3. Pending completion of the move directed in paragraph 2 above, the messages handled by the Kagoshima terminal shall be submitted to the District Telecommunications Censor at Fukuoka via land line telegraph before they are transmitted from persons in Japan to persons outside of Japan, and before they are delivered to persons in Japan from persons outside of Japan.

4. Radio telegraph messages between Japan and any point outside of Japan, as presently defined, will not be transmitted or received by the Kagoshima radio terminal subsequent to the date the circuits from Amami O-Shima and Miyako Jima are terminated at Fukuoka.

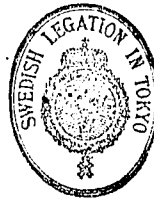

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission, in charge of Norwegian interests in Japan, presents its compliments to the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to state as follows:

By note of 4th March, 1942, No. 25/42, the Norwegian Legation in Tokyo informed the Japanese Foreign Minister that the Swedish Consulate at Dairen, Kwantung Leased Territory, was to take care of the affairs of the Norwegian Consulate there. On 23rd March, 1942, the archives and other property of the said Norwegian Consulate were handed over to the Swedish Consulate, which on or about 13th February, 1943, dispatched the Norwegian Consular property to the Swedish Legation in Tokyo. The goods arrived at Tokyo Shiodome Station on 10th April, 1943.

and the station master informed the Swedish Legation that the goods could only be handed over to the Swedish Legation after approval of the Imperial Foreign Ministry.

The Swedish Legation pointed out to the then Vice Minister for Foreign Affairs that it took for granted that the Japanese Foreign Ministry could have no objection to the goods being delivered to the Swedish Legation since it was a question of shipment from the Swedish Consulate - not from the Norwegian Consulate - to the Swedish Legation. Yet, the said Vice Minister about 30th April, 1943, insisted that the goods, being Norwegian property, and the Japanese Government never having officially recognized Sweden as Protecting Power in Japan for Norway, be kept in custody by the Japanese Foreign Ministry. On 10th May, 1943, the Swedish Minister verbally protested to the said Ministry against its refusal to transfer the goods to the Swedish Legation.

By note verbale on 27th September, 1943, No. 58/C.R., the Imperial Foreign Ministry informed the Swedish Legation that the Ministry had taken delivery of the goods, contained in a wooden box. An inventory was attached to the said note verbale.

Referring to the above, the Swedish Diplomatic Mission requests the Imperial Foreign Ministry to be good enough to deliver this Norwegian property, at its earliest convenience, to this Mission, or if that is still impossible, to state for what reason the goods cannot now be transferred to the Swedish Mission."

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is hereby directed to terminate all payments, whether to servicemen or to civilians attached to the former Armed Forces, granted under the provisions of Regulation No. 210, issued by the 1st Demobilization Ministry on 7 January 1946, and the equivalent regulation, promulgated by the 2nd Demobilization Ministry on 13 December 1945. The above regulations and all instructions implementing them will be rescinded immediately.

3. Immediate action will be taken to recover all sums paid into restricted deposit accounts under the above regulations. All restricted deposit accounts of the household concerned will be considered liable for any amounts not recoverable from the payee's personal account.

4. There is no objection to the promulgation of new regulations, replacing those cited in paragraph 2 above, which will provide only for the payment of actual travelling expenses, to a maximum of ¥300, to the demobilized personnel. Prior to their promulgation, and in no event later than 7 days after receipt of this memorandum, the proposed regulations will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, for approval.

5. A preliminary report of action taken by the Imperial Japanese Government to implement instructions contained in paragraphs 2 and 3 above will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for

 - c. Place all criminals convicted for offenses involving serious crimes or moral turpitude in prison to serve the duration of their sentences.
 - d. Either place prisoners convicted of minor offenses in prison to serve the duration of their sentences, or parole them during good behavior.

1. Reference is made to Paragraph 7, SCAP Directive Number 3, 22 September 1945.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take all necessary steps to stop illicit import and export trade.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will seize all goods, wares and merchandise which are the subject of illicit import or export trade, and will take the following actions in regard to property seized:
 - a. Institute appropriate judicial proceedings for the violations of export, import regulations within two weeks after violations are found.
 - b. Store, protect and preserve all goods, wares and merchandise, except foodstuffs which are in danger of spoilage, pending determination of judicial action affecting the property.
 - c. Place in regular distribution channels all foodstuffs in danger of spoilage, the proceeds from the sale thereof to be subject to judicial determination in the place of the items sold.
4. If it is judicially determined that property is the subject of illicit import and export trade the property shall be confiscated and the following actions will be taken:
 - a. Confiscated consumer goods such as food, clothing, fuel and toilet articles will be placed in regular channels of distribution and distributed in accordance with rationing and allocation plans of the Imperial Japanese Government.
 - b. Confiscated money, negotiable instruments, and precious stones and metals shall be turned over to the custody of the Bank of Japan for the account of the Imperial Japanese Government.
 - c. Other items and durable goods, such as machinery and heavy equipment, shall be reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for instructions as to disposition.

- d. All confiscated vessels or small craft will be placed into service as soon as possible after court action.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government will report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within 48 hours of discovery, all violations of paragraph 7, SCAP Directive Number 3, 22 September 1945, giving the following information:
 - a. Location and date of incident.
 - b. Agency making the arrest.
 - c. National identity of smuggler apprehended and registry of ship or vessel.
 - d. Quantities and types of goods, wares, or merchandise impounded.
 - e. Nature of charges made against the apprehended criminals, the scheduled date and location of trials.
 - f. Any additional information pertinent to the subject.
 6. The Imperial Japanese Government will report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within two weeks after completion of action, the results of all judicial action, including confiscation, taken under this memorandum.
