The United Kingdom Liaison Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Diplomatic Section of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and has the honour to refer to the Diplomatic section's Note of the 8th May 1947 transmitting a copy of the Central Liaison Office's memorandum No. 3156 (W) of 26 April 1947, and to state for General Headquarters information that as a result of careful enquiries which have been made it is considered that the charges made by implication in the memorandum of the Central Liaison Office are frivolous and ill-founded. The facts are as follows:

(a) Responsibility for maintaining lists of cash impounded from individual members of the Japanese Forces was placed on the Japanese Commander on the spot. In some cases the details were recorded in the paybooks of the Japanese surrendered Personnel. The British Government considers that all valuables were improperly acquired and these were accordingly impounded and were handed over to the Custodian of Enemy Property in British territory. Valuables and indigenous currency impounded in Allied countries were handed over to the Governments concerned.

(b) Japanese Surrendered Personnel in South East Asia surrendered unconditionally as units to Commanders in the field and the question of notification of capture does not therefore arise. However, a nominal roll of all the Japanese Surrendered Personnel in the South East Asia theatre has been prepared under arrangements made by Lieut. General Numata, the Acting Commander of the Japanese Expeditionary Force in the Southern Regions and these nominal rolls have been lodged with the Demobilization Bureau in Tokyo.

(c) Japanese Surrendered Personnel are not permitted to possess money. There is therefore no point in establishing canteens especially since the official rations include soap and 30 cigarettes per man per week. In addition, five tons of tobacco, and 50,000 cigarettes have been issued free. British welfare organisations have provided 80 wireless sets for J.S.P. Camps, and games equipment to the value of Singapore \$50,000 in addition to a free issue of surplus Indian athletic equipment. Periodic cinema shows are given. During April of this year, 730 Japanese Red Cross parcels of gramophone records, magazines, indoor games and similar amenities were distributed to camps.

(d) The desirability of issuing working pay certificates has been recognized and considerable thought has been given to the preparation of a workable scheme. This question has been under discussion in London and Washington and is, it is believed, now awaiting a decision by the Far Eastern Commission.

(e) The charge that no distinction of ranks has been maintained is absolutely without foundation. The status of officers and non-commissioned officers has been strictly observed. Officers are employed only in a supervisory role.

(f) Subject to a favourable Decision by the Far Eastern Commission regarding the issue of working pay certificates, Japanese Surrendered Personnel injured on duty will continue to receive payment during any period of disability provided the findings of the War Court of Enquiry support the contention that the individual was in fact injured while on duty.

(g) Personal correspondence between members of the surrendered Japanese Forces in the Southern Regions is encouraged. Letters are issued as soon as received from Japan and in fact, in order to assist in maintaining the morale of Japanese Surrendered Personnel the Headquarters of South East Asia Land Forces have previously urged that every endeavour should be made to persuade persons in the homeland to write frequently to their relatives in South East Asia.

SUBJECT: Funds and Accounts in Connection with Radiotelephone Service to the United States.

1. This directive pertains to the radiotelephone service between the United States and Japan, and becomes effective immediately.
2. The Ministry of Communications will collect a deposit of twelve dollars in Military Payment Certificates from the person filing a call on the transpacific telephone circuit, at the time a call is filed. A receipt for this amount will be issued to the depositor, the form for which will also bear pertinent instructions relative to completing a call to the United States, and to regulations in the matter of collecting any refund due. The prescribed form is shown in Inclosure 1.
3. The Ministry of Communications will comply with the provisions set forth in the receipt form, and will adhere to the following procedure with regard to amounts at variance with the sum required to cover all charges due the carriers, for transpacific telephone service:
 - a. Unclaimed deposits will be retained by the Ministry of Communications, subject to claim, for a period of ninety days from the date of deposit.
 - b. All such unclaimed deposits, and any amounts which the Ministry of Communications fails to collect for payment of calls and report charges, will be accounted for in records maintained by the Ministry of Communications. Such records will include sufficient detail to identify the source of funds or debt concerned, with the specific call or report charge with which it is related.
 - c. The Ministry of Communications is authorized to make up deficits in the amount collected in Japan for payment of calls and report charges, pertaining to the transpacific telephone circuit, out of funds accumulated from unclaimed deposits or overcharges for this service, which have been on hand in excess of ninety days from the date of deposit.

The amount used for this purpose will be applied in payment of any shortages in revenue accruing from the operation of the radiotelephone circuit with the United States. Nothing herein contained, however, will be construed to relieve the Ministry of Communications of the responsibility for currently paying in full the share of revenue due to the American carrier, in accordance with existing directives. Deficiencies in revenue, caused by failure of the Ministry of Communications to collect appropriate charges or for other reasons, which are not offset by funds made available to cover deficiencies in accordance with this directive, will be deducted from the Ministry's share of revenue.

d. Within ninety days of the date of the deposit refunds may be applied for in person at the office where the original deposit was made. The original receipt form, issued by the Ministry of Communications, must be surrendered with each application for refund. The Ministry of Communications will refund any amount due and for which an application is made in this manner.

e. When an application for refund is made by mail, postmarked within ninety days from the date such funds were deposited, and when in such cases there is an amount in excess of fifty cents (\$0.50) due, the amount to be refunded will be deposited with the "Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds" who will arrange to forward the amount, less any necessary expenses in connection therewith, to the applicant. In cases where an application for refund is made by mail, and records show that no refund is due, the Ministry of Communications will prepare a reply memorandum which will be submitted to the "Transfer Agent" for forwarding to the applicant. The reply memorandum will briefly state the reason for disallowing the refund, such as expiration of the ninety days period during which a refund is allowed, the amount is less than fifty cents (\$0.50), or other applicable reason. The Ministry of Communications will furnish the "Transfer Agent" with the complete mailing address of the applicant. The Ministry of Communications will retain a copy of each such communication, including receipts for funds deposited with the "Transfer Agent" in connection with refund procedures, for a period of one year.

f. Funds accumulated by the Ministry of Communications as unclaimed deposits or overcharges, which have been held by the Ministry of Communications for ninety days without claim thereto, and which have not been applied against shortages in the Ministry's accounts, will revert to the Ministry of Communications. Such funds will be deposited with the "Transfer Agent", with a statement identifying their source, who will effect conversion of Military Payment Certificates to Japanese yen, at the current military conversion ratio, and will pay the Japanese yen to the Ministry of Communications and obtain a receipt therefor.

2. Refundable deposits which are now in the hands of the Ministry of Communications will be treated in accordance with the above procedure, except that applications for refund which have not been acted upon, will be settled prior to settling any balance of unclaimed funds in favor of the Ministry of Communications.

1. Colonel Guy H. Stubbs surrendered to the Japanese on Bataan on 9 April 1942. On his departure from the Philippine Islands on 2 July 1944, he had a savings book with a balance of ¥3,954.00 due him from the Davao Branch of the Bank of Taiwan, representing the balance of pay due him as a prisoner of war under Japanese regulations. This savings book was lost on the prison ship while en route to Japan.

2. After the end of the war, Colonel Stubbs was paid approximately ¥2,000.00 for the period 1 September 1944 to 31 August 1945. He was not at that time paid for the period prior to 1 September 1944.

3. The Japanese Government is directed to make a thorough investigation and to furnish the Civil Property Custodian, by 1 August 1947, with a report as to the balance of ¥3,954.00 which is due Colonel Stubbs. If this amount has been paid, a statement of the date and circumstances of payment should be submitted. If this amount has not been paid, statement of the present status and location of the account should be included.


