E) The Legation is until further notice keeping the archives which were earlier taken over by the three Embassies".

2. A definite program has been established for distribution of DDT supplies for communicable disease control measures. The supply of DDT products is not sufficient for all inclusive control measures. Generally distribution must be made to those areas where emergencies arise. Some quantities have been allocated to coal mining regions. No further quantities can be allocated to coal mining regions at present, unless an emergency condition requiring all inclusive control measures, should occur.

3. In view of the urgent need for large quantities of DDT products in Japan for communicable disease control measures, it is directed that an import program be submitted to GHQ, SCAP not later than 10 May 1946. This program should include all DDT supplies needed for communicable disease control measures in Japan for the period 1 July 1946 through 30 June 1947.

4. Authority for direct communication with Chief, Public Health and Welfare Section, GHQ, SCAP, is authorized, with respect to types of DDT supplies considered essential for efficient control of communicable diseases.

At a recent inspection of the Kure Port by a representative of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, it was noted twelve (12) Liberty Ships assigned to repatriation service were tied up in the harbor awaiting provisions. These vessels had been delayed in sailing on this account from 48 hours to 10 days as of 14 April 1946.

3. Statements of officials in charge of Provisions and Stores at Kure indicated that:

a. The prefectural authorities were uncooperative at times and failed to provide provisions at the required rate.

b. Chief of provisions, CMMC, has under his control some three trucks with which he forages into the country for food, the only means at his disposal to supplement the stocks provided as in 3a above.

c. With adequate stocks of provisions on hand at Kure ships can be fueled, watered and provisioned for a long voyage in 48 hours or less.

d. Request for canvas had been made to Tokyo Office CMMC, on 7 April 1946 to improvise ventilators for the holds of Liberty Ships. No word had been received by 14 April as to action being taken by the Imperial Japanese Government.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will without delay:

a. Take the necessary steps to provide adequate supplies for ships utilizing the Kure area.

b. Build up a stock of sufficient provisions at ports used by repatriation shipping in accordance with schedules furnished to CMMC and

c. Change the below named stations from relay to local service:

The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to seek out, inventory, and impound immediately, all identifiable looted property which is now in Japan and which has been the subject of transfer under duress, wrongful acts of confiscation, dispossession or spoliation, whether pursuant to legislation or by procedure purporting to follow forms of law or otherwise, in areas occupied by the Japanese Armed Forces since 7 July 1937.

2. The completed inventory will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by 1 June 1946, and will be compiled by territories or localities from which the property was taken, and will include:

- a. Complete description of property.
- b. Quantity.
- c. Name of owner at time of seizure.
- d. Disposition of property upon arrival in Japan.
- e. Present title holder and address.
- f. Present location of Property.

Five copies of this inventory will be furnished General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and will be submitted in the English language.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to retain all such properties under custody and will not permit any transactions or movement of such properties.
