c. Store the cargo so that it is protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards and is under proper custody at all times.

d. Insure that no distribution is made of the cargo until official authorization for release is given by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. This does not preclude processing or the transportation of the cargo to areas of greatest anticipated need.

REPATRIATION TO AND FROM JAPAN

SECTION I - GENERAL PLAN.

1. a. The following plan governing the repatriation to and from Japan, now in effect, will continue until otherwise directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. The entire plan revolves around the use of reception centers and the flow of persons to be repatriated through these centers in the numbers that can be accommodated by the available shipping and rail transportation.

c. Under this plan non-Japanese nationals who, having registered as being desirous of repatriation, refuse to comply with plans of the Imperial Japanese Government for movement to reception centers forfeit their privilege to repatriation and will not be considered in any future repatriation plans. A list of such persons by name will be maintained by the Japanese Government. The number of persons so listed as of 31 May 1946 will be reported to General Headquarters not later than 25 June 1946. Thereafter monthly reports will be furnished on or about the 10th day of the month following the month reported on.

2. The following reception centers will be used to process non-Japanese repatriates leaving Japan:

Hakata and Sensaki	Primarily to process Koreans.
Kagoshima	Primarily to process Ryukyans.
Kure Area	Primarily to process Formosans, and such Chinese as were formerly domiciled in south China.
Maizuru	Primarily to process Chinese who were formerly domiciled in central China.
Sasebo	Primarily to process Chinese who were formerly domiciled in north China.

3. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will:

a. Make the necessary arrangements to insure that each of the reception centers mentioned in paragraph 2 above is kept filled, insofar as practicable, with outgoing repatriates as hereinafter prescribed.

12. Under this plan it is the responsibility of the Imperial Japanese Government to plan and implement the repatriation of Korean nationals from Japan to Korea. This responsibility will not be delegated wholly or in part to any of the various Korean associations or societies.

1. Reference is made to paragraph 3b, Memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 370.05 (11 May 46)GC, (SCAPIN-1201-A), dated 11 May 1946, subject: "Baggage for Korean Repatriates."
2. Ship No. 3 Taihei Maru with cargo of baggage belonging to Koreans who have been repatriated is in custody of 81st Military Government Company at Tanezaki Urade in Kochi Ken. Ship had no authority to sail or carry the cargo listed.
3. An investigation of the alleged illegal sailing of ship No. 3 Taihei Maru is being conducted by appropriate military agencies under the Eighth United States Army.
4. Upon completion of the investigation mentioned above, Commander Naval Activities Japan will take custody of the ship No. 3 Taihei Maru, sail it to Tokyo, and determine ultimate disposition thereof.
5. The Imperial Japanese Government will, upon arrival of ship No. 3 Taihei Maru at Tokyo, unload, store, and safeguard the baggage until such time as commercial shipments to Korea can be made.

It is directed that the Bank of Japan redeem at face value in valid Japanese currency three (3) one-thousand yen Bank of Taiwan notes now held by Lieutenant Albert E. Sinks, Funding Officer, Office of the Fiscal Director, General Headquarters, United States Army Forces, Pacific.

1. Reference Ministry of Finance Notification, C.L.O. Number 2470 (EF), subject as above.

2. The proposed notification is approved with the following exceptions:

a. The abbreviation for "cubic centimeter" as contained in the Finance Notification should be changed to conform to the abbreviation as used in the memorandum concerning poisonous beverages previously issued. In other words, "cm³" should be changed to read "cc".

b. In paragraph 1, the word "weight" should be eliminated and the word "content" substituted therefor.

c. In paragraph 2, the word "quantity" should be substituted for the word "quality".

3. Label as submitted is approved.

4. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is concerned only with those sections of the proposed Notification which deal with the labeling of bottles containing methyl alcohol, and the provisions for punishment of violations thereof. Other provisions in the Notification submitted have neither the approval nor disapproval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Prior to Admiral T. Kuwahara's military authority over American Nationals and their properties, occupying the home of the Zimmermans, 12 Mu Ping Road, the Japanese authorities removed all of the furniture from the home. Upon occupying the home, Admiral Kuwahara removed from the warehouse of Zimmerman and Company, seventeen cases of personal effects belonging to Mr. Zimmerman and had them brought to the home.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to approximately 9,300 long tons of U.S. Army subsistence stocks:

- a. Accept delivery of the subsistence stocks at the port of Nagoya.
- b. Furnish the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, with quantitative receipts for the stocks at the point of delivery.
- c. Make the necessary arrangements to discharge the cargo promptly upon arrival of vessels.
- d. Store stocks so that they are protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards and are under proper custody at all times.
- e. Insure that no distribution is made of stocks until official authorization for release is given by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. This does not preclude the transportation of the stocks to areas of greatest anticipated need.
- f. Detailed instructions in regard to the disposition of certain luxury-type items in the cargo will be forwarded at a later date.

