MANIFEST OR WAYBILL section will list individual manifests or waybills by MAN. or WB/No. (manifest or waybill number) and quantity listed on such manifest or waybill. MANIFESTED or WAYBILL TOTALS will be the same as No. of UNITS MANIFESTED.

Discrepancies - Over and Short column will show the difference on each item between the Inward Manifest column and Dock Tallies column.

Remarks column will be used for any explanations or comments on discrepancies.

SUBJECT: Dissolution of the Central Life Insurance Corporation and of the Central Non-Life Insurance Corporation

1. In order to stimulate revival of private insurance business in all types of insurance contracts and to provide equal opportunity to firms and individuals to compete in the insurance business, the Imperial Japanese Government is hereby directed to take the necessary action to:

a. Dissolve the Central Life Insurance Corporation and the Central Non-Life Insurance Corporation, and repeal or rescind all laws and regulations giving them legal existence, and preserve the complete records of these corporations within the Ministry of Finance.

b. Liquidate the assets of the Central Life Insurance Corporation and the Central Non-Life Insurance Corporation under the supervision of the Liquidation Branch, Finance Division, Economic and Scientific Section, in accordance with the Commercial Code and existing price control and currency regulations and policies of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to submit a plan for the dissolution of these corporations as outlined in subparagraph 1b above, within thirty (30) days of the date of this memorandum. This plan will include such steps as are necessary to assure maximum protection to the interests of the allied-owned insurance companies.

3. Direct communication between agencies of the Imperial Japanese Government and interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is authorized to implement this memorandum.

A thorough investigation will be made to determine the present location and condition of books and printing materials, two large and three small printing presses and two typewriters belonging to the Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society which were taken from the Society's office on 21 July 1939 by the Tokyo Metropolitan Police.

3. It is further directed that the Central Liaison Office submit a report as to the disposition and whereabouts of fifty rolls of printing paper which were shipped in 1939 from San Francisco to the Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society and were detained at that time in the Yokohama Customs House.

4. The above required reports will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 27 December 1946.

  - c. Clothing, personal possessions and household effects of value only to the owner, limited to 500 pounds per repatriate, and to be transported with each repatriate from his home to the port of Sasebo.
4. Necessary quarters, facilities and supplies, including food, aboard the SS Tai Nan will be furnished by the Chinese Government.
5. The Imperial Japanese Government will:
  - a. Notify subject nationals and provide suitable rail accommodations to transport them and their baggage to

1. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 411.1 (SCAPIN - 1302) dated 30 October 1946, Subject: "Delivery of Lumber to Manila, Luzon, Philippine Islands" is rescinded.

2. The Imperial Japanese Government will take the following action with regard to shipment of lumber from Japan to the Philippine Islands as listed below:

a. Arrange with the Shipping Control Authority, Japan, for the assignment of suitable shipping to lift from Kyushu port to Manila, Luzon, Philippine Islands, as follows:

(1) The Port of Manila, Luzon, Philippine Islands, can receive the shipment of 1,800,000 board feet on 1 December 1946.

b. Instruct the appropriate agency to prepare bills of lading for the shipment of lumber and to make distribution of copies as follows:

(1) Four copies for the ship's master, two of which are to be delivered to the Commanding General, United States Army Forces, Western Pacific, or his auth-

orized representative, at Manila, Luzon, Philippine Islands, by the ship's master.

(2) Three copies for the Imperial Japanese Government for delivery to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

c. Instruct the ship's master to obtain signatures on two copies of the bills of lading from the Commanding General, United States Army Forces, Western Pacific, or his authorized representative as a receipt for the lumber. These receipted bills of lading are to be furnished the Imperial Japanese Government upon the vessel's return to Japan for transmittal to the Commanding General, Eighth Army, Attention: Chief Engineer (L-4), Yokohama.

3. Upon completion of discharge of lumber at Manila, Luzon, Philippine Islands, the vessel will be loaded with cargo for shipment to Korea. The Imperial Japanese Government will take the following action with regard to this shipment:

a. Instruct the ship's master to deliver the cargo to the port in Korea as directed by the Commanding General, United States Army Forces, Western Pacific, or his authorized representative.

b. Instruct the ship's master to obtain bills of lading from the Commanding General, United States Army Forces, Western Pacific, or his authorized representative, and to make distribution of copies as follows:

(1) Four copies for the ship's master, two of which are to be delivered to the Commanding General or his authorized representative at the port of discharge by the ship's master.

