SUBJECT: Clarification of Status of Former Suspected War Criminals

Memorandum to the Japanese Government dated 25 Feb 47, file AG 000.5 (25 Feb 47) LS-R, (SCAPIN 1546), wherein the Japanese Government was directed to deliver one ARISHIMA, Takashi, Sergeant Major, to the Commanding General, Eighth Army at Sugamo Prison (Tokyo Detention Camp), at the earliest possible date, is amended to delete said ARISHIMA's name for the reason that he is no longer required. This name appears as the first name on Page No. 1 of the above-mentioned Memorandum.

1. The following-named Japanese who were interned at Manila, Philippine Islands, and subsequently transferred to Sugamo Prison, are released from suspicion as Suspected War Criminals, are released from Sugamo Prison and henceforth will be returned to their former status.

The Japanese Government is directed to inventory, pack, crate and deliver to United States Army Warehouses as indicated on inclosure 1, the property belonging to the German individuals and/or German concerns named therein and located at the addresses shown. All inventories will be in English and will list the owner, address of location of the property, each separate type item of property, number of pieces of each type of property, yen value of each item and total valuation. Each inventory will note thereon SCAPIN 4323-A.

2. It is further directed that a representative of the Japanese Government contact Headquarters, United States Eighth Army, Yokohama, within three (3) days of receipt of this memorandum to coordinate the program and ascertain information pertinent to the operation. All operations will be under supervision of the United States Eighth Army and no operation will proceed until such time as designated by the United States Eighth Army.

a. Within ninety (90) days from the date of this memorandum, a progress report on the status of rehabilitation authorized by this memorandum. The report shall show the following:

- (1) Complete accounting of the funds authorized for the project, including amounts paid and incurred, and an estimate of further expenditures required to complete the project.
- (2) Percent of project completed.
- (3) If not complete, estimated date when project will be completed.

b. Upon completion of the project, or upon request at any time prior to completion, a report on complete accounting of funds and stating that the materials and equipment used in the rehabilitation were purchased at or below official prices.







1. Reference AG 400.703 (9 Dec 46)ESS/FT, (SCAPIN 1384),  
subject: "Surplus United States Government Property to be Sold  
to the Imperial Japanese Government!"

2. Paragraph 5 of reference 1. above is amended as fol-  
lows:

"Trucks and trailers will be operated by established  
agencies, governmental, prefectural and municipal, charged  
with the responsibility of promoting public health, safety and  
welfare, reconstruction and rehabilitation of devastated areas,  
and distribution of food, clothing, fuel and such other es-  
sential commodities as are required for the prevention of  
disease and unrest among the civilian population. Title to all  
vehicles will be retained by the Japanese Government, except  
that vehicles allocated to relief of passenger traffic con-  
gestion in urban areas may be sold to municipal governments or  
private concerns operating under franchises issued by the Min-  
istry of Transportation, Japanese Government. These vehicles  
will not be used by the government for the purpose of competing  
with private enterprisers. In cases where suitable public  
agencies do not exist for the accomplishment of the objectives  
mentioned above, the government may lease equipment to private  
operators, such arrangements to be subject to prior approval of

SUBJECT: Expansion of Radiotelegraph Service Between Japan and British Commonwealth Areas.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Japanese Government, file AG 311.23 (12 Aug 47) CCS, (SCAPIN-1762), dated 12 August 1947, subject: Osaka-Colombo Radiotelegraph Circuit.
2. The establishment by the Japanese Government of private message service between Japan and the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 of this memorandum is authorized effective 20 August 1947.
3. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) from the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 to Japan addressed to non-accredited organizations or persons, including Japanese nationals, and private messages filed by non-accredited organizations or persons in Japan, including Japanese nationals, utilizing reply paid vouchers in payment of the charges for such messages to the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 are authorized effective 20 August 1947.
4. Private messages with prepaid reply (RP) between the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 and Japan and vice versa, are not authorized for accredited organizations or persons, nor for military personnel.
5. Private messages may be sent by any organization or person in the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 to any organization or person in Japan.
6. Private messages may be sent from Japan by any organization or person authorized to possess and use British Armed Forces Special Vouchers and by the organization or person in Japan specifically named in a reply paid voucher, to any organization or person in the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1.
7. Private messages between the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 and Japan will be subject to all applicable censorship

rules and regulations. Exceptions will be specifically provided for by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

8. All private messages originating in Japan for transmission to the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1, payments for which are provided for in reply paid vouchers, will contain in the preamble the indicator ANSTORP (answer to reply paid message), which will be written in by the accepting office.

9. Private messages circulating from Japan to the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 will be filed at the same post or telegraph offices which are presently, or which may be in the future, designated for the acceptance of SCM messages to British Commonwealth areas.

10. Private messages, other than those utilizing reply paid vouchers in payment of the charges, will be prepaid in Japan in British Armed Forces Special Vouchers.

