MEDICAL AND SANITARY PROCEDURES

1. The Welfare Ministry will carry out the following medical and sanitary procedures as minimum requirements incidental to subject repatriation:

a. Physical inspections for detection of louse infestation, and of cases and suspects of quarantinable diseases (cholera, plague, smallpox, louse-borne typhus, yellow fever) or of communicable diseases which might prejudice the health of subsequent contacts will be made at each repatriate's home before repatriation commences. If it is determined that a repatriate should not depart due to disease or infirmity, this fact will be reported to the Eighth United States Army inspection team immediately, and the repatriate will be given a physical inspection by an Allied medical officer. Names of those exempted from repatriation will be reported immediately to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

b. Hospitalization or other effective segregation of persons known or suspected to be infected with quarantinable or significant communicable diseases, until communicability has passed. These persons will not be moved to the reception center until communicability has passed.

c. Appropriate measures for continued observation of persons known to have had contact with a quarantinable disease of a type liable to convey infection. Observation will continue during the incubation period of the disease concerned, calculated from the day of last contact. The following incubation periods will be observed: Smallpox - 14 days, louse-borne typhus - 12 days, plague - 6 days, cholera - 6 days, and yellow fever - 6 days.

d. Immunizations to be given at reception center.

- (1) All repatriates will be vaccinated against smallpox.
- (2) Typhus vaccine will be administered to all repatriates not vaccinated within the previous four months.
- (3) Only the initial dose of a multi-dose vaccine need be administered at the reception center if the flow of repatriates would otherwise be impeded.

(4) Vaccine necessary for medical processing will be furnished by the Eighth United States Army.

e. Physical inspection during daylight hours, except in exceptional circumstances in which the flow of repatriates would otherwise be impeded.

f. Attachment to the passenger manifest of a blanket certificate to the effect that all required procedures have been accomplished.

g. Maintenance of records required to comply with international quarantine procedures.

PROPERTY REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES

I. General.

1. The term "property" shall include all movable and immovable property and all rights and interests in or claims to such property whether matured or not, including all property, rights, or trustees and all property, rights, interest or claims transferred by way of gifts or otherwise, or for consideration, express or implied, but not including the rights or interests of third parties to a bona fide sale for full consideration, and shall include but shall not be limited to buildings and lands, goods, wares and merchandise, chattels, coin, bullion, currency, deposits, accounts, or debts, shares, claims, bills of lading, warehouse receipts, all kinds of financial instruments whether expressed in Reich Marks or in any foreign currency, evidences of ownership of property, contracts, judgments, rights in or with respect to patents, copyrights, trademarks, etc., and in general property of any nature whatsoever.

2. Attention is invited to the Memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 130 (22 Sep 45)ESS, (SCAPIN 45) dated 22 September 1945, and Appendix A thereto. In addition, all sales, gifts or transfers of any kind of movable or immovable property by foreign nationals to be repatriated in accordance with these instructions is prohibited, except as specifically exempted for former German diplomatic personnel and for non-objectionable personnel, as provided in Paragraphs III and IV of these regulations.

II. Objectionable German Nationals (Part I, Inclosure No. 1).

1. General. When the Eighth United States Army inspection team representative directs, the Japanese custodian will take over all property, both movable and immovable, in excess of that to accompany the repatriate to the port as indicated in paragraphs 2, 3 and 4 below, and the custodian will guard and conserve this property and process it in accordance with instructions herewith. Prior to the departure of the repatriates, the custodian will be on duty at the premises during daylight hours.

The custodian will not live in the house of the repatriate during the period prior to departure of the repatriates, except when specifically directed to do so by the officer in charge of the Eighth United States Army inspection team. However, he will be available during daylight hours to inventory all property and to prevent removal of property from the premises. When directed by the Eighth United States Army inspection team, after departure of the repatriates, the custodian will move in and live on the premises at all times as long as any property, movable or immovable, remains in his custody.

2. Property Which May be Taken. Those nationals being repatriated who are classified as "objectionable" (Part I, Inclosure No. 1) will be allowed to take with them only \$50 (United States currency) or its equivalent in any other monies except yen. Each repatriate will be informed that the current conversion rate is three and one-third (3 1/3) marks for one (1) United States dollar; other foreign currency at official rate. Yen is not approved for export. Each repatriate will be allowed to take with him 350 pounds (159 kg) of personal effects per person, not to exceed 1,500 pounds (682 kg) per family. The following financial instruments are exempted from seizure: personal bank books, personal insurance policies, non-negotiable savings certificates, or any other non-negotiable documents.

