SUBJECT : Refund of Salary Deposits in Pension Fund and Application of General Welfare Annuity Insurance to Ex-Servicemen.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum of Imperial Japanese Government, CLO No. 519 (1.1) dated 2 February 1946, subject: "Pensions and Benefits", and Memorandum to Imperial Japanese Government, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 260 (24 Nov 45) ESS/FI, subject: "Pensions and Benefits".

2. Memorandum to Imperial Japanese Government, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 260 (24 Nov 45) ESS/FI, subject: "Pensions and Benefits" does not preclude refund to ex-servicemen of amounts deducted from their salaries and paid into the pension fund.

3. Refunds of the amounts deducted from the ex-servicemen's salaries are to be made in cash and are not to be applied as premiums for welfare annuity insurance for the period they were in the service.

4. Copies of any ordinance or instructions prepared to carry out the above authorization should be transmitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for the completion of its records.

SUBJECT : Shipment of Salt to Korea.

1. It is directed that immediate action be taken to ship to Korea approximately 4,000 metric tons of salt imported into Japan from Tsingtao, China, aboard the HERKIMER which is scheduled to sail from the port of Karatsu on or about 20 April.

2. It is further directed that this salt will not be unloaded upon vessel's arrival in Japan from China and that action will be taken to provide for prompt refueling and provisioning at port of entry in Japan after which the ship will proceed immediately to Inchon, Korea.

3. Shipment will be consigned and delivered to the Supply Officer, Emergency Civilian Supply Program, USAMGIK, Attention: Monopoly Section, Department of Finance (for Fisheries), Inchon, Korea.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will immediately prepare and submit necessary copies of Form IE 200, subject: "Application to Deliver for Export," as required by memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 091.31(14 Mar 46)ESS/IE, (SCAPIN 814), dated 14 March 1946, subject: "Export Procedure," and will follow the instructions set forth in that directive with regard to distribution of approved copies of the applications, submission of shipping documents and submission of cargo receipts for the shipment from Japan to Korea.

SUBJECT : Release of U.S. Army Subsistence Stocks.
(21,331,666 pounds Canned Meats)

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to 21,331,666 pounds of canned meats being made available for future Japanese consumption:

a. Accept delivery at earliest possible date at points to be designated by Commanding General, Eighth U.S. Army.

b. Furnish the Commanding General, Eighth U.S. Army with quantitative receipts in triplicate for the canned meats at the points of delivery.

c. Store the canned meats so that they will be protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards, and under proper custody at all times.

d. Furnish information as to the location of the storage points stating the quantity stored at each location. All of the canned meats will be held in storage until official authorization for release is given by the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. In view of the inability of the Imperial Japanese Government to reach the rates of flow prescribed in above references, the plan for Korean repatriation is further amended as follows:

a. By 25 April 1946 Koreans will be delivered to the Hakata and Sensaki Reception Centers in such numbers that the following rates of outflow will be maintained.

Hakata	1500 per day
Senzaki	500 per day

b. The Imperial Japanese Government will take necessary measures to progressively increase this rate of flow to insure that, by 5 May 1946 the ports of Hakata and Senzaki will have reached the prescribed rates of outflow of 5000 and 1000 per day respectively. These rates will be maintained thereafter until all Koreans desirous of repatriation are cleared from Japan.

2. It is further directed that whenever the Imperial Japanese Government has given written notice of any type to Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers that a quantity of particular material or product is on hand and could be exported, that quantity of that material or product will be frozen and no release will be permitted for any purpose until Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has indicated whether or not it is required for export.

3. In addition, it is directed that the following statement be added to the certification endorsed by the officially authorized agency of the Imperial Japanese Government on all Applications to Prepare for Export and Applications to Deliver for Export:

It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government, or its agent, immediately inspect, secure samples, examine and stamp as to suitability for export, all of the woven and knitted silk fabrics, either greige or finished, amounting to approximately one hundred (100) million square yards of broad-width and thirty-three (33) million square yards of narrow-width fabrics.

2. The inspection and stamping shall be in accordance with standards previously established for export to the United States, India or other areas.

3. The fabrics to be examined were reported as of 31 December 1945 to be in possession of all owners (including all Imperial Japanese Government agencies) as required by Directive AG 423 (13 Dec 45) ESS/IE, subject: "Inventory of Raw Silk, Semi (manufactured) Greige and Finished Goods".

4. It is further directed that the Imperial Japanese Government or its agents, prepare to collect the fabrics that have been passed and stamped as suitable for export. A list of the fabrics selected together with samples are to be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in anticipation of export. A weekly and monthly inventory procedure is to be established as outlined in inclosures 1 and 2 of Directive AG 423 (3 Apr 46) ESS/IE, (SCAFIN 87C), subject: "Manufacture of Silk Fabric for Export".

5. Silk fabrics owned and held by retailers, custom tailors and dressmakers or seamstresses where the amount does not exceed 1,000 linear yards, will be excluded from the requirements of this Directive.

6. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to promulgate immediately adequate regulations and penalties which will insure strict compliance with all provisions of this Directive.

2. Information of non-compliance with directives mentioned in paragraph 1, above has been received. Specific defects are as follows:

- a. Distribution of relief supplies has been made in some Prefectures without the specific authorization of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- b. Variations found in inventories of reserve relief stocks have not been promptly reported to SCAP.
- c. Copies in English of all regulations and instructions promulgated in connection with the plan of distribution of reserve relief supplies have not been furnished the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- d. Distribution of all winter clothing and blankets held for relief purposes has not been commenced in some Prefectures.
- e. The Ministry of Health and Social Affairs, acting as agent of the Imperial Japanese Government, has failed to allocate and distribute reserve relief supplies among Prefectures based upon the needs in each area.
- f. No effort has been made in some Prefectures to properly store, safeguard, and retate supplies to prevent their deterioration and pilferage.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate steps to correct these defects and will institute procedures which will prevent

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission presents its compliments to the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and has the honour to ask that, through its good offices, the following message from the Swedish Government be forwarded, if possible, to the Imperial Japanese Government:-

"The Swedish Diplomatic Mission has been instructed by its Government to inform the Imperial Japanese Government that the following telegram has been received from the Swedish Legation at RIO DE JANEIRO, Brazil:-

'Since the Japanese Armistice rumours have been circulating within the Japanese Colony in the Brazilian State of Sao Paulo, amounting to about 220,000 persons, that Japan has won the war, and the Japanese citizens have been advised to sell their property and to go to RIO DE JANEIRO and to SANTOS for repatriation to Japan or to Japan-occupied Borneo. The Imperial Decree of 14th August, 1945, and Foreign Minister TOGO's appeal quietly to accept the facts, sent out by the International Red Cross Committee, was distributed in Brazil at the beginning of last October. During the last months, Japanese nationalistic propaganda has caused growing anxiety under the leadership of the Secret Union of SHINDO RENMEI, which is probably subordinated to the BLACK DRAGON SOCIETY and the ZAIGO GUNJIN KAI who are taking terror actions against the sensible Japanese elements, as for instance by compiling an execution list, on which the first name is that of the Japanese Chancellor serving with the Swedish Legation. Up till now two murders and several attempts at murder have taken place. The Brazilian Police has now arrested about 400 persons who will probably be deported to Japan.

The Swedish Legation, in agreement with the Brazilian Authorities and with the Allied Embassies, has lately distributed a Circular in the Japanese language about the real situation of Japan.

The Swedish Legation, after agreement with the Brazilian Authorities and with the Allied Ambassadors, suggests that the Imperial Japanese Government

/1/ in some suitable manner, for example by telegram via the Swedish Legation and/or by Tokyo Radio, which is said to be heard in Brazil, address a direct appeal to the Japanese citizens in Brazil to accept the situation and to show calmness and order, and

/2/ if possible by air, through the intermediary of the United States Authorities, distribute enlightening material.'

In view of the above the Swedish Diplomatic Mission ventures to indicate that it holds itself at the disposal of the Imperial Government for the transmission to the Swedish Legation at RIO DE JANEIRO of the telegraphic texts and of the - reasonable amount of - reading material that they deem fit to dispatch.

It seems to the Swedish Mission that a telegraphic message from the Imperial Government to the Japanese citizens in Brazil

/a/ giving the substance of, for instance,

- /1/ the Imperial Rescript of 14th August, 1945,
- /2/ the Instrument of Surrender of 2nd September, 1945, and
- /3/ the Japanese Legislation regarding the Dissolution of Political Organisations that may have been promulgated in accordance with the Directive on this subject of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of 4th January, 1946, and

/b/ appealing for compliance with the actual situation as suggested in the above telegram might carry far to calm both ~~s~~ides of the disagreeing Japanese parties in Brazil.

If direct broadcasting can be arranged as suggested above, the Swedish Mission is, of course, ready to indicate to the Swedish Legation at RIO DE JANEIRO, by telegram, at what times and on what frequencies such broadcasts will take place, if that is deemed expedient.

The transmission of reading material is, for technical reasons, more difficult owing to limited transportation facilities. The Swedish Mission is, however, ready to try to arrange for the dispatch of a small amount of such material, if desired. But in view of the fact that the facilities for telegraphic messages are practically unlimited, the Mission ventures to suggest that the Imperial Government give, as amply as possible, by telegram and/or broadcasts the messages they might desire to dispatch. Some time might thus also be saved.

It seems to the Swedish Mission as if early action would be desirable."