11. The handling of private messages containing reply paid indicator (RF L) in the address, including issuance of vouchers and use or refund of vouchers, will be accomplished in accordance with the provisions of the International Telegraph Regulations (Cairo 1938), Article 56, paragraph 465, except that:

a. The number or words in any such messages filed from Japan to the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 must be limited to prevent the charge from exceeding the amount contained in the reply paid voucher.

b. No refund of an unused portion of any such prepayment will be made unless such portion amounts to at least 25 (two shillings).

12. The procedure to be employed in refunding unused amounts of reply paid vouchers, or the payment of the British carriers' share of revenue derived from utilization of reply paid vouchers, will be as follows: The Ministry of Communications will deduct such amounts from its proportion of British Armed Forces Special Vouchers derived from prepaid messages destined to the British Commonwealth areas listed in Inclosure 1 during the period in which the refund or apportionment is made, and include such amounts in the sum deposited with the British Transfer Agent to the credit of the British carrier for the same period. The final monthly traffic accounting statements will include identification of all ANSTORP messages sent over the circuit during the period concerned, and appropriate entries in these reports will indicate amounts

which have been refunded to the British carrier in accordance with requests therefor, with sufficient data to identify the messages concerned.

13. Private message classifications authorized are Full Rate, LC (deferred) CDE (Code), NLT and DLT. Rates and division of revenue per full rate word between the Ministry of Communications and the British carrier for the message traffic authorized by this memorandum are shown in Inclosure 1.

14. Rates per word, terminal charges applicable, and residue to be divided equally, for CDE, LC, NLT, and DLT classifications are proportionate and will be 60%, 50%, 1/3 and 1/3 respectively of the charges per full rate word shown in Inclosure 1.

15. The total charges for each message authorized by this memorandum will be rounded up to the nearest three pence (3d).

16. Private messages authorized by this memorandum will be included by the Ministry of Communications on the same or similar statements as EFM and SCM messages exchanged between Japan and other British Commonwealth areas. Established procedures for settlement of accounts and payment of revenue accruing to the Ministry of Communications and to the British carrier for EFM and SCM messages circulating between Japan and all countries in the British Commonwealth will apply to private messages authorized by this memorandum.

17. Direct communication within the scope of this memorandum is authorized between the Civil Communications Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, the General Accounting Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers or the British Transfer Agent and the Ministry of Communications.

2. The Central Liaison Office is directed to submit a summary report on the activities of the following agencies concerned in the collecting, purchasing, forwarding, receiving, in Japan and disposing of diamonds removed from the Netherlands East Indies:

- a. Showa Tsusho K.K.;
- b. Army Aeronautical Headquarters;
- c. Army Ordnance Administration Headquarters;
- d. Army Arsenals.

The required report will contain detailed information as to the number of carats of diamonds received by each agency, types of stones, dates of delivery and disposition made thereof. It is anticipated by the Civil Property Custodian that this new report will elaborate upon, clarify and correct the report previously submitted with reference 1a above.

3. Reference 1b above, list C-2, giving information on the acquisition of diamonds by the Japanese Navy lists the disposition of all subject stones, with the exception of those seized by the Allied Forces, as "unknown". The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate further and to furnish complete information on the disposition of this property.

4. The Central Liaison Office is directed to furnish a separate report on the source and disposition of the 50,000 carats of diamonds which Mr. S. Uda stated he saw at the Army Arsenal at Oji, Tokyo, in July 1944. The subject report will

Mr. Sato stated that his former assistant, Tashiro, should have exact information as to the amount of diamonds sent to China. The Central Liaison Office is directed to interrogate said Tashiro and to submit a report as to the source, type and number of carats of diamonds so shipped.

6. Additional information is also requested on the report received through Mr. Uda to the effect that 500-600 carats of diamonds collected in the Netherlands East Indies were forwarded directly to India by the Army in Java. The Central Liaison Office is directed to investigate this matter and to report on the date and details of the shipment.

7. The Central Liaison Office is also directed to have all the responsible officials of the former Army Aeronautical Headquarters and Army Administration Headquarters, who were concerned with the receipt and disposition of diamonds from abroad, report to the Civil Property Custodian for questioning. It is desired that the officer (accountant) in charge of diamonds at Oji in July 1944, and Lt. Col. Sakitani, Capt. Matsubara and Its. Todo and Ikenaga be included in the group.

8. The reports required above and interrogations which were requested are to be completed by 30 September 1947.

Maceda has been designated by the Government of the Republic of the Philippines as the authorized representative to receive and receipt for subject property.

3. The Japanese Government will designate by name an authorized representative to execute the receipt forms in its behalf and will notify General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, of his appointment. This representative will report for instructions to the Civil Property Custodian on or before 4 September 1947.
