SUBJECT: Control of Radio Communications.

1. 2. Inclosure 1, with amendments attached, is a Geographical List of Authorized Japanese Radio Stations as of 1 July 1947.

3. Inclosures 2 and 3 contain the same information and are the same as Inclosure 1 except the listings are made according to frequency and call letter sequence, respectively.

4. Inclosure 4 is a list of definitions, abbreviations and limitations pertaining to the frequency assignments which appear in the three lists.

5. Inclosure 5 is a list of Japanese Ship Radio Stations and their assigned frequencies authorized by this memorandum.

6. Inclosure 6 is a list of inactive police radio stations. The retention on an inactive status of these stations is authorized. This does not constitute authority to operate these stations.

7. All radio stations, together with frequencies allocated thereto, previously authorized by SCAPIN-1166 and amendments thereto, are hereby authorized.

8. All radio station licenses bearing the SCAP Registry No. assigned by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 676.3 (29 Aug 46) CCS (SCAPIN-1166), dated 29 August 1946, subject: Control of Radio Communications, as amended, which are in conformance with Inclosure 1, are herewith re-authenticated by this memorandum.

9. The Japanese Government will require that a station license be issued to each ship radio station listed in Inclosure 5. The license issued will bear the SCAP Registry No. appearing in the second column of the list of Japanese Ship Radio Stations, Inclosure 5.

10. Licenses will be issued to any additional radio stations only when operation of such radio stations is approved by the Ministry of Communications and the authorization subsequently authorized by Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Licenses will be printed in both Japanese and English and will be posted in a conspicuous place in the transmitter room of the licensed station.

11. The Japanese Government will exercise the utmost surveillance by monitoring methods and take such action as may be necessary to assure that no unauthorized radio stations are permitted to operate.

12. Hereafter, all applications for additions, deletions and changes to the lists of authorized radio stations will be submitted by the Ministry of Communications directly to the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, which Section will advise the Ministry of Communications by memorandum of the action taken on the application.

13. At the end of each two-month period beginning 1 July 1947, the Ministry of Communications will have complete lists printed of all additions, deletions and changes that were authorized during the preceding two-month period and deliver six hundred (600) copies of these

printed lists to the Civil Communications Section within ten days after the end of each two-month period.

14. Beginning 15 July 1947 and every six months thereafter, on 15 July and 15 January of each year, the Ministry of Communications will have new lists printed of all the stations and frequencies authorized by this memorandum, including all additional authorizations that were made during the previous six-month period, making such additions, deletions and changes to the lists that were authorized during that period. The lists and quantities to be provided, and delivered to the Civil Communications Section, are as follows:

15. Temporary authorizations will be made by direct communication between Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications, and will not appear in any printed list.

16. Direct communications between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers and the Ministry of Communications, regarding matters within the scope of this memorandum, are authorized.

- (2) Percent of project completed.
- (3) If not complete, estimated date when project will be completed.

b. Upon completion of the project, or upon request at any time  
prior to completion, a report stating that the materials and equipment used  
in the construction, reconstruction or rehabilitation were purchased at or  
below official prices.

1. Reference is made to Central Liaison Office 3886 (ECI), 22 May 1947, Central Liaison Office 3590 (ECI), 10 May 1947, and Central Liaison Office 4409 (EG), 6 June 1947, which reported location and quantities of raw silk and fabricated silk materials formerly the property of the Japanese Army and Navy, which were released for domestic consumption by the former Japanese Army and Navy immediately following the termination of the war and prior to the issuance of SCAPIN 53, dated 24 September 1945.

2. Preliminary investigation of some of the reported cases reveals that a considerable quantity of the subject raw silk has been processed, and is no longer held as raw silk. Though the quantity so processed exceeds 1000 bales it is directed that the Japanese Government at this time make available 1000 bales as specified below at once for the needs of the occupation as replacement for a part of the Japanese Army and Navy raw silk which has been processed into forms which are unsuitable for the needs of the Occupation Forces.

3. Total occupation force requirements and disposition of existing stocks formerly the property of the Japanese Army and Navy and not required by Occupation Forces will be the subject of further instructions.

