- c. Name and address of user;
- d. Authority under which use made;
- e. Nature of use made;
- f. Extent of use -
 - (1) Length of time used,
 - (2) Amount of production,
 - (a) Type of article produced,
 - (b) Units produced,
 - (c) Net selling price,
- g. Miscellaneous pertinent information.

3. The responsibility will be placed on all private individuals, firms or corporations to investigate and determine whether or not they have used or are now using any patents, utility models, designs, trademarks or copyrights owned by nationals of the United Nations. An appropriate penalty will be prescribed for failure to investigate and report such use.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will require all individuals, firms and corporations to keep and maintain full and complete records regarding use of rights referred to herein.

Before they left Sweden in January, 1946, in order to be repatriated to Japan by the proper Authorities of the Allied Powers, the following three Officials served at the above Naval Office at Stockholm:-

Comdr MISHINA, who had been at Stockholm for some years, has been entered into the Swedish Automobile Register as the owner of the car.

However, Dr WAKUTA, who, like Comdr INABA, arrived in Sweden from Berlin, Germany, has - according to certain reports - imported the car to Sweden and used it in the service of the above Naval Office. Inde

In a report to the Swedish Government Flight Property Bureau, Dr WAKUTA has declared that he owns an automobile, worth 4.000:- Swedish Kronor.

In connection with their departure from Sweden Comdrs MISHINA and INABA, separately, by separate, attested documents of transfer, presented the ADLER car as a gift to two different persons, viz. the Japanese Newspaper Correspondent Hiroshi KITANURA, and the Swedish citizen Uno LINDHOLM.

As the above information is not sufficient definitely to establish the ownership of the car, the Swedish Mission ventures to request the assistance of the Imperial Ministry in order to obtain the further information necessary for the said purpose from the three above Officials, whose present address in Japan is unknown to the Mission. It would be preferred if all three of them would give a written statement as to who owns the car. Should it be found that the vehicle belongs to Dr WAKUTA, it would also be necessary for him to indicate his further desires as to the disposition of the car.

"under the actual circumstances, so particular for the International Bureau, the Committee thinks suitable to forward to the countries which subscribed to the "Convention du Mètre " a urging claim to obtain from them the full payment of all overdue and actual shares they promised to pay for the maintenance of the Bureau....."

The Committee, which would like to be able to use the foreign exchange facilities granted by the French Minister of Finances, backs the request brought up by the Bureau International to all countries subscribers to the Convention to pay their shares in Swiss currency originally drawn up in french gold currency. The Committee wishes that all countries not able to settle their account in swiss currency would kindly in a compensatory manner triple the account of their share in french currency "

The account of the share of each country is settled in french gold currency of 1913. On gold-franc contains 322,581 mg of gold with a standard of 900 millièmes i.c. 290,322 9 mg of fine gold.

According to a decret of the Swiss Federal Council date september 27, 1936, the gold parity the Swiss franc is between 190 and 215 mg of fine gold. So this parity may be equal to 206,2 mg of fine gold. One french gold franc equals to 1,408 swiss franc.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will be furnished shipping schedules governing the movement of:

a. Japanese merchant and naval vessels, Japanese-manned Liberty ships and Landing Ships, Tank, by the Shipping Control Authority for the Japanese Merchant Marine.

b. US-manned Landing Ships, Tank, and other Allied vessels, as they are established, by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. Guards aboard trains carrying non-Japanese repatriates.

a. Allied military authorities have been directed to provide on request of authorized officials of Imperial Japanese Government, a minimum of one Allied Force guard per train aboard all trains scheduled specifically to carry non-Japanese repatriates (excludes Ryukyuan) for purpose of lending necessary support and prestige to Japanese police guards and coordinating their activities.

b. The Imperial Japanese Government will direct the local Japanese Government officials to:

(1) Request local Allied military authorities to place Allied guards aboard trains scheduled specifically to carry non-

- (5) Persons with the following diseases may be placed aboard repatriation ships, provided the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is notified and proper surveillance is maintained enroute to Korea: amebic dysentery, bacillary dysentery, enteritis or diarrhea, malaria, kala azar, tuberculosis, pleurisy, undulant fever and venereal disease.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

- a. Concerning Japanese repatriates mentioned in paragraph 2 a above:
 - (1) Make the necessary arrangements to insure that the initial dose of typhus vaccine is administered the first day they are aboard ship.
 - (2) Administer the final dose of typhus vaccine upon their arrival at reception centers in Japan.

- (4) Move them to the Sasebo Reception Center during the period 23 February to 9 March 1947 and process them in accordance with the provisions of reference paragraph 1 above, as amended by paragraph 2 b above.
- (5) Outload not to exceed 10,000 Koreans during the period 9 - 15 March 1947 inclusive on shipping designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. In addition, make the necessary arrangements to insure that:
