The appointed custodian of the documents will present his credentials and clearance certificate from the port of embarkation to the proper authority at the port of debarkation for final clearance to transfer these documents to the control of the Imperial Japanese Government. The provisions of paragraph 2g (1) above are not to be construed as a matter of policy and do not abrogate the prerogative of the local Allied commander to retain in his area such documents as he considers necessary.
- 3. In processing Korean, Chinese, or Formosan nationals, or Ryukywans being repatriated from Japan to their respective homelands, the Imperial Japanese Government will:
- a. Permit them to take with them yen currency in an amount not to exceed \$1000 per person.
- b. Permit Koreans. Chinese and Ryukyuans to take with them in addition to currency:
 - (1) Postal savings pass books and bank pass books issued by financial institutions in Japan and in the country to which they are being repatriated.

- 1. Reference is made to SCAP Memorandum file number AG 441.1 (12 Oct 45)PH, subject: "Control of Narcotic Products and Records in Japan" and to C.L.O. #6206 (EA), 22 November 1946, subject: "Application to Cultivate 'Taima' in Japan.
- 2. The above referenced memorandum is modified insofar as Marihuana (Cannabis Sativa L.) is concerned until 1 December 1947.
- 3. The Imperial Japanese Government will promulgate regulations in accordance with the following provisions.
- a. The possession, planting, cultivation or growing of Marihuana is prohibited to any person except as licensed and registered by the Imperial Japanese Government, and no more than a total area of 5,000 hectares for such production will be authorized and will be limited to the following prefectures: Aomori, Iwate, Fukushima, Tochigi, Gumma, Niigata, Nagano, Shimane, Hiroshima, Kumamoto, Cita and Miyazaki.
- b. Import, manufacture, compounding, selling, dealing in, dispensing, prescribing, administering or giving away Marihuana shall be prohibited, except that transfer of seeds and plants between registered persons may be made upon preparation of suitable forms as authorized by the Imperial Japanese Government.
- c. Records of all production and transactions including the number of plots or fields and their total area and of all Marihuana under cultivation at the beginning of the period, planted or brought under cultivation during the period, harvested or otherwise disposed of during the period, and under cultivation at the close of the period shall be maintained by each producer and reported to the Imperial Japanese Government.
- d. Froducers will ret the entire crop in the field where grown, removing only the matured hemp stalks and no other part of the plant from

the field; except that seeds and plants may be removed if accounted for as authorized by the Imperial Japanese Government.

- e. Records of quantities of such matured stalks gathered and the total fiber yield will be maintained by each producer and reported to the Imperial Japanese Government.
- 4. Provisions will be made for necessary funds and personnel as required by the Narcotic Division, Manistry of Welfare, and Narcotic Officials, Prefectural Governments, for the enforcement of the regulations, and maintaining and forwarding required records.
- 5. The definition of Marihuana as given in the referenced memorandum is amended to read as follows: The term Marihuana means all parts of the plant Cannabis Sativa L. whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of such plant; and every compound, mnufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such plant, its seeds, or resins; but shall not include the mature stalks of such plant, fiber produced from such stalks, oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture, or preparation of such mature stalks (except the resin extracted therefrom), fiber, oil, or cake, or the sterilized seed of such plant which is incapable of germination.
- 6. Severe penalties will be provided for any person who violates the provisions of the enactment.
- 7. Summarized monthly reports of Marihuana control will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, attention, Narcotic Control Branch, Supply Division, Public Health and Welfare Section, by the Imperial Japanese Government by the end of each month following the month for which the report is made. These reports shall include the following:
 - a. Number of registrants, by prefecture.
- b. Number of hectares under hemp cultivation showing number of plots or fields, by prefecture.
 - c. Quantities of matured stalks gathered, by prefecture.
 - d. Total hemp fiber yield, by prefecture.
- $\ensuremath{\text{e.}}$ Number and amount of transactions in marihuana seeds and plants, by prefecture.

SCAP memoranda to the Imperial Japanese Government AG 710 (21 Nov 45) PH (SCAPIN 331) dated 21 November 1945, subject: Trevention and Control of Typhus Fever in Japan; and AG 710 (29 Nov 45) PH, (SCAPIN 368) dated 29 November 1945, subject: Prevention and Control of Typhus Fever in Japan, are hereby rescinded and the following memorandum substituted in place thereof.