4. The release of the subject silk as restricted by AG 091.3 (25 Sep 45) ESS, dated 25 September 1945, paragraph 2 a, is approved and the following specifications will be applied:

REPATRIATION TO AND FROM JAPAN

SECTION I - GENERAL PLAN

- 1. a. The following plan governing the repatriation to and from Japan, now in effect, will continue until otherwise directed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
- b. The entire plan revolves around the use of reception centers and the flow of persons to be repatriated through these centers in the numbers that can be accommodated by the available shipping and rail transportation.
- c. Under this plan non-Japanese nationals who, having registered as being desirous of repatriation, fail to comply with the instructions of the Japanese Government for consummation of their repatriation, forfeit their privilege to repatriation and will not be considered in any future repatriation plans. A list of such persons by name will be maintained by the Japanese Government.

d. Exception to paragraph 1 c above may be made in the case of families which cannot comply with plans of the Japanese Government for their repatriation, due to circumstances over which they have no control. Insofar as practicable the immediate family group should be considered a unit, and should be repatriated as a unit, unless members thereof have forfeited their privilege of repatriation.

2. The Sasebo Reception Center will be used to process Korean repatriates leaving Japan. Reception centers to process other non-Japanese nationals will be designated.

3. The Japanese Ministry of Welfare will:

- a. Arrange for the necessary transportation to move incoming repatriates, except for such personnel as may be designated by the local United States Army Commanders supervising processing, from the reception centers within twenty-four (24) hours after completion of processing.
- b. Establish controls to fix in their present abodes non-Japanese nationals, desiring return to their homelands, until such time as they are directed to move under the provisions of this plan.

c. Prohibit the use of active reception centers as housing except as required in the actual processing and quarantine of repatriates.

4. The Japanese Government will be furnished schedules governing the movement of repatriation shipping as follows:

a. Japanese merchant and naval vessels and other Japanese-manned ships, by the Shipping Control Authority for the Japanese Merchant Marine.

b. Allied vessels by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

5. Control.

a. The Japanese Government will direct its representatives at reception centers to:

(1) Organize outgoing non-Japanese repatriates into groups under selected group leaders prior to embarkation.

(2) Thoroughly instruct these groups in shipboard routine and sanitary measures to be observed.

(3) Insure orderly embarkation of groups.

b. The local Japanese officials will utilize every legal means available to control repatriates, while in Japan and aboard Japanese-manned vessels.

SECTION II - REPATRIATION TO KOREA

6. Mass repatriation of Koreans from Japan to Korea south of 38° north latitude was completed on 28 December 1946.

7. Repatriation of Koreans from Japan to Korea north of 38° north latitude was completed 26 June 1947.

8. Repatriation of Korean prisoners.

a. The Japanese Government will not repatriate Korean civil prisoners from Japan until they have served their terms of imprisonment and are duly released from confinement. This shall not be construed as in any way infringing upon the prerogative of the Japanese Government to remit or mitigate sentences.

2. Under this plan it is the responsibility of the Japanese Government to plan and implement the repatriation of Korean nationals from Japan to Korea. This responsibility will not be delegated wholly or in part to any of the various Korean associations or societies.

SECTION III - REPATRIATION TO AND FROM THE RYUKYU ISLANDS

10. Mass repatriation of Ryukyans from Japan to the Ryukyu Islands south of 30° north latitude was completed on 28 December 1946.

11. Mass repatriation of Japanese from the Ryukyu Islands to Japan was completed on 31 December 1946.

SECTION IV - REPATRIATION FROM SOVIET AND SOVIET-CONTROLLED AREAS, BRITISH-CONTROLLED AREAS IN SOUTHEAST ASIA, AND CHINA.

12. Japanese repatriates arriving in Japan from British-controlled areas in Southeast Asia, and China (including Manchuria) will be processed in accordance with the provisions of this memorandum.

13. a. Repatriation of Japanese Nationals from Soviet and Soviet-controlled areas will be accomplished as prescribed. Repatriates will be processed through reception centers in Japan in general as follows:

<u>Area from Which Repatriated</u>	<u>Port in Japan</u>
<u>Karafuto and Kurile Islands</u>	<u>Hakodate</u>
<u>Siberia</u>	<u>Maizuru</u>
<u>North Korea</u>	<u>Sasebo or Maizuru</u>

b. Japanese repatriates will be processed as prescribed herein. In addition the Japanese Government will:

- (1) Allow the repatriates to retain authorized clothing and equipment issued by Soviet authorities.

(a) Use the English language when communicating with shore or ship stations in Soviet or Soviet-controlled areas.

(b) Accept custody of Japanese repatriates, which will be transferred by the Soviet authorities to them according to passenger lists and transfer documents written in the Russian language.

