MEDICAL AND SANITARY PROCEDURES

1. The Welfare Ministry will carry out the following medical and sanitary procedures as minimum requirements incidental to subject repatriation:
 - a. Physical inspections for detection of louse infestation, and of cases and suspects of quarantinable diseases (cholera, plague, smallpox, louse-borne typhus, yellow fever) or of communicable diseases which might prejudice the health of subsequent contacts will be made at each repatriate's home before repatriation commences. If it is determined that a repatriate should not depart due to disease or infirmity, this fact will be reported to the Eighth United States Army inspection team immediately, and the repatriate will be given a physical inspection by an Allied medical officer. Those excused from repatriation will be reported immediately to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
 - b. Hospitalization or other effective segregation of persons known or suspected to be infected with quarantinable or significant communicable diseases, until communicability has passed. These persons will not be moved to the reception center until communicability has passed.
 - c. Appropriate measures for continued observation of persons known to have had contact with a quarantinable disease of a type liable to convey infection. Observation will continue during the incubation period of the disease concerned, calculated from the day of last contact. The following incubation periods will be observed: smallpox - 14 days, louse-borne typhus - 12 days, plague - 6 days, cholera - 6 days, and yellow fever - 6 days.
 - d. Immunizations to be given at reception center.
 - (1) All repatriates will be vaccinated against smallpox.
 - (2) Typhus vaccine will be administered to all repatriates not vaccinated within the previous four months.
 - (3) Only the initial dose of a multi-dose vaccine need be administered at the reception center if the flow of repatriates would otherwise be impeded.
 - (4) Vaccine necessary for medical processing will be furnished by the Eighth United States Army.

e. Physical inspection during daylight hours, except in exceptional circumstances in which the flow of repatriates would otherwise be impeded.

f. Attachment to the passenger manifest of a blanket certificate to the effect that all required procedures have been accomplished.

g. Maintenance of records required to comply with international quarantine procedure.

PROPERTY REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will carry out the following procedures in processing the property of repatriates listed in Inclosure No. 1 of the basic memorandum:

a. General. When the Eighth United States Army inspection team representative directs, the Japanese custodian will take over all property, both movable and immovable, in excess of that to accompany the repatriate to the port as indicated in c, d and e below, and the custodian will guard and conserve this property and process it in accordance with instructions herewith. Prior to the departure of the repatriates, the custodian will be on duty at the premises during daylight hours. While not necessary that the custodian live on the premises during this period, he will be available to inventory all property and will be in position during daylight hours to prevent removal of property from the premises. When directed by the Eighth United States Army inspection team, after departure of the repatriates, the custodian will move in and live on the premises at all times as long as any property, movable or immovable, remains in his custody.

b. Definition of Property. With the exception of those items specifically exempted in paragraph c, d and e below, and in accordance with maximum baggage limits, the term "property" as used in this letter shall include all movable and immovable property and all rights and interests in or claims to such property whether matured or not, including all property, rights, or trustees and all property, rights, interests or claims transferred by way of gifts or otherwise or for consideration, express or implied, but not including the rights or interests of third parties to a bona fide sale for full consideration, and shall include but shall not be limited to buildings and lands, goods, wares and merchandise, chattels, coin, bullion, currency, deposits, accounts, or debts, shares, claims, bills of lading, warehouse receipts, all kinds of financial instruments whether expressed in Reichs Marks or in any foreign currency, evidences of ownership of property, contracts, judgments, rights in or with respect to patents, copyrights, trademarks, etc., and in general property of any nature whatsoever.

c. Property Which May Be Taken.

(1) Those nationals being repatriated will be allowed to take with them only currencies of a value not exceeding \$50.00 (United States) or its equivalent in other monies.

and 350 pounds (159 Kg.) of personal effects per person, not to exceed 1500 pounds (682 Kg.) per family. The following financial instruments are exempted from seizure: personal bank books, personal insurance policies, non-negotiable savings certificates, receipts, or any other non-negotiable documents.

- (2) Each repatriate will be allowed to withdraw from his or her bank account during the month in which the repatriation takes place, the sum of ¥750 in addition to any sums withdrawn for living expenses. In case of a family where the bank account is in the name of the family head, the withdrawal will be on the basis of ¥750 per person.
- (3) Each repatriate will be advised that regulations in effect in the United States, United Kingdom and French zones of Germany require surrender of all foreign exchange upon debarkation, equivalent to be given in marks at military conversion rate. The current conversion rate is 10 marks to one United States dollar.

d. Personal Effects. Personal effects will not be seized for custody, except those in excess of maximum baggage limits and limits as set forth in paragraph e below.

e. Prohibited Items. Those nationals being repatriated will be prohibited from taking with them the following articles:

- (1) Watches in excess of two watches per adult, or four watches per family.
- (2) Cameras in excess of one camera, including moving picture types, per adult, or three cameras per family.
- (3) Necklaces and bracelets in excess of two necklaces and two bracelets per adult regardless of the value.
- (4) Rings, precious stones, bullion and all other jewelry except that which has sacred or marital significance.
- (5) Firearms, ammunition or weapons of any sort.

f. Inventory of Property.

