- d. No explanation was given as to the amount of supplies that were withdrawn because of spoilage, transfer or issued to needy persons.
- e. The number of families and persons represented in the families and single persons to whom supplies were issued during the month was reported by only six prefectures.

3. Food from reserve supplies held for relief was reported distributed in one prefecture. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has not as yet authorized the distribution of food except in cases where there is danger of spoilage or deterioration.

4. A written report as to the action taken to insure accurate reports in the future will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers not later than 20 May 1946.

  - b. Symbols of militarism and ultranationalism.
  - c. Representations of Shinto shrines or other symbols of Shinto.
  - d. Scenes from territories no longer under Japanese sovereignty.
  - e. Any other subjects which are not in harmony with announced objectives of the occupation.
2. Postage stamps issued since 15 December 1945 which include in their designs Shinto shrines or other symbols of Shinto will be withdrawn from sale immediately and destroyed.
3. The continued sale and use of existing supplies of postage stamps other than those referred to in paragraph 2 is authorized, but no additional stamps containing prohibited subjects in their designs will be printed. Existing plates for printing postage stamps containing prohibited subjects in their designs will be destroyed.
4. The continued printing and circulation of the current issue of currency is authorized as a temporary

The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to authorize the Ministry of Finance to permit the removal of foreign exchange assets or evidence of ownership thereof as defined in the reference memorandum, from their present depositories to other places of safekeeping when such removal is necessary for the completion of transactions in such property that have been authorized by the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. If the External Asset report, as required by the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1, has been submitted prior to such removal, an amendment to the report, previously filed, will be submitted specifying the address of the new depository.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is further directed to authorize the release from the provisions of the referenced memorandum, any document evidencing the claim of a person in Japan upon a person formerly abroad, but who has now returned to Japan, when such claim is expressed and payable in yen.

1. The quality of cement being furnished for construction projects for the Allied Forces is unsatisfactory. It does not permit the mixing of concrete of adequate strength to meet proper design standards, including safety factors. Tests which have been made on samples of cement being used at the Imperial Hotel, Tokyo, and the Yokota Airfield indicate that the cement being used is only fifty per cent (50%) of proper strength.

2. It is desired that the following action be taken by the Imperial Japanese Government:

a. Appoint a qualified cement manufacturing technician immediately to inspect the cement plants to determine corrective action necessary.

b. Initiate the necessary steps to produce cement which will meet Japanese Engineer Standards.

c. Submit a report to the Chief Engineer, General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific, not later than 20 May 1946 outlining the action taken in accordance with this directive and results of the investigation of the cement manufacturing technician appointed.

1. In view of the serious shortage of fertilizers in Japan, the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take immediate action to accomplish the following:

a. Commercial Fertilizers:

(1) Increase present production and assure rapid and continuous increase in future production of all commercial fertilizers. Your actions will include immediate coordination of all governmental agencies to assure that the following are effected:

(a) Prices: Establish and maintain prices which will be fair and equitable to both producers and consumers. In no case will production be curtailed because of price differences.

(b) Raw Materials: Allocate and deliver to all plants concerned, sufficient quantities of coal and other raw materials to assure full use of production facilities now and in the future.

(2) In connection with repairs and conversions of nitrogenous plants, you are directed to:

(a) Effect rapid repair and conversion of approved plants through immediate determination of requirements, and prompt location, delivery and installation of needed equipment. Approved plants are those appearing on the attached annex to this Memorandum. Repair and conversion of nitrogenous plants other than those listed will not be undertaken except by authority of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

(b) Submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within three (3) weeks of receipt of this directive two (2) lists of equipment and materials required for repair and construction, as follows:

(3) Collection and delivery of night soil from the cities to the farms will be expedited.

c. General measures to increase the production, distribution, and use of fertilizers:

(1) Movement of fertilizers from production plants to farms will be expedited.

(2) Conservation measures will be inaugurated to insure that minimum losses occur in the handling, storing, transportation, and application to crops of commercial and farm-produced fertilizers.

(3) Special consideration will be given to distribution of fertilizers to areas of greatest need.

(4) An energetic educational program using all available means for disseminating information to the farmers on the production and efficient use of farm-produced fertilizers will be instituted immediately.

1. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government conduct a survey and furnish to this headquarters not later than 3 June 1946 nominal rolls of all Italian, Hungarian and Rumanian nationals now in Japan.

2. Rolls will be submitted in duplicate, in form indicated by attached sheets.

3. As indicated by attached sheets, separate rolls will be submitted for following categories of personnel:

a. Civilians, including those with former diplomatic status, who desire repatriation.

b. Civilians, including those with former diplomatic status, who do not desire repatriation. The Japanese authorities will inform these nationals that no consideration will be given to their remaining in Japan unless it can be shown conclusively that they established permanent domicile in Japan prior to 1 January 1939, that they are able to maintain a livelihood and their presence will add to the economic and social welfare of Japan.

c. Military, including Naval, personnel.

4. Information to be furnished will be grouped alphabetically by prefectures and by families within prefectures.
