1. Receipt is acknowledged of your letter C.L.O. No. 4966(AG) dated 26 September 1946, in reference to: SCAP Memorandum AG 400.12 (27 Aug 46)CD, (SCAPIR-1160), subject: "Procurement Demand Procedure".

2. The following information is transmitted on items mentioned in the inclosures to your letter:

a. Project 1-104 has been approved and a proper procurement demand will be served on the Imperial Japanese Government.

b. The memorandum of 24 August 1946 from Headquarters, Eighth Army, subject: "Supplies for Japan Lumber Company", is not a procurement demand, but a customary instruction to the Central Liaison Office to take corrective action on matters requiring official correction when production is jeopardized. The Imperial Japanese Government should investigate this matter.

c. The memorandum of 9 September 1946 is not a procurement demand but a normal memorandum of instructions. A procurement demand for the lumber has been issued but, apparently, has not yet reached the Imperial Japanese Government. The memorandum will be complied with as soon as the procurement demand is received.

3. In December 1945, a loan of 4,000,000 E/M of lumber, for use in the Dependent Housing Program in Japan, was made from United States Army stocks in Manila. This is a repayment of that loan.

SUBJECT: Property belonging to Mr. C. E. Whitmore left in British Consulate General, Mukden, China.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present location and condition of:

a. Nineteen packing cases containing household effects, the property of Mr. C. E. Whitmore, former British Consul General at Mukden;

b. Other property removed from the Consulate General in Mukden, China, during the Japanese occupation.

2. When Mr. Whitmore was sent to Kobe, 2 June 1942, the nineteen cases were put into the garage of the Consulate General at Mukden. The Consulate General was occupied by five Japanese Police officers including one Shojima, Chief of the Foreign Section of the police. The officers removed two typewriters, one bookcase and one icebox when they moved from the Consulate building in July 1945. A short time later the nineteen cases containing Consul General Whitmore's belongings, one case containing the belongings of Mr. Cheke, the Acting Consul and all the stationary and documents in the office were removed to the City Government. On October 1943, the Deputy Mayor of Mukden, one Yamasuge, moved into the premises.

3. It is directed that Shojima and Yamasuge be interrogated as to the disposition of the above property and that the report required in paragraph 1 above be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 31 December 1946.

SUBJECT: Disposition of State-Owned Land Used
by Religious Institutions

1. Reference is made to Memorandum, CLO No 4842 (PP-E), 20 September 1946, subject: Disposition of State-Owned Land and Forests Used by Shrines and Temples, and to the draft texts of the law and ordinance inclosed therewith.

2. No objection is offered to the proposed law and ordinance, provided that such provisions as are in conflict with the standards set forth in paragraph 3, below, are modified or deleted.

3. In the disposition of State-owned land under the proposed law and ordinance, the Imperial Japanese Government is directed to adhere to the following standards:

a. The title to all public land presently utilized by religious institutions and necessary for their religious functions shall, upon application to the appropriate Japanese Government agency, be given to such institutions free of charge:

- (1) Provided the religious institution was in possession of the land prior to 1868 and the State gave no compensation to the religious institution when it assumed title to the land, or,
- (2) Provided the land was obtained by the religious institution from non-governmental sources and without the expenditure of public funds.

b. Whether land not necessary for the religious functions of religious institutions but which otherwise comes within the provisions of paragraph a, above, shall be given free of charge shall be determined in accordance with such criteria as may be formulated by the Japanese Government.

c. Title to State-owned forest land in custody of religious institutions shall remain in the State, and the present custodial system shall be terminated. Compensation may be paid to religious institutions for their custodial interest in such land in accordance with the provisions of paragraph e, below.

d. Religious institutions may be permitted to purchase such other land now in their possession or custody at one-half market value if it is essential to religious functions, but in no case if it is primarily revenue-producing land. However, religious institutions may exchange land of equal value in lieu of payment for land which is presently devoted to essential religious purposes.

e. Religious institutions may be compensated for the reasonable cost of improvements made on land of which they will be deprived of possession and custody, but only insofar as these improvements have enhanced the value of such land.

f. The provisions for the transfer to religious institutions of land title shall not apply in the case of military shrines (Yasukuni Jinja, Gokoku Jinja, Shokonsha). Classifications existing on 15 December 1945 shall determine the status of such shrines.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit comprehensive reports to this headquarters monthly describing in detail all actions taken in the disposition of State-owned land presently used by religious institutions.





SUBJECT: Approach Zone to Haneda Airfield.

1. In order to insure safe flying conditions from runway "A" (this runway is 7,000' by 150' and is oriented approximately northwest-southeast) it is necessary that certain clearances be maintained in the approach zone to the northwestern end of the runway.

2. The following criteria are applicable:

a. The approach zone consists of a trapezoid with a 1,500' base at the end of the runway over-run and with a 4,000' width at a point two miles from the end of said over-run. The 4,000' width will be maintained to a distance of 5 miles from the over-run.

b. The plane of the trapezoid is tilted at an angle so as to rise 1' for every 100' from the base. The above-cited tilt of the plane of the trapezoid commonly is called the glide angle and, in this case, would be 1 to 100.