3. Seizure of Personal Effects. Personal effects will not be seized for custody except those in excess of maximum baggage limits and limits as set forth in paragraph 4 below.

4. Prohibited Items. "Objectionable" nationals will be prohibited from taking with them the following articles:

- a. Watches in excess of two watches per adult, or four watches per family, regardless of value.
- b. Cameras in excess of one camera, including moving picture types, per adult, or three cameras per family.
- c. Necklaces and bracelets in excess of two necklaces and two bracelets per adult regardless of the value.
- d. Rings, precious stones, bullion and all other jewelry except that which has sacred or marital significance. One child's ring of nominal value may be allowed each child.
- e. All table silverware and flat silverware in excess of complete service for 6 persons in case of a single individual or a family of 6 persons or less; in case of families composed of more

than 6 persons, the flat silverware service allowable will be increased correspondingly to the increase in the number in the family. Examples as follows:

- (1) Single person - complete flat silverware service for 6 persons.
- (2) Family of 6 persons or less - complete flat silverware service for 6 persons.
- (3) Family of 7 persons - complete flat silverware service for 7 persons.

f. Firearms, ammunition or weapons of any sort.

5. Property Inventory. Inventory of property of "objectionable" nationals will be processed in the following manner:

a. The owner and custodian will together inventory all property which is to be stored. Prior to the inventory, property will be divided into three categories as follows:

- (1) Small items of high intrinsic value such as cash in excess of limits as set forth in paragraph 2 above, bullion, bills of lading, warehouse receipts, financial instruments, evidences of property ownership, contracts, judgments, rights in or with respect to patents, copyrights, trademarks, jewels and jewelry in excess of that which may be taken, and similar items, the safekeeping of which requires bank vault storage. No items of jewelry or small items of intrinsic value will be included which have a value of less than \$50 (U.S.) per item or set. Each copy of inventory will show in the upper left-hand corner thereof the repatriate's number as listed on the nominal roll of repatriates.
- (2) All other movable property, except that which accompanies the repatriate. Any item of movable property inventoried by the repatriate and the Japanese custodian which is deemed by the Eighth United States Army inspection team to be of insufficient value to warehouse will be lined out, initialed and added to the end of the immovable property inventory.

- (3) All immovable property, i.e. lands and buildings, to include all such property owned within the prefecture of the repatriate's residence, other prefectures of Japan, or abroad, plus movable property left on the premises as stated in (2) above.
- b. Each category of property will be inventoried separately.
- c. Seven copies in English will be made of each inventory of high intrinsic value (5a(1) above) and movable property (5a(2) above), typed or in ink, and each copy will be signed by the owner and by the custodian. Disposition of these copies will be as follows:
 - (1) One copy retained by the owner as his record and receipt.
 - (2) One copy dispatched immediately by the Eighth Army officer in charge of repatriation operations in each area, to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attn: Civil Property Custodian.
 - (3) One copy, receipted by the Eighth United States Army custodian to whom the property is turned over, will be retained by the Japanese custodian.
 - (4) The remaining four copies will be used for future property transfer.
- d. Only four copies of immovable property will be made and disposition will be as follows:
 - (1) One copy retained by the owner as his record and receipt.
 - (2) One copy dispatched immediately by the Eighth Army officer in charge of repatriation operations in each area, to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attn: Civil Property Custodian.
 - (3) One copy, receipted by the Eighth United States Army custodian to whom the property is turned over, will be retained by the Japanese custodian.

- (4) One copy to be retained by Eighth United States Army representative for record purposes.
- e. Care will be exercised in filling out the forms completely and uniformly. The custodian will supervise and protect all property left when the repatriate departs.
- f. The inspecting team, before departure of the repatriates, will physically check all inventory records upon completion, verify their accuracy and proper signature thereon by both parties.
- 6. Inventory Lists of Movable and Immovable Property. The inventory lists of movable property in excess of baggage allowance, and immovable property will contain the following information:
 - a. Name of Owner.
 - b. In the upper left-hand corner of each copy of each inventory will be shown the repatriate's number as indicated on the nominal roll of repatriates.
 - c. Address of Owner. (Address in Japan)
(Address in home country, if known)
 - d. In the case of movable property each box, trunk and crate and all unpacked articles will be tagged and numbered consecutively, each separate container will be marked plainly and indelibly with the repatriate's number as indicated on the nominal roll of repatriates and the inventory will contain a list of all items by number and description. Boxes and trunks will contain one package inventory inside the container and one package inventory permanently attached to the outside thereof. One key for each of any locked containers will be placed in a sealed envelope and wired to the container. All copies of the inventory of each container will be signed by the repatriate and the custodian.
 - e. Address at which property is located.
 - f. Name and address of custodian.
- 7. Livestock of all types will be taken into custody, concentrated in one location, and a Japanese custodian placed in

charge thereof. The Japanese Government is charged with the maintenance of such animals.

