1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present location of diamonds and other jewels, the property of Mr. Lim Kam, removed from the Weeskamer of Padang during the Japanese occupation of the Netherlands East Indies in 1942.

2. Among Mr. Kam's jewels was one bundle of diamonds, wrapped in yellow cloth containing from four to six kilos of loose stones, the smallest one weighing eight carats. There was also a group of sixty brooches and a large diamond and platinum brooch with the center cover set with twenty four diamonds of three carats each.

3. The required report to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 15 January 1947, will contain information regarding these jewels from the time of their removal from the Weeskamer of Padang until their ultimate disposition in Japan.

SUBJECT: Gold and Gold Bullion Bars Removed from the Netherlands East Indies.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and make a complete report on the removal and ultimate disposition of gold and gold bullion bars taken from the Java Bank at Batavia during the Japanese occupation of the Netherlands East Indies.

2. Inclosed are the following:

a. Statement giving full particulars of the gold and gold bullion bars on deposit in the Java Bank in Batavia at the time of the Japanese occupation;

b. Six assay certificates of the gold and gold bullion bars on deposit in the same bank belonging to the mining companies Mijnbouw Maatschappij Simau and Mijnbouw Maatschappij Zuid Bantam.

3. The usual packing of the Simau bullion was 3 bars, weighing about 25 kilograms each, in a wooden box measuring about 35 x 32 x 16 centimeters. The lid was fastened with screws and the boxes strapped with hoopiron. They were also secured with wax seals bearing the letters "M.K.S.". The color of the bullion is gray (lead or silver color) and the top of the bars are generally rough. The shape is the usual bar form without lugs or ears.

4. The bullion produced by the mining company Zuid Bantam was cast in the shape of anodes, of which a sketch is attached. The weight of these anodes averaged 7 kilograms each, and the average precious metal content was about 1.5% gold and 95% silver. Ten of these anodes were packed in a wooden box, sketch inclosed. The color of the bullion was the same as that of the Simau bullion. The anodes had a letter or letters stamped into them, in addition to numerals. All of the anodes from one smelting carried the same serial number in figures and consecutive letters of the alphabet provided the distinguishing mark, as shown in the inclosed assay certificates. On deposit in the Bank of Java, there were 200 anodes with the serial numbers 2053 to 2064. The lettering ran from A through Z and from AA through ED for each of the numbers in the series. The 2064 - 2084 series comprised 450 anodes, each bearing

one of these serial numbers and one letter from A through T. The 2085 series numbered 15 anodes from A through O.

5. The Central Liaison Office is further directed to investigate and submit a complete report on the removal and ultimate disposition of the gold and gold bullion bars stored at the mines of the mining company Simau at Benkelen, Sumatra, and the mining company Zuid Bantam at South Bantam, Java.

6. At the Simau Company mines there were 180 bullion bars stored, averaging about 25 kilograms in weight each. The precious metal content of approximately 30% of these bars was about 5% gold and 92% silver and the balance about 8% gold and 89% silver. These bars had consecutive numbers stamped into them beginning with 25478. It is believed that the Japanese occupation authorities handed this bullion over the Benkowlan Shyu Seicho.

7. The Simau Company also had in its possession bars Nos. 25305 through 25328, which were in process of being refined at the Batavia refinery, Essaieer and Affinagebedrijf v/h R.T. Braakensiek. The precious metal content of these was the same as in the bars belonging to the company on deposit in the Bank of Java.

8. At the Zuid Bantam mines there were bars marked 2086 A through T and 2087 A through T. It is not certain how many anodes were at the mine at the time of the Japanese occupation, but it is believed that the total weight of the bullion was about 1,500 kilograms, which would mean 20 to 21 boxes, each containing 10 anodes.

9. The Zuid Bantam Company had 295 anodes, in the process of being refined, numbered from 199 A through E to 2057 A through E. It is believed that the precious metal resulting from this bullion had been either partly or wholly returned to the Java Bank.

10. The reports required in paragraphs 1 and 5 above will be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 31 December 1946.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Imperial Ministry for Foreign Affairs and with reference to the former's note verbale BB-149/46, dated 24th April, 1946, addressed to the General Headquarters of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, regarding the handing over of the diplomatic and consular property and archives of the Imperial Japanese Government at Sofia, Bulgaria, to the proper Allied Authorities there, has the honour to inform the Imperial Ministry that the Swedish Legation at Sofia has furnished the following additional information on the same subject.

