SUBJECT : Release of Salt

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take action and assume responsibility as follows with regard to approximately 5,000 metric tons of salt being made available for future Japanese consumption:

a. Accept delivery of approximately 5,000 metric tons of salt at points in Kobe designated by the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

b. Furnish the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, with quantitative receipts for the salt at points of delivery.

c. Store the salt so that it is protected against spoilage, pilferage, theft or other hazards and is under proper custody at all times.

d. Ensure that no distribution is made of the salt until official authorization for release is given by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. This does not preclude processing or the transportation of the salt to areas of greatest anticipated need.

2. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, file AG 430(11 Apr 46)ESS/PC, (SCAPIN 960-A), 11 April 1946, subject: "Maintenance of Records of Storage and Distribution of Imported Foodstuffs." A report providing the information in paragraph 1 a of the above memorandum will be made to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers concerning the storage of this salt.

- 2. The memorandum approves the request of the Japanese Government to add Shionogi Pharmaceutical Company, Ltd. 12, 3-chome, Doshu-machi, Higashi-ku, Osaka City, to the list of SCAP-approved wholesale drug houses to have custody and distribution of Japanese Military Medicinal Narcotics as directed in Memorandum Number (SCAFIN 913), file AG 441.1 (1 May 46)PH, subject: "Custody and Distribution of Japanese Military Medicinal Narcotic Stocks."
- 3. Command instructions will follow through command channels pertaining to the execution of surveillance. The following procedure is suggested:
 - a. Determine that narcotic stocks are kept under proper custody.
 - b. Advise GHq, SCAP, of any corrective action that should be taken at the national level.
 - b. Maintain periodic surveillance to assure that stock records are being properly prepared and forwarded as required.

SUBJECT : Repeal of the East Asia Shipping Company Act and
Dissolution of the East Asia Shipping Company, Ltd.,
(Toa Kai-un K. K.).

1. In order to remove certain wartime legislation and prevent the re-establishment of a monopoly in the shipping industry, the Imperial Japanese Government is hereby directed to:

a. Repeal the East Asia Shipping Company Act (Law No. 68, 1941) and all laws, ordinances and regulations based thereon, within sixty (60) days from the date of this Memorandum.

b. Dissolve the East Asia Shipping Company, Ltd., within sixty (60) days from the date of this Memorandum.

c. Provide for the liquidation of the East Asia Shipping Company, Ltd., in accordance with the Commercial Code of Japan and existing price control and currency regulations, provided, however, that all transfers of property and equipment will have the prior approval of the Civilian Merchant Marine Committee and the Commander of Naval Activities in Japan, and that such liquidation will be completed within one (1) year from the date of this Memorandum.

d. Preserve the records of the East Asia Shipping Company, Ltd., in the office of the supervising bureau, subject to further use by the Imperial Japanese Government or further directions from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, a report of the action taken pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 1, above, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Memorandum.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to acknowledge the receipt, to-day, through the proper intermediary, of the latter's note verbale No.27/RJ, containing detailed description of the energetic endeavours of the Imperial Government to contribute to the smoothing out of the unrest among the Japanese citizens in Brazil. The contents of the said communication were immediately telegraphed to the Swedish Government for relay to the proper Authorities in Brazil.

d. The Bank of Japan, Tokyo, which received a check in the amount of fl.18,890,000 from the Nanpo Kaihatsu Kinko, for which the Bank of Japan's account in the Nanpo Bank was debited.

2. The Central Liaison Office is directed to make an investigation of this matter and to furnish the Civil Property Custodian with a report by 28 October 1946. The required report will include information as to the amount of silver coins removed from the Java Bank at Bandoeng, a description of how they were packed when they were shipped to Japan, an inventory of the coins when they arrived in Japan and details as to their ultimate disposition.

Copies of the inventories of the contents of the package prepared by Ipekjdjian Brothers, Ltd., and by the Japanese Military authorities are attached.

3. The diamonds were later sold by the Japanese Army to the Japanese Government and the sales price credited to the firm in a separate account in a Japanese bank, the Nanpo Kaihatsu Kinko. Subsequently the property was sent to Tokyo.

4. A Mr. S. Uda who was adviser to the Nederlandsche Handel Maatschappij, N. V., appraised the diamonds in question and may have information as to their ultimate disposition.

5. For the purpose of this directive, a subsidiary is defined as any corporation, partnership, or association for the purpose of doing business in which the parent company is directly or indirectly the owner of or enjoys other beneficial interest in 10% or more of any one class of stock or indebtedness outstanding, or exercises control to the extent of 10% or more over voting, operations or policy.

3. a. All reports will be prepared in English in the form of the best accounting practice current in the United States.

b. Reports will be typewritten on white paper eight (8) by eleven (11) inches. If that size is not available, paper used will be approximately that size, but in any case all pages of any one report will be uniform.

c. Text will be single spaced, while double spacing will be used for financial statements, schedules, tabulations, lists, rosters, and other such matters.

d. Five copies of each report will be submitted.

e. In the upper right hand corner of each page, one-eighth (1/8) inch from the top of the page, will be typed the abbreviated name of the company and the number of the section of the report.

4. Each report submitted will be for the reporting company only. It will not be consolidated to include both the company and its subsidiaries and affiliates.

Further, it is directed that no steps be taken which will have the effect of impeding the orderly liquidation of institutions, including affiliates and subsidiaries at the discretion of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, falling within the purview of the reference memoranda, without the express approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. By "liquidation" referred to in paragraph 2 above, is meant:

- a. The collection of obligations outstanding at the time of closing plus accrued interest up to and including the date of payment on interest-bearing accounts, promissory notes, or other evidences of indebtedness.
- b. The realization, by means of sale, transfer, or other method of disposal, of all assets in Japan of closed institutions and their affiliates or subsidiaries.
- c. The orderly payment of creditors' claims against closed institutions and their affiliates or subsidiaries plus accrued interest, on interest-bearing accounts, to the date of closing, subject to priorities determined by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Such payments to be made in conformity with existing regulations with respect to restricted checks and other means of controlling currency inflation.
- d. All contracts and agreements outstanding at the time of closing are deemed to have been automatically cancelled unless otherwise indicated by the liquidating agencies with the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. It is further directed that provision be made for the payment of liquidation expenses incurred by the Bank of Japan and the Committee of Conservators for Closed Institutions without restriction, but subject to the approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

- 4. Within 30 days after completion of the overhaul, repairs, salvage and refitting directed on each vessel, the Imperial Japanese Government will submit a report of the total costs involved to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

In the past supplies of this nature have been distributed directly to Japanese health authorities, by the Occupation Forces, as required for disease control programs. This function will now be assumed by the Japanese Government.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to prepare and submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval, not later than 25 October, a plan for distribution of subject supplies making provision for the following:
 - a. Adequate facilities for transportation, warehousing and safeguarding until delivered to the jurisdiction of designated health authorities.
 - b. Expeditious delivery to each prefectural health officer of sufficient supplies to carry out prescribed health programs.
 - c. Control of distribution agencies to obviate the possibility of release through unauthorized channels.