8. Foodstuffs of non-perishable nature left by repatriates will be collected and placed under custody of Eighth United States Army. Such items will be stored in the collecting point warehouse but will not appear on any inventory sheets. After the completion of inventorying, a consolidated list of such non-perishable foodstuffs will be dispatched immediately by repatriation officers in charge in each respective area to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attn: Civil Property Custodian.

9. Packing and Crating of Property. The Japanese Government will be required to furnish packing boxes, crating materials, other necessary materials, and personnel to prepare furniture, household property and other items left behind for storage upon departure of repatriates, and for crating of such personal property within the prescribed allowances to accompany the repatriate. In addition, arrangements will be made by the Japanese Government to weigh all baggage accompanying repatriates, before departure from their homes, to insure that prescribed allowances are not exceeded.

10. Disposition of Property Taken into Custody.

- a. Small items of high intrinsic value. Immediately upon inventory and proper packing, small items of high intrinsic value, noted in paragraph 5a(1) above, will be delivered to the inspection team representative of the Eighth United States Army who will receipt for and be responsible for delivery to the vaults, Bank of Japan, Tokyo or Osaka Mint, Osaka. The inventory, packing and delivery of high intrinsic items will be given priority over all other tasks.
- b. The Japanese Government will arrange for working teams to crate, pack and deliver to the nearest collecting point, noted in paragraph 11 below, all movable property to be warehoused as shown on the inventories. Crating and packing will begin immediately after inspection of property by the Eighth United States Army inspecting team, who will be informed when the crating and packing has been completed and the property is ready for shipment to a collecting point.
- c. The Japanese Government will guard all immovable property and all items stored therein pending further orders from the Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.

11. Collecting Points: Collecting points at which property will be turned in will be established by the Eighth United States Army at Nagahama, Kagohara and in the Kobe-Osaka area, in addition to warehouses in Tokyo.

12. Property of Japanese Wives. The processing of property of Japanese wives who elect to remain in Japan instead of accompanying their husbands, will be as follows:

- a. Japanese wife remaining in Japan whose husband is classified as "objectionable" may retain:
 - (1) Personal or real property which she can prove was acquired prior to marriage.
 - (2) Family movable property in the weight specified for repatriates to take with them.
- b. Japanese wife remaining in Japan whose husband is classified as "objectionable" will not be allowed to retain:
 - (1) Watches in excess of two.
 - (2) Necklaces and bracelets in excess of two.
 - (3) Rings, precious stones, bullion or other jewelry except that which has a sacred or marital significance.
 - (4) Firearms, ammunition or weapons of any sort.
- c. All movable or immovable property in which there is a German interest will be taken into custody.

III. German Nationals Formerly Having Diplomatic Status (Part II, Inclosure No. 1).

1. Each repatriate formerly having diplomatic status will be permitted to take from Japan 8000 pounds (3636 kg) of personal effects and household goods, provided that the size does not exceed 200 cubic feet per repatriate. However, all those repatriates having former diplomatic status will be clearly warned that existence of facilities at port of debarkation for handling more than 500 pounds per person is highly dubious.

2. German nationals formerly having diplomatic status may take with them United States dollars, German marks, or any other currency except yen, in an amount not to exceed the equivalent of \$250 (U.S.) at the rate of three and one-third

(3 1/3) marks for one (1) U. S. dollar. No yen will be taken by such repatriates. The following additional financial instruments are exempted from seizure: personal bank books, personal insurance policies, non-negotiable savings certificates, or any other non-negotiable documents.

3. German nationals formerly having diplomatic status are prohibited from taking with them any firearms, ammunition, or weapons of any sort.

4. Owners of real and/or personal property may sell such property prior to repatriation and use the proceeds therefor for any legal transactions within Japan prior to repatriation. Any proceeds remaining in possession of such former owners, in Japanese yen, will be seized by repatriation officials and listed on the high intrinsic items inventory as outlined in paragraph 7c below. Proceeds remaining in possession of such former owners, in U. S. dollars, German marks, or any other foreign currency, in excess of limits set forth in paragraph 2 above, will also be seized and listed on the high intrinsic items inventory, as outlined in paragraph 7c below.

