According to authoritative informations recently received from the Chinese Government, the matter has been referred to the local authorities concerned in the Northeastern Provinces and the latter have been instructed to pay due attention to the living conditions of the Japanese nationals remaining in Dairen, as soon as the port is taken over by the Chinese Government and before they are repatriated.

SUBJECT: Release of Cotton Fabric from the Stocks of Koeki Eidan

1. Reference is made to G.L.O. No. 3680(EE), 14 May 1947, subject, "Application for Release of Cotton Fabric from the Stocks of Koeki Eidan".

2. The Japanese Government is directed to release, from the stocks of Koeki Eidan, three million (3,000,000) yards of plain weave and twill cotton fabrics suitable for use by farm families, to Sangyo Fukko Kodan for distribution to farmers as a bonus to encourage delivery of wheat and barley.

3. The Japanese Government is further directed to submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, within thirty (30) days from the date of this memorandum, a report showing the quantities, grades, book values and purchase prices of subject goods released, together with the location of the warehouses from which removed. The Japanese Government will further submit, at thirty (30) day intervals until final disposition of subject material, reports showing the organizations to which subject material has been allotted and the quantity allotted to each.

SUBJECT: Restitution of Stuffed Birds Removed from Raffles Museum, Singapore, Malay States

1. Reference is made to C.L.O. No. 4196(RP), 31 May 1947, subject, "Property Removed from the Raffles Museum and Library, Singapore".
2. The Japanese Government is directed to restore to the British Government the one hundred eighty-five (185) stuffed birds which are at present in the custody of the Imperial Household, Tokyo.
3. The subject stuffed birds are to be packed for shipment as freight under South Seas climatic conditions and delivered to the Naval Officer-in-Charge, Kure, on 25 August 1947, where they are to be placed alongside the pier or brought to a ship as he will direct.
4. The Naval Officer-in-Charge, Kure, has been designated as the authorized representative of the British Government to receive and receipt for the said property.
5. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment.
6. The inclosed receipt forms, original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the two Governments, the British Government and the Japanese Government. The receipt forms are to be distributed as follows:
 - a. Original and one (1) copy to be returned to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by the Japanese Government;
 - b. Two (2) copies to be retained by the British Government;
 - c. Two (2) copies to be retained by the Japanese Government.

of United Nations Nationals' Property Wrongfully Transferred", from
General Headquarters; Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

CPG/FP, 26 May 1947, subject, "Property in Japan Owned on 7 December 1941

2. The Japanese Government is directed to take possession of all
property covered by the attached list and to assemble all movable prop-
erty at a safe storage area, by 18 August 1947, preparatory to restoring
the property to William Axling, D.D., who owned the property on 7 December
1941.

3. It is further directed that the Japanese Government return all
property on the attached list, and any additional movables which may be
located and identified, to William Axling, D.D., at 1342-8 Takase Atagoyama,
Karuzawa-machi, Kitasaku-gun, Nagano-ken (Villa No. 934) on 18 August
1947 at 1000 hours, under conditions set forth in "Receipt for Restitution
to United Nation National of Wrongfully Transferred Property in Japan",
and under the following conditions:

AG 095 (2 Aug 47) CPG/FP

a. A general and a final report by the Japanese Government on
the management of the property from 7 December 1941 to the date of resto-
ration, said report to include statement of all financial transactions,
will be attached to each copy of the receipt;

b. If the property has been leased subsequent to seizure, the
Japanese Government will afford the restorer the option either to allow
the lease to continue in force or to terminate it at the time of the
restoration of the property to him. Should the restorer decide to termi-
nate such lease, the Japanese Government will take the action necessary to
provide him vacant possession;

c. All inventories included in the receipt will contain a state-
ment as to the condition of the property at the time of restoration.

d. Title to the property shall be restored to its status prior
to wrongful transfer, confiscation or transfer under duress, and the prop-
erty will be restituted free of all legal encumbrances placed on it subse-
quently. Transfer of title will be made at the Judicial Bureau, or its
branch offices, having jurisdiction;

e. All funds subject to restitution will be restored to a free
yen account status. Funds formerly on deposit in United Nations banking
institutions and now on deposit in the Special Property Administration
Account in the Bank of Japan are not subject to restitution to individual
depositors.