3. It is desired that the Imperial Japanese Government, in accordance with instructions to be issued by the Commanding General, Eighth Army, remove or modify certain structures that now obstruct the above described approach. It is further desired that the Imperial Japanese Government take action to insure that no structures are erected so as to encroach upon the above cited approach zone.

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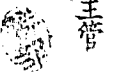

2. It is not believed desirable to fly the National Flag of Japan during the period of the occupation as a special tribute to any individual. The gesture proposed in reference letter would be misconstrued in foreign circles and an adverse and hostile reaction would result against the Emperor himself. This would introduce into a delicate situation an unnecessary element of prejudice against the Emperor which would seem to be unwarranted.

3. It is suggested, therefore, that other means of recognition of loyalty and devotion of the people could be substituted without the introduction of this element of display.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to forward herewith three copies of list, received from the Swedish Vice Consulate in Honolulu being in charge of Japanese interests in the Territory of Hawaii, and containing the names of 451 persons, former residents of the Territory of Hawaii, who arrived in Honolulu on 13th November, 1945, by the U.S. Army transport s/s "Yarmouth" having been released from various detention centers and returned to these Islands by the U.S. Military Authorities after internment for varying periods following the outbreak of the war in 1941.

The personnel of the Swedish Vice Consulate in Honolulu, aided by volunteers from organizations among the residents of Japanese extraction in the community, were on hand to receive the home-coming families and individuals and to aid the immigration officials in their laborious task of checking in so large a number of passengers.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to enclose herewith four copies of a list, received from the Swedish Vice-Consulate at Honolulu, in charge of Japanese interests in the Territory of Hawaii, regarding a contingent of Japanese Prisoners of War recently transferred from the Island of Oahu, Territory of Hawaii, to their respective homelands.

The total number of Prisoners of War named in this sailing list is 554, of whom 439 are grouped as Japanese being returned to Okinawa, and 115 as Koreans being returned to Korea. Apparently all were afflicted with more or less serious physical disabilities. Many of those from the Okinawas had been hospitalized for a long time but recovered sufficiently to be ambulatory. Others, to the number of 18, were litter cases. The 292 non-hospitalized Okinawan prisoners of War are classified as afflicted with Filariasis, a disease which is said to be endemic

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among the people of Okinawa and since it is communicable, these men have had to be isolated and were subsequently evacuated with those who have been treated for disabling illness or injuries.

The 115 Koreans were apparently all in good health.

All above Prisoners of War were departed from the Island of Oahu on 25th July, 1946, via the ship "Mexico Victory" and were expected to arrive in Okinawa about 6th August, 1946.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to request its assistance in the following matter.

The Swedish Legation at Lima, Peru, in charge of Japanese interests in the said country, has informed this Mission that, by a Cabinet decision on the 26th August, 1946, the Peruvian Government ordered that the Japanese national Kenzo ABE be expelled from Peru owing to unlawful entrance into said country. He is still being held in prison there until the Peruvian Authorities find a possibility to arrange his return passage to Japan. Before the Lima Press the said person has declared himself to be an Admiral of the Fleet of the Japanese Navy and an Imperial Delegate to promote unity amongst Japanese people in South America. Under these pretensions he has also

approached the Peruvian President.

In order to be able to inform the Swedish Legation at Lima of the above-mentioned person's position it would be appreciated if the Imperial Ministry could, without delay, furnish this Mission with a statement whether ABE holds the above or similar offices of the Imperial Government, as well as other possibly pertinent information regarding his person. He has himself stated that he is a resident of Fukushima-ken, Shimpu-gun, Sasaya-mura Aza Sekiba 210, and that he is 50 years of age.

1. Reference is made to Paragraph 1a of Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, File AG OL4.33(16 May 46)DS (SCAPIN 958) dated 16 May 1946, subject: "Information Concerning Acts of American Nationals and Certain Japanese Legal Procedures".

2. Information of non-compliance with directive named in paragraph 1 above has been received. Specific defect is as follows:

a. Cited paragraph 1a concerns all persons who are believed to have had American citizenship and who applied for Japanese nationality. The list submitted, however, contains only the names of those persons whose applications were granted and omits those whose applications were either refused or are pending.

b. As an example, the names of the following persons, who are understood to have made application for Japanese nationality subsequent to 1941, do not appear on the submitted list:

- (1) KILBURN, Elizabeth
- (2) WELLS, Florence
- (3) FINCHER, Robert Toombs (alias NAI Tamio)

3. Therefore, the Imperial Japanese Government will correct this deficiency by submitting, in duplicate, an alphabetically arranged list of all those believed to have had American citizenship and who applied for Japanese nationality, whether the application was refused or is pending, and with particular attention to the period from 1 January 1941 to date.