5. Seizure of Personal Effects. Personal effects will not be retained for custody by repatriation officials except that property which the repatriates specifically designate be left. Repatriation officials will make certain that no oriental art objects and oriental jewelry are looted property. In case any looted property is discovered, the same will be seized and noted on the inventory of property left for United States Army custody as "looted".

6. Agents to be Appointed by Repatriates. In all cases in which a repatriate leaves real and/or personal property the repatriate will designate in writing in quadruplicate an agent in Japan to deal with Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers if and when the property is released. The original will be given to the designated agent, one copy will accompany the inventory copy forwarded to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attn: Civil Property Custodian, one copy retained by repatriate, and one copy by United States Eighth Army.

7. Property Inventory. Inventory of property of German nationals formerly having diplomatic status will be processed in the following manner:

- a. The owner, the Japanese custodian and a representative of the United States Eighth Army will together inventory all property which the repatriate chooses to leave. Prior to the inventory, property will be divided into three categories as follows:

- (1) Small items of high intrinsic value such as cash in excess of limits as set forth in paragraph 2 above, or other high intrinsic items voluntarily left by repatriates. No items, except cash, which have value of less than \$50 will be included.
- (2) All other movable property except that which accompanies the repatriate.
- (3) All immovable property, i.e. lands and buildings, to include all such property owned within the prefecture of the repatriate's residence, other prefectures of Japan, or abroad.

b. Each Category of Property will be Inventoried Separately.

c. Seven copies in English will be made of each inventory of high intrinsic value (7a(1) above) and movable property (7a(2) above), typed or in ink, and each copy will be signed by the owner, the Japanese custodian and the United States Eighth Army representative. Disposition of these copies will be as follows:

- (1) One copy retained by the owner as his record and receipt.
- (2) One copy dispatched immediately by the United States Eighth Army officer in charge of repatriation operations in each area, to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attn: Civil Property Custodian.
- (3) One copy, receipted by the United States Eighth Army custodian to whom the property is turned over, will be retained by the Japanese custodian.
- (4) The remaining four (4) copies will be used for future property transfers.

d. Only four (4) copies of inventory of immovable property will be made and disposition will be as follows:

- (1) One copy retained by the owner as his record and receipt.

- (2) One copy dispatched immediately by the United States Eighth Army officer in charge of repatriation operations in each area, to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Attn: Civil Property Custodian.
- (3) One copy, receipted by the United States Eighth Army custodian to whom the property is turned over, will be retained by the Japanese custodian.
- (4) One copy to be retained by the United States Eighth Army representative for record purposes.

8. Inventory Lists of Movable and Immovable Property.

- a. The inventory lists of movable property voluntarily left by repatriates, or left involuntarily at port of embarkation due to shipping space restrictions, and immovable property will contain the following information:
 - (1) Name of Owner.
 - (2) In the upper left-hand corner of each copy of each inventory will be shown the repatriate's number as indicated on the nominal roll of repatriates.
 - (3) Address of Owner. (Address in Japan)
(Address in home country, if known)
 - (4) In the case of movable property each box, trunk, and crate and all unpacked articles will be tagged and numbered consecutively, each separate container will be marked plainly and indelibly with the repatriate's number as indicated on the nominal rolls of repatriates, and each inventory will contain a list of all items by number and description. Boxes and trunks will contain one package inventory inside the container and one package inventory permanently attached to the outside thereof. One key for each of any locked containers will be placed in a sealed envelope and wired to the container. All copies of the inventory of each container will be signed by the repatriate and the custodian.

- (5) Address at which property is located.

9. Packing and Crating of Property. The Japanese Government will be required to furnish packing boxes, crating materials, other necessary materials, and personnel to prepare furniture, household property and other items left behind for storage upon departure of repatriates, and for crating of such personal property within the prescribed allowances to accompany the repatriate.

10. Disposition of Property Taken into Custody.

- a. The Japanese Government will arrange for working teams, to crate, pack and deliver to the nearest collecting point, noted in paragraph 11 below, all movable property to be warehoused as shown on the inventories. Crating and packing will begin immediately after inspection of property by the United States Eighth Army inspecting team, who will be informed when the crating and packing has been completed and the property is ready for shipment to a collecting point.
- b. The Japanese Government will guard all immovable property and all items stored therein pending further orders from the Commanding General, United States Eighth Army.

11. Collecting Points. Collecting points at which property will be turned in will be established by the United States Eighth Army at Nagahama, Kagohara and in the Kobe-Osaka area, in addition to warehouses in Tokyo.