- (1) The owner and custodian will together inventory all property which is to be stored. Prior to inventory, property will be divided into two categories as follows:
 - (a) Small items of high intrinsic value such as cash, bullion, bills of lading, warehouse receipts, financial instruments, evidences of property ownership,

contracts, judgments, rights in or with respect to patents, copyrights, trademarks, jewels and jewelry in excess of that which may be taken, and similar items, the safekeeping of which require bank-vault storage.

- (b) All other movable property, except that which will accompany the repatriate, and all immovable property.
- (2) Each category of property will be inventoried separately. Five copies will be made of each list in English, typed or in ink, and each copy will be signed by the owner and by the custodian.
- (3) One copy of each inventory will be retained by the owner as his record and receipt. Disposition of the other copies will be as provided in paragraphs (a) 1 and 2 below. The custodian will supervise and protect all property left when the repatriate departs.

(a) Property Inventory

1 Five signed copies of inventories of each category of property will be made. Disposition of these copies will be as follows:

- a One signed copy to be given the repatriate.
- b One signed copy, receipted by the Eighth United States Army custodian to whom the property is turned over, will be retained by the Japanese custodian.
- c Three signed copies to be turned in with the property. Of these, one receipted copy will be dispatched immediately to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Att: Civil Property Custodian. The remaining two will be used for future property transfers.

2 The inspecting team, before departure of the repatriates, will physically check all inventory records upon completion, verify their accuracy and proper signature thereon by both parties, and check in the proper column all immovable property items and all movable items which the inspection team decides should be left on the premises rather than moved to warehouses.

g. Inventory Lists of Movable and Immovable Property. The inventory lists of movable and immovable property, in excess of baggage allowance, will contain the following information:

- (1) Name of Owner.
- (2) Address of Owner. (Address in Japan)
(Address in home country, if known)
- (3) Each box, trunk and crate and all unpacked articles will be tagged and numbered consecutively, and the inventory will contain a list of all items by number and description. Boxes and trunks will contain one package inventory inside the container and one package inventory permanently attached to the outside thereof. One key for each of any locked containers will be placed in a sealed envelope and wired to the container. All copies of the inventory of each container will be signed by the repatriate and the custodian.
- (4) Address at which property is located.
- (5) Name and address of custodian.

h. Packing and Crating of Property. The Imperial Japanese Government will be required to furnish packing boxes, crating material and personnel to prepare furniture, household property and other items left behind for storage upon departure of repatriates, and for crating of such personal property within the prescribed allowances to accompany the repatriate. In addition, arrangements will be made by the Imperial Japanese Government to weigh all baggage accompanying repatriates, before departure from their homes, to insure that prescribed allowances are not exceeded.

i. Disposition of Property Taken into Custody.

- (1) Small items of high intrinsic value. Immediately upon inventory and proper packing, small items of high intrinsic value, noted in paragraph f(1) (a) above, will be delivered to the inspection team representative of the Eighth United States Army who will receipt for and be responsible for delivery to the vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo, or Osaka Mint, Osaka.
- (2) The Imperial Japanese Government will arrange for working teams to crate, pack and deliver to the nearest collecting point, noted in paragraph j below, all other movable property of sufficient value to justify moving. Crating and packing will begin immediately after inspection of property by the Eighth United States Army inspecting team, who will be informed when the crating and packing has been completed and the property is ready for shipment to a collecting point.

- (3) The Imperial Japanese Government will guard all immovable property and all items stored therein pending further orders from the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

j. Collecting Points. Collecting points at which property will be turned in will be established by the Eighth United States Army at Uruga, Kagohara and in the Kobe-Osaka area, in addition to warehouses in Tokyo.

k. Property of Japanese Wives. The processing of property of Japanese wives who elect to remain in Japan instead of accompanying their husbands, will be as follows:

- (1) Japanese wife remaining in Japan may retain:
 - (a) Personal or real property which she can prove was acquired prior to marriage.
 - (b) Family movable property in the weight specified for repatriates to take with them.
- (2) Japanese wife will not be allowed to retain:
 - (a) Watches in excess of two.
 - (b) Necklaces and bracelets in excess of two.
 - (c) Rings, precious stones, bullion or other jewelry except that which has a sacred or marital significance.
 - (d) Firearms, ammunition or weapons of any sort.
- (3) All immovable property in which there is a German or Austrian interest will be taken into custody.