4. Four copies of accomplished receipt for the property, with documen-
tary evidence of the transfer of title, will be submitted to General Head-
quarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers within ten (10) days of
completion of delivery. Receipts and evidence of transfer of title will be
submitted in both English and Japanese text with the Japanese translation
certified as correct.

1. References:

a. Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers Memorandum, file AG 463.7 (3 Jul 47) GD, (SCAPIN 4086-A), dated 3 July 1947, subject as shown.

b. Memorandum from Central Liaison Office, CLO, No. 4729 (EG) dated 14 June 1947, subject as above.

2. Reference 1a above is cancelled in its entirety and the policy and plans for rationing petroleum products, as submitted under reference 1b above, are approved with the following exceptions:

a. Paragraph 4 (1), Chapter II of Policy on Distribution of Petroleum Products, shall be changed to read:

"Purchasing pass books, allocation and/or ration certificates, to be issued by the competent ministry to consumers to enable them to purchase petroleum products from dealers. Detachable or negotiable coupons shall not be used."

b. Paragraph 10, Chapter III shall be changed to read:

"The dealers shall have the following qualifications:

(1) To have or produce evidence of making available the facilities necessary for the distribution of petroleum products.

(2) To have a shop in the sales area.

c. Paragraph 12, Chapter III shall be changed to read:

"Application described in the preceding article shall be filed with the detached office or branch office of the Petroleum Distribution Kodan. The detached office or branch office of the Petroleum Distribution Kodan shall report it to the President of the Petroleum Distribution Kodan, together with the opinion of the Prefectural Advisory Group.

"The Advisory Group described in the preceding paragraph shall be democratically organized by the representatives of the Petroleum Distribution Kodan, the consumers, and competent governmental officials concerned."

d. Article 12 (2) shall be inserted in Chapter III as follows:

"The President of the Petroleum Distribution Kodan shall, on the basis of the reports described in the preceding article and with the approval of the Commerce and Industry Ministry, as an agency of the Economic Stabilization Board designate the dealer, upon examining whether or not the applicants have qualification described in Article 10, Chapter III.

"The designation of the dealer shall be made specifying the following matters:

- (1) Designation number.
- (2) Name and address.
- (3) Location of shop.
- (4) Name of prefecture designated as sales area.
- (5) In case where applicants specified the kind of petroleum products, the name or names of the petroleum products which he shall handle.
- (6) The necessary matters other than those above mentioned."

"The designated dealer shall display the above at a readily visible place in front of his shop.

No person other than the Petroleum Distribution Kodan or the designated dealer shall sell petroleum products to consumers."

e. Article 13, Chapter III is amended by adding the following clause:

"However, the Director of the District Commerce & Industry Bureau may not allocate the allowable inventories to dealers in cases where the allotted quota by each prefecture is not sufficient to make minimum economical allocation to all dealers.

"Allowable inventories shall be granted in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 8 to 13 of Article 3 of Cabinet Instruction No. 3, 1947 (Procedure Regulation on Distribution of the Designated Rationed Goods)."

3. Plans for the allocation and rationing of petroleum products for farming, fishing, etc., are to be submitted within 14 days consistent with this policy directive as approved above and, so far as possible, with the plan approved for motor cars and trucks. Such plans shall expressly prohibit the use of the National and Prefectural Agricultural and Fisheries Associations as distributing or rationing agencies.

4. The Policy on Distribution of Petroleum Products, as amended by paragraph 2 above, and plans for Rationing of Petroleum Products for motor cars and trucks will be placed in effect no later than 1 August 1947.