(2) Instruct the ship's master to obtain signatures on two copies of the bills of lading from the Commanding General or his authorized representative, at the port of discharge, as a receipt for

a. The shipment of lumber to Manila, Luzon, Philippine Islands, is a partial replacement of 4,000,000 board feet borrowed from the United States Army stocks in the Philippine Islands during May 1946 to meet urgent needs of the Occupation Forces.

b. The back shipment to be made from the Philippine Islands to Korea is for the purpose of meeting the needs of the Occupation Forces in Korea.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit a report of the expense incurred in this operation to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. SUBJECT : Restitution of United Nations Nationals' Property Wrongfully Transferred.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for Imperial Japanese Government, AG 386.3(6 May 46)CPC, SCAPIN 926, 6 May 1946, subject "Procedure for Returning Property in Japan to Nationals of the United Nations," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The "Receipt Form" attached to the above referenced memorandum as Part 2, Annex A, is hereafter obsolete and the "Receipt Form" attached hereto as Annex A is substituted therefor.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to provide the necessary procedures for the restitution of properties owned by United Nations nationals in Japan on 7 December 1941, which have been the subject of transfer under duress, wrongful acts of confiscation, dispossession or spoliation, whether pursuant to legislation or by procedure purporting to follow forms of law or otherwise, and such restitution will be made under conditions as follows:

a. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers will issue a directive to the Imperial Japanese Government in each case of restitution, stating time and place for delivery of property to be restored and transfer of title thereto.

b. Receipt in the form of the "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan" attached hereto as Annex A, and containing all provisions therein, will be executed in

original and seven copies and distributed in accordance with distribution as shown on the bottom of page 2 of the receipt form. All copies will be signed.

c. Separate pages will be used where space provided in "Receipt for Restitution to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan" is insufficient and notation to that effect inserted in space provided.

d. Receipt will be the result of a joint inventory by the Restoree and Representative of the Imperial Japanese Government.

4. In each case of restitution the Representative of the Imperial Japanese Government will present to the Military Government Officer in the locality in which the property to be restituted is located a copy of the Directive requiring the restitution. The Military Government Officer or his representative will witness the restitution.

2. Reference 1a above is hereby amended by deleting therefrom paragraph numbered 3b.
  3. References 1b, 1c and 1d are hereby rescinded.
  4. Except as herein otherwise provided permits from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to convert or reconvert industrial plants will be required only for plants specifically designated for reparations, and for such other concerns and industries as the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers may hereafter direct.
  5. Applications for permits to convert or reconvert plants designated for reparations will be submitted by the Imperial Japanese Government to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. The Imperial Japanese Government will be responsible for rejecting applications received by it which:
    - a. Utilize productive facilities for which alternate facilities not subject to reparations are available for use or can be developed within a reasonable period of time; or,
    - b. Are for production on Japanese demands not deemed essential to the Japanese economy. Application for use of reparations facilities for production on Allied Forces demands will be screened for the first criterion only.

6. Applications for permits submitted by the Imperial Japanese Government to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, will be approved only when they show adequately:

- a. The nature of the proposed conversion or reconversion.
- b. The extent of any proposed changes in physical facilities.
- c. That other facilities adequate for such production or equally as adaptable are not available for use.
- d. That the product to be produced is essential to the needs of the Japanese economy or of the occupation forces.
- e. The length of time for which utilization of the facility is requested.
- f. That provisions are being made to replace the production, if necessary, when the given facility is closed for reparations removal.

7. A conversion or reconversion permit authorizes a given plant to change the end products manufactured. The distinction between conversion and reconversion rests upon the nature of the desired change. Conversion applies generally to those cases where the desired end products have not previously been manufactured. Reconversion applies generally to cases where the desired end products have been previously manufactured in the subject plant.

8. Conversion and reconversion permits heretofore issued to reparations plants by proper authority will continue in effect and new applications need not be submitted. Continued operations pursuant to any such permit will be governed by the provisions of the applicable custody memorandum, reference paragraph 1 above.

9. Special controls for fertilizer plants, insofar as production of fertilizer is concerned, will be in accordance with the provisions of reference 1n, above, regardless of whether such plants are also designated for reparations. Productive facilities of fertilizer plants not used for the production of fertilizer will be dealt with in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 4 above.

10. This memorandum will not be construed as amending previous memoranda, and/or instructions issued pursuant thereto or delegations of authority prescribed thereunder, with respect to plants designated for reparations for matters regarding custody and control other than procedures for conversion and reconversion applications.

2. Arrangements have been completed to repatriate 25,000 Japanese Nationals from the territory of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and territories under the control of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics. Repatriates will be processed through reception centers in Japan as follows:

3. Japanese repatriates will be transferred by the Soviet authorities to the masters of the repatriation ships, according to passenger lists written in the Russian language at Soviet and Soviet-controlled ports. In addition, certain transfer documents, written in the Russian language and furnished by the Soviet authorities, will be signed by ships' masters.

4. a. The Russian language will be used in all navigation messages issued from Soviet ports and Soviet-controlled ports.

b. The English language will be used in all navigation messages dispatched from repatriation ships, arriving at repatriation ports in Soviet or Soviet-controlled areas.

