Item 7.A. Dinitrotoluen	35,000 kg	For dyestuffs only;
B. Thionyl Chloride	2,000 kg	For medicine only;
C. Benzyl Ether	2,000 kg	For medicine only;
D. Benzyl Alcohol	1,000 kg	For medicine only;
E. Zinc Oxide	65,000 kg	For paint only;
F. Iron dust	23,000 kg	For catalyst for hydrogen production.

- 3. Items designated for use in medicines will be released for distribution by the Ministry of Public Welfare.
- 4. Transactions will be subject to existing price control and currency regulations.
- 5. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to submit, within thirty (30) days from the date of this memorandum, a report showing the quantities of each material released, the name of the firm to which released, and the purpose for which each item is to be used.

SUBJECT: Permission to Sell Bauxite Found Aboard the SS "Admiral Y.S. Williams".

- 1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 386.7(26 Dec 46)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 2883-A, 26 December 1946, subject: Bauxite Found on the SS "Admiral Y.S. Williams", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- 2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to sell the bauxite, approximately 1000 tons, found on board the SS "Admiral Y.S. Williams", which is now in protective custody of the Imperial Japanese Government in accordance with paragraph 1 above. A fair price is to be established for the property by the Price Board, Imperial Japanese Government, and equitable distribution is to be made among all producers.
- 3. Proceeds from the above sales will be deposited in the Bank of Japan in the "Custody Account for the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers".
- 4. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will be notified as soon as the action directed in paragraph 2 and 3 above has been taken and will be furnished with complete statements of receipts from the sale and of the funds deposited in the Bank of Japan.

SUBJECT: Shipment of Cross Ties to Korea

1. It is directed that immediate action be taken to ship 100,000 pieces 6" x 9" x 8' Cross Ties to Korea, as follows:

- 50,000 pieces By end of January
- 25,000 pieces By end of February
- 25,000 pieces By end of March

2. Immediate action will be taken to divert to Korea approximately 10,000 koku Cross Ties to be loaded on the Hosojima Maru at Wakamatsu Port, ETD 29 January 1947. This shipment will constitute a part of the total shipment.

3. Shipments will be consigned to Supply Officer, Civilian Emergency Supply Program, United States Army Military Government in Korea, Department of Transportation, Pusan, Korea, Schedule No. 2B6173.

4. Submission of necessary shipping documents for these shipments to Korea will be handled in the same manner as lumber shipments to China.

5. This memorandum as it refers to the Hosojima Maru only, supersedes Memorandum for the Board of Trade (boeki Cho), Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Tokyo, File All.1 (30 Dec 46) ESS/FT, (DT-220), 20 December 1946, subject: Lining Timbers to China.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to transmit herewith a list, received from the Swedish Vice-Consulate at Honolulu, Territory of Hawaii, containing the names of Japanese prisoners of war who embarked at the port of Honolulu, Hawaii, on 14th November, 1946, for repatriation, with Uraga, Japan, as the port of debarkation.

The contingent numbered 1694 of whom 1122 were classified as Japanese and 572 as Okinawans. All but 19 were in good health. Of those in the "sick bay", 17 were ambulatory and only 2 were brought aboard on litters.

The Swedish Vice-Consulate further indicates that the remaining prisoners of war in Hawaii were to be repatriated about the 15th December, 1946, the number of them being about the same as the contingent which left on the 14th November, 1946.

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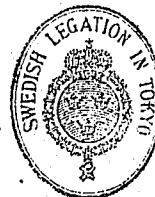

Provide ambulance service for those persons who are physically incapacitated to such an extent that they would otherwise be unable to travel from their place of residence to the proper railroad station. Verbal instructions will be issued to a representative of the Central Liaison Office concerning specific cases for which such ambulance service is desired.
  - b. Medically examine and inoculate all Netherlands East Indies Nationals reporting for repatriation and process their baggage and personal belongings in accordance with instructions contained in memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 above.
5. In the event that additional Netherlands East Indies Nationals desire repatriation in the future, this memorandum, supplemented by appropriate verbal instructions to a representative of the Central Liaison Office, will constitute authority for their movement, processing and repatriation.