IV. Non-Objectionable German Nationals (Part III, Inclosure No. 1).

1. Those nationals being repatriated who are classified as "non-objectionable" (Part III, Inclosure No. 1) will be allowed to take with them \$250 (U. S. currency) or its equivalent in any other monies, except yen, and not to exceed 500 pounds (227 kg) of personal effects per person. Repatriates will be informed that current conversion rate is three and one-third (3 1/3) marks to one (1) U. S. dollar.

2. Non-objectionable nationals are prohibited from taking with them any firearms, ammunition, or weapons of any sort.

3. No property restrictions or prohibitions other than those noted in paragraphs 1 and 2 above will apply to "non-objectionable" nationals. In case any "non-objectionable" repatriate has movable property in excess of the 500 pounds limitation per person, such repatriate will be advised that the

responsibility for its disposition, custody or safekeeping in Japan rests with the repatriate and that the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, or any other official agency of the Allied Powers, will not assume, in trust or otherwise, the custody or safekeeping thereof. It is, therefore, anticipated that no inventories of property of "non-objectionable" nationals will be necessary.

4. The Japanese Government will be required to furnish packing boxes, crating materials, other necessary materials, and personnel to crate, box and prepare for shipment all personal property within the prescribed weight allowances which is to accompany the repatriates. In addition, arrangements will be made by the Japanese Government to weigh all baggage accompanying repatriates before departure from their homes to insure that prescribed allowances are not exceeded.

5. A Japanese wife remaining in Japan, whose husband is classified as "non-objectionable" and being repatriated, may be allowed to retain, in addition to all property owned by her, whether title was acquired prior to marriage or not, all personal and real property of her German husband over and above his baggage limitations.

6. No Japanese custodian will be appointed in the case of any "non-objectionable" repatriate.

1. For planning purposes, the Japanese Government is hereby informed that on the initiation of the reparations transfer program, the principles and procedures outlined in the following paragraphs will be applicable.
2. In delivering reparations assets to claimant nations, the Japanese Government will bear all costs and perform all operations relative to the packaging, transfer, storage, delivery to a port in Japan for water-borne or air-borne craft, handling, and stowage on board the claimant nation's craft at that port.
3. Prior to the receipt of an allocation notice, the Japanese Government may be requested to furnish to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers a detailed step by step plan for the dismantling, packaging, and transportation of each plant or facility designated for reparations removal other than aircraft factories, army and navy arsenals, and privately owned munitions plants. Reference is Annex 1 for instructions.
4. Upon receipt of an allocation notice from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (references are Annex 2 and Annex 3 for forms), the Japanese Government will accomplish and be responsible for performing the following operations or actions:
 - a. Acquiring title from present owners to allocated reparations assets which are not already the property of the Japanese Government.
 - b. Necessary dismantling and disassembly of plants and equipment. Reference is Annex 4 for instructions.

Dismantling and disassembly operations will follow previously prepared plans.

- c. Cleaning and preservation, and packaging of equipment to standards which will ensure its stowage aboard the craft of the claimant nation in good order. - d. Supplying all materials and equipment required for dismantling, disassembly, cleaning and preservation, packaging, transportation to a port in Japan, storage in Japan, and loading and stowing with proper dunnage and bracing aboard the craft of the claimant nation.
- e. Marking of containers and preparing packing lists. Reference is Annex 7 for instructions.
- f. Preparing necessary constructional plans, drawings, and engineering data required for purposes of re-assembly, re-installation and/or re-erection.
- g. Transporting equipment to ports in Japan, designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, for water-borne or air-borne craft according to shipping schedules established by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers. Reference is Annex 8 for transportation permit form, designating the port and authorizing shipments thereto in order to meet established shipping schedules.
- h. Storing equipment whenever necessary prior to stowage aboard the claimant nation's craft.
- i. Handling and loading of equipment up to, and including stowage with proper dunnage and bracing in, the claimant nation's craft. Stowage operations will be performed under the direction of the craft's officers.
- j. Guarding the equipment while enroute and in storage in Japan.
- k. Reporting the progress of removal operations. Reference is Annex 9 for instructions.
- l. Reporting the detailed costs of removal operations. The Japanese Government will furnish to Supreme

Commander for the Allied Powers within thirty (30) days of receipt of this memorandum copies of the forms proposed for cost accounting use. The proposed forms will be reviewed by Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers for their acceptability. Reported costs of removal will be subject to review by Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers who will disapprove any unjustified charge. Reports will be submitted according to the same schedule as prescribed for Progress Reports, reference Annex 9.

m. Making good any damage or shortage resulting from carelessness or negligence in the processes of dismantling, packaging, transporting, handling, storing, and stowing on board carrier if such damage or shortage occurred prior to final acceptance by the claimant nation aboard the carrier.

n. Making good any damage sustained by the carrier, resulting from loading, stowage and bracing cargo therein in a careless or negligent manner.

o. Other operations, not listed above, relative to the packaging, transfer, and delivery of allocated reparations assets.