(c) After verification, sign the transfer documents presented by the Soviet authorities.

(d) Take special precautions, to include arrival at rendezvous points and ports in Soviet and Soviet-controlled areas during daylight hours, to avoid possible damage to ships and supplies.

(e) Report to stations in Soviet or Soviet-controlled ports the estimated time of arrival at rendezvous points and ports in Soviet and Soviet-controlled areas six (6) hours prior to arrival thereat.

(f) Make a copy of the document of transfer, referred to in paragraph 13 b (3) (c) above, when furnished by the Soviet authorities, part of the ship's log.

(g) Turn over the list of repatriates, referred to in paragraph 13 b (3) (b) above, to reception center authorities, if only one (1) copy is furnished by Soviet authorities. If more than one (1) copy is furnished, one (1) copy will be made part of the ship's log and extra copies will be turned over to reception center authorities.

(4) Inform the ships' masters that the Russian language will be used in all navigation messages issued from ports in Soviet and Soviet-controlled areas.

SUPPLY AND TRANSPORTATION

1. The following govern the provision of food, clothing, and other supplies for repatriates.

a. Adequate food, safe drinking water, clothing and medical supplies will be provided repatriates while enroute to and in the reception centers. Resupply will be arranged if trains are delayed while enroute to the reception centers.

b. All Japanese-manned vessels, including hospital ships, leaving designated ports in the home islands (paragraph 2 a, Annex II) will be provided by the reception centers with sufficient stocks of fuel (when prescribed), palatable food, safe fresh water, medical supplies, clothing and other items required for the ships' crews and repatriates on the outgoing and return voyages plus enough stocks to take care of unforeseen delays.

c. The cost of supplies and facilities for repatriates will be borne by the Japanese Government.

d. Supplies of food and clothing for the reception centers will be levied proportionally on all prefectures of Japan.

2. Transportation.

a. Water transportation will be provided without cost to repatriates.

b. Rail transportation will be provided without cost to authorized repatriates moving to reception centers under Japanese planned evacuation.

c. Vessels and trains will be clean, and adequate sanitary facilities therein will be provided.

d. Adequate fire fighting equipment and life rafts will be provided Japanese-manned repatriation vessels.

3. Emergency supplies furnished repatriation ships in foreign ports.

a. Arrangements have been made with the authorities who control ports outside of Japan to accept receipts for necessary supplies issued to Japanese-manned ships servicing those ports.

In processing repatriates from Soviet and Soviet-controlled areas, the initial dose of typhus vaccine will be administered to the repatriates the first day they are aboard ship, and the final dose will be administered at the reception centers in Japan.
    3. Cholera vaccine will be given during spring and summer to all incoming and outgoing repatriates.
  - (b) Only the initial dose of multi-dose vaccine need be administered at the reception centers if the flow of outgoing repatriates would be impeded otherwise, except that 2 inoculations against cholera will be administered to each Ryukyuan repatriate during the appropriate seasons.



With reference to the Japanese Government's Memorandum of April 11, 1947, C.L.O. No. 2649 (RJ) concerning the repatriation and treatment of Japanese nationals remaining in China, this Headquarters has received in response to inquiries a reply from the Chinese Mission in Japan, the pertinent portion of which is quoted below.

"The Mission has been instructed by the Chinese Government to reply as follows:

1. The Japanese technicians have remained in China out of their own free will. Those who desire to return to Japan have been either repatriated or are now being repatriated as fast as transportation facilities are made available.

2. All Japanese technicians who remain in China have been given living allowances. As to the request for remittances to their families in Japan, no action can be taken at the present since remittance between China and Japan is not allowed. This matter is however under negotiation between the Mission and G.H.Q.

3. Regarding general living conditions, maintenance of health and nutrition, the Japanese war criminals and suspects have been given full sympathetic consideration and treatment.

4. As to the Japanese now retained in territories under the control of the communist forces, they will be released and repatriated as soon as these territories are recovered by the Government."

b. One woman's ring with one stone, 8 mm square cut diamond, mounted in white gold, arm of ring decorated with incised flower;

c. Two men's rings each set with a 8 mm square cut diamond, mounted in white gold, ring arm decorated with incised flower.

2. The subject jewelry was removed on 6 December 1944 from the home of Mrs. Cordero at 300 - 304, Tayuman, Tondo, Manila, by members of the Japanese Military Police who raided the house.

