MEMORANDUM

U.S. Governments have had under consideration the question of the dispersal of credit balances which may be due to Japanese Prisoners of War and personnel protected by the Sick and Wounded Convention on repatriation.

U.S. Governments desire to inform the Japanese Government that in the case of such personnel they will adhere to the policy followed by them throughout the war in regard to the settlement of claims by prisoners of war for credit balances which may have accrued to them during their captivity, viz; that, on repatriation, the amount of such credit balances should not be paid out by the detaining Powers but should be notified to the ex-prisoners' own Government who would then be responsible for settlement with the individual concerned, adjustments between the Governments concerned being taken into account in any post-war settlement.

2. Paragraph 3 of the referenced memorandum is amended, as an interim measure, to permit the manufacture of finished medicinal narcotic drugs as required for the medical needs of the Japanese people.

3. Crude and semi-processed narcotics now held in custody by Occupation Forces shall be received, receipted for, and delivered into the custody of duly licensed manufacturers by the Japanese Government as approved by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

4. Complete monthly reports of stocks on hand shall be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the Japanese Government no later than the last day of the month following the month for which the report is made.

5. Direct communication with the Narcotic Control Branch, Public Health and Welfare Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, is authorized for the entire process including the plan for accomplishing manufacture of the narcotics, transfer of custody, secure storage of stocks, and estimating requirements for the medical needs of the Japanese people.

1. Reference is made to the following:
 - a. Memorandum to Central Liaison Office, file 410.4 (4 Apr 47) CPC/FP, 4 April 1947, subject, "Diamonds Removed from South Celebes, Netherlands East Indies", from Civil Property Custodian;
 - b. C.L.O. No. 3721(RP), 15 May 1947, same subject.
2. The Central Liaison Office is directed to broaden the investigation on the diamond collecting activities of the Nomura Tooindo Shokusan Kabushiki Kaisha in the Netherlands East Indies, outlined in reference la above, to include Borneo. The following Japanese connected with the company are reported to have carried on the firm's business in that area: Hirashima, M. Matukawa, I. Tuhida and Morita.
3. The Central Liaison Office is also directed to submit a complete report on the removal of diamonds from the Netherlands East Indies by the Japanese Navy, containing such pertinent data as:
 - a. Total number of carats removed from each area of the Netherlands East Indies;
 - b. Records of shipment of diamonds to Japan;
 - c. Ultimate disposition made of the property in Japan.
4. According to the information received, shipments of diamonds from the Netherlands East Indies were consigned to the Navy Department in Tokyo, Kai Gun Sho, for delivery to the Chief of the Nanpo Seimubu Heibi Kyoko. The diamonds from Celebes, it has been reported, were in the safe of the Kaigun Cho Kyoku (chief paymaster) at Tokyo at the time of the surrender. Regarding shipment of diamonds from Borneo, it is estimated that from the beginning of the Japanese occupation until about November 1944, monthly shipments of 4,000 carats per shipment and from November 1944 until about June 1945, weekly shipments of 4,000 carats were forwarded to Japan, a total of about 216,000 carats of rough and cut diamonds. These shipments were as a rule sent by air to Japan through the intermediary of Shokei Ka. The Central Liaison Office is directed to verify all these above stated facts.

'a. an assumption that the Chinese quarters asked for his being barred from public service is completely fabulous;

'b. The Chinese quarters have never intended nor have at present any intention whatsoever that he be purged.'

"However, regarding paragraph 1-c, Mr. HSIEH states that he was misquoted. What he actually said is as follows:

'c. I know, as many other Chinese know, that Mr. NARAHASHI is a capable person and I feel that, if he is cleared regarding his public office qualification, and from all what I know, the Chinese Mission will have no objection to his case.'

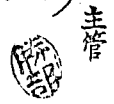

3. In carrying out the provisions of the memorandum:

a. All assets of said companies shall be disposed of in accord-
ance with existing legislation and ordinances, by open market sale, or
in such other manner as may be fair and equitable.

b. The Holding Company Liquidation Commission may remove any
officers of said companies or appoint officers to act as liquidators.

c. The Holding Company Liquidation Commission may require the
companies to furnish reports and information or inspect any books or
records.

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of restoration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions, will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the Japanese Government will afford the restoree the option either to allow the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the restoration of the property to it. Should the restoree decide to terminate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to provide it vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a statement as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration;

d. Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the property will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subsequently. Transfer of title will be made at the Judicial Bureau, or its branch offices, having jurisdiction;

e. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free yen account status.

4. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property with documentary evidence of the transfer of title will be submitted to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten days of completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation certified as correct.