5. Copies of all ordinances, memorandums, rationing evidences or other documents issued by the Japanese Government in implementing the rationing of petroleum products will be submitted to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The application to dissolve and liquidate the corporation in the form and manner stated therein is denied.

3. The corporation shall be dissolved and liquidated by special liquidation pursuant to Imperial Ordinance No. 74 of 1947. This liquidation will be carried out by the Closed Institutions Liquidating Commission.

4. Direct communication is authorized between the interested Staff Sections of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and agencies of the Japanese Government concerned to implement all provisions of this memorandum.

5. The Japanese Government shall submit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in quintuplicate, typed in English on 8" x 11" paper, within sixty (60) days from the date of this memorandum, a report of action taken.

SUBJECT: Exercise of Jurisdiction over Vessels

1. The Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, may exercise jurisdiction over vessels within its territorial waters if, in the case in which the vessel is involved, it would be authorized, under existing directives, to exercise jurisdiction over both the owner and the charterer or other authorized user or possessor of the vessel, and, also, would be authorized to exercise jurisdiction over the particular offense involving the vessel.

2. In accordance with the foregoing general principle, jurisdiction over vessels will be exercised as follows:

a. The Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, will not exercise any jurisdiction over vessels owned or chartered by, or in the authorized possession of, a United Nations national, or organization (including a corporation), who is attached to or is accompanying the Allied Armed Forces.

b. (1) In criminal cases in which vessels are involved, the Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, will not exercise any jurisdiction over the vessels if they are owned, or chartered by, or in the authorized possession of, one of the United Nations, or any national of such nation, including vessels owned or chartered by, or in the authorized possession of, Formosans who, at the time, are in fact, inhabitants and residents of the Island of Formosa, and, thereby, have acquired Chinese nationality or citizenship.

(2) In civil cases involving vessels, subject to review by occupation authorities, the Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, may exercise jurisdiction over the vessels, unless such vessels are owned or chartered by, or are in the authorized possession of, a United Nations

national, or organization (including a corporation), who is attached to or is accompanying the Allied Armed Forces, in which case paragraph "a" above applies.

c. The Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, subject to review by occupation authorities, may exercise jurisdiction over vessels in its territorial waters, which are owned by persons who are not nationals of one of the United Nations, unless such vessels have been chartered to, or are in the authorized possession of, one of the United Nations or a national of one of the United Nations, in which case paragraph "b" above applies.

d. The Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, subject to review by occupation authorities, may exercise jurisdiction over vessels owned by Formosans who are residents of Japan, except that in criminal cases involving such vessels the Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, will not exercise jurisdiction if such Formosans possess registration certificates duly issued by the Chinese Government, or by the Chinese Mission in Japan, or if such vessels have been chartered to, or otherwise transferred to the authorized possession of one of the United Nations, or its nationals, in which case sub-paragraph "b", above, applies.

3. Vessels from Korea, the Marianas, the Ryukyus and other places occupied by the Allied Occupation Forces, which carry duly authenticated documents purporting to be clearance papers from military government officers, or duly authorized port authorities, will be recognized by the Japanese Government as having entered Japanese territorial waters and ports legally. However, such vessels will be subject to the jurisdiction of the Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, if, after entry into Japanese territorial waters, and ports, they are used for illegal purposes, or are involved in illegal acts, which would make such vessels answerable to the Japanese law; but the Japanese Government will obtain the approval of the Allied occupation authorities before taking jurisdiction in such cases.

4. In cases involving personnel of vessels, the Japanese Government, and its tribunals and agencies, will exercise the same jurisdiction over such persons as they do under existing directives with respect to the exercise of jurisdiction over persons.





With reference to paragraph (a) of reference "a" above, the Chinese Mission in Japan has informed this Headquarters that the Chinese government has already issued orders to the effect that all Japanese war criminal suspects and war criminals are to be accorded the same treatment as regular Chinese soldiers. The Mission states further that the Japanese Liaison Office in China is still functioning.

