26/7/945 gunu sabahi saat tam yedide 132 yaka sayılı polis memuru eve gelerek Japon Sefirini intihar ettigini ve savci Kemal Boranında hadise mahalline gitmek üzere oldugunu bildirmesi üzerine 1402 pilaka numaralı taksiarabasi ile Ataturk Bulvarındaki ve enterne edilmiş Japon Hariciye memurlarina mahsus 327 numaralı eve gelilerek hadisenin vukuu buldugu ikinci kata girildi. Tabib Murtaza soylu ile Emniyet sube mudurlerinden Ekrem hadisenin vuku buldugu odada Gorulerek gerekli tahkikat baslandı. Gerek yaralı bayanı ve gerek olmus olan orta elciyi ilk def'a gormus ve muayene etmiş olması sifatile doktor Murtaza soyluya yemini icra ettirilerek ehli-vukuf sifatile fen'i mutalaası soruldu. Soz alan tabib bu sabah saat 5; 10 gece belediye nobetci tabibligine japon sefarethanesinde geldim. Odada bayan sefire kapinin onunde yatıyordu. (Yerde yatıyor konusacak vaziyette degildi. Yanliz inliyordu derhal kendisine ilk tetbir olarak kanfir yapıldi. Ve derhal hastahaneye kaldirildi. Kendisine birisi son nahi ve ceniyeden giren ve disari cikmiyan digeri sol terkova altından ve kısmi vahsiden hatti iptigi kodamiye yakin olmak üzere girmis ikinci bir kursun arkadan cikmiş bulunuyordu. Bay sefirin ise yatagında yari sola donuk ve karyolanin bas tarafına- yaslanmış bir vaziyette yatıyordu. Yapılan muayenesinde kendisinin agzından giren kursunu arkada hatpeyi kafaliye uzerinden ciktiği gorulmustur. Bu kursun yarasiyle derhal oldugu neticesinevarilmistir. Sefirin yatagında fazla ve cok fazla miktarda kan ve kan pãhtilari goruldu. Yerde uc kapcik ve bir tanede sefirin karyolasinin kenardina atılmış kusunun mermisi bulundu. Yapılan muayenelere ve elde eilen neticelere gore hadisenin cini mahiyette olmayip dogrudan dogruya intihar oldugu kanaatin a varilmistir. Sefireye ait kat'i raporu bilaha hastaneden alınması iktiza eder. Diger mutalaa eylemesi uzerine vak'anin ceryan eyledigi oda icersinde tetkikat icrasına baslandı.

- Odanın vaziyeti: İkinci katta olan ve sefire sit bulunan yatak odasında yarım metre aralıkla iki karyola mevcut olup bunlardan birisi kapuya yakin ve digeride onun yaninda bulunmakta ve kapuya yakin olan karyolada hastahaneye kaldirilmiş bulunan sefirinin yattigi anlasilmakta olup diger karyoladada olmus olan sefirin kayrolanin sol kenarında ve sola donuk bir vaziyette bas kısmi kanla mulerma olarak goruldu. Sahid sifatile dinlenmiş olan japonkancilarya memurlarından kanbo ile kamoy ve sihojilinin ifadelerine nazaran intihar eden sahsin japyonanın portekiz maslahat guzari ve orta elci siniciciva ile refikasi viyakociva olduklari neticesine varilmistir. Elci intihar icin yedi altimis bes capında 277900 numarili ve valde markali tabancayı kullanmistirki bu tabanca hadise mahallien ilk gelen memur kamey tarafından elcinin sag elinden alınmiş olup ahiren tarafimiza teslim edilmistir; Mezkur tabancanın sarjorunda 5 fisek olup bunlardan ucu endehat edilmiş ve ikisi kullanılmamistir. Atılan mermilare ait uc kovani ile sefirin karyolasi yaninda bir adet mermi cekildigi yapılan taharri neticesi elde edilmistir. Gerek yatak odasında ve gerek sefire ait diger odalarda sahsina ait zati esyalardan baska resmi varakarala ve resmi vesikalara tesaduf edilmedigi gibi bu husus ifadeleri alınan memurlardan teyit eylemişlerdir. 2. No objection is offered to the above application, subject to the following conditions:

- a. The sum to be made available at this time shall not exceed ¥600,000,000.
- b. There shall be submitted to the Antitrust and Cartels Division, Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, applications by each of the companies concerned showing details of proposed expenditures, prior to beginning the rehabilitation work and expenditure of funds.
- c. No new or used spindles or spinning frames shall be purchased with the allocated funds, but new or used complementary equipment, except looms, sufficient to operate presently owned spindles may be purchased, if necessary, after approval of applications.
- d. No part of the allocated rehabilitation funds is to be expended for the repair of buildings or machinery, or for the purchase of new complementary machinery, or construction of new buildings beyond the necessary requirements to operate the total spindles presently owned, whether or not installed.
- e. First expenditure shall be made for the rehabilitation of buildings and machinery necessary to put the presently installed operable spindles into production.
- f. A report shall be submitted on the last day of each month to the Textile Division, Economic and Scientific Section, General

2. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government take immediate action to prohibit all transactions involving the sale or transfer of natural or cultured pearls and pearl articles except:

a. Transactions involving the sale to or for the Central Purchasing Office, General Headquarters, Army Forces, Pacific.

b. Transactions specifically authorized in writing by this headquarters. Requests for authorization will be submitted in writing through the Central Liaison Office. These requests are to indicate:

An investigation of expenditures made by the Imperial Japanese Government for supplies delivered on procurement demand and for repair, rehabilitation and construction of facilities, indicates that prices are being paid for labor, supplies, materials, and services far in excess of value received. It is clearly evident that the prices allowed by the Imperial Japanese Government on construction and rehabilitation projects, reflect payment of black-market prices for a large share of materials, payment of excessive wage rates, inclusion of taxes, and padding of costs for labor and materials.

1. Reference C.L.O. Memorandum No. 6175 PM dated 20 November 1946 and previous correspondence relating to the same subject.

2. The conditions outlined in the foregoing paragraph appear to be due largely to a failure on the part of the Imperial Japanese Government to establish and operate efficiently a system of supervision over the consummation of contracts and the performance of contractors, as well as otherwise to obtain the maximum return from required expenditures. It is therefore directed that, effective immediately, the Imperial Japanese Government will institute a system of supervisory inspection and auditing procedures adequately to control government expenditures.

2. It is directed that on or before 3 January 1947 the identity and whereabouts of the former master of the "SHINSHU MARU" mentioned in previous correspondence, be made known.

3. It is further directed that a complete and detailed explanation of the failure to report the master's identity, as previously requested, together with the identity of the section or office responsible, be submitted on 3 January 1947.

- The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to approximately 3,000 tons of wheat bran being made available for future Japanese consumption:
 - Arrange with Shipping Control Authority Japan for sending a vessel to Shanghai and Tsingtao, China for the purpose of lifting approximately 1,800 tons and 1,200 tons of wheat bran, respectively.
 - Declare ports of discharge in Japan for cargoes of wheat bran at the time shipping is assigned and make all the necessary arrangements to discharge the cargoes at such ports.
 - Submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers a forward schedule of the ports of discharge.
 - Instruct the ship's master to furnish the official representative of the Chinese National Government at Shanghai and Tsingtao with quantitative receipts for this wheat bran at the shipping point; two copies of these quantitative receipts to have a signed verification by the official representative of the Chinese National Government at Shanghai and Tsingtao, and to be retained by the ship's master.
 - Both copies of the quantitative receipts will be verified by an official representative of the Imperial Japanese Government upon discharge of the wheat bran at ports in Japan and will be transmitted to the Commanding General, Eighth U. S. Army.
- The wheat bran will be held in storage until official authorization for release is given by the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, (SCAPIN 1177), file AG 311.1, (5 Sept 46) CCS, dated 5 September 46, subject: "Resumption of International Postal Service between Japan and all other Countries except Germany".