5. Damage which is the result of faulty gear of the recipient nation's carrier, sustained by the equipment or carrier in the process of loading and stowing, will be the responsibility of the recipient nation.

6. Injury to Japanese personnel engaged in the loading and stowage of the recipient nation's carrier will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

7. Receipt for equipment delivered to the claimant nations for reparations will be given by the claimant nation upon the completion of the proper stowage of equipment aboard the claimant nation's craft. Reference is Annex 10 for receipt form and instructions. After the delivery receipt has been executed, the equipment will become the entire responsibility of the claimant nation. A representative of the claimant nation may be present at the dismantling of each facility and all subsequent operations up to the execution of the delivery receipt.

The powdered eggs, dried skim milk, and ice cream mix will be used with indigenous foods to manufacture a milk substitute for distribution to infants as part of the milk ration while the sugar will be used to supplement indigenous supplies for distribution to infants who receive imported and evaporated milk. Distribution will be made in accordance with the plans set forth in the CLO letters referred to in paragraph 1 above.

The Swedish Diplomatic Mission in Japan presents its compliments to the Japanese Ministry for Foreign Affairs and has the honour to indicate that the Swedish Legation in Bern, in charge of Japanese interests in Switzerland, has reported to the Swedish Foreign Ministry that one of their Japanese Beneficiaries, Masataka TAKAGI, has a great friend called Seiei SHINOHARA, who is lying ill in tuberculosis of the lungs in Wildeshausen, Oldenburg, the British Zone in Germany. TAKAGI has informed the Legation that both the British and the Swiss Authorities are favourably disposed towards the removal of SHINOHARA to Switzerland, where the prospects of his recovery are considerably greater. However, the conditions were first of all that his stay in Switzerland would be guaranteed financially by the protecting power Sweden.

The instructions contained in memorandum to the Japanese Government, reference paragraph 1, will be expanded to include delivery of official and commercial messages filed by Occupation Force military and accredited personnel for transmission over the domestic telegraph system between points within Japan.
3. In order to speed delivery of telegrams addressed to United States Occupation Force military and accredited civilian personnel in Japan this directive will supersede information regarding delivery included in the directive to which reference is made in paragraph 1 above, effective 1 October 1947 at 0001 hours or as otherwise directed in accordance with paragraph 4 of this memorandum. The directions for delivery of such Occupation Force telegrams as set forth under "Telegram Delivery Instructions" attached hereto as Appendix I will be placed in effect as indicated above.
4. Direct communications between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications in connection with the implementation of the provisions of this memorandum and within the scope thereof are authorized.

TELEGRAM DELIVERY INSTRUCTIONS

1. From information which will be furnished to the local telegraph offices throughout Japan on or before 1 September 1947 by the officer in charge of individual United States Occupation Force units, (in accordance with a form shown as Inclosure 1 hereto), the Ministry of Communications will set up and maintain on an up-to-date basis, an individual record in the English language of each such Occupation Force military unit or staff section in Japan which will show:
 - a. The designation (name) in full of the military unit or staff section.
 - b. The designation (name) in proper abbreviation thereof of the military unit or staff section.
 - c. The name of the city and prefecture in which the military unit or staff section is located.
 - d. The complete local address of the headquarters office of the military unit or of the administrative division of a staff section within the city listed under paragraph c above. Include, where applicable, the commonly accepted name or names identifying the particular building (or grounds) as known to the Occupation Forces and as known by the Japanese, and include the room number.
 - e. The Army Post Office (APO) number of the military unit or staff section and the name of the city in which the APO is located.
 - f. The name of the Japanese telegraph office and/or branch office and city and prefecture thereof to which it is desired by the military unit (or staff section) that its international telegrams (incoming at Tokyo, Osaka, or Fukuoka) be relayed by telegram.
 - g. Date of information as supplied by the military unit (or staff section) to the telegraph office.
2. A complete record for each United States Occupation Force military unit and staff section in Japan will be maintained at Tokyo, Osaka, and Fukuoka for the purpose of effecting local delivery by messenger and for relaying incoming international messages to the appropriate telegraph offices. At all other telegraph offices there will be maintained only the individual record for each such Occupation Force military unit or staff section for which a particular telegraph office will make delivery of telegrams by messenger.