5. Vaccinations against typhus will not be administered in Soviet or Soviet-controlled areas to the repatriates indicated in paragraph 2 above.

6. Arrangements for securing emergency supplies in Soviet and Soviet-controlled ports, as stated in paragraph 3, Annex IV to reference paragraph 1 above, have not been completed. Ships must be provisioned and bunkered for the round trip plus enough additional fuel, water and food to take care of unforeseen delays.

7. Repatriation of Koreans from Japan to Northern Korea is not authorized at this time.

8. The Imperial Japanese Government will:

a. Open the repatriation reception centers at Maizuru and Hakodate at once and prepare them for processing repatriates at the rates prescribed in reference, paragraph 1 above.

b. Provision and bunker ships as specified in paragraph 6 above.

c. Inform masters of ships concerning the provisions of paragraphs 4 a and 6 above.

d. Insure compliance, by masters of ships repatriating Japanese from Soviet and Soviet-controlled areas, with the instructions contained in paragraphs 3 and 4 b above.

e. Process the 25,000 Japanese repatriates in accordance with the instructions contained in reference paragraph 1 above. In addition, complete the series of inoculations against typhus prior to their release from the reception centers.

9. Provisions contained in reference paragraph 1 above are amended in accordance with provisions of this memorandum.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 062.2(8 Jul 46)CPC/FP, SCAPIN-1056, 8 July 1946, subject "Census of Foreign Films in Japan," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied **MARKED 15 20 NOV 29 46 AG GHO**

2. An analysis has been made of films listed as having been impounded by the Home Ministry as a result of the referenced memorandum. It indicates that among them are some which probably belong rightfully to Japanese nationals who for various reasons are unable to show legal documents proving ownership or to obtain such documents under present circumstances.

3. The Home Ministry shall determine which films fall into this category and re-examine them. Those which have classroom value and can be withdrawn from use only to the detriment of education in scientific and technical fields shall be returned to those who claim to own them on the understanding that such return does not constitute recognition of legal ownership and that surrender of the films and compensation for their use may be demanded if proof of ownership cannot be obtained when the reopening of normal communication channels makes possible the obtaining of such proof. To determine whether a film has value in scientific or technical education, the Home Ministry shall consult the Education Ministry. Scenic films, newsreels and animated cartoons, unless purely scientific or technical, shall not be regarded as educational in the above sense, and in no case shall a 35-millimeter film produced by a foreign concern engaged primarily in the production of commercial entertainment films be returned.

4. A list of illegally-possessed films by country of origin will be compiled giving title of picture in language of origin, name of producer, prefecture where located, and name of possessor or person who made report on it. Sample form to be used is inclosed as Annex A. Four copies will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within one month of the date of this memorandum.

5. The analysis of films listed in compliance with memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 above also reveals that:

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 091.112(13 Sep 45)CPC, SCAPIN - 26, 13 September 1945, subject "Protection of Allied and Axis Property," from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. In a recent general inspection of properties which belonged on 7 December 1941 to nationals of the United Nations, it was observed that many of these properties are not being properly preserved, and that necessary measures are not being taken by the Imperial Japanese Government to prevent further deterioration of such properties, in spite of the instructions contained in the memorandum referred to in paragraph 1 above.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is instructed that it is held responsible for preservation and for paying all expenses incurred in the preservation of property in Japan owned on 7 December 1941 by nationals of United Nations, where such property is not in the possession, custody or control of the United Nations national owner.

4. The Imperial Japanese Government is directed to make such minimum outlays as are necessary to preserve and protect all such properties as are covered by paragraph 3 above, so as to prevent further loss or deterioration.

5. The Imperial Japanese Government is further directed to maintain detailed records, in the case of each United Nations national's property, of all expenditures incurred in preservation and to submit a report of action taken with statement of expenses incurred in each case where measures are taken to preserve property of United Nations nationals.

6. General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, whenever renewals and repairs to specific properties are required because

1. Reference is Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 091.3(22 Sep 45)ESS, dated 22 September 1945, subject: Controls over Exports and Imports of Gold, Silver, Securities and Financial Instruments.

2. Information received by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers indicates that a Mr. Fukuta Kazuo, on 29 September 1945 and 19 December 1945, purchased demand drafts from the Tsingtao, China Branch of the Yokohama Specie Bank, in the amount of F.R.B. \$1,000,000 and F.R.B. \$7,670,000 respectively. These drafts were subsequently imported into Japan and presented for payment by Mr. Kazuo at the Osaka Branch of the Yokohama Specie Bank. The importation into Japan of these drafts constitutes a violation of the provisions of the Memorandum referenced in paragraph 1 above.

3. The Imperial Japanese Government is hereby directed to seize the above mentioned draft against receipt and hold in safe custody pending further directions from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. A report, indicating compliance with the instructions contained herein and the means by which these drafts were imported into Japan, will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty days from the date of this memorandum.