1. Attention is invited to the Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 15C (22 Sep 45)ESS, (SCAPIL 45) dated 22 September 1945, and Appendix A attached thereto. In addition, all sales, gifts or transfers of any kind of movable or immovable property by foreign nationals to be repatriated in accordance with these instructions is prohibited.

TRUMAN: URGES UNIVERSAL TRAINING

LAST 6, President Truman told Congress today that the development of a trained citizen reserved force is vital to our national security. He said this can be best accomplished through universal training. The draft may have to be continued, said Mr. Truman.

He spoke before a joint session of Congress, delivering the annual message on the State of the Union.

URGES UNIFICATION OF ARMED FORCES The President again urged unification of the armed forces. "There is one certain way," said Mr. Truman, "by which we can cut military costs and at the same time enhance our national security. That is by the establishment of a single department of national defense."

OPPOSES ADDITIONAL VETERAN BONUSES PLAN The plan for additional bonuses for veterans was opposed by the President. He said that for except minor adjustments, he believed the nation's program for veteran benefits is now complete. Mr. Truman revealed that exclusive of mustering-out pay and terminal leave pay, the Nation's program for veterans of all wars is consuming more than seven billion dollars annually, or one-fifth of the total federal budget.

ADVOCATES COMPULSORY ARBITRATION IN STRIKES The President stated his policy in a number of other major issues. In labor matters, he asked Congress to impose compulsory arbitration against unjustified strikes, and he urged that the nation be protected against restricted business monopolies.

REJECTS PERSONAL INCOME TAX REDUCTIONS Republican proposals for personal income tax reductions this year were rejected by the President, and not only did he oppose income tax cuts, but he further challenged Republican intentions by asking Congress to immediately extend beyond June 30th the billion and a half dollars of wartime excise taxes which would expire at that time under his recent proclamation ending the state of hostilities. Republican leaders are planning on the contrary to pass a bill ending those taxes this month.

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to furnish to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attention: General Accounting Section, the following information pertaining to surrendered military installations released to Imperial Japanese Government.

a. The name, location, and yen value of each installation released to Imperial Japanese Government up to and through 31 January 1947. Properties will be evaluated upon the price level prevailing in August 1945.

b. For all subject installations released after 31 January, the Ministry of Finance, Bureau of State Property, will receive from Commanding General, Eighth Army or Commander of Naval Activities for Japan, General Accounting Section Forms Number 1, as amended, pertaining to surrendered military installations released to Imperial Japanese Government. The Ministry of Finance, Bureau of State Property, will insert the yen value of the installation as of August 1945 in the column "estimated value in yen", and return these forms to the Commanding General, Eighth Army, Attention: Military Government Section, or Commander of Naval Activities for Japan.

2. Direct communication is authorized between General Accounting Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and Eighth Army, and between General Accounting Section and Commander of Naval Activities for Japan, and also between General Accounting Section and Ministry of Finance, Bureau of State Property, Imperial Japanese Government, to implement the provisions of this memorandum.

1. Reference is made to paragraph four SCAPIN 1802-A, dated 23 July 1946, which is as follows: "4. The conditioning houses will arrange to re-test, visually and mechanically, all raw silk that is held by weavers, knitters, and other manufacturers. Priority will be given to the testing of newly reeled silk." This paragraph is hereby rescinded.

2. Reference is made to SCAPIN 878, dated 14 April 1946, subject: "Raw Silk of Exportable Grades in Possession of Weavers and Manufacturers". This directive is hereby rescinded.

3. It is directed that the following stocks and future production of raw silk be released in accordance with instructions contained herein:

- a. All raw silk and raw silk in the process of weaving and knitting, in the possession of weavers, knitters, and other manufacturers.
- b. All raw silk of "F" Grade and below.
- c. All damaged raw silk and raw silk with bad winding that is not exportable.
- d. All grades of 28 denier raw silk.
- e. All raw silk "out of size" 13/15 and 20/22.
- f. All raw silk 42 denier and coarser.
- g. All coupions and hand reeled silk of all grades and deniers.
- h. All raw silk in open bales in the possession of control agencies and silk companies and/or in skein or book form.
- i. All single filament raw silk, also known as "Woolen Silk".