3. The required report is to be submitted to the Civil Property Custodian by 10 September 1947.

1. Reference is made to the following:

- b. C.L.O. No. 3588(RP), 10 May 1947, same subject.

2. With regard to paragraph 2a of reference 1b above, information received from the Netherlands East Indies indicates that the Mangani Mine was operated by the Japanese authorities.

3. The Central Liaison Office is directed to make a further investigation of the Japanese operation of the two subject mines and to submit the information requested in paragraphs 1 and 2, reference 1a above, to the Civil Property Custodian by 25 August 1947.

4. With regard to paragraph 2b, (5) of reference 1b above, the Central Liaison Office is also directed to submit information as to the disposition made on its arrival in Japan of the 1 kg of platinum from the Mangani Mine. Information is also required as to how many natives were permitted to purchase the gold produced in the mine, prices paid and other details relating to the purchase of the gold.

SUBJECT: Repatriation of German and Austrian Nationals

1. References.

a. Nominal rolls of German and Austrian nationals to be repatriated, as follows: (Inclosure No. 1).

- (1) Part I - Objectionable German nationals subject to forcible repatriation.
- (2) Part II - German nationals formerly having diplomatic status.
- (3) Part III - Non-objectionable German and Austrian nationals desiring repatriation.

b. Medical and Sanitary Procedures (Inclosure No. 2).

c. Property Regulations and Procedures (Inclosure No. 3).

2. The Japanese Government will carry out instructions contained in this memorandum and inclosures thereto to effect the repatriation of persons listed in Inclosure No. 1 as follows:

a. Appoint an English speaking Japanese custodian for each family and for each individual not a member of a family as listed in Part I, Inclosure No. 1 (Objectionable German nationals subject to forcible repatriation). The Japanese Government will be responsible for maintenance of custodians during the period they are on duty. Custodians will:

- (1) Be available to inventory all property and will be in position during daylight hours to prevent removal of property from the premises.
- (2) Move in and live on the premises when so directed by officers in charge of Eighth United States Army

inspecting teams, at which time custodians will assume custody of all property, movable and immovable. They will not move in and live on the premises prior to departure of the repatriates except upon specific orders of officers in charge of inspecting teams.

(3) Guard and conserve property and process it in accord with instructions contained in Inclosure No. 3.

b. Appoint an English speaking Japanese custodian for each family and for each individual not a member of a family as listed in Part II, Inclosure No. 1 (German nationals formerly having diplomatic status). Custodians will:

(1) Together with the owner and a representative of the United States Eighth Army inventory all property which the former diplomats desire to leave behind.

(2) Upon departure of the repatriates, move in and live on the premises, and assume custody of all property left behind by the repatriates. This will be done when directed by the officer in charge, Eighth United States Army inspecting team.

(3) Guard and conserve property and process it in accordance with instructions contained in Inclosure No. 3.

c. Provide transportation for repatriates listed in Inclosure No. 1 and baggage authorized to accompany them (See Inclosure No. 3) from their present addresses to the reception center at Nagahana. Transportation will be arranged so that the repatriates will arrive at the reception center in numbers and on dates as specified by the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

d. Subsist, maintain and provide adequate medical care for all repatriates during movement to and during their stay at the reception center. Initially, a minimum of one week's supply of western style rations for each repatriate will be available at the reception center, and additional amounts will be furnished as required.

3. The Commanding General, Eighth United States Army, has been authorized to exempt from repatriation:

a. Japanese wives and children who desire to remain in Japan.

b. Those nationals who, upon examination by United States Army or Allied medical authorities, are considered physically unfit to travel. Immediately upon notification of repatriation, each repatriate will be informed of this, and if unfit for travel will be directed to report to the nearest

military government unit for physical examination. In the event that any member of a family is exempted due to physical or mental infirmities, all members of that immediate family, including mother, father, dependent children and other dependents will be exempted also. Report will be made immediately to Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of any personnel exempted from repatriation for above reasons.

4. The Japanese Government will carry out the instructions contained in this memorandum and inclosures thereto under the supervision and administrative direction of the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army. A liaison agent from the Central Liaison Office will be designated to report to the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army upon receipt of this memorandum to effect direct liaison between the Japanese Government and the Eighth United States Army until the completion of repatriation of the foreign nationals listed in Inclosure No. 1.

5. Upon completion of this repatriation, the Japanese Government will report immediately to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers the names of all persons repatriated and persons whose names appear in Inclosure No. 1, but who were not repatriated, with reasons therefor in each case.
