MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT.

THROUGH : Central Liaison Office, Tokyo.

SUBJECT : Action to be taken Concerning Personnel of
KURASHIKI SHOKO GAKKO, Okayama Prefecture.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government, on receipt of this Memorandum, will investigate the following-named personnel of KURASHIKI SHOKO GAKKO, Okayama Prefecture, with reference to the activities herein described:

a. SASAKI, Motoichi, Principal of Kurashiki Shoko Gakko, did knowingly secrete military training aids in the storehouse of a nearby Buddhist temple, in direct violation of Ministry of Education Document BPE No. 100, dated 26 December 1945, subject: "Thorough Disposal of Weapons and Militaristic Arts used in Physical Education". Among the articles discovered were wooden training swords, complete kendo equipment, cartridge belts and cases, war maps and dummy grenades.

b. SASAKI, Motoichi; ASHIDA, Norimichi; and KANAMITSU, Harumasa admitted cutting naginata swords in such a manner as to appear to comply with directives but still render the swords suitable for future military use. Such action was ordered by the office of the Prefectural Bureau of Education.

c. TAKEMASA, Satoru and AOKI, (fnu) were charged with the actual handling and disposition of above-listed material.

d. The actions of all personnel concerned were such as to obstruct the progress of an inspection party of CIC and MG personnel.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will make a report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to include results of investigation and recommendation for disciplinary action to be taken in the case of each individual. Report will reach this headquarters not later than two (2) weeks from date of this memorandum.

SUBJECT : Liquid Chlorine.

1. It is directed that immediate action be taken to accept delivery from the Commanding General, Eighth Army, of three hundred (300) metric tons of liquid chlorine.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government will furnish the Commanding General, Eighth Army with quantitative receipts for the liquid chlorine at the points of delivery.
3. It is directed that the liquid chlorine be used for the chlorination of certain Japanese municipal water systems to U. S. Army standards, and that this chlorine be used for no other purpose. The handling, allocation, and shipment of chlorine to designated municipalities will be the responsibility of the Imperial Japanese Government, based upon the instructions received from the Commanding General, Eighth Army.

SUBJECT : Shipment of Grain to Japan.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to 8101 long tons of grain being made available for future Japanese consumption:

a. Accept delivery of one shipload of grain totaling 8101 long tons ex SS Frederick Bouchard, arriving on or about 5 June 1946, at a point designated by the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

b. Furnish the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, with quantitative receipts for the grain at the point of delivery.

c. Store the grain so that it is protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards and is under proper custody at all times.

d. Ensure that no distribution is made of the grain until official authorization for release is given by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. This does not preclude the transportation of the cargo to areas of greatest anticipated need.

SUBJECT : Modifications of Short Wave Broadcast Service for Japanese Repatriation Camps in China, Formosa and Manchuria.

1. It is directed that the present short wave broadcast service transmitting programs to Japanese repatriation camps in Formosa and Manchuria be modified to provide increased signal strength in areas presently served and to provide service to the Shanghai and Tsingtao area as follows:

a. Transmitter Number R-1 at Kawachi Transmitting Station, Minami-kawachi-gun, Osaka-fu, operating on 15225 kilocycles (day) and 9505 kilocycles (night) will supply 10 kilowatts power to each of two (2) antennas. One (1) antenna will be directed toward Formosa and the other toward Shanghai, China and Tsingtao, China. The call signs will be JLT 3 (15225 kc) and JLV 2 (9505 kc).

b. Transmitter Number T-2 at Kawachi Transmitting Station, operating on 15140 kc (day) and 9560 kc (night) will supply 10 kilowatts power to one (1) antenna directed toward Peiping, China; Tientsin, China and Changahun, Manchuria. The call signs will be JLV 6 (15140 kc) and JZA (9560 kc). Since tubes are not available for the Kawachi transmitter at present, transmitter T-2 at Nazaki, Yuki-gen, Ibaragi-ken will be substituted until such time as tubes are available. This headquarters will be notified five (5) days prior to transfer of operation from Nazaki to Kawachi.

2. The short wave broadcast service described above will commence on or about 10 June 1946.

3. Present short wave broadcasts to Formosa and Manchuria on 6190 kc 11705 kc will be discontinued on the date of change-over to the service described in paragraph 1.

4. The program to be transmitted will be the number one network program of the Broadcasting Corporation of Japan or other programs approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

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1. In accord with the procedure established under the memorandum of 4 January 1946, "Removal and Exclusion of Undesirable Personnel from Public Office" (SCAPIN 550), the action of the Japanese Government in screening and passing as eligible for public office one Giichi MATSUMURA, member of the House of Peers since April 1927, and recently nominated for appointment as mayor of Kudamatsu City, Yamaguchi Ken, has been reviewed by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The development of democratic tendencies in Japan is one of the principal objectives of the occupation. The mayor of a city, as chief magistrate of the government unit closest to the every day lives of the people, is in a key position to retard or encourage the development of such tendencies. The quality of the personnel chosen to fill such key positions is a powerful determining factor in the Japanese nation's progress toward fulfilling the obligations imposed by the Potsdam Declaration.