SUBJECT: Import-Export Accounting Control for Japan

1. The Imperial Japanese Government will take immediate steps, and not later than 30 November 1946, be prepared to effect the accounting procedures set forth in this memorandum, and such subsequent instructions as may be prescribed by the General Accounting Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. Accounting Control Procedures for Japanese Imports.

a. Ships Other than Shipping Control Administration Japan Register.

(1) Qualified cargo checkers will be furnished at time of discharge of cargo. The cargo checkers will tally cargo upon discharge and Duplicate Tallies will be prepared. One copy will be signed by a representative of the Boeki Cho agency furnishing the checkers and delivered to the Port Customs.

(2) The Port Customs will obtain one set of shipping documents from the Port Agent of Boeki Cho and will reconcile the signed cargo tally and the shipping documents on Shipment Reconciliation Sheets. An Individual Shipment Reconciliation Report will be prepared, in quadruplicate and in English, and three copies forwarded to the Eighth Army Military Government Unit represented. One copy of each cargo tally, one set of shipping documents and one copy of the Individual Shipment Reconciliation Report will be retained by the Port Customs and filed by ship name and date of shipment.

(3) It will be the duty of the Port Customs to act as arbiter between the Ship's Master and Boeki Cho in the event of a dispute involving cargo count and to conduct any investigations necessary to ascertain accuracy of reported quantities. On any such disputes a written report in English will be rendered, giving the details and findings and signed by a Port Customs official, to the Eighth Army Military Government Unit represented.

(4) Boeki Cho will have an official representative at the port of entry empowered to sign for all incoming shipments at that port. He will obtain shipping documents, duplicate and distribute copies as follows: one set to Port Customs; two signed sets to the Eighth Army Military Government Unit represented, one of which will be the original from the Ship's Master; enough copies to maintain a permanent file at Boeki Cho Main Office. He will verify the count of cargo upon discharge and render a quantitative receipt in quadruplicate, submitting three copies to the Eighth Army Military Government Unit represented and one copy to the Ship's Master.

b. Shipping Control Administration Japan Ships.

(1) When shipments are delivered to Japan in Shipping Control Administration Japan ships, the above procedure will apply with the following amendment:

(a) The quantitative receipt rendered in triplicate to the Eighth Army Military Government Unit represented will correspond with that signed by the Ship's Master, except in cases of special agreement with the exporter and Boeki Cho.

c. To Other Government Cargo.

(1) When cargo aboard a United States vessel is too small or too interstowed with other cargo to allow expeditious segregation at port of entry and is therefore shipped to a United States Army depot for turnover to the Imperial Japanese Government; and also when supplies that have been stored in a depot and are diverted from Military stocks; the following will ensue:

(a) Boeki Cho representative will verify count and condition of supplies received and sign two copies of the tally outs prepared by the issuing United States Army Technical Service Depot. He will sign four copies of the quantitative receipt furnished by the Technical Service Depot upon transfer of title of the cargo. For "To Other Government" shipments, he will obtain shipping documents, distributing one set to Port Customs and two signed sets to Eighth Army Military Government Unit represented.

d. Shipping documents referred to above consist of:

- (1) Inward Manifest
- (2) Packing List
- (3) Invoice of Consigned Merchandise
- (4) Weight Measurement List
- (5) Test Certificates
- (6) Inspection Sheets
- (7) Bill of Lading

e. Individual Shipment Reconciliation Report is a summarized reconciliation of the Cargo Tallies and the Inward Manifest showing the discrepancies between the amount manifested and that discharged, together with explanations of the differences. Each item unloaded from the ship will be listed on a separate shipment reconciliation sheet and tallies reconciled against the Inward Manifest. A summarized Individual Shipment Reconciliation Report, showing totals of each item, will be forwarded to the Eighth Army Military Government Unit represented. (Sample forms attached. These forms may be reproduced.)

3. Accounting Control Procedure for Japanese Exports.

a. The following procedures will be complied with in the case of Japanese Exports.

- (1) Boeki Cho will carry out all functions as outlined in applicable directives. It will forward all documents requiring certification at the port of entry to the Port Agent of Boeki Cho. It will deliver all shipping documents, required by Eighth Army and Cargo Receipts to the Commanding General, Eighth Army Military Government Section. One copy of the Consigned Merchandise Invoice will also be forwarded to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Economic and Scientific Section.
- (2) Port Agent of Boeki Cho will be designated as the official representative of Boeki Cho to transact its business arising at the port of entry. He will supervise the delivery of cargo at the port for shipment. He will forward all forms for certification, and receipts signed by the Ship's Master for ship's documents, to Boeki Cho. He will obtain from Boeki Cho two sets of shipping documents and deliver one set to the Port Customs and one set to the Ship's Master.



Boeki Cho will have an authorized representative at the air port.
The above procedures will apply.

anese Government and Economic and Scientific Section, General Head-
quarters, of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers is hereby
authorized to implement the instructions contained in this memo-
randum.