2. The Board of Communications is authorized to reopen the Japan-France radio telegraph circuit for which the Japanese terminal will be located at the city of Osaka, Japan, subject to the following conditions:

a. Call Signs and Frequencies: Call signs and frequencies to be employed by the Japanese terminal will be:

These frequencies are assigned for A1 emission with maximum power of 20 kilowatts.

b. Censorship: SCAP Memorandum, AG 311.7 (10 Nov 45)CIS, dated 21 November 1945, subject: "Regulations Governing Communications over International, Foreign, and External Telegraph, Telephone and Wireless Facilities", and any subsequent memoranda governing censorship will apply to this service. Official government messages of Allied or Neutral Nations may be sent in clear or code.

c. Classes of Service: All the classes of service available before the suspension of Japan-France radio telegraph service will be offered users.

1. Under the memorandum of 4 January 1946 "Removal and Exclusion of Undesirable Personnel from Public Office," (SCAPIN 550) the Japanese Government was directed to disqualify any candidate for the Diet who had deceived and misled the people of Japan within the spirit and letter of that directive.

2. After the election on 10 April 1946, the Central Liaison Office was informed that the eligibility of one Ichiro Hatoyama, (member-elect of the House of Representatives from the First Electoral District, Tokyo) to hold any public office being open to doubt in the light of evidence published subsequent to his screening by the Japanese Government, it was expected that his eligibility would be re-examined by the Government forthwith.

3. The Japanese Government having failed to act on its own responsibility, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has determined the facts relative to Hatoyama's eligibility and finds that he is an undesirable person within the meaning of paragraphs 1 and 3 of Category "G", Appendix "A", SCAPIN 550 in that:

a. As Chief Secretary of the Tanaka Cabinet from 1927 to 1929, he necessarily shares responsibility for the formulation and promulgation without Diet approval of amendments to the so-called Peace Preservation Law which made that law the government's chief legal instrument for the suppression of freedom of speech and freedom of assembly, and made possible the denunciation, terrorization, seizure, and imprisonment of tens of thousands of adherents to minority doctrines advocating political, economic, and social reform, thereby preventing the development of effective opposition to the Japanese militaristic regime.

b. As Minister of Education from December 1931 to March 1934, he was responsible for stifling freedom of speech in the schools by means of mass dismissals and arrests of teachers suspected of "leftist" leanings or "dangerous thoughts." The dismissal in May 1933 of Professor Takigawa

from the faculty of Kyoto University on Hatoyama's personal order is a flagrant illustration of his contempt for the liberal tradition of academic freedom and gave momentum to the spiritual mobilization of Japan which, under the aegis of the military and economic cliques, led the nation eventually into war.

c. Not only did Hatoyama participate in thus weaving the pattern of ruthless suppression of freedom of speech, freedom of assembly, and freedom of thought, but he also participated in the forced dissolution of farmer-labor bodies. In addition, his indorsement of totalitarianism, specifically in its application to the regimentation and control of labor, is a matter of record. His recommendation that "it would be well" to transplant Hitlerite anti-labor devices to Japan reveals his innate antipathy to the democratic principle of the right of labor freely to organize and to bargain collectively through representatives of its own choice. It is a familiar technique of the totalitarian dictatorship, wherever situated, whatever be its formal name, and however be it disguised, first to weaken and then to suppress the freedom of individuals to organize for mutual benefit. Whatever lip service Hatoyama may have rendered to the cause of parliamentarianism, his sponsorship of the doctrine of regimentation of labor identifies him as a tool of the ultra-nationalistic interests which engineered the reorganization of Japan on a totalitarian economic basis as a prerequisite to its wars of aggression.

d. By words and deeds he has consistently supported Japan's acts of aggression. In July 1937 he traveled to America and Western Europe as personal emissary of the then Prime Minister Kenoye to justify Japan's expansionist program. While abroad he negotiated economic arrangements for supporting the war against China and the subsequent exploitation of that country after subjugation. With duplicity, Hatoyama told the British Prime Minister in 1937 that "China cannot survive unless controlled by Japan," and that the primary motive behind Japan's intervention in China involved the "happiness of the Chinese people."

e. Hatoyama has posed as an anti-militarist. But in a formal address mailed to his constituents during the 1942 election in which he set forth his political credo, Hatoyama upheld the doctrine of territorial expansion by means of war, referred to the attack on Pearl Harbor as "fortunately . . . a great victory," stated as a fact that the true cause of the Manchuria and China "incidents" was the anti-Japanese sentiment (in China) instigated by England and America, ridiculed those who in 1926 and 1927 had criticized the Tanaka Cabinet, boasted that that cabinet had "liquidated the (previous) weak-kneed diplomacy toward England and America," and gloated that "today the world policy drafted by the Tanaka Cabinet is steadily being realized." This identification of himself with the notorious Tanaka policy of world conquest, whether genuine or merely opportunistic,

in and of itself brands Hatoyama as one of those who deceived and misled the people of Japan into militaristic misadventure.

4. Accordingly, in view of these and other considerations not herein recited, the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to bar Ichiro Hatoyama from membership in the Diet and to exclude him from government service pursuant to SCAPIN 550.