3. With reference to paragraph (b) of reference "a" above, the Chinese Mission has informed this Headquarters that the Chinese authorities are expediting the investigations and trials of Japanese war criminal suspects, that two groups of those acquitted have already been repatriated, and that those newly acquitted will be repatriated as soon as transportation facilities are available.

b. The officer responsible for the removal of the subject property was Suzuki-Toshiyoki, who was the Japanese Minister of Armaments and whose present address is alleged to be 22, Hikawa-cho, Nakano-ku, Tokyo. Other Japanese army officers responsible were Col. Tanihagi Nakao, Chief of Army Special Service; Niyasaki, Chief of Economic Section; and Lt. Col. Honda, in charge of Industrial Relations.

c. In December 1937, a Japanese lieutenant with about thirty soldiers joined Lt. Col. Honda, Shibuta and Ishitsu Group which was in charge of gunnery and general army supply, whereupon the actual removal of machinery and equipment was begun. SUBJECT: Expansion of Radiotelegraph Service via the United States.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government file AG 311.23 (18 Apr 47)CCS (SCAPIN-1612), dated 18 April 1947, subject: Expansion of Radiotelegraph Service Between Japan and the United States, and Between Japan and Hawaii.

2. Expansion of radiotelegraph service to include private, press and government messages between Japan and the points named in Inclosure 1, attached hereto, is authorized, effective 15 August 1947.

3. Messages exchanged between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1 to which the rates shown in Inclosure 1 apply, will be routed via the Japan-United States circuits in conformity with existing traffic distribution regulations and practices. Incoming transit messages destined to points beyond Japan will not be accepted.

4. Payment of Japanese Ministry of Communications' share of revenue and the American carriers' share, including their outpayment to connecting carriers, will be handled through the Transfer Agent for Telephone and Telegraph Message Funds in the same manner in which payments are made to the Japanese Ministry of Communications and the American carriers for message traffic exchanged between Japan and the United States.

5. Message classifications authorized between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1 are as follows:

Full Rate	MLT or DLT
CDE	Ordinary Press
LC	Government

6. Per word rates for Full Rate, CDE, LC, MLT and DLT and Ordinary Press classifications are shown in Inclosure 1, and except for Ordinary Press are proportionately reduced from Full Rate, as follows:

- CDE - 60% of full rate
- LC - 50% of full rate
- MLT and DLT - 1/3 of full rate

7. Urgent press messages are authorized at the rates for full rate messages, as quoted in Inclosure 1.

8. Messages filed by United States military and accredited civilian personnel between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1, in the classifications specified in this memorandum, are authorized.

9. All press messages, and government messages for other than the United States Government will be sent "collect" from Japan to the points listed in Inclosure 1, and arrangements for collection of charges must be made prior to acceptance of such messages. Specific authorization must be obtained from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in each such case.

10. All other messages from Japan to the points listed in Inclosure 1, payment for which is not provided for by use of prepaid reply (RP) vouchers, will be prepaid in United States Military Payment Certificates. All messages from the points listed in Inclosure 1 to Japan will be prepaid at the point of origin.

11. United States Government messages between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1 will be handled in the same manner as United States Government messages between Japan and the United States. Rates for United States Government will be supplied at a later date. Rates for other government messages will be the same as for full rate, CDE, LC, MLT and DLT messages as provided for in this memorandum.

12. Revenue accruing to the Japanese Ministry of Communications, and to the other carriers including American carriers for the radiotelegraph services outlined in this memorandum, for each settlement period, will be computed on the equated words basis, an example of which is shown in paragraph 13, and will consist of the following, based on Inclosure 2 attached hereto:

a. The Japanese Ministry of Communications' share will be:

- (1) The Japanese terminal charge of \$0.0675 per full rate word, with proportionately lower terminal charges for other lower classifications except press, the terminal charge for which is \$0.02, plus
- (2) One half the radio circuit tolls between Tokyo and San Francisco, computed after deduction of the Japanese terminal charge.

b. The American carriers' share will be:

- (1) One half the radio circuit tolls between Tokyo and

San Francisco, computed after deduction of the Japanese terminal charge, plus

(2) Outpayments to connecting carriers beyond San Francisco.

