SUBJECT: Colors of the Malay Regiment

1. Reference is made to the following:

a. Memorandum to Central Liaison Office, file 332.2(7 Nov 46)  
CPC/FP, 27 November 1946, subject, "Colors of the Malay Regiment", from  
General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;

b. C.L.O. No. 6949(RP), 27 December 1946, same subject.

2. The following additional information is now available on the  
Colors of the Malay Regiment:

a. The Colors were packed in a cylindrical, airtight, tin map  
case container which had never been opened. They were handed to the  
Secretariat in Kuala Lumpur for safe keeping and it is known that they  
were placed in a vault at the Secretariat Building (Treasury);

b. The Color was of green silk. In the center, inside a wreath  
were "CROSSED KRISSES", surmounted by the motto "TA'AT SEPILAH" with "ASKA  
MELAYU" beneath, both in Arabic script. It is possible that there was an  
Oriental Crown above the motto. The Color was edged with a tasseling of  
yellow and red silk and the pole was surmounted by a tiger rampant;

c. Some time during the occupation of Malaya, the Japanese held  
a parade for the display of captured colors either in Kuala Lumpur or  
Singapore.

3. It is directed that the investigation be continued and that a  
further report be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian on the present  
location and condition of the said Colors by 15 February 1947.

3. It is further directed that the Imperial Japanese Government return all property on the attached list, and any additional movables which may be located and identified, to Mr. Stewart J. Teaze at 10-441, Aza Kamiyama Oaza Nojiri, Shinanojiri-mura, Kamiminochi-gun, Nagano Prefecture on 10 January 1947 at 1000 hours, under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan", and under the following conditions:

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow  
the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the  
restoration of the property to him. Where the restoree decides to ter-  
minate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary  
to provide him vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a state-  
ment as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Transfer of title will be made at the District Court having  
jurisdiction.

Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10)  
days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present condition and location of the library removed from the Eijkman Institute, Batavia, Netherlands East Indies, during the Japanese occupation of the Islands.

2. The library consisted of annual editions of the scientific periodical, "Chemisches Zentralblatt" from 1902-41, printed in the German language. The early editions of the periodicals were bound in two volumes per year and later editions in four volumes per year. Yearly registers were bound separately as were combined registers of five or ten years beginning with the period 1922-28. All the volumes of the periodical were bound in linen with marmor paper to the sides, the backs brown, red or black.

3. The early editions were stamped with an oval stamp, "Geneeskundig Laboratorium Weltevreden Bibliotheek". Later editions were marked with a hexagonal label, "Geneeskundig Laboratorium Oranje Boulevard, Kast en Plank, Volnummer, Tiendeelige Indeeling" and often stamped on the insides with an oblong stamp, "Boekerij Geneeskundig Laboratorium, Batavia C" and the date of receipt. There are also oblong labels, "Geneeskundig Laboratorium Weltevreden", whereas the newest volumes may be labelled and stamped "Eijkman Instituut Batavia C". Volume 1941 had not been bound and consisted of 52 loose numbers, all stamped.

SUBJECT: Registration of Motor Vehicles

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will register all motor vehicles and motor vehicle trailers which are in operation or use in Japan, irrespective of the nationality of the owners thereof, except those motor vehicles and trailers which are:

a. Operated by the Allied Occupation Forces, or by organizations and personnel attached to or accompanying the Allied Occupation Forces.

b. Owned and operated by duly accredited diplomatic representatives and members of their official families, who are accorded special privileges, including vehicles privately owned by such persons.

c. Owned by any of the United Nations and operated by representatives or agencies thereof who are in Japan on official business associated with the occupation.

d. Privately owned and operated by personnel on duty with, attached to or affiliated with the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and by their dependents.