3. Based on information available from the individual record, as described in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, the Ministry of Communications will direct the relay of any international message incoming at Tokyo, Osaka, and Fukuoka to the telegraph office in Japan which furnishes messenger delivery for the headquarters office of the military unit (or administrative division of the staff section) to which the addressee is attached.

4. Guided by information available from the individual record, as described in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, the Ministry of Communications will effect delivery by messenger of any international or domestic telegram received at any of its telegraph offices for an addressee of the United States Occupation Forces whose military unit's headquarters (or staff section's administrative division) is located within a two mile radius of the telegraph office. Where located beyond a two mile radius of a telegraph office, such Occupation Force military unit or staff section will arrange to pick up its telegrams at least once daily at the receiving telegraph office. In order that a telegram delivered by a messenger will be properly receipted for and that studies may be made from time to time relating to speed of delivery, the messenger making delivery will present his "record of delivery" to the person accepting the telegram at the military unit (or staff section) of the addressee and request that acknowledgement and time of receipt be indicated in the proper spaces thereon.

5. The Ministry of Communications will be responsible for selecting suitable delivery messengers and instructing them in such manner that the methods and practices of delivering telegrams for United States Occupation Force Units will be properly comprehended. These messengers will be supplied with proper identification cards in the English language showing that they are representatives of the Ministry of Communications. Where necessary, arrangements will be made by each local telegraph office with the United States Occupation Force unit to secure admission to the premises thereof to make delivery of telegrams. No messenger will be dispatched from a telegraph office to deliver a message to such Occupation Force unit who does not bear on his person:

a. Identification card showing he is a representative of the Ministry of Communications.

b. Where necessary, any pass that will have been issued to him for gaining admission to the premises of a particular Occupation Force installation wherein he is expected to make delivery of telegrams.

6. In case a telegraph office in Japan receives a telegram for an addressee whose military unit's headquarters (or staff section's administrative division) is not located within the area it serves, the telegraph office will advise the "international receiving terminal in Japan" (in case of an international telegram) or the "office of origin in Japan" (in case of a domestic telegram) by service message that delivery could not be made, and will include any further information it may have relative to the location of the military unit or staff section of the addressee. In the

case of international telegrams so reported upon, the "international receiving terminal in Japan" will deposit the telegram with the nearest Army Post Office for delivery to the addressee through Army postal channels. In the case of domestic telegrams so reported upon, the "office of origin in Japan" will notify the sender that the telegram was undelivered.

7. In connection with all incoming international telegrams at the Central Telegraph Offices in Tokyo, Osaka, and Fukuoka for Occupation Force personnel which are either delivered locally or relayed to another telegraph office in Japan for delivery and which include an Army Post Office number in the address, a "Confirmation Copy" will be sent to the addressee through Army postal channels. The words "Confirmation Copy" will be inserted in the remarks space of the message form and this copy will be sent by messenger to the nearest Army Post Office for delivery through those channels to the addressee. No "Confirmation Copy" will be supplied or required in connection with domestic telegrams for addresses attached to Occupation Force units.

8. The Ministry of Communications will instruct the Yokohama Telegraph Office to send a messenger daily (except Sunday) to the Central Mail Directory, Army Post Office 503, located in Yokohama to pick up messages which have been processed through the Army postal system's locator files and have been found to be undeliverable in Japan through Army postal channels. The Yokohama Telegraph Office will advise the "office of origin in Japan" (in case of a domestic message) or the "international receiving terminal in Japan" (for international messages) of each message that is undeliverable. The Central Telegraph Offices at Tokyo, Osaka, or Fukuoka upon learning from the Yokohama Telegraph Office that an international message handled by it was undeliverable will advise the "foreign office of origin" to that effect in accordance with international telegraph practices.

9. A copy of each domestic telegram addressed to Occupation Force personnel whether delivered or not will be retained in the files of the originating telegraph office for a period of one year; also in line with international telegraph practices a copy of each incoming international telegram addressed to United States Occupation Force personnel whether delivered or not will be retained for a period of one year in the files of the telegraph office in Japan which first received the message from the foreign point of origin.

10. Messenger delivery, as set forth above, will be provided for in the service areas of only those telegraph offices in Japan which are presently authorized or which may be authorized in the future to accept Sender Composition and/or Expeditionary Force Messages. Incoming international telegrams bearing an APO address for an addressee of an Occupation Force unit which is situated in a city or locality whose telegraph office is not authorized to accept Sender Composition and/or Expeditionary Force Messages (or where no telegraph office is established) will be relayed by land telegraph to the city in which the addressee's APO is located. There it will be delivered by messenger to the Army Post Office for delivery to the addressee through Army postal channels.