The Swedish Legation, on 22nd March, 1946, in the presence of a Representative of the Bulgarian Foreign Ministry, provisionally handed over the property in question to Representatives of the Allied Control Commission, and the American and British Missions at Sofia, as described in the enclosed Protocol, with one annex, dated the same day. The property was kept under the seals of the Swedish Legation and the said Allied Authorities until 15th April, 1946, when the Swedish Legation, upon receiving the duly signed Protocol, removed its seal from the apartment, where the property was kept, and transferred the key of the apartment to the said Allied Authorities.

SUBJECT: Surplus United States Government Property to be Purchased by the Imperial Japanese Government

1. Reference is made to the contract on sale of surplus property signed 23 November 1946 between the Office of the Foreign Liquidation Commission and the Imperial Japanese Government. The Imperial Japanese Government will take steps to see that the following regulations concerning marking, registration and utilization of the surplus property purchased by it are complied with.

2. Tents, clothing, soap and other similar supplies will be rationed at official prices according to plans which will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (Attn: Price Control and Rationing Division, Economic and Scientific Section) for approval. All such items other than soap will be clearly marked or dyed so as to be distinguishable from U.S. military supplies before distribution is made by the Imperial Japanese Government.

3. Medical, dental, veterinary and sanitary supplies and equipment will be distributed in such a manner as to insure equitable allocation and efficient utilization in the medical care and treatment of the civilian population. A plan covering distribution of these supplies will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (Attn: Public Health and Welfare Section) for approval prior to such distribution. The plan will make provisions for:
 - a. Adequate facilities for transportation, warehousing and safeguarding until delivered to the jurisdiction of designated distributing agencies.
 - b. Expeditious delivery to distribution agencies.
 - c. Control of distribution agencies to obviate the possibility of release through unauthorized channels.
 - d. Maintenance of sufficient records to provide:

- (1) Accurate information on national and regional levels of stock on hand available for distribution.
- (2) A check on the integrity of distribution channels.
- c. Adequate price control.

4. Engineering equipment will be used for essential purposes only, according to plans which will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (Attn: Industry Division, Economic and Scientific Section) for approval. All insignia and unit markings appearing on the equipment will be completely obliterated. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to the Office of the Provost Marshal, Eighth Army, in duplicate, an original listing of the makers' names, serial numbers, as well as descriptions of this equipment as given on Vendor's Shipping Documents. All wheeled vehicles included in this engineering equipment will be provided with license plates and vehicle registration certificates by the Imperial Japanese Government, and two copies of each vehicle registration certificate will be forwarded to the Provost Marshal, Eighth Army.

5. Trucks and trailers will be operated by established agencies, governmental, prefectural and municipal, charged with the responsibility of promoting public health, safety and welfare, reconstruction and rehabilitation of devastated areas, and distribution of food, clothing, fuel and such other essential commodities as are required for the prevention of disease and unrest among the civilian population. Title to all vehicles will be retained by the Imperial Japanese Government. These vehicles will not be used by the government for the purpose of competing with private enterprises. In cases where suitable public agencies do not exist for the accomplishment of the objectives mentioned above, the government may lease equipment to private operators, such arrangements to be subject to prior approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Plans covering the distribution and use of these trucks and trailers will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (Attn: Transportation Section) for approval prior to such distribution.

6. Marking and registration of trucks and trailers will conform to the following:

a. The U.S. vehicle registration numbers, insignia (symbols), bumper markings and any other painted markings will be obliterated. A straight white line four (4) inches wide will be painted over the hood and front mudguards of each truck and horizontally around the body of each trailer, as an easy visual means of identifying these vehicles. The white line will be centrally placed. License plate, 16 1/2" x 6-3/4", with light green background, will be affixed in front and in back of each vehicle. At the upper left hand corner of the plate will appear the Japanese prefectural symbol, and in the lower right hand corner the name

of the prefecture in English lettering. The license plate number will be four (4) inches high and in accordance with the Japanese registration system (see inclosure no. 1). The number and the markings will be embossed on the plate in black.

b. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to the Provost Marshal, Eighth Army, an original listing in duplicate of the engine serial numbers and body serial numbers of the vehicles, and one numerical list of the serial numbers of all tires (those that come with the vehicles and those purchased separately). A vehicle registration certificate will be issued by the Imperial Japanese Government for each vehicle, after necessary overhauling and repairs have been effected and the vehicle is ready to be put into service. The certificate will mention type, cargo capacity, wheel base, number of engine cylinders, motor serial number and body serial number. The original of the certificate will be handed to the vehicle operating entity and carried by the driver at all times during operation of the vehicle; two copies will be forwarded to the Provost Marshal, Eighth Army.

c. The vehicles will be declassified by the Imperial Japanese Government until the necessary marking and registration described in paragraphs 6a and 6b have been carried out.

d. Outload Korean illegal immigrants from the Sasebo Reception Center on shipping designated for this purpose.

e. Furnish Japanese police for guards aboard trains and repatriation ships transporting Korean illegal immigrants.