2. Paragraph 1 of the reference memorandum is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"1. International postal service between Japan and all other countries is authorized effective 2 January 1947 subject to the following provisions:

"a. The service will be restricted to postal cards (including reply cards) and letters to and from Japan; one-way gift parcel post to Japan, and the mailing from Japan of such scientific and professional publications as may be approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

"b. Communications on postal cards and in letters will be restricted to personal and family messages, and to business, financial, and commercial correspondence, limited to ascertainment of facts and exchange of information, and subject to the following prohibitions:

- "(1) Letters authorizing or effecting specific financial and commercial transactions.
- "(2) Letters containing instructions or authorizations which effect property and financial transactions.
- "(3) Letters which contain currency, securities, checks, drafts, payment orders or other financial instruments.

"c. Communications on postal cards and in letters must be written in Chinese, English, French, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, Russian, or Spanish.

"d. Gift parcels to Japan will be limited to eleven pounds in weight and contents will be restricted to relief items such as non-perishable foods, clothing, soap, and mailable medicines."

The Imperial Japanese Government through Petroleum Distribution Company as agent for Board of Trade, is authorized to accept quantity of any one item greater than that specified in any one month provided that the total for the three months indicated is not exceeded. This authorization is to provide for contingencies that might arise such as direct discharge from ocean tanker to Petroleum Distribution Company storage.

c. Current instructions relative to accounting procedure are continued in force.

3. The Board of Trade (Boeki Cho) as agent for the Imperial Japanese Government shall be responsible for insuring that timely and adequate notice of intent to accept delivery is furnished United States Army and Navy commands who are responsible for delivery of petroleum products to the Imperial Japanese Government. The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs and - with reference to the latter's note verbale of 7th December, 1946, No. 44/L.J.S., regarding Japanese Prisoners of War reported remaining in British India - has the honour to inform the Imperial Ministry as follows.

The Swedish Mission agrees that the contents of its note verbale of 9th September, 1946, No. BB-299/46 - which was based upon a message from the Swedish Consulate General at Bombay, in charge of Japanese interests in the Indian Empire - is contradicted by the Press information of 16th November quoted by the Imperial Ministry. The Mission has brought this ambiguity to the notice of the Swedish Government requesting them, in conformity with the desire of the Imperial Ministry, to investigate the matter through the local Swedish Authorities and to furnish the fullest obtainable information by telegram as to the actual circumstances and regarding the other details suggested by the Imperial Ministry. The

reply of the Swedish Authorities will be forwarded to the Imperial Ministry, through the proper Allied intermediary, as soon as received.

The Mission ventures, on behalf of the Swedish Authorities concerned, to express their appreciation of the spirit in which the above note verbale of the Imperial Ministry was despatched. It is gratifying to know - as has been noticed on many occasions during this, now closing year - that the Imperial Authorities concerned are both closely following the activities of the Swedish Authorities, entrusted with the charge to safeguard Japanese interests in various countries, and also readily collaborating with the latter with a view to attain those results of the endeavours in this respect, desired equally highly by the Royal as by the Imperial Government. Having been given the privilege, by practice as of late, to act as the intermediary between the two Governments in this respect, the Mission ventures to avail itself of this occasion to express its hope not only that, in due course, it will be possible to extend this collaboration into other fields, but also that the activities of the Imperial Authorities in the now approaching year will prove fruitful for their Country.

SUBJECT: Financial Restrictions and Blocking of all Assets of Mr. Willy Rudolf Foerster, a German National.

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 140 (18 Apr 46) ESS/TF (SCAPIN 885), subject "Exempting accounts of deposit of certain individuals from the Terms of Emergency Measures Imperial Ordinance", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;

b. Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 150 (22 Sep 45) ESS (SCAPIN 45), subject "Control of Financial Transactions", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;

c. Report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, ZO TOKU GAI, No. 278, 12 November 1946, subject "REPORT OF PRESENT CONDITION OF THE PROPERTY OWNED BY MR. W. R. FOERSTER (GERMANY) AND THE CONCERNED", from the Ministry of Finance, Imperial Japanese Government.

2. The terms of reference 1a above are not applicable to Mr. W. R. Foerster, a German national, of Nagano-ken, Furumamura, Lakeside House.

3. The terms of reference 1b above are directly applicable and shall be strictly enforced in regard to:

a. All assets and property of Mr. Foerster, as reported in 1c above;

b. All assets of Magome Sangyo Goshi Kaisha as reported in 1c above;

c. Any other assets that may be found to exist in which Mr. Foerster has an interest.

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