13. Computation of revenue accruing to the Japanese Ministry of Communications and other carriers will be accomplished in the following manner:

a. CDE, IC, MLI and DLT wordages will be reduced to their equivalent in full rate words, per the following examples:

- (1) CDE words multiplied by 60% equals full rate words.
- (2) IC words multiplied by 50% equals full rate words.
- (3) MLI and DLT words multiplied by 33-1/3% equals full rate words.

b. After wordages have been equated in accordance with paragraph 13a (1), (2) and (3) above, division of tolls between the carriers will be accomplished in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 12 above.

14. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) from the points listed in Inclosure 1 addressed to non-accredited organizations or persons in Japan, including Japanese nationals, and private messages filed by such non-accredited organizations or persons in Japan, utilizing reply paid vouchers in payment of the charges for such messages to the points named in Inclosure 1, are authorized. Prepaid reply (RP) amounts will in all cases be quoted in United States dollars.

15. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1 are not authorized for accredited organizations or persons, nor for military personnel.

16. Private messages between the points listed in Inclosure 1 and Japan will be subject to all applicable censorship rules and regulations. Exceptions will be specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

17. The following languages are hereby authorized for use in messages between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1.

18. All provisions of paragraph 11 through 13 of the reference memorandum, pertaining to private messages with prepaid reply (RP) exchanged between the United States or Hawaii and Japan, will apply equally to private messages with prepaid reply (RP) exchanged between Japan and the points listed in Inclosure 1.

19. Direct communications between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, and the Ministry of Communications, regarding operating and accounting procedures within the scope of this memorandum, are authorized.

1. Reference is made to memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 560 (5 Oct 46)CPC/FP, SCAPIN 1254, 5 October 1946, subject, "Salvage, Repair and Refitting of Captured Vessels", from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to take immediate action to repair and refit the SS "Yung Yuan" in order that the ship may be restored to a condition substantially similar to that at the time she came into the hands of the Japanese Government.

3. The SS "Yung Yuan" will be repaired and refitted preparatory to restitution at the Maizuru Yard of the Iino Industry Company.

4. It is directed that the Japanese Government notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, when the vessel has been placed in dry dock, before undertaking the work of repairing and refitting, in order that an inspection may be made by a qualified marine surveyor and other Allied technical experts to determine the extent of repairs which will be required. Based on the results of such inspection, the Japanese Government will submit immediately thereafter estimates of the cost of repairs as recommended and of the quantities of materials critically short in Japan that will be required for the work.

5. In addition, the Japanese Government will submit to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, the following reports:

a. Monthly report covering expenditures for repairing and refitting the SS "Yung Yuan", under the following headings:

- (1) Materials;
- (2) Labor;
- (3) Shipyard utilities and services;
- (4) Harbor facilities;
- (5) Use of dry dock or marine railroad and other docking charges.

b. A bi-monthly report of the progress of the repairs to the vessel.

2. Supplementing the above memoranda, certain additional ships will be released to the Japanese Government from time to time for destruction by scrapping or by other method approved by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

3. Vessels released for scrapping will be designated by Commander Naval Activities, Japan. Destruction in each case will be accomplished within six (6) months of release to the Japanese Government, unless otherwise specified by Commander Naval Activities, Japan.

4. The provisions of paragraph 3 of reference 1a above will be complied with by the Japanese Government in carrying out the directive.

5. When specified by Commander Naval Activities, Japan, detailed accounting shall be kept of the scrapping operation, as follows:

a. Costs of scrapping.

b. Tonnage of various grades of ferrous scrap recovered.

c. Weights of nonferrous scrap recovered. (Brass, Bronze, Copper, Lead).

2. The rate schedule contained in paragraph 4 of reference 1a above as replaced by inclosure 1 to reference 1b above is hereby superseded by the rate tables shown in inclosure 2 of this memorandum.