BASIC: APPENDIX I (SCAPIN 884/1) Issue 1, Telegram Delivery Instructions

11. Statements of services rendered for relaying incoming international Senders Composition messages from United States territory to localities outside the Tokyo area, in accordance with this directive, will be furnished the Occupation Force in accordance with existing instructions. No statement of services rendered shall be made for delivery of Expeditionary Force messages beyond the Tokyo area.

12. In connection with the handling of telegraph traffic addressed to military and accredited civilian personnel of the British Commonwealth Occupation Force the arrangements presently in effect will be continued but may be expanded in the future as required or desired within the limits of this directive. "Locator" responsibility, as at present, will continue to be that of the Army Postal Services (BCOF) as directed by Headquarters, British Commonwealth Occupation Force which is authorized to make such local arrangements for messenger delivery as may from time to time be required, subject to the limitations of this directive.

This form is for the purpose of enabling the Japanese Ministry of Communications to deliver by messenger (beginning 1 October 1947) a maximum number of telegrams (international and domestic) addressed to United States Occupation Force military and accredited civilian personnel directly to the headquarters office of a military unit, and to the administrative division of a staff section from the nearest telegraph office. For the purpose of telegraph delivery the term "military unit", will be construed as covering a detachment, group or organization of any size whose headquarters or station is located in a different city from its immediate superior headquarters, or if located in the same city as its immediate superior headquarters the headquarters is located at a different street address and/or in a different building from that of its immediate superior headquarters. The term "staff section" shall embrace regular or special staff sections at General, Army, Corps, and Division levels.

2. Preparation

This form will be prepared and signed by the officer in charge of each military unit or staff section, and care will be exercised that complete and exact information is entered on the form. Entries will be made in typed or printed capital letters (preferably typed) in the English language. For uniformity use only white, regular letter-sized, 8" by 10 1/2" paper.

3. Distribution

a. Four copies of the completed form shall be furnished by the officer in charge to the Director of the local telegraph office of the Japanese Ministry of Communications who will keep one copy and who will mail one copy each to the Director of the Central Telegraph Offices of Tokyo, Osaka, and Fukuoka. (Exception: In Tokyo, Osaka, and Fukuoka the four copies will be delivered to the Director of the Central Telegraph Office instead of to any branch office thereof.)

b. One copy will be furnished by the officer in charge to Headquarters, Eighth Army, Signal Section, Communications Division, AFO 343.

4. Completion date

The form covering each military unit and staff section will be completed and distributed on or before 1 September 1947.

5. Regarding Future Changes in Unit Designations and Locations

Any changes made in the information contained on the form as previously prepared and supplied to the Public Office Manager of the local telegraph office will require preparation and distribution of revised information in the same manner as specified in paragraphs 2 and 3 above.

SUBJECT: Property Removed from Yenching University

1. Reference is made to the following:

- a. Memorandum for Japanese Government, AG 444.5 (13 Jul 46)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1717-A, 13 July 1946, subject, "Laboratory Equipment Removed from Yenching University, Peiping, China", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers;
- b. C.L.O. No. 4426(PM), 3 September 1946, same subject;
- c. Memorandum to Central Liaison Office, 444.5 (20 Sep 46)CPC/FP, 20 September 1946, subject, "Laboratory Equipment Removed from Yenching University", from Civil Property Custodian;
- d. C.L.O. No. 5811(RP), 1 November 1946, same subject;
- e. C.L.O. No. 832(RP), 10 February 1947, same subject.

2. With reference to paragraph 3 of 1a above, information received from Yenching University indicates that at Mr. Kano's request, President Stuart consented to accept a voluntary contribution for the rehabilitation of the University from the local Japanese residents on the condition that the sum be deducted from the indemnity which the school expected to receive from the Japanese Government. Upon such an understanding, the University received from Mr. Kano the sum of \$60,637,500 F.R.B. and it has never considered this sum as a settlement of its total claim against the Japanese Government.

3. The Central Liaison Office is directed to reopen the investigation and to submit a report on the disposition made of the laboratory equipment removed from Yenching University as directed in reference 1a above.

4. The Central Liaison Office is further directed to make an investigation as to the present location and condition of the following additional property removed from the University:

Maps	8 scrolls 28 volumes 136 sheets