2. 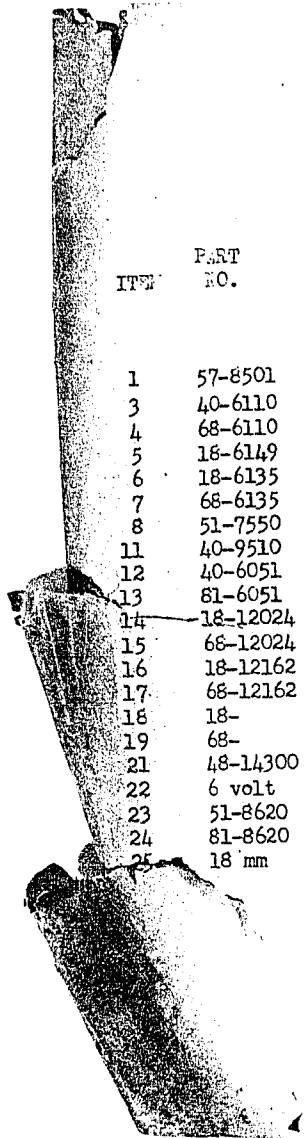

a. The Nippon Fertilizer Company, Limited, will be permitted to continue conversion of the following units for production of Ammonium Sulphate at the 2nd Naval Fuel Depot at Yokkaichi, Mie Prefecture:

- (1) Complete electrolytic unit for production of Hydrogen (capacity 1,500 cubic meters Hydrogen per hour).
- (2) Two units of the Lind Air Separation Plant (capacity 500 cubic meters Nitrogen per hour each).
- (3) Two Ammonia Synthesis Units with one gas compressor for use with both units.
- (4) Two mixing chambers and necessary pumps for production of Ammonium Sulphate.
- (5) Two boilers (capacity 15 metric tons steam per hour each).

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BASIC: Memo for IJG, AG 464.6 (22 Jun 46) ESS/IN (SCAPIN - 1031), subject: "Conversion of 2nd and 3rd Naval Fuel Depots to Production of Nitrogenous Fertilizers", dated 22 June 1946.

b. The above specified portion of the 2nd Naval Fuel Depot at Yokkaichi is placed on the approved list of plants for production of nitrogenous fertilizers, as set forth in Memorandum, paragraph 1b, above.


c. Authority to convert the remainder of the 2nd Naval Fuel Depot at Yokkaichi, the affiliated plant at Kogetwucho, Nagoya, and the 3rd Naval Fuel Depot at Yokuyama, as indicated in Memorandum, paragraph 1a, above, is hereby rescinded.

d. The provisions of Memorandum, paragraph 1c, above, are to be adhered to with respect to all portions of the 2nd and 3rd Naval Fuel Depots.

1. The provisions of references (a) and (b), and paragraphs 1 and 3 of reference (c) in so far as they relate to authorization of Japanese fishing areas, are rescinded.

2. Effective this date and until further notice Japanese fishing, whaling and similar operations are authorized within the area bounded as follows: From a point midway between Nosappu Misaki and Kaigara Jima at approximately 43°33' North Latitude, 145°51' East Longitude; to 43° North Latitude, 146°30' East Longitude; thence to 45° North Latitude, 165° East Longitude; thence south along 165th Meridian to 24° North Latitude; west along the 24th Parallel to 123° East Longitude; thence north to 26° North Latitude, 123° East Longitude; thence to 33°30' North Latitude, 125° East Longitude; thence to 33° North Latitude, 127°40' East Longitude; thence to 40° North Latitude, 135° East Longitude; to 45°30' North Latitude, 140° East Longitude; thence east to 45° 30' North Latitude, 145° East Longitude rounding Soya Misaki at a distance of three (3) miles from shore; south along 145th Meridian to a point three (3) miles off the coast of Hokkaido; thence along a line three (3) miles off the coast of Hokkaido rounding Shiretoko Saki and passing through Nemuro Kaiyo to the starting point midway between Nosappu Misaki and Kaigara Jima.

3. Authorization in paragraph 2 above is subject to the following provisions.

(a) Japanese vessels will not approach closer than twelve (12) miles to any island within the authorized area which lies south of 30° North Latitude with the exception of Sofu Gan. Personnel from such vessels will not land on islands lying south of 30° North Latitude, except Sofu Gan, nor have contact with any inhabitants thereof.

(b) Japanese vessels or personnel thereof will not approach closer than twelve (12) miles to Takeshima (37°15' North Latitude, 131°53' East Longitude) nor have any contact with said island.

5. The present authorization is not an expression of allied policy relative to ultimate determination of national jurisdiction, international boundaries or fishing rights in the area concerned or in any other area.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 370.05 (7 May 46) GC (SCAPIN 927), 7 May 1946, subject: "Repatriation."

2. Japanese nationals being repatriated from Canada to Japan are hereby exempted from the provisions of paragraph 2 of Annex VI of the reference memorandum.

3. You are directed to authorize the Bank of Japan to effect payment in yen to these repatriates based on attached schedule of payments. The conversion will be at the rate of 15 yen to one United States dollar. In effecting payment to these repatriates a maximum of \$1,000 in currency may be paid to each individual. The balance will be paid by a restricted check in accordance with the provisions of the Emergency Financial Measures of the Imperial Japanese Government.

4. Each repatriate will carry with him a form CT-JAP-1 which expresses in Canadian dollars the amount the Government of Canada has transferred to the custody account for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers with the United States Treasury for payment in yen upon the repatriates' arrival in Japan. These forms are not negotiable instruments but are issued to assist paying officials in identifying repatriates. Should there be any discrepancies between any amounts shown on these forms and the schedule of payments attached hereto the amounts shown on the schedules are to be taken as correct. The forms will be surrendered by the repatriate

when the yen is paid over by the Bank of Japan. The Bank of Japan at the completion of each shipment will forward these forms to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. In addition to form CT-JAP-1 certain repatriates will also have in their possession form CT-JAP-2. This form is merely an acknowledgment by the Government of Canada of property to the value stated on the form. No payments in yen will be effected against this form at the time of arrival of repatriates in Japan.

6. Present procedure contemplates that at a later date any remaining amounts due repatriates will be forwarded to the United States Government in Washington for transmission to the repatriates in Japan. To facilitate the completion of these payments a directory of the names and addresses of the repatriates will be maintained.

7. Repatriates from Canada are exempted from filing a foreign exchange report as required under the provisions of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 123 (6 Oct 45) ESS, 6 Oct 1945, subject: "Reports on Foreign Exchange Assets and Related Matters."