3. Paragraph 7 of reference 1a above is hereby amended to read as follows:

Statements of accounts shall be expressed in sterling and will be rendered monthly to the British Liaison Agency. A copy of the monthly statements of account will be supplied to the General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, attention Accounting Section.

4. Paragraph 5 of reference 1a above as amended by paragraph 5 of reference 1b above is superseded by the list of public acceptance offices shown in inclosure 1 of this memorandum.

5. Memorandum for Japanese Government, file AG 311.23 (5 May 47)CCS (SCAPIN 1657) dated 5 May 1947, subject: Change in Acceptance Offices for EFM and SCM Messages from Japan to British Commonwealth Points, further identified as reference 1c above, is rescinded coincidentally with the effective date of this memorandum.

6. This memorandum will become effective at 0001 hours Japan time 15 August 1947. Thereafter EFM and SCM messages from Japan to all points in the British Commonwealth will be prepaid in British Armed Forces Special Vouchers, hereinafter referred to as BAFSVs, at rates per message or per word, expressed in sterling as shown in the rate tables in inclosure 2 of this memorandum.

7. At least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the effective date of this memorandum, the Ministry of Communications will issue the following instructions to its representatives at all public acceptance offices in Japan where EFM and SCM messages as described in paragraph 6 above will be filed:

a. Effective 0001 hours 15 August 1947, and thereafter until further notice, only BAFSVs will be accepted in prepayment of the charges for EFM and SCM messages from Japan to points in the British Commonwealth.

b. As soon after the close of business on 31 August 1947 as the Ministry of Communications will direct, each public acceptance office concerned will forward to the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications any amount in BAFSVs which is in excess of the amount authorized to be withheld for change making purposes by that office, as set forth in inclosure 1.

8. The Ministry of Communications will supply each of the public acceptance offices for EFM and SCM messages from Japan to the British Commonwealth shown in inclosure 1 of this memorandum, with a list of rates in sterling and payable in BAFSVs, showing charges for all classes of messages currently authorized for transmission from Japan to any point in the British Commonwealth. One copy of such a list of rates is provided in inclosure 2. It will be noted that since the lowest denomination that will be available in BAFSVs will be that of three pence (3d), it will be necessary to round out the total charges for a message to the nearest three pence (3d) or multiple thereof, as per the following examples:

- a. 11 chargeable words LC
11 x 7^{sd} = 6s-10^{sd}; charge 7s-0d

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- b. 50 chargeable words NLT
50 x 5d = 30s-10d; charge 30s-9d
- c. 37 chargeable words NLT
37 x 5d = 15s-5d; charge 15s-6d

9. The Ministry of Communications is hereby authorized to withhold the amount of £ 325. 0. 0 in BAFSVs for change making purposes in its public acceptance offices. Inclosure 1 is a list of the public acceptance offices authorized to withhold this currency, together with the amount allocated to each public acceptance office. The Ministry of Communications is further authorized to withhold, as an addition to the amount listed in inclosure 1 for its own Treasury, sufficient BAFSVs to offset any deficiency in the total amount of £ 325. 0. 0 which may be occasioned by one or more of its public acceptance offices not having accumulated the full amount authorized for that public acceptance office. The amount so held by the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications will be reflected in the semi-monthly revenue collection report referred to in paragraph 20 below. The total amount in BAFSVs withheld by the Ministry of Communications, in its Treasury and at its public offices for change making purposes, will be at all times exactly £ 325. 0. 0 in BAFSVs. Any public acceptance office which has not accumulated by 31 August 1947, sufficient BAFSVs to equal the amount authorized, that public acceptance office is authorized to withhold such BAFSVs collected in subsequent semi-monthly periods, or as the Ministry will direct, until such time as the total amount authorized to be withheld for change making purposes in BAFSVs by that office, in accordance with inclosure 1, has been accumulated. Each public acceptance office upon accumulating the total amount authorized will thereafter maintain, for change making purposes, the exact amount authorized in BAFSVs and will forward to the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications at intervals which the Ministry of Communications will prescribe all BAFSVs collected for prepayment of messages, as described in paragraph 6 above, in excess of the stipulated amount to be withheld for change making purposes.