- 2. Due to the continued threat of typhus fever-epidemic (louse-borne) and murine (flea-borne)-in Japan, it is desired that the responsible Japanese agency institute the following measures for the prevention and control of typhus fever in Japan:
- a. Adequate control measures (including rodent control) against typhus fever in cities, towns, villages and areas where cases of typhus fever occur.
- b. Routine disinfestation with insecticide powder, louse, of all civilians crossing the straits of Tsugaru from Hokkaido to Honshu, and from Honshu to Hokkaido.
- c. Routine disinfestation and immunization of all foreign repatriates embarking from Japanese ports to their homeland.
- d. Routine disinfestation and immunization of all repatriate Japanese nationals debarking at Japanese ports as covered by memorandum of 5 November 1946 for the Imperial Japanese Government, subject: "Repatriation" (Reference: AG 014.33 (5 Nov 46)GC (SCAPIN 927/10) dated 5 November 1946.)
- e. Routine disinfestation of railway coaches, railway stations, public conveyances, theaters, etc., as contained in the memorandum of 13 December 1946, subject: "Rickettsicidal (Typhus Control) Spray Program" (Reference PHMJG-3 dated 13 December 1946).

BASIC: Memo to Imperial Japanese Govt., file AG 710. (1276) PH dtd12 February 1947, subject: "Prevention and Control of Typhus Fever in Japan".

- f. Disinfestation by use of Insecticide, spray, DDT residual effect at 30 day intervals:
 - (1) All railway cars assigned for use of all United Nations nationals, military and civilian, including dependents.
 - (2) All ferries operating between Aomori and Hakodate assigned for use by all United Nations nationals, military and civilian, including dependents.
 - (3) Such other public conveyances that may be assigned for use of all United Nations nationals, military and civilian, including dependents.

(After each disinfestation, all conveyances will be plainly and uniformly marked as directed by the military command concerned to show date and place of treatment.)

g. Imperial Japanese Government is responsible for providing necessary supplies, equipment and funds required for typhus control operations.

h. Japanese civilian personnel will be provided by the Japanese agency concerned to carry out required typhus control procedures.

- 2. In order to complete the repatriation of non-Japanese nationals still in Japan, who are eligible for and desirous of repatriation, and to effect the onward shipment of non-Japanese nationals who are being repatriated via Japan, the following procedures will be followed:
- a. Hyukyuans, Chinese, Formouses and Koreans destined for Korea south of 38° North Latitude, now in Japan and who are eligible for repatri-/ ation, will be assembled at Sasebo Reception Center, processed for ship- 12 ment, and held in the Sasebo Reception Center pending shipping instructions.
- b. Repatriates arriving Japan for onward shipment will be received, cared for, assembled at Sasebo Reception Center, processed for shipment and held in Sasebo Reception Center pending arrangements for onward shipping.
 - c. Repatriates will be embarked on shipping as designated.
- 5. In view of the fact that outgoing repatriates will often be in small groups, it will be necessary to utilize shipping other than that regularly assigned to repatriation service. In such cases the Imperial Japanese Government will provision the ships to accommodate the repatriates to be embarked in the same manner as prescribed for regular repatriation shipping.
- 4. Upon notification that repatriates are to be outloaded on other than repatriation chipping, the Imperial Japanese Government will:
 - a. Provision the ships in accordance with above instructions.
- b. Move the repatriates from Sasebo Reception Center to the port from which the ship is acheduled to depart, coordinating the movement so that repatriates will be in the port of departure a minimum length of time.
- c. Instruct the masters of the ships in the procedures to be followed in receiving repatriates, care of repatriates while aboard ship, anddelivery to appropriate authorities at the port of detarkation.

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 091.31 (19 Jan 46)ESS/FI (SCAPIN - 622) dated 19 January 1946, subject: "Supplemental Instructions Relating to Export Control".

b. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 014.33 (9 Jan 47) GA (SCAPIN - 1450) dated 9 January 1947, subject: "Closing of Uraga Reception Center".

- 2. The Italian nationals listed on attached nominal rolls desire to be repatriated on the Italian Motorship SESTRIERE, now expected to arrive at Uraga on 25 February 1947.
 - 3. The Imperial Japanese Government will:
- a. Postpone the closing of the Uraga Reception Center until completion of repatriation of the Italians aboard the SESTRIERE.
- b. Make the necessary arrangements for and provide suitable transportation to the Italian nationals from their homes to Uraga Reception Center. Recessary measures must be taken to insure that the transportation provided for the Italian nationals arrives at Uraga Reception Center early enough on the day scheduled for embarkation to facilitate compliance with paragraphics 3d below.
- c. Acdically examine and inoculate the Italian nationals upon arrival at Uraga Reception Center and process their belongings in accordance with the instructions contained in reference la above.
- d_{\bullet} Embark Italian nationals on the SESTRIERE on the same day of their arrival at Uraga Reception Center.
- 4. The Experial Japanese Government will be notified through the appropriate representative of Central Liaison Office of any