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BASIC: Memo from SCAP to the I.J.G., File No. 423(14 Jan 47)ESS/TD,
subject: "Release of Raw Silk"

4. Such raw silk is to be released to an authorized agency, designated by the Imperial Japanese Government. This agency will allocate the available raw silk supply to the weavers, knitters, and other manufacturers for processing into end items.

5. This government designated agency will be responsible for the production of end items manufactured from released raw silk. On completion of manufacture, this agency will also be responsible for and control distribution, in accordance with plans approved by or directives issued by the Price Control and Rationing Division of the Economic and Scientific Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

6. All products manufactured from the released raw silk will be distributed pursuant to the Japanese Government rationing system, and will be sold at no higher than Japanese Government official ceiling prices. The agency designated by the Imperial Japanese Government to distribute the raw silk and allocate the end products will maintain such checks as to insure the accounting for by manufacturers of all raw silk received for manufacture, and all end products produced.

7. Direct communication between the Textile Bureau, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, and General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section, Textile Division, is authorized to implement the provisions of this memorandum.

2. The scientific material was excavated in 1939 by a group of scientists headed by Kung-che Chen on sixteen islands in the vicinity of Hongkong. The cases contained a large quantity of prehistoric stone and earthenware of which four photographs are inclosed.
3. The Home Ministry has reported that there are five boxes of "Materials for Scientific research" described as "fragments" stored in the Looted Property Warehouse, Kyoto Museum, Higashiyama Hichijo, Kyoto. It is directed that an investigation be made of the origin of this material and that a search be made of other institutions in Japan to which this scientific material might have been sent.

1. Program transmission service between Tokyo and San Francisco, for the purpose of transmitting commercial radio programs from Tokyo to radio broadcasting networks in the United States, is authorized and will be provided under the following conditions:

- a. Radiotelephone circuits between Tokyo and the San Francisco terminals of the American Telephone and Telegraph Co., Press Wireless, Inc. and RCA Communications, Inc. are authorized to handle program transmission service.
- b. The rates and division of revenue for program transmission service from Tokyo to San Francisco, covering service at both terminals and including reception at Tokyo of radiotelephone control signals in connection therewith, are as follows:

- (1) Initial period of 10 minutes or less -----\$40
- (2) Overtime period (time in excess of initial 10-minute period), per minute or fraction thereof -----\$4
- (3) The minimum period charge will apply for schedules cancelled less than one hour prior to pre-arranged schedule time.
- (4) Program transmission service charges will be divided equally between the Ministry of Communications and the United States carrier.

c. All charges for the service will be collected in the United States. The Ministry's share of the revenue collected will be deposited in the United States Treasury Trust Fund Receipt Account, "Deposits, Proceeds of Remittance to and Exports from Occupied Territories, Japan."

d. e. At the conclusion of each PTS schedule the American carrier will be asked to report the chargeable time for accounting purposes.

g. A representative of the Eighth Army will supervise all personnel, and the operation of all facilities, utilized in providing program transmission service, and will establish necessary operating procedures to insure maximum efficiency of operation.

from various Government cash offices in Java and concentrated in the
vaults of the Java Bank, Batavia, then occupied by the Nanpo Kaihatsu
Kinko. According to a statement by R. Harada, manager of Java Branch of
the Nanpo Bank, on 13 September 1943, the amount in question, F. 493,030,
was charged to the account of the Bank of Japan on the books of the Nanpo
Kaihatsu Kinko in a check issued by Major S. Sasaki, intendant officer in
charge of "Osamu" 1602 Unit Intendant Department.

3. 1st Lt. M. Takeda, attached to the 16th Army Ordnance Depot has
stated that from September 1943 to the middle of 1944, the 16th Army
Ordnance Depot shipped 1,000 to 1,100 packages of copper coins from
Batavia in four separate lots, all presumably consigned to the Osaka Army
Arsenal. These coins were received from two sources, the Nanpo Kaihatsu
Kinko and a jail in Bandoeng. The coins from the Nanpo Bank were packed
in iron drums and wooden cases and the coins from the Bandoeng jail in
wooden cases of various sizes.

2. It is apparent that provisions of reference 1a above are not being adequately enforced and that the desired results are not being obtained.

3. Paragraph 5 of reference 1b above directed the Imperial Japanese Government to establish a program for rationing of petroleum products to individual consumers.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval by 3 February 1947 a plan for rationing of petroleum products to individual consumers. This plan will contain, as a minimum requirement, necessary restrictions and controls to insure that consumption for non-essential purposes is eliminated. Generally, all petroleum products consumption not required in the production of necessary commodities, transaction of essential business, or essential employment in the public transportation system, is to be considered as non-essential.

5. The conversion of vehicles which consume substitute fuels to operation by gasoline will not be permitted.