10. The amount in BAFSVs in the possess of any public acceptance office will never be in excess of the amount collected since the last forwarding of collections to the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications plus the amount authorized for change making purposes. The transactions of each public acceptance office involving BAFSVs will be shown by the accounting records of that public acceptance office and such records will be open for inspection at all times by representatives of the Financial Adviser to the General Officer Commanding, British Commonwealth Occupation Force, and to representatives of General Accounting Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

11. The amount authorized for change making purposes must be withheld from the Ministry of Communications' share of the revenue derived from receipts for prepaid messages, described in paragraph 6 above, and must not be withheld from the share due the British Carriers.

12. The amount withheld for change making purposes at any public acceptance office and the number of public acceptance offices shown on inclosure 1 may neither be increased nor decreased without the approval of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers; except as provided for while accumulating the withholding fund. By pre-arrangement, large denominations of BAFSVs may be exchanged by public acceptance offices of the Ministry of Communications with the nearest British Commonwealth Paymaster for small denominations so that a proper balance in denominations will be available to facilitate change making.

13. On 20 September 1947, the Ministry of Communications will deposit with the "Transfer Agent for British Commonwealth Telecommunications Funds" (hereinafter referred to as the "British Transfer Agent") the total amount of BAFSVs that has been collected by its public acceptance offices for payment of messages for the period 15 August to 31 August 1947, less the amount of £ 325. 0. 0 authorized to be held for change making purposes. Thereafter the Ministry of Communications will render statements and make deposits in accordance therewith to the "British Transfer Agent" on a semi-monthly basis, the periods of which will be from the first to the fifteenth of the month inclusive, and from the sixteenth to the last day of the month inclusive. Statements and deposits will be made with the "British Transfer Agent" within twenty-one (21) days after the close of each period. The deposits to be made in accordance with the above will be accompanied by five (5) copies of a preliminary statement showing, from the records of the Ministry of Communications, the amount in pounds sterling (BAFSVs) due in net settlement for all traffic in the period involved (or as a result of adjustment made for previous periods) either from the Japanese Ministry of Communications to the British Carrier or vice versa. The "British Transfer Agent" will forward the statements to the carriers concerned, endorsing one as a receipt to be returned to the Ministry of Communications.

14. If the net balance is in favor of the British Carrier, the "British Transfer Agent" will convert to pounds sterling from the amounts deposited with him the amount due to the British Carrier in net settlement and will convert the balance to Japanese yen for payment to the Ministry of Communications. If the net balance is in favor of the Ministry of Communications, the "British Transfer Agent" will convert the entire sum deposited to Japanese yen for payment to the Ministry of Communications and will, in addition, deposit in an account designated by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, in sterling, the net sum due to the Japanese Government from the British Carrier, such sum to be under the control of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers without restrictions.

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15. The Japanese Ministry of Communications' share of revenue for the radiotelegraph services performed in accordance with this directive will be:

- (a) The applicable Japanese terminal charges.
- (b) One-half of the radio rate computed after deduction of the Japanese terminal charge and the U.K. terminal and beyond charges.

16. The British Carriers' share of revenue will be:

- (a) The applicable U.K. terminal charges plus the beyond charges.
- (b) One-half of the radio rate computed after deduction of the Japanese and U.K. terminal charges and the beyond charges.

17. The division of charges per full rate word for the radiotelegraph services to be performed within the scope of this directive are shown in inclosure 2 of this memorandum. The rates, terminal charges and residue applicable to SCM messages of LC, NLT, and VLT classifications exchanged between Japan and the United Kingdom and between Japan and all other British Commonwealth countries will be proportionate charges based upon the respective charges applicable to SCM full rate messages exchanged between Japan and the British Commonwealth countries concerned.