3. Examination of the record of Giichi MATSUMURA discloses that he is an undesirable person within the meaning of paragraph 1 of Category G, Appendix "A", SCAPIN 550 in that:

a. As Director of the Police Bureau of the Ministry of Home Affairs, he played an important governmental part in the forced dissolution in December 1925 of the newly formed Farmer Labor Party (Nomin Rodo-to) which advocated anti-militarism, anti-imperialism, the betterment of labor conditions through collective bargaining and through legislation, and the abolition of the Peace Preservation Law.

b. In the same capacity, MATSUMURA was responsible for the arrest in December 1925 of students of Kyoto Imperial University

who had protested against military training for university students, and for the mass arrests in January 1926 of members of the Social Science Study Society (SHAKAI-GAKU KENKYU-KAI), a nationally federated association of university and college students of liberal tendencies.

c. These and other facts not herein recited mark MATSUMURA as one of those who, during the critical years when minorities still had a voice in Japan, stifled that voice by ruthlessly suppressing freedom of speech and assembly, thus paving the way for the transformation of Japan into a totalitarian fascist state.

3. In view of the foregoing, the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to bar Giichi MATSUMURA from the position of Mayor of Kudamatsu City, remove him from membership in the House of Peers and exclude him from government service pursuant to SCAPIN 550.

1. This memorandum is to confirm the verbal instructions of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, to the Japanese Board of Communications regarding inauguration of radio telegraph service between Japan and the Hawaiian Islands on 7 May 1946. Transmission and reception of EFM, SCM, Private, Government and Press messages was directed under the provisions hereinafter set forth.

2. Definitions. a. SCM (Sender Composition Message) is a message freely composed by the sender, from or to military or accredited civilian personnel, and shall be sent prepaid from Japan and the Hawaiian Islands.

b. Private Message is one including commercial and/or personal contents, and shall be sent collect (receiver to pay), from Japan, and shall be sent prepaid from the Hawaiian Islands. This service is available only to non-accredited persons, firms and corporations located in Japan who are specially authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to send and receive messages over the radio telegraph circuits between Japan and San Francisco.

c. Accredited Personnel, for the purpose of this memorandum, is defined as those persons in Japan having APO or FPO addresses, or the equivalent addresses of personnel of allied powers jointly occupying Japan.

d. Non-accredited Personnel are those not having addresses as stated in paragraph c above.

3. The procedures relating to censorship, the "beyond" rates in Japan, acceptance and places of acceptance of messages in Japan, delivery of messages, and financial settlements, shall be the same as those in effect (or which may in the future become effective) for messages passing between Japan and the continental United States.

4. Messages between Japan and Hawaii will be handled over the Tokyo-San Francisco and Tokyo-Los Angeles circuits, and thence relayed to the Hawaiian Islands. Until otherwise advised, Press Wireless, Inc. is auth-

By letter of the 30th April, 1946, transmitted through the intermediary of the proper Allied Authorities, the Director of the General Affairs Bureau of the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs has informed me, on Your Excellency's behalf, that, the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for the time being withholding its approval of the Imperial Government's application to pay 100.000:- Swedish Kronor in indemnity to the Swedish Government for the maltreatment of Mr. E.F. JOHANSEN, a Staffmember of the former Swedish Legation, the Imperial Government are, at this time, unable to effect the said payment.

In the cases of German nationals who may be permitted by this headquarters to remain in Japan, the foregoing applies only until such time as the decision has been made exempting them from evacuation. Thereafter their housing arrangements will be a matter concerning the individuals and their landlords.
3. The instructions contained herein will not be construed to preclude the requisition by Occupation Forces of Japanese residences now occupied by German nationals.

1. Cholera has broken out in Korea and is rapidly reaching epidemic proportions. In view of the grave danger of the introduction of this disease into Japan by carriers transported from Korea to Japan on unauthorized shipping, positive steps must be taken to detect and apprehend ships illegally entering Japanese ports.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government will:
 - a. Place into effect measures to detect ships illegally entering Japanese ports.
 - b. Seize all such ships and sail them together with their crews, passengers and cargo to Senzaki, Sasebo or Maizuru, and deliver them to US military authorities at that port.
 - c. Insure that no crew member or passenger of such vessels is allowed ashore while in Japanese custody.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters not later than 20 June 1946 a report setting forth the steps taken to implement the provisions of this directive.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 360(18 Nov 45)ESS/E (SCAPIN 301) to the Imperial Japanese Government, subject: "Commercial and Civil Aviation."

2. Paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 of the above referenced memorandum are hereby deleted and the following paragraphs are added thereto:

"4. You will prohibit the manufacture, ownership, storage or operation by any public or private agency under your jurisdiction of any aircraft, or components or devices specifically designed therefor.

"5. You will permit no individual or group under your jurisdiction to develop or execute plans for the design, manufacture, procurement or operation of any aircraft, components or devices designed therefor; or for procurement outside Japan of such services, except as specifically authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

"6. You will prohibit research and organized instruction having purposes directed towards activities forbidden by paragraphs 4 and 5 hereof.

"7. The provisions of Directive No. 3 (SCAPIN 47) dated 22 September 1945 as amended by SCAPIN 984, 25 May 1946, continue to apply to the subjects covered by this memorandum, aircraft in all phases being classified for this purpose as implements of war."