2. Registration under this memorandum will conform with the following requirements:

a. Owners of motor vehicles and trailers will be directed and required to register them before they are operated or in any way used on the public roadway.

b. A provision of registration will be that satisfactory proof of legal ownership must be shown. Upon completion of registration, an owner's registration certificate will be issued.

c. All motor vehicles and trailers will be required to display license plates at all times when on the public roadway whether they are in operation or not.

d. A record of all registrations will be maintained in such a manner that the owner of any registered vehicle or trailer may be readily and promptly determined by information obtained from the vehicle license plates.

e. The owner's registration certificate, or other authorized evidence of registration and ownership, must accompany the motor vehicle or trailer at all times when it is moving upon the public roadway. Such owner's registration certificate, or authorized evidence thereof, will be required to be shown to any authorized person upon request.

f. All persons driving a motor vehicle will be issued, and must have in his possession at all times when driving, a license to drive. The license to drive will not be issued to any person who is not qualified because of physical defects, lack of skill, or other deficiencies which would disqualify him as a safe driver. The Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible that only qualified persons are permitted to drive motor vehicles which are subject to registration under this memorandum.

3. a. Violation of the provisions of this memorandum will be declared to be a penal offense under the Japanese law, and offenders hereof will be prosecuted to the full extent of the law, if subject to the jurisdiction of Japanese courts.

b. Violators of the provision of this memorandum who are not subject to the jurisdiction of Japanese Courts will be reported by representatives of the Imperial Japanese Government to occupation authorities.

a. Memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 370.05 (7 May 46)GC (SCAFIN 927), dated 7 May 1946, subject: "Repatriation", as amended.

b. Nominal rolls of German and Austrian nationals to be repatriated (Inclosure No. 1).

c. Medical and Sanitary Procedures (Inclosure No. 2).

d. Property Regulations and Procedures (Inclosure No. 3).

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will carry out instructions contained in this memorandum and inclosures thereto to effect the repatriation of persons listed in inclosure No. 1 as follows:

a. Appoint an English-speaking Japanese custodian for each family subject to repatriation and for each individual subject to repatriation but not a member of a family subject to repatriation. Custodians will be notified by officers in charge of Eighth United States Army inspecting teams when to move in and live on designated premises, at which time custodians will move in and assume custody of all property, movable and immovable. Custodians will guard and conserve property and process it in accordance with instructions contained in inclosure No. 3. The Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible for maintenance of custodians during the period they are on duty.

b. Furnish police guards to maintain surveillance over each residence until movement of repatriates to reception center is complete, in order to prevent removal of property.

c. Provide transportation for repatriates listed in inclosure No. 1 and baggage authorized to accompany them (See inclosure No. 3) from their present addresses to the reception center at Uraga, Kanagawa in accordance with the provisions of Annex III, reference 1a above. Transportation will be arranged so that the repatriates will arrive at the reception center in numbers and on dates as specified by the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

d. Subsist, maintain and provide adequate medical care for all repatriates during movement to and during their stay at the reception center. Initially, a minimum of two weeks supply of western style rations for each repatriate will be available at the reception center and additional amounts furnished as required.

3. Request for guards for the movement of repatriates should be made by local Japanese Government officials in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 5, Annex No. III, of reference 1a above. Local Allied military authorities have been directed to place guards aboard trains scheduled specifically to carry repatriates to the reception center only when, in the opinion of such authorities, the number of repatriates warrants such guards.

4. Transportation, processing and outloading of repatriates will, insofar as practicable, be governed by the provisions of reference 1a above.

5. The Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, has been authorized to exempt from repatriation those nationals who, upon examination by United States Army or Allied medical authorities, are considered physically unfit to travel. Immediately upon notification of repatriation, each repatriate will be informed of this, and if unfit for travel will be directed to report to the nearest military government unit for physical examination. In the event that any member of a family is exempted due to physical or mental infirmities, all members of that immediate family, including mother, father, dependent children and other dependents will be exempted also.

6. The Imperial Japanese Government will carry out the instructions contained in this memorandum and inclosures thereto under the supervision and administrative direction of the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army. A liaison agent from the Central Liaison Office will be designated to report to the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, upon receipt of this memorandum to effect direct liaison between the Imperial Japanese Government and the Eighth United States Army until the completion of repatriation of the foreign nationals listed in Inclosure No. 1.

7. Upon completion of this repatriation, the Imperial Japanese Government will report immediately to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers the names of all persons repatriated and persons whose names appear in Inclosure No. 1 but who were not repatriated, with reasons therefor in each case.
