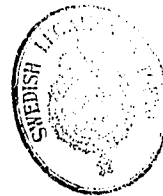

SUBJECT: Establishment of Hourly Weather Circuits

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, subject same as above, file AG 000.93 (8 Mar 46)CCS, dated 8 March 1946, (SCAFIN 805).

2. The Memorandum given as reference in paragraph 1 provides that the Japanese Bureau of Communications will furnish certain telegraph circuits and services for use in connection with the collection and dissemination of weather information. It will not be necessary to furnish the telegraph circuits and services described therein and the original Memorandum is hereby rescinded.

3. Occupation Force teletypewriters have been installed in certain of the Japanese meteorological observatory offices in connection with furnishing service in accordance with the original memorandum. Arrangements will be made for these teletypewriters and any other Occupation Force telegraph equipment which may have been installed to be removed and returned to Occupation Force agencies. Details in connection with this will be handled by direct correspondence in accordance with paragraph 4 of this memorandum.

4. Direct communication between General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Communications Section, and the Ministry of Communications on technical matters within the scope of this memorandum is authorized.

which reported the location and quantities of raw silk and fabricated silk materials formerly the property of the Japanese Army and Navy, which were released for domestic consumption by the former Japanese Army and Navy immediately following the termination of the war and prior to the issuance of SCAPIN 53, dated 24 September 1945 and to:

d. SCAPIN 4154 A, dated 15 July 1947, which directed that 1000 bales of silk be released to the Occupation Forces as a partial replacement of silk which had been processed into forms unsuitable to the needs of the Occupation Forces.

2. An investigation of one of the cases, listed as item 18 in the report referred to under 1 b above, revealed that on 16 August 1945 the Nippon Kogyo K. K. entered into an agreement with the Imperial Japanese Army Clothing Depot whereby certain stocks of silk, the property of the former Japanese Armed Forces, were transferred to the Nippon Kogyo K. K. and on 26 December 1945, the sum of ¥1,203,200 was transferred from the Nippon Kogyo K. K. to the Central Army Clothing Depot in payment for subject silk.

3. In view of the Japanese Army Military Secret Order No. 363, 17 August 1945, it is not considered that the Nippon Kogyo K. K. was guilty of willful wrong doing although this transaction was clearly in violation of SCAPIN 582, 11 January 1946, which informed the Japanese Government that attempts to dispose of the supplies and equipment of the Japanese Armed Forces between the dates of 14 August 1945 and 2 September 1945 did not fall within the spirit of the Potsdam Declaration.

This service will be extended to Osaka immediately and to other points when directed in correspondence between Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications. 4. Calls may be placed by United States military and accredited civilian personnel only and will be made from telephones designated by the United States Occupation Forces for this purpose. a. All messages addressed HOTEETO or to any individual in care of HOTEETO will be delivered directly to Hotel Teito, (formerly the Imperial Forestry Bureau Building) Otemachi, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo.

SUBJECT: Responsibility for cargoes aboard SCAJAP tankers

1. The Japanese Government will be held responsible for petroleum products owned by the United States Army when shipped aboard tankers or barges operated by the Japanese Government. This responsibility will extend from time of loading to time of discharge when the United States Army is both consignor and consignee.

2. Title to cargoes shipped aboard Japanese operated tankers or barges consigned by the United States Army to the Japanese Government will change at the time of loading and the Japanese Government will be charged with the quantity loaded.

3. Shore tank gauges will govern in measurement of quantities loaded and discharged. Measurements will be converted to 60° F.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the Government of the Republic of the Philippines a collection of 500 shell specimens, referred to in reference memorandum above and at present in the custody of the Kyoto Imperial University.

3. The subject specimens are to be packed for shipment as freight under South Seas climatic conditions and delivered on 11 August 1947 to Room 50L, Hattori Building, Tokyo. Major G. S. Maceda has been designated by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines as the authorized representative to receive and receipt for said property.

4. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.

5. The inclosed receipt forms consisting of an original and five (5) copies are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the two Governments, the Government of the Republic of the Philippines and the Japanese Government. The receipt forms are to be distributed as follows:

a. Original and one (1) copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the Japanese Government;

b. Two (2) copies to be retained by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines;

c. Two (2) copies to be retained by the Japanese Government.
