SUBJECT: Repatriation of Italian Nationals

1. Reference is made to:

a. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 091.31 (19 Jan 46)ESS/FI (SCAPIN 622) dated 19 January 1946, subject: Supplemental Instructions Relating to Export Control.

b. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, AG 014.33 (9 Jan 47)GA (SCAPIN 1450) dated 9 January 1947, subject: Closing of Uraga Reception Center.

2. The Italian nationals listed on attached nominal rolls desire to be repatriated on the Italian Motorship SESTRIERE, now expected to arrive at Uraga on 25 February 1947.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Postpone the closing of the Uraga Reception Center until completion of repatriation of the Italians aboard the SESTRIERE.

b. Make the necessary arrangements for and provide suitable transportation to the Italian nationals from their homes to Uraga Reception Center. Necessary measures must be taken to insure that the transportation provided for the Italian nationals arrives at Uraga Reception Center early enough on the day scheduled for embarkation to facilitate compliance with paragraph 3d below.

c. Medically examine and inoculate the Italian nationals upon arrival at Uraga Reception Center and process their belongings in accordance with the instructions contained in reference 1a above.

d. Embark Italian nationals on the SESTRIERE on the same day of their arrival at Uraga Reception Center.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will be notified through the appropriate representative of Central Liaison Office of any

SUBJECT: Regulations Affecting International Telecommunications Company, Ltd, (Kokusai Denki Tsushin K. K.), and Subsidiaries

1. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to take immediate action to prohibit the International Telecommunications Company, Ltd, and the following subsidiaries, from making any sale, transfer or other disposition of any capital assets, including land, buildings, major items of equipment and securities, except as otherwise authorized by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

- Japan Telephone and Telegraph Construction Company, Ltd (Nippon Denshin Denwa Koji K. K.)
- Japan Submarine Cable Company, Ltd (Nippon Kaitei Densen K. K.)
- Japan Telephone Equipment Company, Ltd (Nippon Denwa Setsubi K. K.)
- Ships Wireless Telegraph and Telephone Company, Ltd (Sempaku Musen Denshin Denwa K. K.)
- Communications Construction Industries Company, Ltd (Tsushin Kensetsu Kogyo K. K.)

2. The Imperial Japanese Government shall submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, within fifteen (15) days from the date of this memorandum, the following information concerning the International Telecommunications Company, Ltd, and its subsidiary companies:

- a. All movable and immovable assets showing locations.
- b. Outstanding loans and liabilities.
- c. All securities and investments.
- d. Contracts and leases of properties and equipment.
- e. Estimated borrowings needed for ordinary business purposes for the next thirty (30) days.

3. It is further directed that the Imperial Japanese  
Government return all property on the attached list, and  
any additional movables which may be located and identified,  
to Nippon Seikokai S. P. G. Kyoshi Shadan at 4/234 Yamate-cho,  
Naka-ku, Yokohama on 24 March 1947 at 1000 hours, under con-  
ditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution to United  
Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan,"  
and under the following conditions:

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese  
Government on the management of the property from 7 Decem-  
ber 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include  
statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to  
each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to  
seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the  
option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to  
terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property  
to him. Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease,  
the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to  
provide him vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will  
contain a statement as to the condition of the property at  
the time of restoration;

d. Cash and deposits covered by the receipt will  
be broken down into:

- (1) Net proceeds from sale of property (if  
none, so state),
- (2) Net proceeds from other transactions (if  
none, so state),
- (3) Other (if none, so state).

e. Transfer of title will be made at the District  
Court having jurisdiction.

4. SUBJECT: Teak removed from Hong Kong.

1. Reference is made to the following:
  - a. Memorandum to the Central Liaison Office, file 411.1 (3 Dec 46) C/C/FP, 3 December 1946, subject: Teak Consigned to White Bros., San Francisco, Removed from Hong Kong, from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;
  - b. C.L.O. No. 6668(RP), 15 December 1946, same subject;
  - c. C.L.O. No. 762(RP), 7 February 1947, same subject.
2. With reference to paragraph 3 of 1c above stating that former high officials of the 23rd Army and the Military Government of Hong Kong were questioned regarding the disposition of subject consignment of teak removed from Hong Kong, the Central Liaison Office is directed to make further investigation as to the disposition of the property through individuals whose work would have given them direct knowledge of the subject property.
3. Attention is drawn to the fact that investigations which are confined to former high officials only, do not usually bring satisfactory results for it is unlikely, except in situations where these persons are specifically named as having had knowledge of the property, that the disposition of individual items would have come to their notice. It is believed that more satisfactory results can be obtained in most cases by questioning individuals in lower echelons whose work gave them direct contact with the property being investigated.

b. By 1 March 1947, have the Hakata Reception Center on an active status, prepared to process 1,500 incoming repatriates per day.

c. Report to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 5 March 1947, on the accomplishment of this directive.

c. Direct Japanese guards to accept custody at Pusan, Korea, of the 5 Formosan deportees and insure their delivery to proper authorities at the Sasebo Reception Center.

d. Receive and process Japanese being repatriated from Korea in accordance with the provisions of reference paragraph 1 a above.



1. Reference is made to Memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 370.05 (23 Feb 46)GA, (SCAFIN - 769) dated 23 February 1946, subject "Repatriation of German Nationals and Nationals who Claim Austrian or Czechoslovakian Citizenship Now in Japan".

2. Legitimate bearers of these registration certificates will be presumptively considered as Chinese subjects and hence United Nations Nationals for purposes of the exercise of criminal jurisdiction by the Japanese authorities.

2. It is directed that the Imperial Japanese Government conduct a survey and furnish to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, not later than 10 March 1947, nominal rolls of all German and Austrian nationals in Japan, in the form indicated on the attached sheets.

These reports will indicate which of the properties have been licensed for use under the terms of this Memorandum.

1. References are the following memoranda to the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. File AG 091.3, (SCAPIN 58) dated 25 September 1945, subject: Operation of Manufacturing Industries.

b. File AG 423 (SCAPIN 1569-A), dated 26 June 1946, subject: Release of Leather.

2. Authorization is given to the present use of an additional 1,500 metric tons of the original 20,000 tons of frozen military stocks of hides and leather listed in paragraph 5. of Memorandum C.L.O.M. No. 14, undated, subject: Operation of Manufacturing Industries. The use of the balance of 3,500 metric tons of hides and leather remaining of the original 20,000 tons is not authorized at this time.

3. The use of the 1,500 metric tons should be governed by the following considerations:

a. As much as possible should be incorporated into industrial leather products, viz., textile leathers, machinery belting, packing et cetera.

b. The balance, or the part which is unsuitable for incorporation into industrial leather products, should be incorporated into leather products suitable for export.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will, in conformity with SCAPIN 1337-A, render to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers:

a. Within fifteen (15) days of receipt of this directive, a proposed production schedule showing intended uses of leather which will become available through the authorization granted in paragraphs 2. and 3.