SUBJECT: Removal of One Piece of Astridite from Netherlands East Indies to Japan.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present location and condition of a piece of astridite (meteoric stone) removed from the Museum of the Geological Laboratory at Bandoeng, Java in April 1942, during the Japanese occupation of the Netherlands East Indies.

2. The original piece of astridite was cut in two by the Japanese and one-half, about the size of a fist, was sent to Japan.

3. The inclosed photograph of the astridite shows the most highly polished side. Since the stone was cut, it is likely that at least one side is rough. The color of the stone is bright green. The light colored veins and spaces in the photograph are in reality white.

4. It has been reported that this geological material was presented to the Emperor of Japan and placed in the imperial collection at Tokyo.

5. The required report is to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 20 January 1947.

1. Reference is made to Central Liaison Office letter No. 5489 (CM), dated 16 October 1946, subject as above, in which mention is made of so-called "permits" allegedly issued by Allied Forces to various vessels.
2. Japanese vessels on voyages extending outside of Japanese territorial waters are required to carry on board an authorization from the Administrator, Naval Shipping Control Authority for Japanese Merchant Marine (SCAJAP) specifically authorizing such voyage. With this exception, the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers has authorized the issuance of no other voyage permits.
3. The United States Army Military Government in Korea has advised the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers that its Bureau of Marine Transportation is the only agent authorized to issue permits to vessels, and that the only vessels now in authorized foreign trade by order of the above-mentioned Bureau are Baltic Coaster-type cargo vessels and vessels of the Chosen Steamship Company.

SUBJECT: Methods of Control under the Temporary Demand and Supply Adjustment Act

1. Reference is the Temporary Demand and Supply Adjustment Act.
2. The Imperial Japanese Government will withdraw from industry the powers of distribution control. The control of distribution of materials and products by the method of exclusive purchase and sale by a designated private company or association will be eliminated.
3. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers plans for carrying on distribution functions through a government distribution corporation. The purpose of such corporation will be to exercise necessary control functions where adequate distribution cannot be accomplished through normal distribution channels.
4. No agency will be designated by the Economic Stabilization Board under the Temporary Demand and Supply Adjustment Act without approval of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
5. The officers and employees of agencies or corporations established or designated under paragraphs 3 and 4, above, will not be permitted to be stockholders or employees or to have any beneficial interest in any company or enterprise engaged in the production or distribution of goods and materials under the control of the agency or corporation.
6. The Imperial Japanese Government will submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for approval, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, within ten (10) days from date of this Memorandum, proposed ministerial ordinances for the control of essential products and materials which are consistent with the policies set forth in this Memorandum.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present location and condition of a presentation sword and other valuables removed from the home of Mr. Edward Cock in Hong Kong during the week after the surrender of Hong Kong.

2. The sword, a presentation to Mr. Cock from the British Admiralty, was engraved as follows on the blade:

"Presented by The Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to Mr. E. Cock as having been Chief Captain of Engineer and Naval Construction Cadets for the year 1904-5."

3. The required report is to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 30 January 1947.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present location and condition of a collection of books, pamphlets and articles on the Oligochaeta (the group containing earthworms) owned by Dr. G. E. Gates. Reference property was removed from the middle floor, west end room, Biology Block of Judson College, Rangoon, during the Japanese occupation of Burma.

2. The books and pamphlets have the name of the owner, "G.E. Gates" written or rubber stamped thereon or "Judson College". A number of the pamphlets were from the libraries of deceased scientists and therefore were inscribed with names other than that of the owner. A number were presentation copies with inscriptions. Many of the pamphlets were stored in cardboard filing cases. The collection also included tubes, jars and bottles containing earthworms. Each container had a paraffin paper label bearing the name of the species.

3. The required report is to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 30 January 1947.

c. Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 014.33 (16 Oct 46)GC, (SCAPIN-1273), dated 16 October 1946, subject: "Repatriation to Korea".

2. Mass repatriation from Japan for former residents of China, Formosa, Manchuria and the Solomon, Marshall, Caroline, Bonin, Gilbert and Marianas Islands has been completed.

3. Mass repatriation from Japan will terminate upon completion of current repatriation programs for former residents of:

a. Korea, South of 38° North Latitude; estimated completion date, 15 December 1946; reference paragraph 1 c above.

b. The Ryukyu Islands, South of 30° North Latitude; estimated completion date, 26 December 1946; reference paragraph 1 b above.

4. Repatriation of former residents of localities named in paragraphs 2 and 3 above, remaining in Japan after termination of mass repatriation, will be considered only on the merits of each individual case and provided that proof is presented that individual did not forfeit his privilege of repatriation.
