SUBJECT : Japanese Budget for Fiscal Year 1946.

1. Recent letters from the Minister of Foreign Affairs transmitting aide-memoires of the Japanese Government on the matter of the Japanese budget for the fiscal year 1946 have been received by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is informed that the so-called GHQ Plan for dependent housing as described in the Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from GHQ SCAP (SCAPIN-799), dated 6 March 1946, has been modified. A revised directive adjusting the production and delivery of required construction materials to satisfy a demand for approximately 10,000 family groups during the Japanese fiscal year 1946 is being prepared and will be forwarded upon completion to the Imperial Japanese Government. This modification will not be construed as a rescission of the ultimate family housing requirements set forth in the aforementioned memorandum.

3. The Japanese Government is advised that a recomputation of costs for the construction of dependent and troop housing, subject to the strict application of legal prices and appropriate crediting of materials stock piles seized from the Japanese military which have been returned to the Japanese Government, should result in very substantial reductions in budget estimates. In this connection, it is pointed out that a recent informal recomputation of troop housing construction costs by Japanese Ministries representatives indicates that budget estimates for this project should be more nearly 3.3 billion yen than 5.4 billion yen, even without consideration to returned military stocks.

4. The Japanese Public Works Program in the so-called GHQ Plan is designed to provide from 1,000,000 to 1,250,000 man years of employment. This program is considered essential to increase the supply of food, clothing and fuel for

the Japanese people and to establish a counter-inflationary program and will be included in the budget without change.

5. The contention that the proposed budget is beyond the economic or productive capacity of Japan appears to be without foundation. Accordingly, the Japanese budget for the FY 1946 will be revised to reflect actual costs based upon legal prices applied to the list of materials required for the accomplishment of the dependent and troop housing construction of the so-called GHQ Plan as modified and credit for stocks returned to the Japanese Government and submitted without further delay.

SUBJECT : Manning of U.S. Vessels by Japanese Seamen.

1. Circumstances described in C.L.O. No. 2082(CM) of 2 May 1946 have been investigated and the following information has been ascertained:

a. In some instances competent Japanese Masters, Chief Engineers and subordinate officers have not been readily available through the CMMC necessitating the use of U.S. personnel.

b. In some instances more competent seamen have been available through the Yokohama Seamen's Union than through the CMMC.

2. It is conceded that dealing solely with the CMMC would facilitate procurement of Japanese seamen and it is also appreciated that employment of an all-Japanese crew would avoid difficulties through differences in customs, language and standardization of wages, food and clothing rations. However, the paramount consideration is operating efficiency of the vessels and to the extent that full efficiency cannot be realized from the employment of seamen procured from the CMMC, crews will be assembled in whatever manner that will ensure such efficiency.

SUBJECT : Sender Composition Message Service for Approved Private Companies.

1. It is directed that the Japanese Board of Communications arrange to furnish telegraph message service as follows:

a. Accept and transmit, on a receiver to pay basis, messages to the United States sent from business concerns, organizations and persons within Japan, to be designated by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. Receive and deliver to business or cable addresses approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, prepaid messages from the United States addressed to approved business concerns, organizations or persons in Japan.

c. Extend the service to be provided, in accordance with paragraphs "a" and "b" above, to possessions of the United States when telegraph services thereto are established.

2. This supplements (SCAPIN 379), AG 676.1 (1 Dec 45) CCS, subject: "Establishment of Sender Composition Message Service Between the United States and the Tokyo Area".

3. Information as to the names, locations and cable addresses of firms, organizations and persons authorized to use the service covered by this memorandum; details as to identification, methods of filing and other pertinent information will be furnished to the Board of Communications from time to time by direct correspondence from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. Money accumulated at the United States terminals of the international circuits due the Japanese Board of Communications for services rendered will be held in a special account to be settled at some future date.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to approximately 200,000 tons of salt being made available for Japanese consumption:

a. Arrange with Shipping Control Authority, for Japanese Merchant Marine, for the assignment of suitable shipping to lift approximately 45,500 tons of salt monthly from May to October, inclusive, 1946 as follows:

- 30,000 tons at Seeu Taa (Katabaki Shima)
- 5,500 tons at Chian Chin Creek (Shogan Creek)
- 10,000 tons at An Ping (And Hei)

b. Declare ports of discharge in Japan for cargoes of salt at the time shipping is assigned and make all the necessary arrangements to discharge the cargoes at such ports.

c. Submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers a forward schedule of the ports of discharge.

d. Instruct each ship master concerned to furnish the official representative of the Chinese National Government at Seeu Taa, Chian Chin Creek and An Ping, as the case may be, with quantitative receipts for the salt at the shipping point. Two copies of these quantitative receipts to be verified by the official representative of the Chinese National Government at the port of loading and to be returned to the ship master.

e. Both copies of the quantitative receipts will be verified by an official representative of the Imperial Japanese Government upon discharge of the salt at ports in Japan and will be transmitted to the Commanding General, Eighth U. S. Army.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is authorized to distribute the subject salt upon arrival in Japan.
