estimate of further expenditures required to complete
the project.

1. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate and report on the present location and condition of the Danish motor vessel "Nordbo", seized by the Japanese Government in the Port of Kobe, Japan, June 1942. The subject vessel is reported to have been sunk on 25 September 1942, in Campong Bay, French Indo China.

2. The required report, to be submitted by 15 July 1947, will contain in addition a statement of the circumstances surrounding the seizure and subsequent sinking of the vessel, and a detailed statement as to the possibility of salvaging the ship.

The Japanese Government is hereby notified that patents, utility models, trademarks, designs, copyrights and contracts or licenses affecting or involving patents, utility models, trademarks, designs and copyrights, fall within the scope of the definition of "property" given in Appendix A of reference 1b above.
3. The Japanese Government is directed to take whatever steps are necessary to ensure inclusion of the property described in paragraph 2 above within the scope of measures taken in compliance with reference memoranda.
4. Attention is directed to the fact that proper protection has not been afforded by the Japanese Government to trademarks registered on 7 December 1941 in the names of nationals of the United Nations as required by reference 1a above; infringement of trademarks of the Singer Sewing Machine Company (American) and the Dunlop Rubber Company, Ltd. (British) have been reported to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 095 (13 Mar 47)GPC/PP, SCAPIN 3414-A, 13 March 1947, subject, "The Impounding, Blocking and Freezing of All Bank Accounts of Mr. Manbei Takeuchi, Osaka", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
2. Reference memorandum is amended to apply only to ¥35,576.18 of the funds now held in the account of Mr. Takeuchi in the Sanwa Bank, Osaka.
3. The Japanese Government is directed to transfer to the "Custody Account of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers" in the Bank of Japan, Tokyo, the amount of ¥35,576.18 now held in the Sanwa Bank, Osaka, under the name of Manbei Takeuchi, to be credited to the name of Iutipold-Werke, Munich, Germany.
4. All other property and assets of Mr. Takeuchi which were impounded, blocked or frozen shall be released from the provisions of reference memorandum. No further special restrictions are to be applied to the property of Mr. Takeuchi.
5. Within thirty (30) days from date of this memorandum the Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, a detailed report of compliance with this directive, together with appropriate evidence of bank transfers.

SUBJECT: Restitution of Cadillac Sedan Removed from the Philippine Islands

1. The Japanese Government is directed to impound immediately and place in protective custody in the looted vehicle warehouse at the Agricultural College, Setagaya-ku, Tokyo, the vehicle listed below:

Cadillac, 1941 model, grey, engine No. 7340543, body No. 417.

2. The vehicle described above was obtained by the Japanese Navy in October 1942 in Manila and is presently in the custody of Kuni-no-Miya, Miyashiro-cho, Shibuya-ku, Tokyo.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to restore the subject vehicle to the Government of the Republic of the Philippines on 16 June 1947 at the office of the Civil Property Custodian, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to deliver the vehicle to the office of the Civil Property Custodian and to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will inform General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment. This representative will report for instructions to the Civil Property Custodian on or before 14 June 1947.

5. The necessary copies of the receipt forms will be available for signature by the authorized representatives of the two governments concerned at the time and place of the actual restitution.

a. All Japanese prisoners of war and Japanese Nationals who are to be repatriated to Japan are informed in due time of their departure date, as well as of the amount of personal belongings and funds authorized to be taken with them, as prescribed by Section VI of the Agreement on Repatriation.

b. No receipts of any kind are given for the articles taken away from the Japanese either because of the customs regulations forbidding their export, or because they do not fall into the category of items which the Japanese are permitted to bring with them according to the agreement with General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of 19 December 1946.

c. Cases of supposedly illegal confiscation of financial and other documents belonging to the repatriates, which they are permitted to take with them in accordance with Section VI of the agreement, are unknown to the Soviet repatriation authorities and investigation by Soviet authorities has proved that no such cases have taken place.





b. Each vessel will display in the prescribed manner only the International code flag "E" (Easy), except that a vessel operating within the authorized Japanese fishing area will fly in addition the flag of the Japanese Merchant Marine.

c. The master of each of the participating factory ships during the periods enroute to and from the Antarctic Whaling Area will forward a daily radiogram to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo listing the location of his ship at 1200 hours on the date the radiogram is dispatched.

d. The master of each of the participating factory ships during the whaling operations in the authorized Antarctic Whaling Area will forward a daily radiogram to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo listing the following information:

- (1) Location of his ship at 1200 hours on the date radiogram is dispatched.
- (2) Number and kind of whales processed on his ship during the previous 24-hour period ending at 1200 hours and output of whale oil, meat, blubber, and other products.

e. Applications for frequencies for radio communications by the whaling fleet will be made to Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

f. Each vessel will proceed to and return from the Antarctic Whaling Area by the most direct route and without approaching any land nearer than 12 miles except when passing through the Lombok Straits, where continuous passage must be maintained. The route to be followed by each vessel to and from the Antarctic Whaling Area will be supplied by the Japanese Government to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Commander, Naval Forces Far East, 15 days prior to departure of each vessel from Japanese ports and from the Antarctic Whaling Area.

g. The master of each of the factory ships on departing from the Antarctic Whaling Area will dispatch a radiogram to the Japanese Bureau of Fisheries in Tokyo stating date of departure.

5. The Japanese Bureau of Fisheries will maintain at its office in Tokyo a file of all radiograms required to be dispatched in accordance with paragraph 4 for reference by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers when desired.

6. The whale oil produced by operations in the Antarctic Whaling Area will be transported to Japan and as soon as possible after arrival the oil will be suitably stored and safely guarded. Within ten days of storage, the Japanese Government will notify the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of the location of the place or places of storage and the amount stored. Final disposition of the whale oil will be the subject of a further memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers to the Japanese Government.

7. The attention of the Japanese Government is directed to memorandum on the whaling industry referred to in paragraph 1 g. above. Reports called for in accordance with referenced memorandum will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers by 1 June 1948.

8. This authorization does not establish any precedent for whaling operations in the Antarctic area or in any other area for any subsequent period of time; nor is it an expression of Allied policy relative to ultimate determination of national jurisdiction, international boundaries or fishing and whaling operations in the area concerned, or in any other area.