18. Inclosure 3 is the prescribed form to be used by the Ministry upon depositing BAFSVs on 20 September 1947, which represents funds due to the Ministry of Communications. Inclosure 4 is the prescribed form to be used by the Ministry of Communications as a receipt for the Japanese Yen received from the British Transfer Agent on 20 September 1947. Inclosure 5 is the prescribed form to be used by the Ministry upon depositing BAFSVs on 20 September 1947, and semi-monthly thereafter, which represent funds due to the British Carrier. Inclosures 6 and 7 are the prescribed forms to be used by the Ministry upon depositing BAFSVs for periods subsequent to the period ending 31 August 1947, in respect of funds due to the Ministry of Communications. Inclosure 8 is the prescribed form to be used by the Ministry for requesting the "British Transfer Agent" to credit to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers in sterling the net sum due to the Japanese Government from the British Carrier, when the net balance is in favor of the Ministry of Communications.

19. The "British Transfer Agent" will arrange with the Chief Paymaster, Headquarters, British Commonwealth Occupation Force, or such other agent as the Headquarters, British Commonwealth Occupation Force may designate, to convert the BAFSVs into pound sterling instruments and into Japanese Yen to accomplish the purpose described in this directive. Japanese Yen will be paid in cash to the Treasury of the Ministry of

Communications. In all cases in this directive which require transactions by or with the Ministry of Communications or its Treasury, it is understood that such transactions will be performed on behalf of the Ministry of Communications or its Treasury by a duly authorized representative in each instance.

20. In addition to the semi-monthly preliminary statements required in accordance with paragraph 13, the Ministry of Communications will submit a report in triplicate semi-monthly to the Financial Adviser to the General Officer Commanding, British Commonwealth Occupation Force, Eta Jima, and supply a copy of the same to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, attention General Accounting Section, not later than five days after the close of each semi-monthly period, showing the exact amount in BAFSVs collected by each of its public acceptance offices during the period, as well as the exact amount withheld by each public acceptance office for change making purposes on the closing date for that period. The figures for this preliminary report are to be collected by means of rapid communications from outlying public acceptance offices, in order that no delay will be incurred in submitting the report to the Financial Adviser. Description or breakdown by classification of messages is not required in this report. Total amounts will be shown in two columns for each public office, the columns representing, (1) total BAFSVs collected during the current periods, and (2) BAFSVs withheld for change making purposes.

21. Final traffic accounting statements in triplicate will be submitted monthly to the "British Transfer Agent" showing payments made and adjustments, if any. The British Carrier will prepare a similar statement which, when received by the "British Transfer Agent", will be forwarded to the Ministry of Communications. Upon receipt of the traffic accounting statements submitted by the British Carrier the Ministry of Communications will reconcile the statements of the British Carrier with those prepared by the Ministry of Communications for the period covered by the statements, and reflect any necessary adjustments in the Ministry's Traffic Accounting statements for the next succeeding month. A copy of each Final Traffic Accounting statement will be submitted to the Financial Adviser to the General Officer Commanding, British Commonwealth Occupation Force, Eta Jima, and to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, attention General Accounting Section.

22. All communications relative to fiscal or accounting matters relating to the Osaka-Colombo circuit will be transmitted through the "British Transfer Agent" except as provided for in paragraphs 20 and 25 of this memorandum. All matters pertaining to basic rates and underlying policies will, as heretofore, be directed to the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

23. The "British Transfer Agent" will be located at United Kingdom Liaison Mission, British Embassy, Tokyo.

24. The Ministry of Communications will not permit BAFSVs received by its public acceptance offices for messages, as described in paragraph 6 above, to be turned over to the "British Transfer Agent" until after the currencies have been received by the Treasury of the Ministry of Communications, Tokyo To, Azabuku, Iigura, Rokuchome.

25. Direct correspondence within the scope of this memorandum is authorized between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, the General Accounting Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or the "British Transfer Agent" and the Ministry of Communications.
